**EARLY DEFICIT TOO MUCH TO OVERCOME**

--The Royals attempted a late rally but a pair of Shelley Duncan homers and a career-best 5 RBI were took much to overcome the Tribe took the rubber match yesterday, 9-6...the contest was the final matchup of 2011 between the two clubs, with the Royals dropping 12 of the 18 contests...yesterday, starter Jeff Francis was not his usual self, walking three en route to allowing 4 runs on 9 hits in 5.0 innings to suffer his 15th loss of the season...the "add-on" runs by the Indians proved to be the important ones, as Cleveland scored 5 runs off the Royals bullpen coming on two swings from DH Shelley Duncan...eight of nine in the Royals lineup recorded hits, led by Billy Butler who had three hits, including two doubles...rookies Eric Hosmer and Johnny Giavotella each drove in two runs.

**OFFENSE ROLLING ON ROAD**

--Dating to an 11-hit attack at Tampa Bay on August 11, the Royals have batted .311 (160-for-515) in their last 14 road games, going 6-8 in that span...included in those 14 games are 9 double-digit hit efforts, including an 18-hit contest, a 17-hit affair and a pair of 16-hit performances...in splitting 10 games on the last trip, Kansas City batted .325 (121-for-372) with 26 doubles, 13 home runs and slugging .511, averaging 5.3 runs per game.

**ROAD STRETCH CONTINUES**

--The Royals complete a brief "homestand" yesterday by dropping the rubber match against the Indians in the three-game set...Kansas City will play here by the Bay through Wednesday afternoon and then travel up I-5 to Seattle for four games starting Thursday...the Royals are in the middle of a 20-game stretch with the Tribe series the only 3 games being contested in "The K"...the Royals have only one homestand remaining, a 7-gamer from September 13-21 that features Minnesota (2), Chicago (4) and Detroit (2).

**HOZ BUILDING A CASE**

--The American League Rookie of the Month for July is beginning to build a solid case for consideration for the overall Rookie of the Year award in the junior circuit...despite missing the first 31 games of the year while dominating in his first taste of AAA baseball in Omaha, the 21-year old first sacker is currently leading all A.L. rookies in hits (122), multi-hit games (33) and walks (34), while ranking second among rookies in runs scored (51), total bases (194), doubles (21) and third in home runs (15), RBI (63) and extra-base hits (39)...Hosmer is also fourth in on-base pct. (.334), fifth in batting (.283), sixth in slugging (.450), tied for seventh in triples (3) and even tied for seventh in stolen bases (8)...he's also had the third longest hitting streak for a rookie with an 11-gamer.

**40-DOUBLE CLUB**

--Jeff Francoeur extended his career-best doubles total to 44 Saturday night, while Alex Gordon remained at 41...they are the fifth pair of Royals teammates to have 40 or more doubles in the same season, joining Hal McRae (46) and Frank White (45) in 1982, Jermaine Dye (44) and Mike Sweeney (44) in 1999, Johnny Damon (42) and Dye (41) in 2000 and Billy Butler (51) and Alberto Callaspo (41) in 2009...Melky Cabrera needs one more to join the duo with 40 while Billy Butler is hot on their heels at 38 after a pair of two-baggers yesterday...Francoeur was joined by Gordon as two of seven in club history to post a 40+ double, 15+ home run and 15+ stolen base season, joining Amos Otis (1976), Hal McRae (1977), George Brett (1979), Johnny Damon (2000) and Carlos Beltran (2002)...one more steal would give Frenchy 20 and knock both Brett and McRae off this select list...the Royals are the only club in the Majors with four players in the top 10 in baseball in doubles with Francoeur's 44 leading all of MLB.

**FELIPE PAULINO** makes his 17th appearance and 16th start for KC...today is his 82nd career appearance (50th start) and 35th outing of 2011 and the first of his career vs. the Athletics...the 27-year-old Dominican, who resides in Pearland, Texas, was acquired from Colorado for cash considerations on May 26, 2011.

**LATE SCRATCH IN DETROIT**

--Paulino was scratched from his scheduled start just hours before last Wednesday in Detroit due to back spasms.

**TOUGH SETBACK LAST TIME OUT**

--It's been 9 days, but the last time Felipe took the hill he incurred a hard-fought 2-1 loss in Cleveland...he tossed 6.0 shutout innings and was nursing a 1-0 lead heading into the seventh inning when the Tribe pushed across two 2-out runs, the decider coming against the KC pen to hand Felipe the defeat...Paulino matched a season high with 120 pitches while not allowing a home run for the third straight start...his win on July 5 in Chicago, 5-3, was his first victory in over a year, spanning 33 appearances (10 starts) back to June 4, 2010.

