REMEMBERING SPARKY

The Tigers are wearing a patch on their right sleeves this season in the shape of a home plate emblazoned with the name SPARKY, to honor Hall of Fame manager Sparky Anderson who passed away on November 4, 2010. Anderson's number 11 was retired in a pre-game ceremony on June 26.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers knocked off the Athletics 3-1 last night, clinching the American League Central Division title. Doug Fister (9-13) limited Oakland to one run over eight innings of work to earn the win, while Jose Valverde closed out the game for his 45th save. Don Kelly led the Tigers with two hits, including a home run, and two RBI, while Wilson Betemit added a run-scoring triple. The Tigers continue a nine-game road trip this afternoon with the third game of a four-game series at Oakland. Following an off day on Monday, the trip concludes with a two-game series at Kansas City beginning on Tuesday.

AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL CHAMPIONS: The Tigers clinched the American League Central Division title with a 3-1 win over Oakland last night and the club has advanced to the playoffs for the 13th time in franchise history. It marks Detroit's first division title since the club captured the American League's East Division in 1987 and it is the club's fourth division title since divisional play began during the 1969 season.

PICKING UP WINS: The Tigers enter today's game at Oakland having won 23 of the club's last 28 games dating back to August 19, an .821 winning percentage. Detroit is tops among all major league clubs with an .821 winning percentage during that stretch.

RECENT ROAD SUCCESS: The Tigers enter today's game at Oakland having won 25 of the club's last 36 games on the road dating back to July 6. Detroit is tops among all American League clubs with a .694 winning percentage on the road during that stretch.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Tigers enter today's game hitting .310 (233x752) with 137 runs scored, 47 doubles, nine triples and 27 home runs over the club's last 21 games dating back to August 26. Detroit is second among all American League clubs with a .310 batting average, .370 on-base percentage and .504 slugging percentage during the stretch.

FISTER'S FIVE: Doug Fister earned the win for the Tigers last night at Oakland to extend his personal winning streak to five games. He has compiled a 0.81 ERA (44.2IP/4ER) and 41 strikeouts over the six-start stretch dating back to August 20.

VICTOR'S DRIVING THEM IN DURING SEPTEMBER: Victor Martinez is hitting .339 (20x59) with five doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI in 15 games during September. He is tops among all American League players with 17 RBI during the month.

CABRERA HEADED TOWARDS RARE TERRITORY: Miguel Cabrera enters today's game at Oakland with 102 runs scored, 97 RBI and 103 walks as he looks to become just the fifth player in Tigers history to reach a total of 100-or-more in all three categories during a single season. He would join Hank Greenberg (1937, 1938), Charlie Gehringer (1938), Rocky Colavito (1961) and Norm Cash (1961) in accomplishing the feat.

VALVERDE'S CONVERTING SAVES: Jose Valverde converted his 45th consecutive save to begin the season last night at Oakland. His 45 straight saves converted is the longest such streak during a single season in Tigers history. His streak surpasses Guillermo Hernandez who converted 32 straight save opportunities April 6-September 23, 1984.

BULLISH BEHAVIOR: Tigers relievers have compiled a 1.98 ERA (123.0IP/27ER) and 116 strikeouts over the club's last 41 games dating back to August 4. During the 41-game stretch, club relievers have limited opponents to a .197 batting average (85x431).

BENOIT ON THE BALL: Joaquin Benoit enters today's game with a 3-0 record, 1.47 ERA (43.0IP/7ER), two saves and 45 strikeouts over his last 46 outings dating back to May 20. He has limited opponents to a .179 batting average (26x145) during the stretch.

MIGGY'S THE MAN WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Miguel Cabrera is hitting .475 (19x40) with runners in scoring position for the Tigers dating back to August 3. He enters today's game against the Athletics tops in the American League with a .397 batting average with runners in scoring position.

PLAYING LONGBALL: Don Kelly belted a home run for the Tigers last night at Oakland and the club has now hit at least one home run in 13 of the team's 15 games in September, belting a total of 24 home runs. Detroit is second among all American League clubs with 24 home runs during September.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Jim Leyland is in his sixth season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 512-450 record (.532).

- Leyland registered the 1,500th win of his major league career on April 15 at Oakland, becoming just the 19th manager in major league history to accomplish the feat. He is second among all active major league managers with 1,580 wins.
- Today's game marks the 3,165th game Leyland has managed during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.
- He registered the 500th victory of his Tigers career on September 2 versus Chicago, becoming the fifth manager in Tigers history to register 500 victories with the club.

