The A's have lost the season series for the fifth time in the last six years as they trail 5-11 entering this final three-game series...have lost 10 of the last 11 games to the Rangers...went 2-7 in Texas and are 3-4 in Oakland...the seven losses in Texas (1977, 1968)...are 50-61 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 291-305 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-142 in Oakland and 136-163 in Texas...have an all-time record of 388-387 against the RangerS.e.the

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 20 saves and he joins Kazuhiro Sasaki and Billy Koch as the only relievers in ML history with at least 20 saves in each of their first three seasons.

Kurt Suzuki hit his 14th home run last Thursday, which is one short of his career high of 15 in 2009.

Jemile Weeks leads AL rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21) and third in hits (110) and doubles (23).

Josh Willingham hit his 27th home run last Friday night, which is a new career high (2006)...also has a career high 92 RBI, which are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006...he is tied for third in the American League in home runs since the All-Star Break (16) and ranks sixth in RBI (48).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** the A's clinch their first American League Pennant...in **1975** Vida Blue wins 20 games for the third time in his career as he pitches eight innings in the A's 16-4 win at Kansas City...he would go on to win each of his final two starts to finish at 22-11...in **1991** Rickey Henderson walks for the 776th time in an A's uniform, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 1227 walks. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 9-8 (.529) in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...have lost eight of the last 13 games and are 15 games under .500 at 69-84...that is one short of the season low of 16 games under on August 31 (60-76)...have not finished a season more than 14 games under .500 since going 65-97 in 1997...will finish without a winning record for the fifth consecutive season, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 72-79 is on pace to be the fourth)...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 47-64 (.423) since then...have spent 58 of the last 59 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 92 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 28-23 (.549) record on the weekend (15-12 on Saturday, 13-11 on Sunday) compared to 41-61 (.402) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

SHUTOUT: The A's were shutout on Sunday 3-0...it was the 15th time the A's were shutout this year, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (San Diego, 18)...it is also third most in Oakland history and is the most since the 1979 club was blanked 17 times...the record is 19 in 1978...the A's have scored 615 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...are averaging 4.02 runs per game, which is currently seventh lowest in Oakland history

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on the final homestand of the season, a 10-game stand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (2-2) and Texas (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand and are 42-36 (.538) at home for the season...have clinched a winning record at home for the second consecutive season...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Texas and are 27-48 (.360) on the road...that is the second worst road record in the American League (Baltimore, 26-49)...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 48 road losses match the most by an A's team over the last 13 years (also 2008)...are batting .252 (641 for 2542) at home and .239 (627 for 2618) on the road...have a 3.15 ERA (249 er in 711.0 ip) at home compared to 4.41 (322 er in 657.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.11).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.97 ERA (119 er in 215.1 ip) over the last 24 games and now have a 3.76 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.379) and the fewest home runs (127), rank third in pickoffs (19) and fourth in strikeouts (1108)...the strikeouts are the third best single-season total in Athletics franchise history (1124 in 2009, 1117 in 2001)...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run in three of the last four games and are 2-2 with a 2.03 ERA (6 er in 26.2 ip)...have a 3.74 ERA (388 er in 932.2 ip) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have 105 home runs, which is third fewest in the American League...it is currently the third lowest total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1978 club hit 100...the fourth lowest total is 108 in 1979...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.370), which is the second lowest mark by an A's team over the last 29 years (.369 in 2008)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.246) and have hit under .250 just once over the last 20 years (.242 in 2008)...have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314) and have not finished with a mark under .318 since 1982 (.309).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have 120 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (127)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...the last time the A's lead the American League in errors was 1998 (141)...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is also tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 80 unearned runs, which is tied with Minnesota for the most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 30-31 (.492) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .265 (552 for 2085) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.72 ERA (285 er in 543.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks third in the AL in doubles (129) and walks (218) since the break and is tied for fourth in triples (14)...are hitting .305 (167 for 547) with runners in scoring position since the break after hitting .239 before the break ...A's starting pitchers are 25-25 with a 4.64 ERA (187 er in 362.1 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 8-8 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception was the three-game series at Texas September 9-11...prior to that, had a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-24 (.429) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League (Texas, 17-23)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games, tied for second in losses and have the fourth worst record...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-27 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract for 2012 and beyond: Brett Anderson (2013, club options for 2014 and 2015), Grant Balfour (2012, club option 2013), Trevor Cahill (2015, club options 2016 and 2017), Brian Fuentes (2012, club option 2013) and Kurt Suzuki (2013, club option 2014)...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season...the A's are 5-8 (.385) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 96-62 (.608) in his starting assignments in his career, including 63-39 (.618) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in six of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer nine times...is 42-0 in 59 career starts with run support of four or more.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Is 0-1 with a 6.97 ERA (16 er in 20.2 ip) and .348 (31 for 89) opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 4-2 with a 3.91 ERA and .210 opponents average over his first nine starts

