A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series, 4-3...won two of three in Kansas City and are 2-2 in Oakland...need one more win to clinch their third consecutive season series win...are 16-8 (.667) against the Royals since the start of the 2009 season...have won eight of the 12 games in Oakland over that stretch...all-time, the A's are 295-242 against the Royals...that breaks down to 162-107 in Oakland and 133-135 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 11 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 34 for 34 in saves after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui is batting .337 (62 for 184) since the All-Star Break, which ranks seventh in the American League.

Cliff Pennington has career highs in home runs (7) and RBI (53)...is batting .327 (53 for 162) since the All-Star Break, which ranks ninth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks leads AL rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21), third in hits (95), fourth in doubles (20) and fifth in extra base hits (28) despite spending the first two months of the season in the minors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1913 Eddie Collins steals home twice in the same game against Boston to tie a major league record...in 1943 Carl Scheib becomes the youngest player to appear in an American League game at the age of 16 years, 248 days...in 1969 the A's play their second 18-inning game in a 14-day span but lose to Minnesota 8-6 after each team scores once in the 16th...in 1976 the A's steal seven bases in a 2-1, 11 inning win at California to run the season total to an American League record 297...Oakland would go on ot steal 341 bases to best the AL record of 291 established by Washington in 1913.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped yesterday and are now 4-6 over the last 10 games...trail Texas by 15½ games in the American League West and the tragic number for elimination in the West is six...are 20½ games behind Boston in the Wild Card and the tragic number for elimination in the Wild Card is two...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 42-57 (.424) since then...have spent 44 of the last 45 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 78 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 4-1 in September after going 11-17 last month...August marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 in July, 2010...have a 26-21 (.553) record on the weekend (13-12 on Saturday, 13-9 on Sunday) compared to 38-56 (.404) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

STRIKEOUTS: A's pitchers struck out 14 batters yesterday, their sixth consecutive game with nine or more strikeouts...that is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous: 5, Oct. 1, 1999-April 4, 2000) and the longest by an Athletics team since at least 1919...have 71 strikeouts in 60.1 innings during this streak (10.59 per nine innings)...now have 1032 strikeouts for the season, which ranks third in the American League...it is the ninth best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001, 1075 in 2005, 1070 in 2010, 1061 in 2008, 1042 in 1987, 1036 in 2007, 1034 in 2004).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 5.52 ERA (67 er in 1091. ip) over the last 12 games and has a 3.71 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (113), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but have issued the third most walks (468)...A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (6 er in 33.0 ip) over the last five games...have a 3.73 ERA (356 er in 860.0 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.371) in the American League, the third fewest home runs (95) and the fourth fewest runs (569)...are on pace to hit 109 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (108)...have a .314 on-base percentage and have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 109 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (118)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 74 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 25-24 (.510) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .269 (456 for 1693) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.79 ERA (233 er in 437.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles since the break (115), tied for second in triples (13), third in walks (181) and fourth in runs (254)...are hitting .313 (141 for 451) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 20-20 with a 4.82 ERA (155 er in 289.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (0-1)...went 4-6 on the last homestand and are 38-31 (.551) at home overall...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and are 26-46 (.361) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...are batting .252 (568 for 2252) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have a 3.16 ERA (221 er in 630.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the fifth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 3-1 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is a three-game series at Texas this weekend...just completed a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-28 .391)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-27 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

PLAYERS USED: Last Friday night, Michael Taylor and Andrew Carignan became the 46th and 47th players to appear in a game for the A's...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Carignan is the 26th pitcher the A's have used this year, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's...Taylor became the A's fourth right fielder (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 28th start of the season...the A's are 13-14 (.481) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-41 (.512) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 19 of his 26 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has won each of his last three starts, matching his longest winning streak of the season...has a 2.18 ERA (5 er in 20.2 ip) and .195 (15 for 77) opponents batting average with 21 strikeouts in 20.2 innings during the streak...the longest winning streak of his career is four (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010).

STRIKEOUTS: Has 167 strikeouts in 168.0 innings...is averaging 8.95 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks fourth in the American League...the Athletics franchise record (since 1901) for strikeouts per nine innings in 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...his 167 strikeouts rank 10th in the AL...his career high is 171 last year.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 4-5 with a 4.75 ERA (29 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the

break...is tied for sixth in the American League in losses since the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League lead in walks (80) and	is
tied for ninth in losses (11)the 11 losses are a career-high.	

