Halos are 18-5-2 in last 25 series & 28-15-4 through 47 overall series in 2011...With 80 wins, Angels have already matched win total from 2010 (80-82).

- In last minor league start, earned seventh victory tossing a complete game, August 14th vs. Omaha.
- Is ninth pitcher to make a start for the Angels this season and third starting pitcher to make Angels debut.
- Wears pink glove in honor of mother who passed away in 2001 after her battle with breast cancer.
- Williams began the 2011 season with the Lancaster Barnstormers of the Atlantic League before signing a free agent contract with the Angels on June 16^{th} ...In 2010, he played for the Uni-President Lions in Taiwan.
- The Honolulu, HI native is just the 27th Major Leaguer born in Hawaii...Is
- playing for his fourth MLB organization (Giants, Cubs, Nationals, Angels).

 Former first round pick (39th overall) of the San Francisco Giants in 1999 owns a 26-29 career record with two complete games, one shutout and a 4.21 ERA (451 IP - 211 ER) in 82 Major League appearances (74 starts).
