(DET, 14-3) and has won 13 of 19 and 27 of last 41...team is 37-24 (.607) since All-Star break, 3rd-best in A.L., and is 65-42 since May 22.

-At 88-65 (.575), Rangers have the 3rd-best record in A.L., 6th-best in majors...Texas is ${\bf 23}$ games over .500 for the 1st time since the end of the 1999 season (95-67) and just the 3rd season overall in team history: 1999 (high of 31 over) and 1977 (26)...the Rangers have been 20+ games over .500 for each of the last 7 days...club had not been as many as 20 over in any season since 1999...Texas' current record is 2nd-best ever through 153 games behind a 90-63 mark in 1999.

VICTORIES: The 88 wins for Texas in 2011 match 1998 for the 6th most in team history...club posted 89 victories in 2004...over the last 2 seasons, Texas is tied for 4th in the majors with 178 wins (195--PHI; 187--NYY; 181--TB; 178--ATL), the 3rd most in back-to-back years in club history (183 in 1998-99; 181 in 1977-78)...the Rangers have posted 3 consecutive winning seasons, matching longest such streak in franchise history (1977-79 and 1989-91).

ON TOP IN WEST: With the Angels' loss in Toronto on Monday, the Rangers increased their lead in the A.L. West to 5.0 games with 9 to play...it is the club's largest advantage since a 5.0-game margin on Aug. 20...last bigger lead was 6.0 games on Aug. 19...the club has gained 3.5 games in the standings over the last 9 days...club has led by at least 2.0 games for 39 of last 40 days...the 5.0-game margin matches New York's edge over Boston in the A.L. East for the smallest of any division leader in the majors.

--club increased its lead from 1.5 to 7.0 games over a 7-day span from Aug. 11-17 with 7.0-game advantage on Aug. 17 being season-best...lead then fell from 7.0 to 2.0 games over next 8 days from Aug. 18-25.
--Texas has had sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 113 of the last

115 days beginning May 16, including 75 straight days beginning July 6, as Texas has not been out of first since May 15 (-0.5 GB)...team has had at least a share of division lead for 159 of 171 days in 2011, club's 3rd-most days in first ever in a single season behind 179 in 1999 and 177 in 1996...has been in 1st for 277 of 291 days beginning June 8, 2010.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have won consecutive road games for the 1st time since club posted a 7-game away win streak, Aug. 4-17...Texas has won 13 of its last 20 on the road and is 23-15 (.605) away from home since June 17, the 2nd best road winning percentage in the A.L.. in this span behind Detroit at .609 (28-18) and T3rd best in the majors...overall road winning percentage of .520 (39-36) is 6th in A.L....club's best road mark of 2011 is 4 games over .500 twice (33-29 on Aug. 17; 34-30 on Aug. 19).

ON TO OAKLAND: Texas is 11-5 against the A's this season, winning 10 of the last 11 beginning May 10...club has won more than 11 in a season vs. Oakland only twice ever in a year, 13-2 in 1977 and 12-7 in 2008...the Rangers are 14-5 in the series beginning Sept. 24, 2010...the Rangers are 4-3 at the Coliseum, sweeping 3 games in their last visit, August 12-14...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 305-291 overall with Oakland holding a 155-142 edge at the Coliseum.

VS. A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 32-16 (.667) vs. A.L. West opponents this season, winning 12 of 16, 14 of 19, and 26 of last 34 games, the longer span beginning May 15...it is the 3rd best record by a club vs. a single division behind: .719 (23-9) by Philadelphia vs. the N.L. West and .687 (46-21) by Detroit vs. the A.L. Central...Texas' best record ever vs. the West was a 47-31 (.603) mark in 1986...Texas is 15-9 in A.L. West parks in 2011, winning 13 of 17 since the All-Star break...club was 32-25 vs. A.L. West, 14-14 on road, in 2010.

SEPTEMBER STREAKS: The Rangers are 11-5 (.688) this month, tving the Giants (11-5) for the 3rd best September winning percentage behind .824 (14-3) for Detroit and .706 (12-5) for St. Louis...Texas leads the majors with a .319 (184-576) batting average, a .377 OBP, a .554 SLG PCT, and 31 homers in the month and is 3rd with 112 runs, one back of Boston and Detroit...current winning percentage would be the club's 2nd highest ever for September behind .704 (19-8) in 1979...highest team AVG for September is .315 in 1999.