**ASA ROYAL**

--Paulino has pitched well since joining KC, compiling a 3.83 ERA (96.1 IP, 41 ER) in 16 games (15 starts) despite a 2-6 record...he has struck out 84 and walked 35, throwing 63% of his pitches for strikes...he matched his career high with 8.0 innings on June 23 vs. Arizona...he made his Royals debut on May 27 at Texas, retiring the final 11 Rangers he faced...he opened his Kansas City career by tossing 12.1 scoreless innings before allowing an unearned run on June 6 vs. Toronto.

**MILE HIGH STRUGGLES**

--Paulino joined the Royals on May 26 after being designated for assignment by the Rockies on May 22...he finished 0-4 with a 7.36 ERA (14.2 IP, 23 H, 12 ER) in 18 relief appearances...through his first 6 outings, he posted a strong 1.59 ERA (5.2 IP, 5 H, 1 ER).

**SEEKING SUPPORT**

--Factoring into the aforementioned winless streak was a lack of run support...as a starter, his clubs have scored an average of 3.10 runs per 9.0 innings, which is the second-lowest support in baseball history (Jason Istringhausen, 2.84) among pitchers who have made at least 45 starts since 1974 according to STATS, LLC...the 9 runs scored by the Royals on August 20 was the most he has ever received in a start and just the seventh time in his 49 career starts his club has plated at least 5 runs for him...Kansas City has averaged 3.74 runs for him per 9.0 innings, which is the second-most he's received in his career trailing the 4.74 runs in limited time (5 games) the Astros put up in 2007.

**ROAD WORK**

--Though the season road record reads just 1-7 away from home, he has a 3.67 ERA (61.1 IP, 65 H, 25 ER) in 20 road games (8 starts)...he has been even better away from Kansas City since joining the Royals, compiling a 3.23 ERA (53.0 IP, 53 H, 19 ER) with a 1-3 record in 9 games (8 starts), including a 1.53 ERA (17.2 IP, 3 ER) in his last 3 starts...he has fanned 48 in 53.0 innings...he is 4-18 all-time away from home with a 6.16 ERA vs. a 4.57 career home ERA.

**Hitting Notes**

**Billy Butler** *Cle Series: 5-for-11, run, 3 2B, RBI, 2 BB* *Last Trip: 14-for-43 (.326), 5 runs, 5 2B, HR, 9 RBI, BB, SF* *Hit Streak: 5 g (7-20)*

- Billy was 3-for-4 with a pair of doubles, a walk and a run scored yesterday...has now hit in 5 straight (.350, 7-for-20)...has also hit in 19 of his last 23 games (.374, 34-for-91) with 19 RBI...is now tied for seventh in baseball with 38 doubles.
- He is third in the Majors to Yankees' Granderson (44) and Cano (44) with 42 RBI since the All-Star break.
- He homered in a career best 4 straight games July 26-29, hammering 5 in that span, coming up a game shy of Mike Sweeney's 2002 club record.
- He won co-AL Player of the Week honors from July 25-31, the third of his career, hitting 13-for-32 (.406) with 5 homers and a .938 slugging pct.
- He grounded out as a pinch hitter on June 29 in San Diego, snapping his franchise-record streak of hitting in 131 consecutive series.
- Leads all Major Leaguers since the start of 2009 with 134 doubles (NYY's Robinson Cano is second with 129).

**Melky Cabrera** *Cle Series: 3-for-12, 4 runs, 2B, RBI, BB* *Last Trip: 13-for-43 (.302), 7 R, 5 2B, HR, 5 RBI, 3 BB, Sac* *Hit Streak: 5 g (6-21)*

- Melky was 1-for-4 yesterday with a single, RBI, walk and 2 runs scored...now sixth in MLB with 39 doubles, 1 shy of joining teammates Jeff Francoeur (43) and Alex Gordon (41) as the first trio of Royals ever with 40+ doubles in a season...Billy Butler is 2 doubles from 40.
- Notched two outfield assists August 18 vs. Boston, including Carl Crawford at home to end the fourth...has 12 outfield assists, sixth in MLB.
- His .342 (81-for-237) mark since July 2 is the seventh-best mark in MLB...has 30 extra-base hits and 37 RBI over that 58-game span.
- Has set career highs in 2011 in hits (175), doubles (39), homers (17), RBI (80), runs scored (87) and steals (17).
- He has 54 multi-hit games, second in the Majors behind Boston's Adrian Gonzalez (59).
- He ranks third in the A.L. in hits with 175 and eighth with 273 total bases...he is second in road average (.329).

