A's vs. TIGERS

The season series is even at three games each...the A's are 2-2 in Oakland and 1-1 in Detroit...have won two season series over the previous five years, lost two and split one...are 26-23 against Detroit since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 234-226 against the Tigers...that includes 130-99 in Oakland, 102-125 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 903-979 against the Tigers...

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey picked up his 20th save of the season Saturday and now has 20 or more saves in each of his three seasons...joins Kazuhiro Sasaki and Billy Koch as the only relievers in Major League history with at least 20 saves in each of their first three seasons.

Hideki Matsui is batting .327 (68 for 208) since the All-Star Break, which ranks eighth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21) and third in hits (107) and doubles (23)

Josh Willingham hit his 26th home run of the season yesterday, which matches his career high (2006)...also has a career high 91 RBI, which are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006...is batting .340 (16 for 47) with three home runs and 12 RBI over his last 13 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommell defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in 1971 the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in 1990 Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and six of the last nine games to fall 15 games under .500 at 67-82...the season low is 16 games under (60-76 on August 31)...the A's have not finished a season more than 14 games under .500 since going 65-97 in 1997...will finish without a winning record for the fifth consecutive season, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 70-77 is on pace to be the fourth)...are 7-6 (.538) in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 45-62 (.421) since then...have spent 53 of the last 54 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 87 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...were officially eliminated from the playoffs in Sunday's loss at Texas in game 146...were eliminated from the Wild Card race September 6 in game 142...have a 27-22 (.551) record on the weekend (14-12 on Saturday, 13-10 on Sunday) compared to 40-60 (.400) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on the final homestand of the season, a 10-game stand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (four games) and Texas (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand and are 40-34 (.541) at home for the season...need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the second consecutive season...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Texas and are 27-48 (.360) on the road...that is the third worst road record in the American League...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 48 road losses match the most by an A's team over the last 13 years (also 2008)...are batting .254 (613 for 2418) at home and .239 (627 for 2618) on the road...have a 3.19 ERA (239 er in 675.0 ip) at home compared to 4.41 (322 er in 657.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.11).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.47 ERA (109 er in 179.1 ip) over the last 20 games...that has raised the season ERA .27 runs to 3.80, which is the highest it has been outside the first five games of the season...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.380), have allowed the second fewest home runs (124), rank third in pickoffs (19) and most walks (491) and fourth in ERA and strikeouts (1077)...the strikeouts are the third best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.79 ERA (382 er in 906.0 ip), which is fourth lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit 101 home runs, which is third fewest in the American League...it is currently the third lowest total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1978 club hit 100...the fourth lowest total is 108 in 1979...have scored 603 runs, which is fourth fewest in the AL...are averaging 4.05 runs per game, which is currently seventh lowest in Oakland history...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.371), which is the second lowest mark by an A's team over the last 29 years (.369 in 2008)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.246) and have hit under .250 just once over the last 20 years (.242 in 2008)...have a .315 on-base percentage and have not finished with a mark under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors in the last seven games and have 119 for the season, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (124)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 80 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 28-29 (.491) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .267 (524 for 1961) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.88 ERA (275 er in 507.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the highest post-break ERA in the majors (Minnesota, 4.87)...the offense ranks second in the AL in triples (14) since the break and third in doubles (127) and walks (207)...are hitting .307 (160 for 522) with runners in scoring position since the break after hitting .239 before the break...A's starting pitchers are 23-23 with a 4.85 ERA (181 er in 335.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 6-6 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception was the three-game series at Texas last weekend...prior to that, had a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-24 (.429) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-27 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

PLAYERS USED: Jai Miller became the 48th player to appear in a game for the A's this year Sunday...have not used fewer than 49 players in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 26 pitchers, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season, his 14th since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 10-12 (.455) in his starting assignments and his teams are 37-41 (.474) in his 78 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 18 of his 22 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 21 times.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has compiled a 2.35 ERA (8 er in 30.2 ip) and allowed a .196 (22 for 112) opponents batting average over his last four starts but is just 2-2 over that span...has walked just five and struck out 31.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 7-3 with a 3.36 ERA (27 er in 72.1 ip) in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for third in the American League in wins since the break.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 148.2 innings pitched, which is one-third of an inning short of qualifying for the league

leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he ranks second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.70), third in fewest walks per

CAREER BESTS: Has career highs this year in wins (8), innings pitched (148.2), strikeouts (108) and complete games (4)...is scheduled to make his 23rd start today, which will be a new high, surpassing his previous best of 22 from 2007...has a 3.39 ERA and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Seven of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has allowed a .375 (24 for 64) batting average and three of his eight home runs to the opponents number three hitter.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-5 with a 2.85 ERA (26 er in 82.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more and 4-2 with a 4.19 ERA (31 er in 66.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest.

