KC PLATES SEVEN UNANSWERED FOR "W'--Kansas City and Oakland were wrapped in a holiday see-saw battle yesterday, but the Royals finally got the upper hand by plating the last 7 runs of the game, including 5 in the ninth for an 11-6 win...KC jumped out to a quick 3-0 lead off of starter Rich Harden, but the A's rallied against Felipe Paulino, scoring 4 of their own in the second...the Royals tied it in the third on the first of two Billy Butler game-tying homers in the game...he later brought KC back from a 6-4 deficit with a towering shot to center in the seventh to knot the score again...the Royals blew the game open in the ninth with Alex Gordon snapping the tie with his first hit of the day, a run scoring double to right, followed by an RBI single by Melky Cabrera, RBI double by Eric Hosmer and 2-run single from Mike Moustakas... Butler and Hosmer each had 3 hits to lead KC's 15-hit attack...Greg Holland earned the win in relief and though not a save situation, Joakim Soria fanned all 3 A's he faced to end the game...the win lifted the Royals into sole possession of fourth place in the A.L. Central cellar for the first time since June 17.

ELIAS SEZ ONCE AGAIN ON "THE HOZ"--What seems to be a daily dose of news from the Elias Sports Bureau regarding rookie Eric Hosmer came down the pike again today as the 21-year old has now

recorded 3 consecutive 3-hit games on the road dating back to last week's stop in Detroit...the only other Royals rookie to have 3 straight road games with 3 or more hits was Don Slaught late in the 1983 season.

SPEAKING OF "HOZ"-Eric Hosmer continues to make a strong bid for votes in the A.L. Rookie of the Year balloting, despite missing the first 31 games of the year... the 21-year old first sacker leads all A.L. rookies in hits (125), multi-hit games (34) and walks (34), while ranking second among rookies in runs scored (53), total bases (199), doubles (23), tied for second in extra-base hits (41) and third in home runs (15) and RBI (65)...Hosmer is also fourth in on-base pct. (.337), fifth in batting (.287), sixth in slugging (.456), tied for seventh in triples (3) and even tied for seventh in stolen bases (8).

ROAD OFFENSE CONTINUES ROLL--After a quick 3-game stop at home over the weekend, the Kansas City offense resumed pounding the ball on the road with an 11-run, 15-hit attack yesterday...it was the second straight 11-run road game for KC, also plating 11 on 17 hits last Thursday in Detroit...dating back to the start of the last road trip, which was a 10-game journey through Toronto, Cleveland and Detroit, the Royals have batted .330 as a team (136-for-412) with 29 doubles and 15 home runs, with an on-base pct. of .370 and slugging pct. of .519 while averaging 5.8 runs per game and posting a 6-5 record.

ROAD STREAKING--The rookie duo of Eric Hosmer and Mike Moustakas have actually had a better run of things on the road recently than in the friendly confines of Kauffman Stadium...the 21-year old Hosmer has hit safely in 14 consecutive road games at a .397 clip (23-for-58) with 5 home runs, 10 RBI and a .429 on-base pct... the elder Moustakas at 22 (he turns 23 on Sunday), has hit in his last 11 road tilts with a .391 average (18-for-46), a .417 on-base pct. and 7 multi-hit games.

THE FINAL 20-The Royals have 20 tilts left on the 2011 docket, 13 of which are slated for the road...Kansas City will play here by the Bay through tomorrow afternoon and then travel up I-5 to Seattle for a 4-game set that starts Thursday night...the Royals are in the midst of a 20-game stretch in which 17 games are on the road...the Royals have only one homestand remaining, a 7-gamer from September 13-21 that features Minnesota (2), Chicago (4) and Detroit (2).

<u>CLUB.303</u>.-Kansas City enters tonight with 3 players each hitting .303 on the season (Billy Butler, Melky Cabrera and Alex Gordon)...the only Major League club with more .300 hitters entering tonight is Boston with 4 (Adrian Gonzalez, David Ortiz, Jacoby Ellsbury and Dustin Pedroia), while Detroit also has 3.

