-At 89-65 (.578), Rangers is tied with Detroit for 2nd best record in A.L., T4thbest in majors...Texas is **24 games over .500 for the 1st time since the end of the 1999 season** (95-67) and just the 3rd season overall in team history: 1999 (high of 31 over) and 1977 (26)...the Rangers have been 20+ games over .500 for each of the last 8 days...club had not been as many as 20 over in any season since 1999...Texas' current record is 2nd-best ever through 154 games behind a 91-63 mark in 1999.

<u>VICTORIES:</u> The 89 wins for Texas in 2011 match 2004 for the 5th most in team history...club has won 90+ games in a season 4 times: 95--1999; 94--1977; 90--1996 and 2010...over the last 2 seasons, Texas is tied for 4th in the majors with 179 wins (195--PHI; 188--NYY; 181--TB; 179--ATL), the 3rd most in back-to-back years in club history (183 in 1998-99; 181 in 1977-78)...the Rangers have posted 3 consecutive winning seasons, matching longest such streak in franchise history (1977-79 and 1989-91).

ON TOP IN WEST: On Tuesday, the Rangers maintained their 5.0-game lead in the A.L. West for 2nd straight day with 8 to play...it is the club's largest advantage since a 5.0-game margin on Aug. 20...last bigger lead was 6.0 games on Aug. 19...the club has gained 3.5 games in the standings over the last 10 days...club has led by at least 2.0 games for 40 of last 41 days...the 5.5-game

margin is the smallest of any division leader in the majors.
--Texas has had sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 114 of the last 116 days beginning May 16, including 76 straight days beginning July 6, as Texas has not been out of first since May 15 (-0.5 GB)...team has had at least a share of division lead for 160 of 172 days in 2011, club's 3rd-most days in first ever in a single season behind 179 in 1999 and 177 in 1996...has been in 1st for 278 of 292 days beginning June 8, 2010.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have won 3 straight and 14 of the last 21 on the road...club is 24-15 (.615) away from home since June 17, the 2nd best road winning percentage in the ML behind Philadelphia at .667 (30-15)...overall road winning percentage of .526 (40-36) is 6th in A.L....current mark matches team's best road record of the year at 4 games over .500, the 3rd time (33-29 on Aug. 17; 34-30 on Aug. 19)...club was last as many as 5 games over .500 on the road on Sept. 5, 2006 (37-32).

AGAINST THE A'S: Texas is 12-5 vs. Oakland this season, winning the last 2 and 11 of the last 12 beginning May 10...the 12 wins match 2nd most ever vs. the A's in a season, 13-2 in 1977 and 12-7 in 2008...the Rangers are 15-5 in the series beginning Sept. 24, 2010...the Rangers are 5-3 at the Coliseum, winning the last 4 since a defeat on May 1...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 306-291 overall with Oakland holding a 155-143 edge at the Coliseum.

--the club record for most wins in a single season vs. an opponent is 13 done 3 times: against Chicago in 1975, Oakland in 1977, and Seattle in 2005.

VS. A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 33-16 (.673) vs. A.L. West opponents this season, winning 6 of 8, 13 of 17, 15 of 20, and 27 of last 35 games, the longer span beginning May 15...it is the 3rd best record by a club vs. a single division behind: .719 (23-9) by Philadelphia vs. the N.L. West and .676 (46-22) by Detroit vs. the A.L. Central...Texas' best record ever vs. the West was a 47-31 (.603) mark in 1986...Texas is 16-9 in A.L. West parks in 2011, winning 14 of 18 since the All-Star break...club was 32-25 vs. A.L. West, 14-14 on road, in 2010.

SEPTEMBER STREAKS: The Rangers are 12-5 (.706) this month, the 3rd best September winning percentage in the majors behind .778 (14-4) for Detroit and .722 (13-5) for St. Louis...Texas leads the majors with a .321 (198-616) batting average, a .379 OBP, a .550 SLG PCT, 119 runs, and 32 homers in the month...club's highest winning percentage ever for September is .704 (19-8) in 1979...highest team batting average for September is .315 in 1999.

BIG SPREAD: Of the Rangers last 27 games beginning August 21, 23 have been decided by at least 3 runs.

200 HITS FOR YOUNG: Michael Young had 3 hits on Tuesday to give him 201 in 2011, his 6th career 200-hit season, 1st since 2007...Young becomes just the 16th player in major league history to produce 200+ hits at least 6 times, joining Ichiro (10) and Derek Jeter (7) as the only active players to accomplish it:

-Michael also has a career high 104 RBI (103 in 2006) and 40 doubles...he had 217 hits, 52 2B, and 103 RBI in 2006 and is just the 5th player since 1960 with more than one season of 200+ hits, 40+ 2B, and 100+ RBI (Mattingly-3; Helton, Al Oliver, Ripken-2 each)...only other such seasons in Rangers history are Buddy Bell in 1979 and Ruben Sierra in 1991.
--this is the 13th time a Ranger has had 200 hits in a season with Young being

the only player to do it more than once.

