A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 8-5...are 5-1 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and six of the last seven...are 68-78 (.466) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 373-301 against the Angels...that includes 195-141 in Oakland and 178-160 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 422-378 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey picked up his 20th save of the season Saturday and now has 20 or more saves in each of his three seasons...the only other Major League relievers with 20 saves in each of their first three seasons are Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) and Billy Koch (1999-2001).

David DeJesus is a .340 (85 for 250) career hitter against Los Angeles, which is the best mark ever against the Angels (min. 200 PA).

Hideki Matsui is batting .335 (67 for 200) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fourth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21) and third in hits (106) and doubles (22).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1964** Bob Meyer tosses a onehitter but the A's lose to Baltimore 1-0 as the Orioles Frank Bertaina also tosses a one-hitter...in **1980** Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 28 complete games...in **1986** Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Were officially eliminated from the playoffs with the loss yesterday as they now trail Texas by a season-high tying 16½ games with 16 games remaining...were eliminated from the Wild Card race last Tuesday in game 142...have lost four of the last six games and nine of the last 15...are 66-80 overall and with one more losses the A's will extend their streak of consecutive seasons without a winning record to five...that would be the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 44-60 (.423) since then...have spent 50 of the last 51 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 84 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 6-4 in September after going 11-17 last month...August marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 in July, 2010...have a 27-22 (.551) record on the weekend (14-12 on Saturday, 13-10 on Sunday) compared to 39-58 (.402) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's conclude the home portion of the scheduled with this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (three games), Detroit (four games) and Texas (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (1-2) and are 39-32 (.549) at home for the season...need two more wins to clinch a winning record at home for the second consecutive season...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Texas and are 27-48 (.360) on the road for the season...that is the third worst road record in the American League...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 48 road losses match the most by an A's team over the last 13 years (also 2008)...are batting .253 (588 for 2323) at home and .230 (627 for 2618) on the road...have a 3.15 ERA (227 er in 648.0 ip) at home compared to 4.41 (322 er in 657.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 28 runs in the three game series at Texas over the weekend and now have a 5.67 ERA (96 er in 152.1 ip) over the last 17 games...that has raised the season ERA .25 runs to 3.78, which is the highest it has been outside the first five games of the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the American League (119), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.378), rank third in pickoffs (19) and most walks (483), fourth in ERA and fifth in strikeouts (1059)...the strikeouts are the sixth best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001, 1075 in 2005, 1070 in 2010, 1061 in 2008)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.78 ERA (373 er in 888.2 ip), which is fourth lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have the third lowest slugging percentage in the American League (.371), the third fewest home runs (99), the fourth lowest batting average (.246) and the fourth fewest runs (593)...are on pace to hit 110 home runs, which would be the fifth lowest total in a non-strike season in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978, 108 in 1979, 109 in 2010)...have a .314 on-base percentage and have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last four games and now have 117 for the season, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (122)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors and tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986)...the errors have led to 80 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 27-27 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .268 (499 for 1864) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.91 ERA (262 er in 480.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the second highest post-break ERA in the AL (Baltimore, 4.93)...the offense ranks second in the AL in triples since the break (14), tied for second in doubles (121) and third in walks (194)...are hitting .309 (152 for 492) with runners in scoring position since the break after hitting .239 before the break...A's starting pitchers are 22-23 with a 4.85 ERA (172 er in 319.0 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 5-4 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception was the three-game series at Texas last weekend...prior to that, had a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-24 (.429) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-27 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

PLAYERS USED: Jai Miller became the 48th player to appear in a game for the A's this year yesterday...have not used fewer than 49 players in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 26 pitchers, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Barton, Braden and Magnuson)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season...the A's are 13-15 (.464) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-42 (.506) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 19 of his 27 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 171 strikeouts in 173.0 innings...is averaging 8.90 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks fourth in the American League...the Athletics franchise record (since 1901) for strikeouts per nine innings is 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...his 171 strikeouts are tied for 10th in the AL.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 4-6 with a 5.25 ERA (35 er in 60.0 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in losses since the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League lead in walks (83) and is tied for eighth in losses (12).

CAREER HIGHS: Struck out four batters in his last start and now has 171 for the season, which matches his career high from last year...already has a career high in losses (12) and runs (77) and has matched his high in home runs (15).