STRIKEOUTS: Has 75 strikeouts since the All-Star Break, which ranks eighth in the American League...has 83 strikeouts in 73.2 innings for the season, an average of 10.14 per nine innings...that is the best mark in the AL among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched and sixth best in the majors...struck out 42 batters in August, which ranked fifth in the AL...it was the most by an Athletic in once month since he also struck out 42 in June, 2008...it was third most in August in Oakland history (Blue, 55 in 1971; Stewart, 44 in 1987)...has two games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and 12 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .284 (48 for 169) with the bases empty and .209 (24 for 115) with runners on...nine of the 14 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots....has allowed a .212 (29 for 137) average against left-handed hitters and .293 (43 for 147) against right-handers...has surrendered 10 of his 14 home runs to righties for a .524 slugging percentage...lefties are slugging .387...has allowed eight of his 14 home runs after his 75th pitch of a game...opponents are 2 for 23 (.087) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: is 2-1 with a 4.02 ERA (18 er in 40.1 ip) and .223 (33 for 148) opponents batting average in seven starts at home and 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA (21 er in 33.1 ip) and .287 (39 for 136) opponents average in six starts on the road...is now 21-11 with a 3.10 ERA (118 er in 342.2 ip) in 58 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.09 ERA (262 er in 576.2) in 110 career appearances in all other parks.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 5.86 ERA (28 er in 43.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-1 with a 3.23 ERA (11 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts on six days rest or more.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-3 with a 6.33 ERA (19 er in 27.0 ip) in five starts against American League West teams and 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA (20 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 941 strikeouts in 919.1 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.21 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 900 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.91)...has a .226 (766 for 3386) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 900 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Lincecum, .222).

WITH THE A'S: Is 40-22 with a 3.58 ERA (245 er in 615.1 ip) in 110 games. 102 starts, in an A's uniform...his .645 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...began his career with the A's in 2003 and was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 ... went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 21/2 seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.



2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against July Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...it was his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008 and his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Texas August

14 in Oakland...did not allow a home run, snapping a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to his final outing of 2010...combined with Bailey and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Toronto **August 19** in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying 11...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 16-inning loss at Cleveland **August 31**...it was his 100th career start as an Athletic and he is the 21st pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had a no decision in the A's 11-6 loss to Kansas City **September 5** in Oakland...struck out 10 batters in 5.0 innings...is just the third pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 or more in 5.0 innings or fewer (Tim Hudson and Kirk Saarloos).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles last Wednesday in Oakland...blanked the Angels on five hits and a hit batter over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the sixth innings...allowed a RBI double to Abreu and a two-run home run to Trumbo and left with one out in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1.