**Alcides Escobar** *Cle Series: 2-for-2, RBI, Sac* *Last Trip: 6-for-35 (.171), 4 runs, HR, 2 RBI, BB, 2 Sac, 2 SB* *Hit Streak: 2 g (4-9)*

- Alcides missed the last 2 games with a left ankle sprain suffered on Friday night...was 2-for-2 with an RBI single and a sac bunt on Friday...extended his career high with 20 stolen bases last Thursday...hit a solo home run last Monday night in Detroit, his first home run in 136 at bats.
- Is tied for first in the Majors with 17 sacrifice hits, tied for third-most all-time in Royals history and tied for seventh in American League with 6 triples.
- He leads all Major League shortstops in assists with 418; also leads in total chances (672), is second in putouts (240) and double plays (91).

**Jeff Francoeur** *Cle Series: 3-for-8, 2 2B, 2 RBI* *Last Trip: 14-for-39 (.359), 5 runs, 3 2B, HR, 4 RBI, HBP* *Hit Streak: 4 g (7-17)*

- Frenchy had yesterday off...was 2-for-4 Saturday night with a 2-run double in the first...was his Major League-leading 44th double...the 44 doubles are tied with Jermaine Dye (1999) for the most all-time among Royals outfielders.
- Collected his 1,000th career hit Thursday in Detroit on a 2-run homer in the second.
- He signed a 2-year extension thru 2013 on August 18...has set a career high with 19 steals and is tied for second in the Majors with 12 sac flies.
- Last Wednesday, he started a 9-4-2 out at the plate in the eighth for his 13th outfield assist, tied for third in baseball.
- Has hit in 24 of his last 30 (.333, 40-for-120)...over a longer stretch, is hitting .317 (69-for-218) with 26 doubles over his last 56 games since July 3.
- He is 10th in A.L. with 63 extra-base hits...he joins TB's Ben Zobrist and teammate Alex Gordon as the only three players in MLB with 40+ doubles, 15+ homers and 15+ stolen bases.
- Is batting .271 with a .743 OPS vs. right handers in 2011 after entering the season with career marks of .256 and .699.
- Leads all of baseball with 94 outfield assists since the 2005 season...2007 N.L. Gold Glove winner.

**Chris Getz** *Cle Series: 2-for-7* *Last Trip: 2-for-7 (.286), SB* *Hit Streak: 4 g (4-9)*

- Chris started at shortstop for the second game in a row yesterday and was 1-for-4...he made his first Major League start and appearance at shortstop on August 26 in Cleveland.
- Has yet to homer as a Royal with the streak currently at 593 at bats, which is the longest to start a Royals career.
- He has swiped 20 bases in 27 attempts this season and is 61-for-73 in his career, an 83.6 percent success rate.

**Johnny Giavotella** *Cle Series: 3-for-12, run, HR, 3 RBI, BB* *Last Trip: 9-for-38 (.237), 6 runs, 3 2B, 7 RBI, BB, HBP* *Hit Streak: 2 g (3-8)*

- Johnny was 2-for-4 yesterday with a bases-loaded walk and an RBI single, driving in 2.
- He had a memorable first weekend in the bigs by blasting his first career homer, a solo shot off Max Scherzer, in the fifth on August 7...he had his contract selected from Omaha (AAA) prior to the August 5 vs. Detroit...his first hit came later that evening, a double to right off Rick Porcello.
- Was hitting .338 in 110 games for the Storm Chasers, recording an minor league-leading 153 hits with 34 doubles, nine home runs, 72 RBI and 67 runs...was a PCL All-Star starter, PCL Player of the Month for June and hit a combined .391 (90-for-130) with 31 extra-base hits in June and July.

