#### A's AT A GLANCE

#### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 5-10 with four games remaining...snapped a nine-game losing streak to the Rangers with the win yesterday...that matched the A's longest losing streak second longest losing streak against Texas...it also snapped a six-game losing streak in Rangers Ballpark, which is the A's second longest in this ballpark...are 2-6 in Texas this year and 3-4 in Oakland...have lost more than six games in Texas just twice in Oakland history (7 in 1977 and 1978)...including this year, have lost five of the last six season series...are 50-60 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 291-304 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-142 in Oakland and 136-162 in Texas...including 69-74 at Rangers Ballpark...have an alltime record of 388-386 against the Rangers/Senators

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey picked up his 20<sup>th</sup> save of the season yesterday and now has 20 or more saves in each of his three seasons...the only other ML relievers with 20 saves in each of their first three seasons are Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) and Billy Koch (1999-2001).

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals an AL record six bases in a 9-7 win over Detroit...in **1936** Hod Lisenbee ties a ML record by allowing 26 hits in a 17-2 loss to Chicago...in **1970** Vida Blue tosses his first career complete game, a one-hit shutout at Kansas City...he would go on to compile 105 complete games and 28 shutouts in an A's uniform, both Oakland career records...in **1976** Mike Torrez tosses his club record third consecutive shutout in a 1-0 win at Texas as part of a 38.1 inning scoreless streak...in **1999** Doug Jones records the final out in a win at Tampa Bay for his 300<sup>th</sup> career save...in **2006** Frank Thomas homers in his sixth consecutive game, an Athletics record for consecutive games with a homer.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three of the last five games but have won six of the last nine games...trail Texas by 15½ games in the American League West and the A's tragic number for elimination from the playoffs is two...were eliminated from the Wild Card race Tuesday night in game 142...are 66-79 and with two more losses the A's will extend their streak of consecutive seasons without a winning record to five...that would be the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 44-59 (.427) since then...have spent 49 of the last 50 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 83 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 27-21 (.563) record on the weekend (14-12 on Saturday, 13-9 on Sunday) compared to 39-58 (.402) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.49 ERA (88 er in 144.1 ip) over the last 16 games, which has raised the season ERA to 3.75...that is the highest it has been outside the first five games of the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (117), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376), are tied for second in pickoffs (19), rank third in most walks (478), fourth in ERA and fifth in strikeouts (1055)...the strikeouts are the sixth best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001, 1075 in 2005, 1070 in 2010, 1061 in 2008)...A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 2.97 ERA (19 er in 57.2 ip) over the last nine games...have a 3.75 ERA (369 er in 884.2 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the AL.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have the third lowest slugging percentage in the American League (.371), the third fewest home runs (98), the fourth lowest batting average (.246) and the fourth fewest runs (592)...are on pace to hit 109 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was fourth fewest in a non-strike season in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978, 108 in 1979)...have a .315 on-base percentage and have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 115 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (120)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors and tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986)...the errors have led to 80 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this three-game road trip to Texas...went 4-6 on the last road trip and are 27-47 (.365 on the road for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season and have matched their road loss total from last year...return home following the game today for a 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (three games), Detroit (four games) and Texas (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (1-2) and are 39-32 (.549) at home overall ...are batting .253 (588 for 2323) at home and .240 (621 for 2585) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have hit under .241 on the road just once in Oakland history (.230 in 1968)...have a 3.15 ERA (227 er in 648.0 ip) at home compared to 4.35 (314 er in 649.2 ip) on the road.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** The A's are 5-3 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is this three-game series at Texas...prior to that, had a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 27-26 (.509) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .269 (493 for 1831) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.84 ERA (254 er in 472.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in triples since the break (14), tied for second in doubles (121), third in walks (193) and tied for fourth in runs (277)...are hitting .312 (152 for 487) with runners in scoring position since the break after hitting .239 before the break...A's starting pitchers are 22-22 with a 4.81 ERA (168 er in 314.1 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 18-24 (.429) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-27 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's have used 47 players and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 26 pitchers, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's...have used just four right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney, Taylor), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Barton, Braden and Magnuson)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 12<sup>th</sup> appearance and ninth start of the season...the A's are 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments this year and are 12-12 (.500) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

**BRIEFLY:** Made eight starts during his first stint with Oakland from May 23 to July 2 and was 3-3 with a 3.47 ERA (18 er in 46.2 ip)...was 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA over his first four starts and 2-2 with a 2.88 over his next four...recalled for his second stint August 26 and has made three relief appearances, going 0-1 with a 1.42 ERA (1 er in 6.1 ip).

**THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-3 with a 3.93 ERA (8 er in 18.1 ip) and .303 (23 for 76) opponents batting average over his last five games, two starts, dating back to June 26...the losing streak is the longest of his career, surpassing his previous high of two (Sept. 18-28, 2008).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .218 (12 for 55) batting average against left-handed hitters and .274 (40 for 146) against right-handers...his career splits are .178 (24 for 135) against lefties and .274 (115 for 420) against righties...has allowed all three of his home runs this year and 12 of 13 in his career to right-handed hitters...opponents are 10 for 51 (.196) with three walks when leading off an inning (.241 on-base percentage).