HARDEN vs. TEXAS: Is 5-3 with a 4.78 ERA (75.1 ip, 70 h, 43 r, 40 er, 37 bb, 71 so, 4 hr) in 14 career appearances, 13 starts...that includes 4-1 with a 3.00 ERA (16 er in 48.0 ip) in eight games, seven starts, in Oakland and 1-2 with a 7.90 ERA (24 er in 27.1 ip) in six starts in Texas...is 5-3 with a 4.84 ERA (40 er in 74.1 ip) in his 13 starting assignments...pitched for Texas last year and is 3-4 with a 5.72 ERA (46 er in 72.1 ip) in 16 career appearances at Rangers Ballpark...is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 6 so) in two starts this year...the loss came in a 6-0 decision at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits...then had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss August 14 in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Moreland sacrifice fly...also issued a bases loaded walk to Young in the fourth inning...was relieved by Billings to start the fifth with the A's trailing 4-0...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the fifth and four times in the sixth to get him off the hook.

ORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (9-8, 3.35 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season...is 3-2 with a 2.15 ERA and .196 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is 8-3 with a 3.18 ERA in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in wins since the break...ranks second in the AL with a 4.64 strikeout to walk ratio...the Athletics record (since 1901) is 3.91 by Dan Haren in 2006...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win over Detroit last Thursday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...is 1-4 with a 4.58 ERA in eight career appearances, six starts, against Texas...including 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (21.1 ip, 28 h, 20 r, 12 er, 3 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in four starts this year.

 The A's bullpen has compiled a 6.35 ERA (51 er in 72.1 ip) and .285 (84 for 295) opponents batting average over the last 22 games (since August 25)...now has a 4.87 ERA (98 er in 181.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for second in most losses (24)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (99)...has allowed 69 of 200 (34.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.

Is 20 for 22 (90.9%) in save opportunities on the season, which is the third best percentage in the AL... is 71 for 80 (88.8%) in his career, which is the best mark in Oakland history...ranks sixth on the Oakland career saves list (Isringhausen is 5th, 75). Has allowed at least one run in seven of his last 13 appearances (10 er in 13.1 ip, 6.75 ERA). AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.64) and third in walks per nine innings (1.45)...is on pace to break the all-time Athletic record for strikeout to walk ratio...the current mark is 3.91 by Dan Haren in 2006...currently has the fifth best walk per nine inning mark in Athletics history...also ranks third in the AL in home runs per nine innings (0.52) and fewest pitches per inning (14.8), tied for third in complete games (4) and 10th in on-base percentage (.285).

HOME AND AWAY: is 6-3 with a 2.77 ERA (24 er in 78.0 ip) in 12 starts in Oakland compared to 3-5 with a 3.94 ERA (34 er in 77.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road...has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has allowed a .373 (25 for 67) batting average and four of his nine home runs to the opponents number three hitter.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 5-6 with a 2.73 ERA (27 er in 89.0 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more and 4-2 with a 4.19 ERA (31 er in 66.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest.

BACK-TO-BACK: Tossed back-to-back complete games August 29 and September 3 and is just the second Oakland pitcher to do that over the last seven years (Braden, May 9-14, 2010)...is the first A's right-hander to toss back-to-back complete games since Bobby Witt had three straight (June 23-July 3, 1994)...struck out 10 batters in each start and is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back 10 strikeout games since Mark Mulder (July 24-29, 2003)...is the first righty to do it since Todd Stottlemyre (Sept. 20-26, 1995).

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his fourth complete game of the season September 3 against Seattle, a three-hit shutout...it was his first complete game win...it was the low-hit game of his career and his second career shutout...did not walk a batter and struck out a career high 10 for the second consecutive start...is the 10th pitcher in Oakland history with no walks and 10 or more strikeouts in a complete game...is just the third Athletics pitcher over the last 98 years with a complete game shutout, three or fewer hits, no walks and 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Witt, June 23, 1994 vs. Kansas City; Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota)...had complete game losses April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City and August 29 at Cleveland...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 8-4 with a 3.33 ERA (34 er in 92.0 ip) in 14 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so).


LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Detroit last Thursday in Oakland...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a one-out solo home run to Young in the third inning...walked Cabrera following the home run but then retired 14 of the final 15 batters he faced...the exception was a lead off double by Cabrera in the sixth.

pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when Blake Stein also had 15...the last with more than 15 is Mike Moore, who had 22 in 1992...the 14 losses match Braden's team leading total from last year...the last A's pitcher to lose more than 14 games is Greg Smith (16 in 2008)...his losses are the most by an A's righthander since Tom Candiotti lost 16 games in 1998.