-Young now has 3+ hits in a game 25 times in 2011, matching Adrian Gonzalez for most in majors and a club record, one more than Josh Hamilton's 2010 total.

BELTRE IS BASHING: Adrian Beltre has homered in 3 straight and 7 of his last 9 games with 8 total HR in that span...he is the 1st Ranger to hit as many as 8 HR in a 9-game span since Rafael Palmeiro had 8 HR/9 GM,, Aug. 18-27, 1999...it is the most HR in a 9game span in Beltre's career...he has 16 RBI in his last 10 games and **leads the majors in RBI (21) and is T1st in HR (8) in September**...Beltre has hit safely in 16 of 17 games at .357 (25-70) with 8 HR and 21 RBI since being activated from 15-day DL on September 1

MIKE NAPOLI has hit safely in his last 7 overall games at .560 (14-25) and in 11 of last 12 (all 11 starts) at .537 (22-41) with 4 HR and 9 RBI...he leads the majors in both batting since the All-Star break at .389 (74-190) and in September at .478 (22-46)...the Rangers have won the last 7 games with Napoli behind the plate and are 38-15 (.716) in his catching starts in 2011.

ELVIS ANDRUS hit safely in a season high 13 straight games, matching the injured Buster Posey for the 2nd longest current hitting streak in the majors behind 14 games for Magglio Ordonez...it is one shy of Andrus' career high, set from Aug. 8-24, 2010.

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Derek Holland alowed one run in his 7.0 innings on Tuesday, the 32nd time in 2011 that a Texas starter has worked at least 7.0 innings and allowed one or no runs...Texas starters did that just 23 times in all of 2010...The Rangers' 71 starting wins are tied with Milwaukee for 2nd most in the majors, 2 behind Philadelphia and match the 3rd most in club history (75--1996; 72--1974; 71--1968)...Texas is tied with Tampa Bay for the A.L. lead with 94 quality starts, 5th most in team history and most since 1992 (95)...the team's current starters' ERA of 3.67 would be team's best since 1983 (3.34).

MORE HOLLAND: With his victory last night, Derek became just the 5th different Texas lefthander to ever win as many as 15 games in a season, joining Kenny Rogers (3), C.J. Wilson (2), Jon Matlack (1), and Frank Tanana (1)...at 24 years, 344 days, Holland is the youngest pitcher in franchise history to ever record his 15th victory...Holland has 8 wins since the All-Star Break, tying Brandon McCarthy and Ivan Nova for 2nd in the A.L. behind Justin Verlander (12)...with Wilson's 16 victories, this is 1st time that Texas has had pair of pitchers with at least 15 wins since 2006 (Kevin Millwood-16; Vicente Padilla-15).

C.J.'S K'S: C.J. Wilson is 2 strikeouts shy of becoming the 1st Texas pitcher to fan 200 batters in a season since Nolan Ryan in 1991...his 198 K's are the 7th highest total in club history and most by a lefthander: 301--Nolan Ryan, 1989; 232--Ryan, 1990; 225--Ferguson Jenkins, 1974; 223--Charlie Hough, 1987; 221--Bobby Witt, 1990; 203--Ryan, 1991.

SHORTS: The Rangers bullpen had retired 27 straight batters before Coco Crisp's leadoff HR in the 9th inning on Tuesday...Tuesday's win was the Rangers' 500th in the regular season since the start of 2006...Texas leads the A.L. with 158 double plays turned, 2nd in majors (STL-159)...club has committed errors in just 7 of the last 28 games beginning August 20...Esteban German is expected to rejoin the Rangers this weekend...he returned to his home in the Dominican Republic on Saturday due to the passing of his mother

#36 C.J. Wilson, LHP (16-7, 2.97)