<u>DANNY DUFFY</u> is making his 20th career Major League start tonight, 11th on the road and the second of his career vs. the Athletics...the 22-year-old resident of Vandenberg Village, Calif., was the Royals' third-round selection in the 2007 June Free Agent Draft out of Cabrillo High in Lompoc, Calif.

LIKELY HIS SWAN SONG—Danny takes the hill for what is likely his final start during this rookie campaign, as the 22-year old southpaw has piled up a combined 141.0 innings, 42.0 of which with Omaha (AAA) and then 99.0 with the Royals...prior to this season, Duffy's highest volume of professional work was 126.2 frames with Wilmington in 2009.

LOOKING TO SNAP DROUGHT—Danny is seeking his first "W" winse July 31 in Cleveland, working 6 times since and going 0-2 with 4 no decisions...the most recent was last Thursday in Detroit, allowing 5 runs over 5.0 innings of a contest the Royals would eventually win, 11-8...he gave up 3 two-out runs in third and then 2 more in the fifth on a Magglio Ordonez home run...he's 2-4 with 3 no decisions in 9 starts since returning to the big league club after a one-start hiatus to AAA at the All-Star break.

LOTTA TOSSES--He has averaged over 96 pitches in his 19 starts, but has worked past the fifth just 9 times, averaging under 5.1 innings...Danny has issued 3 or more walks in 10 of 19 overall...Duff has recorded 7.5 strikeouts per 9.0 innings, the third-highest ratio in KC history among rookies with at least 15 starts (Bob Johnson, 8.66 in '70 and Tom Gordon, 8.45 in '89).

K-CLUB--Danny 3.2 inning stint on June 19 at St. Louis, was a memorable 3.2 frames as 9 of the 11 outs he recorded were strikeouts, the most by a KC rookie since Runelvys Hernandez on July 20, 2002 vs. Cleveland...since 1946, Duffy was just the third pitcher in history to fan 9 or more while pitching no more than 3.2 innings, joining the Mariners' Jim Beattie (9 in 3.2 innings on August 9, 1982 vs. Oak) and the Mets' David Cone (9 in 3.2 on April 25, 1992 vs. Atl).

- Bruce will start tomorrow's matinee finale...is 10-6 with a 4.11 ERA (55 ER in 120.1 IP) on the year and 58-56 in 312 career outings (164 starts).
- Cleveland brought Chen's career-best 5-game winning streak to a halt on Friday in KC...the Tribe built a 2-0 lead on 3 hits in the first...Asdrubal Cabrera belted a 2-run homer in the third and Jason Donald added a solo shot in the fourth...Bruce went 6.0 innings, taking the loss in a 5-4 game.
 - Chen was 5-1 with a 3.19 ERA in August as he earned Royals Pitcher of the Month honors...despite Friday's setback, he is 14-6 over his last 27 starts.
- Bruce is 1-0 with a 1.45 ERA in 4 appearances (2 starts) at the Coliseum (3 ER in 18.2 IP)...he has faced the Athletics 10 times overall (6 starts), posting a 2-2 mark and a 4.18 ERA (22 ER in 47.1 IP)...the last outing was a win in Kansas City on September 15, 2010 (5.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER).
 - Tomorrow's start will be Chen's 10th of the year away from home...he is 5-4, recording a 4.30 ERA in 52.1 IP (25 ER).

Billy recorded his second straight 3-hit game yesterday with a single in the first, a solo homer in the third and a 2-run shot in the seventh...was his 6th career multi-homer game and second of 2011 (also July 29 at Cleveland)...has now hit in 6 straight (.417, 10-for-24)...has also hit in 20 of his last 24 games (.389, 37-for-95) with 22 RBI...is now tied for seventh in baseball with 38 doubles and tied for 10th in the A.L. with 157 hits.

- He is third in the Majors to Yankees' Cano (48) and Granderson (46) with 45 RBI since the All-Star break.
- He homered in a career best 4 straight games July 26-29, hammering 5 in that span, coming up a game shy of Mike Sweeney's 2002 club record.
- He won co-AL Player of the Week honors from July 25-31, the third of his career, hitting 13-for-32 (.406) with 5 homers and a .938 slugging pct.
- Leads all Major Leaguers since the start of 2009 with 134 doubles (NYY's Robinson Cano is second with 129).