WINS: Has 11 wins this year after winning 18 games a year ago and 10 in his first season in 2009...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 39 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).



CAREER HIGHS: Has career highs this year in strikeouts (139), losses (14), hits (200), earned runs (93) and walks (80) and has matched his bests in games started (32) and runs (99)...his 194.0 innings pitched are 2.2 innings shy of his best from last year

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-8 with a 3.15 ERA (36 er in 103.0 ip) and .249 (96 for 385) opponents batting average in 16 starts at home compared to 5-6 with a 5.64 ERA (57 er in 91.0 ip) and .288 (104 for 361) opponents average in 16 starts on the road...is now 24-18 with a 3.22 ERA (112 er in 312.2 ip) in 49 career starts in Oakland and 15-17 with a 4.84 ERA (138 er in 256.2 ip) in 45 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .176 (15 for 85) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has yielded a .261 (47 for 180) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .311 (42 for 135) over his last 22 starts (since May 25)...has allowed 19 home runs, 13 of which have been hit by left-handed hitters...has surrendered 41 of his 65 career home runs to lefties.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-6 with a 3.61 ERA (35 er in 87.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day and 6-8 with a 4.89 ERA (58 er in 106.2 ip) in 19 starts at night...his career numbers are 14-12 with a 3.36 ERA (76 er in 203.1 ip) in 32 career starts during the day and 25-23 with a 4.28 ERA (174 er in 366.0 ip) in 62 starts at night.

INNING-BY-INNING: Has a 1.69 ERA (6 er in 32.0 ip) and .176 (19 for 108) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 5.12 ERA (80 er in 140.2 ip) and .288 average (161 for 560) in innings two through six and a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) and .256 (20 for 78) average from the seventh inning on.

CAREER TRENDS: Went 10-14 with a 4.80 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over the first 33 starts of his career...then went 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over a 37-start stretch from May 5, 2010 to May 9, 2011...is 5-14 with a 5.27 ERA (83 er in 141.2 ip) and .289 (159 for 551) opponents batting average in 24 starts since then.



CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 9-4 with a 2.69 ERA (90.1 ip, 80 h, 31 r, 27 er, 24 bb, 54 so, 9 hr) in 14 career starts...has no more than four wins against any other team...the only pitcher in Oakland history with more wins against the Texas Rangers is Barry Zito (17)...only Zito, Catfish Hunter (17) and Vida Blue (11) have more wins against the Rangers/Senators in Athletics franchise history...is 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts in Texas and 5-3 with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in eight starts in Oakland...is 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA (34.0 ip, 31 h, 12 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 21 so) in five starts this year...the first win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland April 29...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, scattering seven hits and four walks...also picked up the win in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas May 9...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was the losing pitcher in a 2-0 loss at Texas July 10...allowed a two-out, two-run home run to Beltre in the sixth and Harrison and Lowe combined to shutout the A's on six hits and a walk...also lost in a 7-1 decision in Oakland August 13...retired 15 of the first 16 batters before Torrealba singled with one out in the sixth inning to break up the no-hitter...win number three came in the A's 8-7 win at Texas September 10...Kinsler scored on a wild pitch in the third and he alllowed a two-run double to Moreland in the fourth inning to tie the game...the A's scored five times in the sixth for the win.

.347 opponents slugging percentage, which ranks sixth in the American League...however, leads the American League lead with 86 walks and is tied for eighth with 12 losses.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 181 strikeouts in 186.2 innings...is averaging 8.73 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks fourth in the American League...the Athletics franchise record (since 1901) for strikeouts per nine innings is 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...his 181 strikeouts rank 10th in the AL and are tied for the 10th best single season total in Oakland history...has 495 strikeouts in his career and need five more to become the 21st pitcher in Oakland history with 500 strikeouts.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