TONIGHT: The 30-year-old All-Star left-hander is scheduled to make his 33rd start in the middle ...has allowed 2 ER-or-less in 8 of 9 starts since beginning of August, going 6-2 w/ a 1.93 ERA (13 ER/60.2 IP) in that span...opponents batting just .208 (46-221) in that stretch with 16 walks and 61 K's...has 4 straight starts of 6.0+ innings while allowing 2 ER-orless, his second such streak in '11...has allowed just one earned run his last 3 starts (2-1, 0.39 $\,$ 1 ER/23.1 IP), dropping season figure from 3.28 to 2.97, lowest since July 21 (2.94)...ranks among A.L. leaders in wins (T4th, 16), ERA (6th, 2.97), strikeouts (6th, 198), winning pct. (7th, .696), and innings (9th, 215.1)...took loss in last start on Fri. at SEA, a 4-0 Texas defeat...has induced 30 GDP's in 2011, tied with teammate Matt Harrison for ML lead, and tied for most in Texas history...will be working on regular 4 days' rest for 8th consecutive start, going 11-7, 2.96 (47 ER/142.2 IP) in 21 starts on normal rest in 2011...team is 19-13 in his 32 starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Needs 2 K's for his first career 200-strikeout season, which would be first such effort by a Ranger since Nolan Ryan's 203 K's in 1991...would be just the 5th pitcher in Texas history with a 200-K campaign (first lefty), the 7th overall instance for the Rangers...others: Ryan (3, 1989-90-91), Bobby Witt (1990), Charlie Hough (1987), Ferguson Jenkins (1974).

STARTS AND INNINGS: Is looking to match his career high in starts tonight (33 in 2010)...joins Colby Lewis ('10-'11) as the only Rangers with back-to-back 30-start seasons since Kevin Millwood in 2006-07...the last Texas lefty to do it was Kenny Rogers in 2004-05...Wilson has become the first lefty in Texas history to eclipse 200.0 IP in consecutive seasons, something no Ranger had done since Rick Helling in 2000-01...his 215.1 innings are already a career high.

WINNING GAME PLAN: Seeking his 17th win tonight...beginning 2000, the only Rangers to reach 17 wins were Kenny Rogers (18 in 2004) and Scott Feldman (17 in 2009)...Rogers is the only Texas lefty ever with a 17-win season, having done it twice (also 17 wins in 1995)...has already posted his 2nd consecutive 15-win season, something no Ranger had done since Aaron Sele in 1998-99...Wilson is also just the 6th pitcher and first lefty in club history with consecutive 15-win campaigns...Texas has won 43 of the southpaw's 65 starts (43-22) since the beginning of 2010 and 31 of his last 47 starts beginning July 18, 2010; the 43 wins are 4thmost by any ML team in an individual pitcher's starts since the beginning of 2010...in the same span, the Phillies are 45-19 in Roy Halladay's starts, the Yankees are 44-22 in C.C. Sabathia's starts, and the Tigers are 46-20 in Justin Verlander's starts.

ELITE COMPANY?: Wilson enters tonight with a 1.175 WHIP figure...seeking to compile 3rd season in club history for a Texas pitcher to have 200+ innings, 200+ strikeouts, 16+ wins, and a WHIP of 1.200 or less...the other such seasons by Rangers were authored by 2 Hall of ers: Fergie Jenkins in 1974 and Nolan Ryan in 1989.

<u>LEADERBOARD:</u> Wilson leads Texas staff with 16 wins, one of Rangers' ML-best 5 pitchers with 13+ wins...ranks among A.L. leaders in wins (T4th, 16), ERA (6th, 2.97), strikeouts (6th, 198), winning pct. (7th, .696), and innings (9th, 215.1)...his team-best 2.97 ERA ranks as lowest by any A.L. lefty, 4th among ML lefties behind only Kershaw (2.27), Lee (2.38), and Hamels (2.80)...his 20 steals are T11th-most allowed in A.L., most by any A.L. lefty and 3rd-most by any southpaw in the majors behind Dodgers' Ted Lilly (33) and Phillies' Cole Hamels (21).

LAST START: Took loss in last start on Fri. at SEA, a 4-0 Texas defeat to begin this road trip (6.1 IP, 6 H, 4 R-1 ER/2 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 116 pitches/70 strikes)...only earned run allowed was Casper Wells solo HR in the 7th...M's scored 3 unearned runs in a Murphy's Law 3rd inning after a Kinsler throwing error in that frame that would have been the 3rd out...the frame also included an infield hit and a "hit" that would have ended the inning but struckthe 2nd base bag to elude Elvis Andrus and extend the inning.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-2, 3.09 (12 ER/35.0 IP) in 5 starts against A's this season, having won 3 straight with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP) in those games...Texas has scored at least 8 runs in each of those 3 starts...will be facing the Swingin' A's for 6th time in as many series in '11...is 1-1 in his 2 starts in Oakland this season despite 2 quality starts and 2.08 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) here in '11...since joining rotation last season, Wilson is 4-2, 3.02 (16 ER/47.2 IP) in 7 starts vs. Oakland...tossed 8.0 SHO innings in last start vs. A's on 9/11 in Arlington

ON THE ROAD: His 2.31 ERA (29 ER/113.0 IP) on the road is lowest in the A.L. and 3rd-low est in the majors behind Lincecum (2.06) and Shaun Marcum (2.21)...current 2.31 figure would be 3rd-lowest road ERA in club history for a season behind only Blyleven (1.95 in 1977) and Gaylord Perry (2.24 in 1977)...is 8-5, 2.31 in 16 road starts, having won 3 of last 4 decisions...has allowed one-or-zero earned runs in 6 of last 7 road outings...has quality starts in 4 of 5 road losses in 2011...has permitted more than 3 runs in just 3 of 16 road starts.

