OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics are now 67-81 this season, which extends their streak of consecutive seasons without a winning record to five...it is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...are 1-1 on the final homestand of the season, a 10-game stand against Los Angeles (1-1), Detroit (four games) and Texas (three games).
- The A's grounded into four double plays, which is a season high (previous: 3, seven times; last: Aug. 7 at Tampa Bay).
- Guillermo Moscoso** had his career-high 15.2-inning scoreless streak snapped when he allowed three runs in the third inning...had allowed just one earned run in 20.0 innings (0.45 ERA) in three starts against American League West teams this year entering tonight.
- Fautino De Los Santos** has a 6.14 ERA (10 er in 14.2 ip) over his past 18 games after posting a 2.35 ERA over his first 12 contests.
- Brandon Allen** (1 for 4) doubled in the fourth inning to snap his 0 for 22 streak, which was the longest hitless streak of his career.
- Hideki Matsui** (1 for 1) had a career-high-tying three walks (16th time, last: June 17, 2011 vs. San Francisco).
- Scott Sizemore** (0 for 4) struck out a career-high-tying three times (fifth time, last: Aug. 13, 2011 vs. Texas).
- Josh Willingham** (2 for 3) recorded his team-leading 90th RBI of the season, which is a new career high (previous: 89 RBI, 2007)...is 15 for 44 (.341) with 11 RBI over his last 12 games.

LOS ANGELES NOTES

- The Los Angeles Angels are 8-4 in the month of September and are now 31-25 since the All-Star Break...1-1 on their final road trip of the season, a 10-game trip through Oakland (1-1), Baltimore (three games) and Toronto (four games).
- Jerome Williams** did not factor in the decision...is 3-0 with a 3.08 ERA (9 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts since having his contract selected August 17...is 2-1 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four career starts against Oakland.
- Jordan Walden** recorded his 30th save of the season, becoming the fifth rookie closer since 2000 to record 30 or more saves (Feliz, Kimbrel, Sasaki, Papelbon).
- Erick Aybar** (2 for 3) is 10 for 21 (.476) over his past six games.
- Alberto Callaspo** (1 for 3) is on a seven-game hitting streak (9 for 24, .375)...is a .304 (38 for 125) career hitter against the A's.
- Howie Kendrick** (2 for 5) hit two home runs in a game for the second time this year (April 3 at Kansas City)...it is his fourth career two home run game.