**Alex Gordon** *Cle Series: 3-for-12, 2 R, HR, 3 RBI, BB, 2 SB* *Last Trip: 15-for-37 (.405), 11 R, 2 2B, 3 HR, 5 RBI, 4 BB, HBP, SB* *Hit Streak: 9 g (16-38)*

- Alex was 1-for-5 in yesterday's loss...has now hit in 9 straight (.421, 16-for-38)...his 4 hits last Monday in Detroit tied a career high (4th time in 2011; t-3rd most in baseball, 7th time in career).
- Gunned down Fukudome at home plate to end the fifth on August 26, his 20th outfield assist on the season which is a single-season record for the Royals, breaking the mark of 17...leads all of baseball by 6...is one of 24 players in MLB since 1969 with 20+ assists.
- Gordo has hit .328 in his last 66 games (86-for-262) with 53 runs scored (2nd in Majors) since June 21.
- In addition to homers and doubles (41), also has career bests in runs (92), hits (166), RBI (75) and stolen bases (16).
- Overall, he ranks third in the Majors in doubles (41), fourth in A.L. extra-base hits (65), fifth in hits (166), sixth in runs (92), seventh in total bases (275) and tied for eighth in multi-hit games (44)...also eighth in home batting average (.325, 92-for-283).

**Eric Hosmer** *Cle Series: 3-for-11, 3 runs, 2B, 3 RBI, BB, SF* *Last Trip: 17-for-40 (.425), 10 R, 5 HR, 7 RBI, 4 BB, 2 SB, SF* *Hit Streak: 2 g (3-8)*

- Eric was 2-for-4 yesterday with a double, 2 RBI, walk and a run scored...recorded his first career two-homer game in Detroit on Wednesday with solo shots in the second and fourth innings...hit in all 10 games on the last trip (.425, 17-for-40) with 5 home runs, 7 RBI and 10 runs scored.
- Leads A.L. rookies in hits (122), multi-hit games (33) and walks (34)...he's second in total bases (194) and runs (50).
- He batted .426 (20-for-47) during career-best 11-game streak from July 19-30, including 7 multi-hit games, 5 doubles, a HR and 8 RBI.
- Of his 15 career homers, 10 have either tied the game (4) or give the Royals a lead (6)...his 21 go-ahead RBI and 10 game-winning RBI lead the Royals.
- Had his contract purchased from Omaha (AAA) on May 6...named Royals Player of the Month for May (.283, 5 HR, 17 RBI).
- Hit home runs in consecutive games on May 11 and 12 in New York, the first blast, his first MLB home run off A.J. Burnett.

**Mitch Maier** *Cle Series: 1-for-3, run, BB* *Last Trip: 1-for-3, 3B, RBI, BB, SF* *Hit Streak: 4 g (4-12)*

- Mitch made his first start since August 25 yesterday in right field and was 1-for-3 with a walk and a run scored.
- He pitched the eighth inning on July 26, the eighth different position player in franchise history to take the mound and first since Tony Pena, Jr., in 2008 (10th instance)...Maier retired Dustin Pedroia on a fly ball to the Green Monster, then worked around a David Ortiz double for a scoreless frame.
- Possesses 3 of Kansas City's 5 pinch hits this season (3-for-11).

**Mike Moustakas** *Cle Series: 0-for-12, RBI, BB* *Last Trip: 16-for-40 (.400), 2 runs, 3 2B, 6 RBI, 2 BB* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-12)*

**ELLAS SEZ...**--The Elias Sports Bureau dug up this nugget from yesterday's game...when the Indians Manny Acta called for an intentional walk of Hosmer in the first inning of yesterday's game, it marked the first time a rookie was intentionally passes in the first inning this season...in addition, only one other rookie in Royals history earned that honor...in 1969, Fred Rico, a rookie playing in his third of 12 career games (all in 1969), was intentionally walked by Tigers skipper Mayo Smith in the first inning on September 2...Rico was intentionally walked by Smith to get to the on-deck hitter, pitcher Roger Nelson, and his .100 career batting average.

**WORKING ON LABOR DAY**--The Royals carry an 18-22 mark on Labor Day in their 42-year-history...the club also has not played six times on this holiday...the Royals are 4-7 against the Athletics all-time on holidays, including a 5-2 loss on Mother's Day (May 8) earlier this season.

**FRENCHY TIES TEAM DOUBLE MARK**--Jeff Francoeur's 2-run double in the first inning Saturday night not only gave KC a lead it would not relinquish, but it tied Kansas City's team record for doubles in a season by an outfielder...it was Frenchy's 44th two-base hit of the year, matching Jermaine Dye's mark established in 1999...Francoeur has been on a doubles roll of late, collecting 15 in his last 29 contests to take over the Major League lead in doubles with 44, one more than Ben Zobrist in the A.L. and 7 up on Arizona's Justin Upton who leads the N.L. with 37.

