The season series is even at four games each entering the final meeting today...the A's have won each of the previous two season series and are 16-9 (.640) against the Royals since 2009......won two of three in Kansas City this year and are 2-3 in Oakland...all-time, the A's are 295-243 against the Royals...that breaks down to 162-108 in Oakland and 133-135 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 11 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 34 for 34 in saves after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui is batting .333 (63 for 189) since the All-Star Break, which ranks seventh in the American League.

Cliff Pennington has career highs in home runs (7) and RBI (55)...is batting .325 (54 for 166) since the All-Star Break, which ranks ninth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21), third in hits (98), tied for third in doubles (21) and fifth in extra base hits (29) despite spending the first two months of the season in the minors.

Josh Willingham is tied for sixth in the American League in home runs (12) and RBI (37) since the All-Star Break and tied for seventh in walks (27).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1984** the A's tie a club record by using 22 players in a game but lose 13-2 at Cleveland...only Mike Davis, who started the game in right and moved to center, played the entire game...in **2005** the A's scored five times in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Seattle 8-7, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's have come back from a four-run deficit entering the final bat and won...Nick Swisher walks with the bases loaded to force in the winning run.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and seven of the last 11 games...were officially eliminated from the Wild Card race last night as they now trail Boston by 21½ games with 20 games remaining...trail Texas by a season-high tying 16½ games in the American League West and the tragic number for elimination in the West is four...have not been farther back in the West since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 42-58 (.420) since then, which is tied for third worst in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the majors...have spent 45 of the last 46 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 79 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 4-2 in September after going 11-17 last month...August marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 in July, 2010...have a 26-21 (.553) record on the weekend (13-12 on Saturday, 13-9 on Sunday) compared to 38-57 (.400) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

STRIKEOUTS: A's pitchers have struck out eight or more batters in each of the last seven games, which is the longest streak by an Athletics team since at least 1919...have 79 strikeouts in 69.1 innings during this streak (10.25 per nine innings)...now have 1040 strikeouts for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...it is the seventh best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001, 1075 in 2005, 1070 in 2010, 1061 in 2008, 1042 in 1987).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 5.55 ERA (73 er in 118.1 ip) over the last 13 games but has a 3.72 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (115), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but have issued the third most walks (471)...A's starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) over the last six games...have a 3.77 ERA (362 er in 865.0 ip) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.370) in the American League, the third fewest home runs (95) and the fourth fewest runs (573)...are on pace to hit 108 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (108)...have a .314 on-base percentage and have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 110 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (119)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 75 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 25-25 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .268 (463 for 1727) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.82 ERA (239 er in 446.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles since the break (116), tied for second in triples (13), third in walks (186) and tied for fourth in runs (258)...are hitting .313 (145 for 463) with runners in scoring position since the break after hitting .239 before the break...A's starting pitchers are 20-21 with a 4.92 ERA (161 er in 294.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (0-2)...went 4-6 on the last homestand and are 38-32 (.543) at home overall...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and are 26-46 (.361) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...are batting .251 (575 for 2288) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have a 3.20 ERA (227 er in 639.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.18).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 3-2 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is a three-game series at Texas this weekend...just completed a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-28 .391)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

PLAYERS USED: Last Friday night, Michael Taylor and Andrew Carignan became the 46th and 47th players to appear in a game for the A's...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Carignan is the 26th pitcher the A's have used this year, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's...Taylor became the A's fourth right fielder (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 20th appearance and 18th start of the season...the A's are 9-8 (.529) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings 10 times, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

BRIEFLY: Is 4-4 with a 5.05 ERA (29 er in 51.2 ip) and .268 (55 for 205) opponents batting average in nine starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19 after going 3-4 with a 2.16 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over his first 11 games, nine starts...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.62 ERA (16 er in 55.0 ip) and .205 (42 for 205) opponents batting average in nine starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) and .257 (47 for 183) opponents average in 10 games, eight starts, on the road.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has a 2.28 ERA (13 er in 51.1 ip) and .203 (38 for 187) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 5.01 ERA (28 er in 50.1 ip) and .254 (51 for 201) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

RUN SUPPORT: Has been the starting pitcher in two of the A's three 1-0 losses and four of the 14 shutouts...has received no run support in six of his 17 starts...has received 33 runs of support in his last seven starts (42.0 ip, 7.07 RSA) after receiving just 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (1.97 RSA).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 7-7 with a 3.65 ERA (40 er in 98.2 ip) in 16 starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3^{rd} and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4^{th} .