**IN RELIEF:** Tossed 4.0 shutout innings in his first relief appearance in the second game of the doubleheader August 27 at Boston...it was the longest outing by an A's reliever this year...struck out seven, which are the most strikeouts by an A's reliever since Erik Hiljus fanned eight in 5.0 innings July 24, 2001 against Minnesota...then took the loss in the A's 4-3, 16-inning loss at Cleveland August 31 when he allowed a Hannahan RBI single in the bottom of the 16<sup>th</sup>....tossed a scoreless sixth inning in his last outing last Sunday against Seattle, retiring three of the four batters he faced.

**COMEBACK:** His start May 23 at Los Angeles (AL) was his first appearance since June 19, 2009 at San Diego, a no decision in the A's 7-5 win...left the game after 1.2 innings with a strained left elbow and had "Tommy John" surgery June 30...missed the entire 2010 season as he continued to rehab from the surgery.

**2011 START-BY-START:** Had a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles *May 23*...allowed an Abreu RBI single in the first but that would be the only run he would allow as he blanked the Angels on four hits and a walk over his final six innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Baltimore *May 28* in Oakland...it was his first Major League win since June 8, 2009 against Minnesota...issued a career-high tying five walks in 6.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Jones in the third and Tatum in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Boston *June 3*...tossed just 2.2 innings but matched his career highs in runs (5) and earned runs (4)...allowed two runs in the first, one in the second and two more in the third...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 3-2 loss at Baltimore *June 8*...allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a Hardy RBI single and a Reynolds two-run home run and left after six innings trailing 3-1...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 2-1 win over Kansas City *June 15* in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, his longest career outing without allowing a run...won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 win at New York *June 21*...blanked the Mets on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 11.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Philadelphia *June 26*...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Victorino RBI single and a Howard grounded into double play, and another in the fifth on a Francisco RBI single...Halladay tossed a complete game eight-hitter for Philadelphia.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Arizona July 2 in Oakland...Chris Young drove in all four Diamondback runs with a RBI single in the first, a RBI double in the third and a two-run home run in the fifth...was relieved by De Los Santos after six innings with the A's trailing 4-0.

**OUTMAN vs. TEXAS:** Is 1-0 with a 3.57 ERA (17.2 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...the win came in a 7-1 A's victory September 13, 2008 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Cruz in the second but the A's scored twice in the fourth and five times in the fifth to give him a 7-1 lead...then had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas September 23, 2008...allowed a Metcalf sacrifice fly in the second and RBI singles by Bradley and Byrd in the third...left with a 4-3 lead but Embree allowed three runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss...had another no decision in a 6-3 loss in the first game of a doubleheader May 29, 2009 at Texas...struck out a career high nine batters in 6.2 innings...allowed a two-run double to Cruz in the first but then retired 17 of the next 18 batters...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Byrd with one out in the seventh.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 8-3 with a 3.91 ERA and .256 opponents batting average in 17 starts with Sacramento...was 4-1 with a 4.78 ERA in eight starts during his first stint and 4-2 with a 3.10 ERA in nine starts in his second stint following his option July 3...issued 47 walks in 78.1 innings (5.40 per nine innings) and was tied for third in the PCL in walks...the River Cats were 12-6 (.667) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in just two of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .256 opponents batting average broke down to .231 (25 for 108) against left-handed hitters and .269 (52 for 193) against right-handers...yielded six of his seven home runs to righties.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (12-12, 3.43 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 29<sup>th</sup> start of the season...has 171 strikeouts in 173.0 innings and his average of 8.90 strikeouts per nine innings ranks fourth in the American League...the Athletics franchise record (since 1901) is 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...is 4-6 with a 5.25 ERA in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for second in the AL in losses since the break...was the losing pitcher in his last start, 7-4 A's loss to Kansas City last Tuesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 5-2 with a 2.72 ERA in eight career appearances, all starts, against Los Angeles...the five wins equal his most against any team (Cleveland, Seattle)...is 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA (19.0 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 20 so) in three starts this year.

 The A's bullpen has compiled a 7.11 ERA (39 er in 49.1 ip) and .306 (63 for 206) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...has allowed
 seven or more runs three times over that span...now has a 4.90 ERA (86 er in 158.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and ranks fourth in most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (95) and tied for third in fewest first batter home runs (8)... five of those nine first batter home runs have come over its last 16 games... has allowed 69 of 184 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 42.7).

- Has converted all 12 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is tied for third in the American League in saves since the break...is now a perfect 35 for 35 in save chances following the break in his career.
- Picked up his 20th save of the season yesterday and has reached the 20 plateau in each of his three seasons...the only other Oakland relievers with at least three straight 20 save seasons are Dennis Eckersley (6, 1988-93) and Bill Taylor (3, 1997-99)...joins Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) and Billy Koch (1999-2001) as the only Major League pitchers to record at least 20 saves in each of their first three seasons in the majors.



record, topping the mark of 29 set by Catfish Hunter (May 3-8, 1968) and Dallas Braden (May 9-14, 2010) when they tossed their perfect games...did not allow a hit over the first seven inning of his last start, giving him a streak of 11.0 consecutive hitless innings...that matched the second longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Ken Holtzman also had an 11.0 inning streak from June 4-8, 1975...now has a 13.2-inning scoreless streak, which is a career high.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Has a 3.34 ERA, which ranks second in the American League among rookies with 100 or more innings pitched...ranks fifth among AL rookies in wins (8) and is seventh in games started (18) and is tied for ninth in strikeouts (62).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 6-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) and .188 (44 for 234) opponents batting average in 10 starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) and .257 (47 for 183) opponents average in 10 games, eight starts, on the road.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