SHUTOUTS: The 3-0 win in Seattle on Sunday was the Rangers' 19th shutout of 2011, 2nd most in the majors to Philadelphia (21) and 2 more than the previous club record set in 1977...it matches the 2nd highest total in the A.L. since the advent of the DH in 1973, most since Oakland's 19 in 2002:

MIKE NAPOLI has hit safely in his last 6 overall games at .545 (12-22) and in 10 of 11 (all 10 starts) at .526 (20-38) with 4 HR and 9 RBI...Mike leads the majors with a .465 (20-43) average in September and has A.L.'s best average since ASB at .385 (72-187), 2nd in ML to SD's Nick Hundley at .387 (41-106). -Napoli caught his 10th shutout Sunday and lowered the team ERA with him behind the plate to 3.22, 3rd lowest in the majors (50 or more G) behind SF's Chris Stewart (2.51) and PHI's Carlos Ruiz (3.22)...club record for lowest catchers ERA (50+ G) is Jim Sundberg with a 3.24 mark in 131 games in 1983

MICHAEL'S MILESTONES: Michael Young has 102 RBI and 40 doubles in 2011...it marks his 2nd 100 RBI season (103 in 2006) and his 3rd campaign with 40+ doubles (52 in 2006; 40 in 2005)...Young needs 2 hits for his 6th season with 200+ hits...he would become the 16th player in ML history with as many as 6 200-hit seasons, the 3rd active player (Ichiro-10; Jeter-7).

ELVIS ANDRUS hit safely in a season high 12 straight games, matching Prince Fielder for the 3rd longest current hitting streak in the majors behind 14 games for Magglio Ordonez and 13 games for the injured Buster Posey

STILL SCORELESS: Neftali Feliz converted save opportunities on Sat. and Sun. after just one save try in his previous 25 games...he has a 0.48 ERA (1 ER/18.2 IP) in 23 games vs. A.L. West this season, converting all 11 save tries...lifetime, Feliz is 3-0, 1.31 (8 ER/55.0 IP) with 25 saves in 26 tries over 54 games vs. the A.L. West...his composite career ERA in 3 A.L. West parks is 0.39 (1 ER/23.1 IP) in 23 games, 12-12 in save tries...has a string of 21.0 straight scoreliss innings in A.L. West parks since Adam Kennedy's HR on Aug. 5, 2009 here in Oakland, Feliz' 2nd ML appearance.
--Feliz has held Seattle hitless in 45 at bats in his career, the longest such

streak for a ML pitcher to start a career since Pittsburgh was 0-for-48 off Billy Wagner from 1996-2001 (Elias Sports Bureau).

SHORTS: The Sept. 24 game with Seattle in Arlington has been moved from 7:05 to 3:11 p.m. to accommodate a FOX national telecast...Rangers bullpen has retired the last 24 batters faced with 14 strikeouts since Cleveland's Lou Marson had a 9th inning 2B on Sept. 15... Texas has been successful on last 10 steal tries since Elvis Andrus was caught on Sept. 7 at Tampa Bay...Texas leads the A.L. with 157 double plays turned, 2nd in majors (STL-159)...Matt Harrison and C.J. Wilson have each induced 30 GIDPs, tying club record held by Rick Honeycutt (1983) and Kevin Brown (1991)...the Rangers are 12-4 when playing after an off day this season, winning the last 4.

TONIGHT: The 24-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 31st start and appearance Tuesday night's game in Oakland...enters the game having made 4 consecutive quality starts for the first time in his career...was the starter and winner in the Rangers' 9-1 victory over Cleveland on Wednesday...has won 3 straight decisions and is 8-1, 2.74 (26 ER/85.1 IP) in his last 13 starts beginning July 7 to drop season ERA from 5.10 to 4.02, lowest figure since his 3rd start of the year (3.66 thru 4/16 at NYY)...has 5 scoreless outings of at least 6.0 IP in...is set to work on extra rest for the 2nd straight outing and is 8-4 with a 4.97 ERA (49 ER/88.2 IP) in 15 starts on extra rest this season..Holland has started 6 of the team's 18 SHO and is T2nd in the majors with CG SHO...Rangers have scored a first-inning run in 14 of his last 21 starts...has departed with Texas ahead or tied in 21 of his 30 starts (17-13 record overall)...made an Opening Day roster for the first time in his career.

