### REMEMBERING SPARKY

The Tigers are wearing a patch on their right sleeves this season in the shape of a home plate emblazoned with the name SPARKY, to honor Hall of Fame manager Sparky Anderson who passed away on November 4, 2010. Anderson's number 11 was retired in a pre-game ceremony on June 26.

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered a 5-3 loss to the Athletics yesterday afternoon. Rick Porcello (14-9) took the loss for Detroit after allowing three runs in seven innings of work. Don Kelly doubled and drove in two runs for the Tigers, while Magglio Ordonez finished with three hits. The Tigers continue a nine-game road trip this afternoon with the final game of a four-game series at Oakland. Following an off day tomorrow, the trip concludes with a two-game series at Kansas City beginning on Tuesday evening.

**AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL DIVISION CHAMPIONS:** The Tigers clinched the American League Central Division title with a 3-1 win over Oakland on Friday and the club has advanced to the playoffs for the 13th time in franchise history. It marks Detroit's first division title since the club captured the American League's East Division in 1987 and it is the club's fourth division title since divisional play began during the 1969 season.

**PICKING UP WINS:** The Tigers enter today's game at Oakland having won 23 of the club's last 29 games dating back to August 19, a .793 winning percentage. Detroit is tops among all major league clubs with a .793 winning percentage during that stretch.

**RECENT ROAD SUCCESS:** The Tigers enter today's game at Oakland having won 25 of the club's last 37 games on the road dating back to July 6. Detroit is tops among all American League clubs with a .676 winning percentage on the road during that stretch.

**ON THE OFFENSIVE:** The Tigers enter today's game hitting .310 (244x786) with 140 runs scored, 48 doubles, nine triples and 27 home runs over the club's last 22 games dating back to August 26. Detroit is second among all American League clubs with a .310 batting average, .369 on-base percentage and .497 slugging percentage during that stretch.

**VICTOR'S DRIVING THEM IN DURING SEPTEMBER:** Victor Martinez is hitting .349 (22x63) with five doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI in 16 games during September. He is tops among all American League players with 17 RBI during the month.

**CABRERA HEADED TOWARDS RARE TERRITORY:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game at Oakland with 102 runs scored, 97 RBI and 104 walks as he looks to become just the fifth player in Tigers history to reach a total of 100-or-more in all three categories during a single season. He would join Hank Greenberg (1937, 1938), Charlie Gehringer (1938), Rocky Colavito (1961) and Norm Cash (1961) in accomplishing the feat.

**VALVERDE'S CONVERTING SAVES:** Jose Valverde converted his 45th consecutive save to begin the season on Friday at Oakland. His 45 straight saves converted is the longest such streak during a single season in Tigers history. His streak surpasses Guillermo Hernandez who converted 32 straight save opportunities April 6-September 23, 1984.

**FOR STARTERS:** Tigers starting pitchers have posted a 2.75 ERA (98.1IP/30ER) and 77 strikeouts over the club's last 15 games dating back to September 2. During the 15-game stretch, team starters have limited opponents to a .230 batting average (84x366). Detroit starting pitchers have registered 11 quality starts during the stretch.

**BULLISH BEHAVIOR:** Tigers relievers have compiled a 2.10 ERA (124.0IP/29ER) and 117 strikeouts over the club's last 42 games dating back to August 4. During the 42-game stretch, club relievers have limited opponents to a .202 batting average (88x436).

**BENOIT ON THE BALL:** Joaquin Benoit enters today's game with a 3-0 record, 1.47 ERA (43.0IP/7ER), two saves and 45 strikeouts over his last 46 outings dating back to May 20. He has limited opponents to a .179 batting average (26x145) during the stretch.

**MIGGY'S THE MAN WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION:** Miguel Cabrera is hitting .452 (19x42) with runners in scoring position for the Tigers dating back to August 3. He enters today's game against the Athletics tops in the American League with a .391 batting average with runners in scoring position.

**PLAYING LONGBALL:** The Tigers have connected for at least one home run in 13 of the team's 16 games in September, belting a total of 24 home runs. Detroit is second among all American League clubs with 24 home runs during September.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Jim Leyland is in his sixth season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 512-451 record (.532).

- Leyland registered the 1,500th win of his major league career on April 15 at Oakland, becoming just the 19th manager in major league history to accomplish the feat. He is second among all active major league managers with 1,580 wins.

- Today's game marks the 3,166th game Leyland has managed during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.

- He registered the 500th victory of his Tigers career on September 2 versus Chicago, becoming the fifth manager in Tigers history to register 500 victories with the club.

## TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

**'11 Season (Detroit):** 23-5, 2.36 ERA, 32 G, 32 GS, 4 CG, 2 SHO, 0 SV, 236.0 IP, 163 H, 68 R, 62 ER, 53 BB, 238 SO.  
**'10 Season (Detroit):** 18-9, 3.37 ERA, 33 G, 33 GS, 4 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 224.1 IP, 190 H, 89 R, 84 ER, 71 BB, 219 SO.

**JUSTIN'S CASE:** In his sixth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his 33rd start of the season today against the Athletics.

**ALL-STAR SELECTION:** Verlander was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the fourth time during his career (2007, 2009-11).

**AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** Verlander enters his start today at Oakland leading the American League with 23 wins, a 2.36 ERA, 238 strikeouts, a .192 batting average against and 6.22 hits per nine innings, while he is third with 9.1 strikeouts per nine innings and tied for seventh with 2.0 walks per nine innings.

**WINS IN 11 STRAIGHT STARTS:** Verlander has won each of his last 11 starts for the Tigers dating back to July 21, compiling a 2.51 ERA (79.0IP/22ER) and 85 strikeouts. His streak of 11 straight starts with a win matches a club record, equaling Earl Whitehill (July 2-August 19, 1930) and Hal Newhouser (June 11-July 27, 1946). (Source: Elias Sports Bureau)

**LOOKING FOR A 12-GAME STREAK:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon at Oakland with a career-best 11-game winning streak. It marks the longest winning streak by a Tigers pitcher during a single season since Bobo Newsom won 13 straight for the club April 25-July 13, 1940.

**SEEKING HIS 24TH WIN:** Verlander enters his start this afternoon at Oakland looking for his 24th win of the season. With a win today, he would match Ed Summers (1908), Hooks Dauss (1915), Schoolboy Rowe (1934) and Denny McLain (1969) for the 10th-highest single-season win total in Tigers history.

**A PAIR OF SEVENS-OR-BETTER:** Verlander enters today's game having won each of his last 11 starts dating back to July 21. It is the second time this season Verlander has won at least seven straight starts, also posting a seven-game streak from May 29-June 30. He is the first major league pitcher to have two streaks of winning seven-or-more straight starts during a single season since Minnesota's Frank Viola did so during the 1988 season. Verlander is the first Tigers pitcher to have two such streaks in a single season since Denny McLain did so for the club during the 1968 season. (Source: STATS LLC)

**MOVING UP THE TIGERS ALL-TIME STRIKEOUT LIST:** Verlander enters his start today at Oakland with 1,203 strikeouts during his career, the seventh-highest strikeout total all-time in Tigers history. He began the season with the 16th-highest strikeout total all-time in Tigers history.

**REACHING 20 WINS:** Verlander earned his 20th victory of the season on August 27 at Minnesota, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to win 20 games in a season since Bill Gullickson in 1991. He also became the first major league pitcher to record 20 wins prior to the end of August since Arizona's Curt Schilling did so in 2002. Toronto's Roger Clemens was the last American League pitcher with 20 wins prior to the end of August, doing so in 1997.

**MORE ON 20 WINS:** Verlander earned his 20th win in Detroit's 132nd game, marking the fastest a Tigers pitcher won his 20th game of the season since Mickey Lolich did so in the 131st game of the 1972 season.

**RECORDING 200 STRIKEOUTS FOR THIRD STRAIGHT SEASON:** Verlander enters his start today with 238 strikeouts this season, marking the third consecutive season he has posted 200-or-more strikeouts. His streak of three straight seasons with 200-or-more strikeouts is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).

**TOSSING 200-OR-MORE INNINGS FOR THE FIFTH STRAIGHT SEASON:** Verlander has surpassed the 200.0-inning mark for the fifth consecutive season with the Tigers. His streak of five straight seasons with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).

**RECORD AT OVERSTOCK.COM COLISEUM:** Verlander is making the eighth start of his career at Overstock.com Coliseum this afternoon. In his previous seven outings, he is 2-4 with a 3.06 ERA (47.0IP/16ER).

**VERLANDER RECORDS 20TH CAREER DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUT GAME:** Verlander fanned 10 batters in his start on August 11 at Cleveland, marking the 20th time in his career he has reached a double-digit strikeout total in a start.

**ANOTHER NO-HITTER:** Verlander tossed the seventh no-hitter in franchise history on May 7 at Toronto. It was his second career no-hitter and first since June 12, 2007 against the Milwaukee Brewers at Comerica Park. He became the second Tigers pitcher to record two no-hitters, joining Virgil Trucks, who tossed no-hitters on May 15, 1952 against the Washington Senators at Briggs Stadium and August 25, 1952 against the New York Yankees at Yankee Stadium. Additionally, it was the first no-hitter by a Tigers pitcher on the road since Jack Morris on April 7, 1984 against the Chicago White Sox at Comiskey Park.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad four times during his career (2007, 2009-11). Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