**OMAHA ONE FINAL SHOT AT RECORD SETTING 80TH**--The Omaha Storm Chasers dropped a 2-1 decision at Iowa last night and now just have one shot at recording 80 wins this year as the PCL American Northern Division Champs enter today's regular season finale with a 79-62 record...should they latch onto that 80th win it will mark the first time in franchise history that Omaha has recorded back-to-back 80-victory seasons...last year's club finished 81-63 for Mike Jirschele, the fifth 80-win season for Omaha, the first since 1999 when they won 81...the others in team annals were 1969 (85), 1988 (81) and 1990 (86).

**BILLY ON ELITE LIST**--According to STATS, LLC, Royals designated hitter Billy Butler is 1 of 7 players in Major League Baseball since the beginning of 2009 to have more than 500 hits, 200 runs, 50 home runs and a greater than .300 batting average...after going 3-for-4 with two doubles and run scored yesterday, Butler has 526 hits, 218 runs, 52 home runs with an average of .306 since 2009...the other six on the list joining Butler are the Tigers' Miguel Cabrera, the Yankees' Robinson Cano, the Brewers' Ryan Braun, the Rangers' Michael Young, the Cardinals' Albert Pujols and the Red Sox' Adrian Gonzalez.

**ALEX SHATTERING TEAM ASSIST MARK**--Alex Gordon has recorded 20 outfield assists this year, not only leading the Majors, but shattering the club record of 17 which was held by Jermaine Dye (1999) and Mark Teahen (2007)...with 20 assists, Gordo is just the 24th player since 1969 to have 20 or more in a season and the first since Alfonso Soriano had 22 in 2006 for the Nationals...of his 20, half have cut off a run at home...the 27-year old Gordon was a third baseman up until the middle of last year...**one other note on Gordon's assist roll, according to Stats, Inc, he is one of only four players since 1969 to record at least 20 outfield assists and commit two or fewer errors as an outfielder (Joe Orsulak - 22 assists and one error with Baltimore in 1991; George Hendrick - 20 assists and two errors with St. Louis in 1979 and Andruw Jones - 20 assists and two errors with Atlanta in 1998).**

**BEST OUTFIELD ARMS IN BALL**--Mitch Maier added another outfield assist yesterday giving Kansas City 46 assists in the books this year, 11 more than the N.L. leading Giants and 13 up on second place Detroit in the A.L...of the 46 assists, 22 have been in the first games of a series...Alex Gordon leads the Majors with 20, while Jeff Francoeur is tied for third with 13 and Melky Cabrera is sixth with a dozen...Mitch Maier became the first outfielder other than the three starters to pick up an assist yesterday, nailing Carlos Santana at the plate to end the first...**the KC outfield has also been involved at nailing a big league leading 24 runners at the plate this year, the second most in MLB since 1974 (Montreal Expos, 30 in 1978), which is as far back as that information is available...**this is the second time in club history that 3 outfielders have double-digits in assists, joining the 1969 club (Lou Piniella-13, Pat Kelly-12, Bob Oliver-11)...Frenchy has 94 outfield assists in his big league career, which ranks #1 over the 72 by Baltimore's Nick Markakis since 2005...current teammate Melky Cabrera is fourth on that list with 58.

**...AND THEY CAN HIT, TOO**--Royals' outfielders have been the most productive overall group in baseball at the plate, leading all of baseball with a .295 collective batting average, 510 hits, 194 extra-base hits, 127 doubles and 824 total bases...KC is also among baseball's elite with 258 runs (4th in Majors, 2nd in the A.L.), 236 RBI (3rd in Majors and A.L.) and a .827 OPS (3rd in Majors, 2nd in A.L.)...Jeff Francoeur is enjoying one of his best overall seasons at the plate, setting a personal best with 44 doubles, while currently ranking tied for third on the club with 16 home runs...Melky Cabrera has established career bests in home runs (17) and RBI (80) and is flirting with his first career .300 season, with a .302 average which at this point has shattered his previous career best of .280 with the Yankees in 2006...Alex Gordon is having a breakout season, already establishing a career bests in hits (166), doubles (41), runs (92), extra-base hits (65) and home runs (20)...Frenchy, Gordo and Melky are three of just seven players in MLB with 35+ doubles, 15+ homers and 15+ steals...the others are Arizona's Justin Upton, the Rays' Ben Zobrist, the Brewers' Ryan Braun and the Red Sox' Jacoby Ellsbury.