OF LATE: His 2.74 ERA beginning July 7 ranks 3rd-best in the A.L. in that span (minimum 10 starts) behind only DET's Verlander (2.32) and TB's Hellickson (2.49)...only A.L. pitcher with more wins beginning July 7 is Verlander (13-1)...the 8 wins are T4th-most in majors in that

CAREER YEAR: Has established career highs in wins (14), starts (30), innings (186.0), and strikeouts (148)...entering this season, had 6 quality starts in his first 31 starting assignments, but has 18 QS in his 30 starts in '11...HR allowed per 9 innings in 2009-10: 1.47...HR per 9 in 2011: 0.87...has allowed a .331 OBP and .398 SLG this season, besting his career figures entering '11: .330 and .398.

SHUTOUTS: Has 4 shutouts, tied with TB's James Shields for A.L. lead, as Holland, Shields and PHI's Cliff Lee (6) are only ML pitchers with that many blankings in '11...the 4 CG SHO are a single-season club record for a lefty, and rank T5th-most in Texas history (1972-2011), most since Doc Medich had 4 SHO in 1981...only Rangers with more SHO in a season: Fergie Jenkins (6 in '74), Bert Blyleven (6 in '76, 5 in '77), and Jim Bibby (5 in '74)...has 5 CG

- SHO in his career, T2nd-most ever by a Ranger lefty behind only Kenny Rogers (6).

 Had SHO in consecutive starts July 7-14, this after lasting less than 1.0 inning in his prior outing on July 2...according to Elias, was just 3rd ML pitcher from 1947-2011 to go less than 1.0 inning in a start and then throw shutouts in next 2 straight, only A.L. pitcher in that span to do it...the others: Pirates' Woodie Fryman (3 straight SHO, June 26-July 1-July 5, 1966) and Giants' Ed Halicki (2, July 11-16, 1976).
- At 24 years of age, became youngest pitcher w/ 4 SHO in a season since Dontrelle Willis (23) had 5 SHO for '05 Marlins when he finished 2nd in Cy Young voting (age as of 6/30).

WEDNESDAY'S SCHEDULED STARTER: LHP C.J. Wilson (16-7, 2.97 ERA in 32 games/starts)

The 30-year-old All-Star left-hander is scheduled to make his 33rd start in the middle game of this series tomorrow...has allowed 2 ER-or-less in 8 of 9 starts since the beginning of August, going 6-2 with a 1.93 ERA (13 ER/60.2 IP) in that span...opponents batting just .208 (46-221) in that stretch with 16 walks and 61 strikeouts...has 4 straight starts of 6.0+ innings while allowing 2 ER-or-less, his second such streak in '11...only other A.L. pitchers with multiple streaks of that kind are Ricky Romero (3), Max Scherzer, Jered Weaver, James Shields, and Gio Gonzalez (2 each)...took loss in last start on Fri. at SEA, a 4-0 Texas defeat to begin this road trip (6.1 IP, 6 H, 4 F.1 ER/2 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 116 pitches/70 strikes)...only earned run allowed was Casper Wells solo HR in the 7th...M's scored 3 unearned runs in a Murphy's Law 3rd inning after a Kinsler throwing error in that frame that would have been the 3rd out...the frame also included an infield hit and a hit that would have ended the inning before going off the 2nd base bag...his 2.31 ERA (29 ER/113.0 IP) on the road is lowest in the A.L. and 3rd-lowest in the majors behind Lincecum (2.02) and Shaun Marcum (2.31)...current 2.31 figure would be 3rd-lowest road ERA in club history for a season behind only Blyleven (1.95 in 1977) and Gaylord Perry (2.24 in 1977)...is 3-2, 3.09 (12 ER/35.0 IP) in 5 starts against A's this season, having won 3 straight with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP) in those games...is 1-1 in his 2 starts in Oakland this season despite 2 quality starts and 2.08 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) here in '11...since joining rotation last season, Wilson is 4-2, 3.02 (16 ER/47.2 IP) in 7 starts vs. Oakland...seeking his 17th win...beginning 2000, the only Rangers to reach 17 wins were Kenny Rogers (18 in 2004) and Scott Feldman (17 in 2009)...Rogers is the only Texas lefty ever with a 17-win season, having done it twice (also 17 wins in 1995).
