# A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-9...won four of the first five games, but have lost eight straight, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Rangers since June 19-Sept. 30, 1986 when they dropped nine in a row...are 1-5 in Texas this year and 3-4 in Oakland...with one more loss, the A's will lose the season series for the fifth time in the last six seasons...are 49-59 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-303 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-142 in Oakland and 135-161 in Texas...including 68-73 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 387-385 against the Rangers/Senators.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 11 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 34 for 34 in saves after the break in his career.

Jemile Weeks had his first career four-hit game Wednesday and now has 102 hits over the first 80 games of his career...no one in Oakland history has reached 100 hits in fewer games...leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21) and third in hits (102) and doubles (22).

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1945 Dick Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...in 1958 Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in an 8-6 win against Baltimore...in 1985 Jose Canseco hits his first major league home run off the Rangers Jeff Russell in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas...in 1988 Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...he is a perfect 5 for 5 and drives in three runs...in 1990 the A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 to complete a sweep of the season series, 12-0...in 1995 Stan Javier ties an Oakland record with a pair of triples in the A's 8-2 win at Chicago.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last seven games but are 5-7 over the last 12 contests...trail Texas by 15½ games in the American League West and the tragic number for elimination in the West is four...were officially eliminated from the Wild Card race Tuesday night in game 142...are 65-78 and with three more losses the A's will extend their streak of consecutive seasons without a winning record to five...that would be the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 43-58 (.426) since then...have spent 47 of the last 48 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 81 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 5-2 in September after going 11-17 last month...August marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 in July, 2010...have a 26-21 (.553) record on the weekend (13-12 on Saturday, 13-9 on Sunday) compared to 39-57 (.406) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**PITCHING:** The A's tossed their third shutout in the last seven games Wednesday and now have 10 for the season...have a 3.29 ERA (23 er in 63.0 ip) over the last seven games and a 3.70 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (115), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.374) and are tied for second in pickoffs (19) but have issued the third most walks (472)...A's starting pitchers are 5-1 with a 2.31 ERA (12 er in 46.2 ip) over the last seven games...have a 3.73 ERA (362 er in 873.2 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the AL.

**STRIKEOUTS:** A's pitchers have struck out 83 batters in 78.1 innings over the last eight games (9.54 per nine innings...now have 1044 strikeouts for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...it is the sixth best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001, 1075 in 2005, 1070 in 2010, 1061 in 2008).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have the third lowest slugging percentage (.370) in the American League, the third fewest home runs (95), the fourth lowest batting average (.246) and the fourth fewest runs (580)...are on pace to hit 108 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was fourth fewest in a non-strike season in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978, 108 in 1979)...have a .315 on-base percentage and have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 112 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (119)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 75 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a three-game road trip to Texas tonight...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and are 26-46 (.361) on the road for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season and with one more loss, will match their road loss total from last year...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (1-2) and are 39-32 (.549) at home overall ...are batting .253 (588 for 2323) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .241 on the road just once in Oakland history (.230 in 1968)...have a 3.15 ERA (227 er in 648.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** The A's are 4-2 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is this three-game series at Texas...prior to that, had a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 26-25 (.510) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .270 (476 for 1762) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.72 ERA (239 er in 455.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (119) and triples (13) since the break and third in walks (189)...are hitting .314 (149 for 474) with runners in scoring position since the break after hitting .239 before the break...A's starting pitchers are 21-21 with a 4.78 ERA (161 er in 303.1 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is tied for the worst record in the American League and tied for second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-28 .391)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-27 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's have used 47 players and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 26 pitchers, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's...have used just four right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney, Taylor), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 22<sup>nd</sup> start of the season, his 13<sup>th</sup> since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 10-11 (.476) in his starting assignments and his teams are 37-40 (.481) in his 77 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 17 of his 21 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times.

BACK-TO-BACK: Has tossed back-toback complete games and is just the second Oakland pitcher to do that over the seven years (Braden, May 9-14, 2010)...is the first A's right-hander to toss back-to-back complete games since Bobby Witt had three straight (June 23games July 3, 1994)...struck out 10 batters in each start and is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back 10 strikeout games since Mark Mulder (July 24-29, 2003)...is the first righty to do it since Todd Stottlemyre (Sept. 20-26, 1995).

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 142.2 innings pitched, which is one-third of an inning short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he rank second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.68), third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.39) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.50).