PORCELLO'S PROGNOSIS: In his third season with the Tigers, Porcello will make his 29th start of the 2011 season this afternoon at Oakland.

GOING FOR HIS 15TH WIN: Porcello enters his start this afternoon at Oakland looking for his 15th win of the season. With a win today, he would join Justin Verlander to become the first pair of Tigers pitchers with 15-or-more wins in a season since Verlander and Kenny Rogers did so for Detroit in 2006.

MORE ON LOOKING FOR HIS 15TH WIN: Porcello enters his start today at Oakland looking for his 15th win of the season. With a win today, he would establish a career high, surpassing his career best of 14 wins established as a rookie with the Tigers in 2009.

SOLID IN HIS LAST FOUR: Porcello has compiled a 3-0 record and 3.08 ERA (26.1IP/9ER) over his last four starts for the Tigers.

AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Porcello is making his seventh start of the season against a club from the American League West Division this afternoon. In his previous six outings, he is 4-1 with a 2.50 ERA (39.2IP/11ER).

YOUNG TIGERS WINNERS: Porcello enters his start today with 38 wins during his major league career. His 38 wins are tied for second-most by a Tigers pitcher prior to turning 23 since at least 1919, along with Hal Newhouser. Denny McLain posted 42 wins prior to turning 23 to lead the way. (Source: STATS LLC)

PILING UP THE WINS EARLY IN HIS TIGERS CAREER: Porcello earned his 38th career win in the 86th start of his major league career on September 12 at Chicago. His 38 wins mark the fifth-highest total by a Tigers pitcher in his first 86 career outings since at least 1919. Justin Verlander registered 43 wins in his first 86 outings to top the list, while Virgil Trucks is second with 41 wins and Schoolboy Rowe and Denny McLain are tied for third with 39 wins.

DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN TOTAL: Porcello earned his 10th win on July 24 at Minnesota and he has now posted a double-digit win total in each of his first three seasons at the major league level. Porcello is the first major league pitcher to post three-or-more consecutive seasons of 10-or-more wins prior to turning 23 since Dwight Gooden did so in four straight seasons (1984-87).

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Porcello has limited righthanded hitters to a .236 batting average (61x259) this season. Lefties are hitting .329 (126x383) with Porcello on the mound in 2011.

LIMITING THE WALKS: Porcello has issued two-or-fewer walks in 23 of his 28 outings for the Tigers this season.

SUCCESSFUL THE FIRST TIME THROUGH: Porcello has limited opponents to a .222 batting average (51x230) the first time through the batting order this season. Opponents are hitting .330 (136x412) beginning with the second time through the order.

RECORD AT OVERSTOCK.COM COLISEUM: Porcello is making his fourth start of his career at Overstock.com Coliseum this afternoon. He has compiled a 0-2 record and 6.32 ERA (15.2IP/11ER) in his previous three outings.

GETTING THE GROUND BALL: Porcello has posted a 1.88 ground ball/fly ball ratio (887 ground balls/473 fly balls) for the Tigers during his major league career. Since the start of the 2009 season, he is sixth among all American League pitchers with a 1.88 ground ball/fly ball ratio.

FIVE-GAME WIN STREAK: Porcello equaled a career high with a five-game winning streak July 3-29. He also compiled a five-game winning streak during both the 2009 and 2010 seasons.

PERFECT DURING JULY: Porcello finished the month of July with a 5-0 record for the Tigers. It marked the second time in his major league career he finished a month with a 5-0 record, also doing so in May of 2009. Porcello is the first major league pitcher to have more than one month with a 5-0 record prior to turning 23 since Wally Bunker did so at age 19 for the Baltimore Orioles in 1964. UNCONVENTIONAL ROUTE TO A WIN: Porcello earned the win in his start on July 3 versus San Francisco despite hitting three batters and throwing three wild pitches. He became just the third pitcher in the last 40 seasons to hit three-or-more batters and throw three-or-more wild pitches in an outing, and all three hurlers came away with the victory. He joined Houston's Joe Niekro (1985) and Tampa Bay's Victor Zambrano (2003) in doing so. (Source: Elias Sports Bureau)

GOING EIGHT: Porcello limited the Angels to two runs over eight innings of work to earn the win in his start on July 29. The eight innings pitched matched a career high for Porcello, marking the sixth time during his major league career he has pitched eight innings.