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.330) and the 10th lowest batting average (.230)...opponents are batting .190 (27 for 142) with runners in scoring position, which is fifth lowest...has yielded just 13 home runs in 168.0 innings for an average of 0.70 per nine innings, which is eighth lowest...seven of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .188 (15 for 80) average, which is third lowest.

THE LAST TWO YEARS: Is 27-20 with a 3.22 ERA (132 er in 368.2 ip) and 338 strikeouts in 60 starts over the last two seasons...the ERA is ninth best among American League pitchers over that span (min. 250 ip) and the wins are tied for ninth.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (24 er in 91.1 ip) and .196 (64 for 326) opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 4-7 with a 4.23 ERA (36 er in 76.2 ip) and .266 (81 for 305) opponents average in 13 starts on the road...is tied for second in the American League in home wins and tied for third in road losses...ranks third in the AL in home opponents batting average and sixth in ERA...over the last two years, he is 16-7 with a 2.47 ERA (53 in 193.1 ip) and .198 (137 for 692) opponents average in 30 starts at home and 11-13 with a 4.06 ERA (79 er in 175.1 ip) and .261 (179 for 687) average in 30 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-4 with a 3.44 ERA (27 er in 70.2 ip) in 11 starts during the day and 6-7 with a 3.05 ERA (33 er in 97.1 ip) in 16 starts at night...is tied for fourth in the American League in day wins and has the seventh lowest night ERA...is now 16-8 with a 3.59 ERA (76 er in 190.1 ip) in 31 career games during the day compared to 18-23 with a 4.28 ERA (148 er in 311.0 ip) in 59 contests at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 15 of his 27 starts...has just 19 runs of support in his 11 losses this year (61.0 ip, 2.80 RSA) and 37 runs of support in his 31 career losses (155.0 ip, 2.15 RSA)...is 29-2 in 39 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-29 in 45 starts with support of two or fewer.

HONORS: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce...was named AL Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

LAST START: He combined with Breslow on a five-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win at Cleveland last Thursday...tossed seven innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed just three base runners to advance as far as second base...it was his fourth consecutive starts against the Indians where he tossed at least six scoreless innings...since division play began in 1969, only three other pitchers have pitched at least six shutout innings in four consecutive starts against a particular opponent: Mel Stottlemyre against the Angels (five straight from 1971 to 1972), Ed Whitson against the Cubs (four straight from 1977 to 1980) and Britt Burns against the Yankees (four straight from 1981 to 1982) (source: Elias).

GONZALEZ vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 3-2 with a 5.74 ERA (31.1 ip, 31 h, 21 r, 20 er, 17 bb, 33 so, 5 hr) in six career starts...is 2-2 with a 5.85 ERA (13 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts in Kansas City and 1-0 with an 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (13.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the first win came in a 3-2 A's victory at Kansas City May 6...allowed a solo home run to Gordon in the first inning and an Aviles RBI triple in the third...those were the only two runs he would allow in his seven innings and the A's scored three times in the fifth inning for the win...also picked up the win in an 8-4 decision in Oakland June 16...struck out 10 batters in just 6.0 innings...shutout the Royals on one hit and two walks over the first four innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed two runs on a Cabrera RBI single and a Francouer RBI double but then struck out three of the final four batters he faced.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (7-8, 3.63 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20th appearance and 18th start of the season...is 4-4 with a 5.05 ERA and .268 opponents batting average in nine starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19 after going 3-4 with a 2.16 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over his first 11 games, nine starts...is 5-2 with a 2.62 ERA in nine starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA in 10 games, eight starts, on the road...has a 2.28 ERA over the first three innings of a game and a 5.01 ERA (28 er in 50.1 ip) from the fourth inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-2 A's win over Seattle last Friday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Royals in his career.

The A's bullpen has a 6.90 ERA (34 er in 44.1 ip) and .291 (53 for 182) opponents batting average over its past 12 games...now has a 4.72 ERA (78 er in 148.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for the third most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (95) and tied for fourth in fewest first batter home runs (8)...four of those eight first batter home runs came on the last road trip...has allowed 68 of 179 (38.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 42.6)

- Is 19 for 21 (90.5%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...is 70 for 79 (88.6%) in his career, which is the best mark in Oakland history...ranks sixth on the Oakland career saves list (Isringhausen is 5th, 75).

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 142.2 innings pitched, which is one-third of an inning short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he rank second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.68), third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.39) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.50).

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his fourth complete game of the season in his last start, but it was his first complete game win...had losses April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City and August 29 at Cleveland...the four complete games are tied for third in the American League...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