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his fourth complete game of the season in his last start, but it was his first complete game win...had losses April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City and August 29 at Cleveland...the four complete games are tied for third in the American League...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

CAREER BESTS: Won his eighth game of the season in his last start, which is a new career high...surpasses his previous high of seven set in 2009 with Texas...also has career highs in innings pitched (142.2), strikeouts (103) and complete games (4)...is scheduled to make his 22<sup>nd</sup> start today, which matches his best from 2007...has a 3.41 ERA and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Seven of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has a .423 opponents slugging percentage against left-handed hitters and .328 against right-handers...has allowed a .377 (23 for 61) batting average and three of his eight home runs to the opponents number three hitter.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-5 with a 2.72 ERA (23 er in 76.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more and 4-2 with a 4.19 ERA (31 er in 66.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 7-3 with a 3.41 ERA (30 er in 79.0 ip) in 12 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** Had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss *April 15* against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10<sup>th</sup> as Fuentes took the loss...it was the first of three times he has left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also July 9, July 20)...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle *April 21*...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City *May 7*...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles July 15 in Oakland...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in a 9-1 loss to Texas August 12, snapping his winning streak at a career-high tying four games...issued a season-high three walks in a 6-5 win at New York August 23, snapping a 21-start streak with two walks or fewer...tossed a complete-game five-hitter and struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 2-1 loss at Cleveland August 29.

LAST START: He tossed his second career shutout (also May 24, 2009 at Houston), a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Seattle last Saturday in Oakland...it was the low-hit game of his career...it was his fifth career complete game...did not walk a batter and struck out a career high 10 for the second consecutive start...is the 10<sup>th</sup> pitcher in Oakland history with no walks and 10 or more strikeouts in a complete game...is just the third Athletics pitchers over the last 98 years with a complete game shutout, three or fewer hits, no walks and 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Witt, June 23, 1994 vs. Kansas City; Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota).

McCARTHY vs. TEXAS: Is 1-3 with a 4.60 ERA (31.1 ip, 30 h, 23 r, 16 er, 7 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in seven career appearances, five starts...that includes 1-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10 er in 20.2 ip) in four games, three starts in Texas, 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (1 er in 1.1 ip) in one game at U.S. Cellular Field and 0-1 with a 4.82 ERA (5 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...is 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA (15 er in 28.0 ip) in his five starting assignments...pitched for Texas from 2007-09 and is 8-6 with a 3.94 ERA (56 er in 128.0 ip) in 26 games, 25 starts, in Rangers Ballpark...is 0-1 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 ip, 22 h, 16 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in three starts this year...the first no decision came in the A's 5-4 win in 10 innings May 2 in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...also had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas July 9...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth on a Kinsler RBI double, an Andrus sacrifice fly, a Hamilton RBI ground out and a Beltre solo home run...then took the loss in a 9-1 decision in Oakland August 22...left the game after 3.1 innings with a right knee contusion...allowed a career-high tying seven runs...allowed six runs on six hits in the second inning...left the game after he was hit in the knee by a Chavez line drive with one out in the

RHP Trevor Cahill (10-13, 4.20 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season...is 2-6 with a 6.67 ERA in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...has the highest post-break ERA in the majors and is tied for second in losses (Vargas, SEA 7)...picked up his 10<sup>th</sup> win of the season in his last start, an 8-5 A's win over Seattle last Sunday in Oakland...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history and sixth in franchise history to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...is 8-4 with a 2.32 ERA in 13 career starts against Texas...has no more than four wins against any other team...is 2-2 with a 1.86 ERA (29.0 ip, 24 h, 7 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 18 so) in four starts this year.

The A's bullpen has a 6.44 ERA (31 er in 43.1 ip) and .280 (49 for 175) opponents batting average over its past 12 games...now has a 4.62 ERA (78 er in 152.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for the third most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (95) and tied for third in fewest first batter home runs (8)...five of those nine first batter home runs have come over its last 14 games...has allowed 68 of 181 (37.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 43.1)

- Has allowed at least one run in six of his last 10 appearances (8 er in 10.1 ip, 6.97 ERA) after allowing just one earned run in his previous 10 outings (0.96 ERA).

**CAREER HIGHS:** Walked two batters in his last start to bring his season total to 74...that is a new career high, surpassing his 72 from his rookie season in 2009...also has a career-high 132 strikeouts and has matched his high with 13 losses...is making his 31<sup>st</sup> start of the season today, which is one short of his high of 32 in 2009.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 6-7 with a 3.08 ERA (33 er in 96.1 ip) and .242 (87 for 359) opponents batting average in 15 starts at home compared to 4-6 with a 5.44 ERA (52 er in 86.0 ip) and .285 (97 for 340) in 15 starts on the road...is now 24-17 with a 3.21 ERA (109 er in 306.0 ip) in 48 career starts in Oakland and 14-17 with a 4.76 ERA (133 er in 251.2 ip) in 44 starts on the road.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