- Melky was 2-for-5 yesterday with a single and run scored in the first and an RBI single and run in the ninth...now sixth in MLB with 39 doubles, 1 shy of joining teammates Jeff Francoeur (43) and Alex Gordon (41) as the first trio of Royals ever with 40+ doubles in a season...Billy Butler is 2 doubles from 40.
 - Notched two outfield assists August 18 vs. Boston, including Carl Crawford at home to end the fourth...has 12 outfield assists, tied for sixth in MLB.
 - His .343 (83-for-242) mark since July 2 is the sixth-best mark in MLB...has 30 extra-base hits and 38 RBI over that 59-game span.

40-DOUBLE CLUB EXCLUSIVITY--Jeff Francoeur (44) and Alex Gordon (42) are currently the fifth pair of Royals teammates to have 40 or more doubles in the same season, joining Hal McRae (46) and Frank White (45) in 1982, Jermaine Dye (44) and Mike Sweeney (44) in 1999, Johnny Damon (42) and Dye (41) in 2000 and Billy Butler (51) and Alberto Callaspo (41) in 2009...Melky Cabrera needs one more to join the duo with 40 while Billy Butler is hot on their heels at 38...when Melky collects his 40th double, the Royals will possess the first outfield in Major League history in which all 3 recorded 40-double seasons (thank you ranyontheroyals.com)...should both Cabrera and Butler attain the 40-double mark, which is likely to this point, Kansas City would be the fourth big league franchise in history to have 4 members of the 40-double club joining the 2006 Texas Rangers (Michael Young-52, Mark Teixeira-45, Gary Matthews Jr.-44 and Mark DeRosa-40), the 1932 Phillies (Chuck Klein-50, Dick Bartell-48, Hal Lee-42 and Don Hurst-41) and the 1929 Detroit Tigers (Charlie Gehringer-45, Roy Johnson-45, Dale Alexander-43 and Harry Heilman-41).

BILLY ON ELITE LIST--According to STATS, LLC, Royals designated hitter Billy Butler is 1 of 7 players in Major League Baseball since the beginning of 2009 to have more than 500 hits, 200 runs, 50 home runs and a greater than .300 batting average...after going 3-for-4 with two home runs and 3 RBI yesterday, Butler has 529 hits, 220 runs, 54 home runs and an average of .307 since 2009...the other six on the list joining Butler are the Tigers' Miguel Cabrera, the Yankees' Robinson Cano, the Brewers' Ryan Braun, the Rangers' Michael Young, the Cardinals' Albert Pujols and the Red Sox' Adrian Gonzalez.

ALEX SHATTERING TEAM ASSIST MARK—Alex Gordon has recorded 20 outfield assists this year, not only leading the Majors, but shattering the club record of 17 which was held by Jermaine Dye (1999) and Mark Teahen (2007)...with 20 assists, Gordo is just the 24th player since 1969 to have 20 or more in a season and the first since Alfonso Soriano had 22 in 2006 for the Nationals...of his 20, half have cut off a run at home...the 27-year old Gordon was a third baseman up until the middle of last year...one other note on Gordon's assist roll, according to Stats, Inc, he is one of only four players since 1969 to record at least 20 outfield assists and commit two or fewer errors as an outfielder (Joe Orsulak - 22 assists and one error with Baltimore in 1991; George Hendrick - 20 assists and two errors with St. Louis in 1979 and Andruw Jones - 20 assists and two errors with Atlanta in 1998).

Alex Gordon leads the Majors with 20, while Jeff Francoeur is tied for fourth with 13 and Melky Cabrera is sixth with a dozen... Mitch Maier became the first outfielder other than the three starters to pick up an assist on Sunday, nailing Carlos Santana at the plate to end the first... the KC outfield has also been involved at nailing a big league leading 24 runners at the plate this year, the second most in MLB since 1974 (Montreal Expos, 30 in 1978), which is as far back as that information is available... this is the second time in club history that 3 outfielders have double-digits in assists, joining the 1969 club (Lou Piniella-13, Pat Kelly-12, Bob Oliver-11)...