HOME AND AWAY: IS 8-5 with a 2.80 ERA (30 er in 96.1 ip) and .210 (74 for 352)

opponents batting average in 15 starts at home compared to 4-7 with a 4.23 ERA (36 er in 76.2 ip) and .266 (81 for 305) opponents average in 13 starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home wins and tied for fourth in road losses...ranks eighth in the AL in home ERA and ninth in home opponents batting average...over the last two years, he is 16-8 with a 2.68 ERA (59 in 198.1 ip) and .205 (147 for 718) opponents average in 31 starts at home and 11-13 with a 4.06 ERA (79 er in 175.1 ip) and .261 (179 for 687) average in 30 starts on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 7-3 with a 2.83 ERA (22 er in 70.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more and 5-9 with a 3.84 ERA (44 er in 103.0 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-4 with a 3.44 ERA (27 er in 70.2 ip) in 11 starts during the day and 6-8 with a 3.43 ERA (39 er in 102.1 ip) in 17 starts at night...is tied for fifth in the American League in day wins and has the seventh lowest night ERA...is now 16-8 with a 3.59 ERA (76 er in 190.1 ip) in 31 career games during the day compared to 18-24 with a 4.39 ERA (154 er in 316.0 ip) in 60 contests at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 16 of his 28 starts...has just 21 runs of support in his 12 losses this year (66.0 ip, 2.86 RSA) and 39 runs of support in his 32 career losses (160.0 ip, 2.19 RSA)...is 29-2 in 39 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-30 in 46 starts with support of two or fewer.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 5.52 ERA in five starts in August...that was his highest single month ERA since July, 2009 when he had a 7.48 ERA...went 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts in July...at the time, that was his highest single month ERA in September, 2009 when he also had a 4.50 ERA...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

HONORS: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce...was named AL Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits (fourth time)...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed back-to-back home runs to Hosmer and Francouer to start the second...also allowed a RBI single to Escobar and a RBI fielders choice by Gordon in the inning...was charged with three more runs in the fifth inning on a Giavotella RBI groundout, a Perez RBI double and a Gordon bases loaded walk.

GONZALEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-2 with a 2.72 ERA (46.1 ip, 38 h, 15 r, 14 er, 14 bb, 53 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, all starts...the five wins equal his most against any team (Cleveland, Seattle)...is 2-1 with a 4.43 ERA (10 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts at Anaheim and 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland...is 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA (19.0 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 20 so) in three starts this year...the loss came in a 5-0 A's loss on April 25 at Los Angeles...allowed a two-run single to Kendrick in the second, an RBI double to Abreu in the third and two more runs in the fourth on an error and a grounded into double play...Weaver shutout the A's on seven hits...then combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win May 17 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...neither base runner advanced past first base...also picked up the win in a 9-1 A's victory in Oakland July 17...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just four hits and two walks while striking out eight...each of his first six outs were strikeouts...allowed just two runners to advance into scoring position.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (8-8, 3.34 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 21st appearance and 19th start of the season...has won each of his two starts in September (0.57 ERA) and has two earned runs or fewer in five of his last six starts (4-2, 2.72 ERA)...has a 3.34 ERA, which ranks second in the American League among rookies with 100 or more innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-0 win over Kansas City last Wednesday in Oakland (8.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...retired each of the first 17 batters after setting down the last 13 in his previous start for an Oakland record 30 consecutive batters retired...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (8.1 ip) in two career appearances, one start, against the Angels...the start was the first of his career and it came earlier this year at Los Angeles on May 24 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 3 so).

 seven or more runs three times over that span...now has a 5.02 ERA (90 er in 161.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and ranks fourth in most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (96) and tied for third in fewest first batter home runs (8)... five of those eight first batter home runs have come over its last 17 games... has allowed 69 of 190 (36.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 42.9).

record, topping the mark of 29 set by Catfish Hunter (May 3-8, 1968) and Dallas Braden (May 9-14, 2010) when they tossed their perfect games...did not allow a hit over the first seven inning of his last start, giving him a streak of 11.0 consecutive hitless innings...that matched the second longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Ken Holtzman also had an 11.0 inning streak from June 4-8, 1975...now has a 13.2-inning scoreless streak, which is a career high.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Has a 3.34 ERA, which ranks second in the American League among rookies with 100 or more innings pitched...ranks fifth among AL rookies in wins (8) and is seventh in games started (18) and is tied for ninth in strikeouts (62).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) and .188 (44 for 234) opponents batting average in 10 starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) and .257 (47 for 183) opponents average in 10 games, eight starts, on the road.



innings, he rank second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.70), third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.40) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48).

CAREER BESTS: Has career highs this year in wins (8), innings pitched (148.2), strikeouts (108) and complete games (4)...is scheduled to make his 23rd start today, which will be a new high, surpassing his previous best of 22 from 2007...has a 3.39 ERA and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Seven of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has allowed a .359 (23 for 64) batting average and three of his eight home runs to the opponents number three hitter

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