ALL-STAR: Wilson was named to his first All-Star team prior to his start on July 3 as one of 7 manager's selections by A.L. skipper Ron Washington...Wilson worked the 4th inning and took the loss in a 5-1 defeat to the N.L., allowing 2 singles to Carlos Beltran and Matt Kemp ahead of Prince Fielder's 3-run homer (1.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R-ER, 1 HR, 0 BB, 1 SO, 22 pitches/14 strikes).

JUNE BOON: Was voted the Rangers Player of the Month for June after going 3-0 with a 2.72 ERA (11 ER/36.1 IP) over 5 starts...had 2nd-most homerless innings of any ML pitcher in June (Cliff Lee, 0 HR in 42.0 IP)...in 10 June starts in 2009-10, went 6-0, 2.90 ERA (22 ER/68.1 IP).

STRIKEOUTS: Has posted 6 games of 10+ strikeouts this season, a club record for a left-hander in a single season (previous Cliff Lee, 3 in 2010)...became just the 2nd pitcher in Texas history to have 4 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in a season before June 1...the other?: Nolan Ryan in 1989 (6)...club record for a single season is 18 by Ryan in 1989, although 2nd-highest total in Rangers history (8 by Ryan in 1990) is within reach...Wilson had 3 games of 10+ K's in May, joining Colby Lewis (3 10-K games in April '10) as only Texas pitchers with 3 such games in a month since Nolan Ryan in Sept. '90 (3).

2011: Team is 19-13 in his 32 starts, with Wilson taking decisions in 23 of those...batterymates: Torrealba (20 starts), Napoli (8), Teagarden (3), Treanor (1)...baserunners 20-for-26 in steal attempts...club record for most steals allowed by a lefty in one season: 22, Jon Matlack in 1980...has tossed at least 6.0 frames in 27 of 32 starts, with at least 7.0 IP 18 times...has permitted 16 HR this season, 6 more than his total for all of 2010 (10)...no HR in 22 of his 32

THURSDAY'S SCHEDULED STARTER: RHP Colby Lewis (13-10, 4.45 ERA in 30 games/starts)

The 31-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 31st start in Thursday afternoon's series finale here in Oakland...earned his career-best 13th win in a 7-6 victory over the Mariners afeco Field, surpassing his previous high from 2010 (12-13)...was unabled to get through 6.0 full innings and was charged with all 6 runs (5.2 IP, 8 H, 6 R-ER, 1 HR BB, 7 SO, 94 pitches/66 strikes), but still exited ahead 7-6 before turning things over to the Texas bullpen...was tagged for 4 runs on 4 hits in the second and also allowed a 2-run HR to Mike Carp in the fifth...4 Rangers relievers combined for 3.1 scoreless frames, retiring all 10 batters faced, including 6 by way of the strikeout...Lewis has won 2 straight starts with the help of 15 combined runs of support, going 2-2 over his last 5 trips to the mound, but is carrying a 7.94 ERA (25 ER/28.1 IP) in that 5-start span to rise from 3.83 to 4.45, highest since June 17 (4.80)...will be starting on regular 4 days' rest for the 16th time in 2011, going 4-6, 4.61 (49 ER/95.2 IP) in 15 previous outings (9-4, 4.29 ERA in 15 starts on 5+ days rest)...is 8-5, 3.40 (36 ER/95.1 IP) in 15 road starts this season, allowing more than 4 ER on just 2 occasions, incl. his start Saturday in Seattle...has won 5 of his last 6 decisions away from Arlington...slated for his 6th start against Oakland this season, going a perfect 4-0 with a 2.83 ERA (11 ER/35.0 IP) in 5 previous tilts...his 4 victories are T2nd-most ever in a single season against the A's since they moved to Oakland in '68, as Lewis looks to join former Ranger Fergie Jenkins (5-0, 0.60 ERA in '74) as the only pitchers to do so 5 times in a single campaign...is 5-2, 2.70 (20 ER/66.2 IP) in 22 games/8 starts here at the Oakland Coliseum, incl. wins in 3 straight outings, going 3-1, 2.23 (8 ER/32.1 IP) in 5 starts over the past 2 seasons for Texas (2010-11)...club is 16-14 in his 30 starts this season.