BACK-TO-BACK: Tossed back-to-back complete games August 29 and September 3 and is just the second Oakland pitcher to do that over the last seven years (Braden, May 9-14, 2010)...is the first A's right-hander to toss back-to-back complete games since Bobby Witt had three straight (June 23-July 3, 1994)...struck out 10 batters in each start and is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back 10 strikeout games since Mark Mulder (July 24-29, 2003)...is the first righty to do it since Todd Stottlemyre (Sept. 20-26, 1995).

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his fourth complete game of the season September 3, but it was his first complete game win...had losses April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City and August 29 at Cleveland...the four complete games are tied for third in the American League...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 7-4 with a 3.49 ERA (33 er in 85.0 ip) in 13 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so).

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss *April 15* against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...it was the first of three times he has left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also July 9, July 20)...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle April 21...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City *May* 7...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles *July* 15 in Oakland...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts...combined with De Los Santos on a five-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Tampa Bay August 6...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in a 9-1 loss to Texas August 12, snapping his winning streak at a career-high tying four games...left the game after 3.1 innings with a right knee contusion...issued a season-high three walks in a 6-5 win at New York *August 23*, snapping a 21-start streak with two walks or fewer...tossed a complete-game five-hitter and struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 2-1 loss at Cleveland August 29...tossed his second career shutout, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win over Seattle **September 3** in Oakland...it was the low-hit game of his career...did not walk a batter and struck out a career high 10 for the second consecutive start...is the 10th pitcher in Oakland history with no walks and 10 or more strikeouts in a complete game...is just the third Athletics pitchers over the last 98 years with a complete game shutout, three or fewer hits, no walks and 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Witt, June 23, 1994 vs. Kansas City; Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota)

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-4 loss at Texas last Friday...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a Beltre RBI double and a Murphy sacrifice fly...allowed two more runs in the fifth on an Andrus RBI double and a Sizemore error...left after six innings trailing 4-2.

McCARTHY vs. DETROIT: Is 1-3 with a 4.36 ERA (43.1 ip, 49 h, 22 r, 21 er, 9 bb, 31 so, 4 hr) in 14 career appearances, including seven starts...is 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA (3 er in 10.2 ip) in four games in his home ballparks and 0-3 with a 4.96 ERA (18 er in 32.2 ip) in 10 games at Comerica Park...is 0-3 with a 4.41 ERA (16 er in 32.2 ip) in his seven starting assignments...is 0-0 with a 3.09 ERA (11.2 ip, 12 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 11 so) in two starts this year...the first start came in an 8-4 A's loss in 10 innings April 15 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and was relieved by Breslow with two outs in the seventh and a 1-0 lead...Fuentes allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save and the Tigers scored seven times in the 10th...also had a decision in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit July 20...allowed two runs in the third on a Santiago RBI ground out and an Ordonez RBI single...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed back-to-back singles to start the sixth...was relieved by Devine who allowed both of those runs to score for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (11-13, 4.32 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 32nd start of the season...is 3-6 with a 6.86 ERA in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA in 20 starts before the break...has the highest post-break ERA in the majors and is tied for fourth in losses...is 5-13 with a 5.33 and .286 opponents batting average over his last 23 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but is tied for the ML lead in losses since May 15...won his second consecutive start in his last outing, an 8-7 A's win at Texas last Saturday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 2-1 with a 4.18 ERA in four career starts against Detroit...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-1 A's victory in Oakland April 17 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 9 so).

The A's bullpen has compiled a 6.71 ERA (47 er in 63.0 ip) and .295 (77 for 261) opponents batting average over the last 18 games (since August 25)...has allowed seven or more runs three times over that span...now has a 4.93 ERA (94 er in 171.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for second in most losses (24)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (98)...has allowed 69 of 197 (35.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL

- Has converted all 12 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and ranks fourth in the American League in saves since the break...is now a perfect 35 for 35 in save chances following the break in his career.
- Picked up his 20th save of the season Saturday and has reached the 20 plateau in each of his three seasons...the only other Oakland relievers with at least three straight 20 save seasons are Dennis Eckersley (6, 1988-93) and Bill Taylor (3, 1997-99)...joins Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) and Billy Koch (1999-2001) as the only Major League pitchers to record at least 20 saves in each of their first three seasons in the majors
- Is 20 for 22 (90.9%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the AL...is 71 for 80 (88.8%) in his career, which is the best mark in Oakland history...ranks sixth on the Oakland career saves list (Isringhausen is 5th, 75).
- Has allowed at least one run in six of his last 11 appearances (8 er in 11.1 ip, 6.35 ERA).
- Is 11 for 11 in saves at home and has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities in Oakland...his last blown save at home was May 18. 2010 against Seattle.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