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings in a 5-4 loss at Chicago June 12...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida June 29 in Oakland ... struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings ... Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 6** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss July 19 at Detroit ... allowed a career-high nine hits and matched his high with two home runs...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay July 25 in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win over Minnesota July 30 in Oakland ... retired 11 of the 12 batters he faced over innings three through six... was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Tampa Bay August 5...blanked the Rays on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth and three more in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-3 win at Toronto August 11 ... retired each of the first nine batters and had a 6-0 lead before allowing his first run...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 win over Baltimore **August 16** in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead and he allowed a RBI double to Guerrero in the fourth and a RBI single to Bell in the fifth...had his career-high two-game winning streak snapped in the A's 1-0 loss to Toronto August 21 in Oakland, despite allowing just one run in 8.0 innings...Perez and Janssen combined to shutout the A's on one hit...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 9-3 loss in the first game of the doubleheader August 27 at Boston...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in 4.0 innings...it was his shortest outing as a starter.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win over Seattle last Friday...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings...Suzuki singled to lead off the game, went to third on a Taylor error and scored on a Gutierrez ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Ryan in the second...the A's scored four times in the third inning and he retired each of the final 13 batters he faced.

MOSCOSO vs. KANSAS CITY: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (8-7, 3.41 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season...tossed a three-hit shutout in his last start last Saturday against Seattle, a 3-0 A's win...did not walk a batter and struck out 10...is just the third Athletics pitchers over the last 98 years with a complete game shutout, three or fewer hits, no walks and 10 or more strikeouts...has tossed back-to-back complete games and is the first A's right-hander to do that since Bobby Witt had three straight (June 23-July 3, 1994)...struck out a career-high 10 batters in each of his last two start and is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back 10 strikeout games since Mark Mulder (July 24-29, 2003)...is 7-2 with a 3.26 ERA in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in wins since the break (Verlander, DET 9)...is 1-3 with a 4.60 ERA in seven career appearances, five starts, against Texas...is 0-1 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 ip, 22 h, 16 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in three starts this year.

 The A's bullpen has a 6.33 ERA (34 er in 48.1 ip) and .281 (55 for 196) opponents batting average over its past 13 games...now has a 4.63 ERA (78 er in 151.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for the third most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (95) and tied for fourth in fewest first batter home runs (8)...four of those eight first batter home runs came on the last road trip...has allowed 68 of 179 (38.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 42.6).

- Has converted all 11 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break...is now a perfect 34 for 34 in save chances following the break in his career.
- Is 19 for 21 (90.5%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...is 70 for 79 (88.6%) in his career, which is the best mark in Oakland history...ranks sixth on the Oakland career saves list (Isringhausen is 5th, 75).
- Has allowed at least one run in six of his last 10 appearances (8 er in 10.1 ip, 6.97 ERA) after allowing just one earned run in his previous 10 outings (0.96 ERA).
- Has a 2.95 ERA (7 er in 21.1 ip) in 22 appearances at home compared to a 4.05 ERA (6 er in 13.1 ip) in 13 road outings...is 11 for 11 in saves at home and has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities in Oakland...his last blown save at home was May 18, 2010 against Seattle.
- Is 6 for 6 in save chances in eight career appearances against Kansas City (6.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 1 hr, 5.40 ERA).
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
 Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 142.2 innings pitched, which is one-third of an inning short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he rank second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.68), third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.39) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.50).

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his fourth complete game of the season in his last start, but it was his first complete game win...had losses April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City and August 29 at Cleveland...the four complete games are tied for third in the American League...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
