A's vs. RANGERS

The A's have lost the season series for the fifth time in the last six years as they trail 5-13...the 13 losses equal the A's most ever against the Texas Rangers (1977)...the Oakland record for most losses against any team is 14 (Seattle, 2009; Seattle, 2007; Minnesota, 1973)...have lost 12 of the last 13 games to the Rangers...went 2-7 in Texas and are 3-6 in Oakland...the seven losses in Texas matched the A's most ever in Texas (1977, 1968) and the six losses in Oakland also match their most (five times)...the A's are batting .204 (119 for 583) against the Rangers...Oakland's lowest average ever against the Rangers is .204 in 1990...are 50-63 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 291-307 alltime against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-144 in Oakland and 136-163 in Texas...have an all-time record of 388-389 against the against Rangers/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jemile Weeks leads AL rookies in triples (8), is tied for second in stolen bases (21) and ranks third in hits (112) and doubles (23).

Josh Willingham has career highs in home runs (27) and RBI (92)...the RBI are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals an AL record six bases for the second time in 11 days...in **1913** 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...in **1970** Joe Rudi has five hits in five at bats in a 5-3 loss to Minnesota...in **1989** Dave Stewart pitches seven innings in the A's 5-2 win at Minnesota to win his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career...it is his third consecutive 20 win season...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties a ML record by homering twice in the 5th inning of the A's 13-11 win at Seattle...the second homer is a grand slam and his 52nd and final of the season.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and six of the last eight games to fall a season-low 17 games under .500...this marks just the second time over the last 14 years the A's have been 17 games under .500 (59-76 on September 4, 2009)...have not been more than 17 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under .500...that was the last time the A's finished a season more than 14 games under .500...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish without a winning record, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 75-79 is on pace to be the fourth)...the A's are 9-10 in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...there have been just three seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not post a winning record in any month (1979, 1982 and 1997)...are 30-33 (.476) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 47-66 (.416) since the....have spent 60 of the last 61 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 94 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 28-23 (.549) record on the weekend (15-12 on Saturday, 13-11 on Sunday) compared to 41-63 (.394) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with Bob Melvin...Melvin was given a three-year contract through the 2014 season yesterday.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 18-25 (.419) in one-run games with the loss last night, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...the 25 one-run losses are the most by an A's team since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games, tied for second in losses and have the fourth worst record...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-28 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (67 for 313) with 27 runs scored over the last 10 games (2.70 runs per game)...have scored 619 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are averaging 3.99 runs per game, which is currently sixth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since the 1979 club averaged 3.54...were shutout for the 15th time on Sunday, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 18)...it is also third most in Oakland history and is the most since the 1979 club was blanked 17 times...the record is 19 in 1978...have hit 107 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...it is currently the third lowest total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1978 club hit 100...the fourth lowest total is 108 in 1979 and the fifth lowest is 109 last year...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.369), which matches the lowest mark by an A's team over the last 29 years (.242 in 2008)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.313) and have not finished with a mark under .318 since 1982 (.309)...are hitting .306 (169 for 553) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star Break after hitting .239 before the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 122 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (130)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...the last time the A's led the American League in errors was 1998 (141)...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is also tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 81 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff recorded two strikeouts last night and now has 1117 for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...that is seven short of the Athletics franchise (since 1901) record of 1124 set in 2009...has a 4.71 ERA (294 er in 561.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...was leading the AL in ERA at the break but has the fifth highest post-break ERA...now has a 3.77 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.381), the second fewest home runs (130) and ranks third in pickoffs (19)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.76 ERA (394 er in 942.2 ip), which is fourth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-6 on the final homestand of the season, a 10-game stand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (2-2) and Texas (0-2)...went 4-2 on the last homestand and are 42-38 (.525) at home for the season...have clinched a winning record at home for the second consecutive season...went 1-2 on the last road trip to Texas and are 27-48 (.360) on the road, which is the worst mark in the AL...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 48 road losses match the most by an A's team over the last 13 years (also 2008)...finish the season with a six-game road trip to Los Angeles (three games) and Seattle (three games)...are batting .250 (649 for 2601) at home and .239 (627 for 2618) on the road...have a 3.19 ERA (258 er in 720.9 ip) at home compared to 4.41 (322 er in 657.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.11).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 8-10 in this stretch that began September 2 and concludes today where they played 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception was the three-game series at Texas September 9-11...prior to that, had a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract for 2012 and beyond: Brett Anderson (2013, club options for 2014 and 2015), Grant Balfour (2012, club option 2013), Trevor Cahill (2015, club options 2016 and 2017), Brian Fuentes (2012, club option 2013) and Kurt Suzuki (2013, club option 2014)...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012...five players are eligible for free agency (Crisp, DeJesus, Harden, Matsui and Willingham) and seven more are eligible for arbitration (Bailey, Barton, Braden Breslow, Devine, McCarthy and Sweeney)...the A's top candidates to gain arbitration eligibility under Super Two status are Rosales (2 years, 171 days at end of season), Gonzalez (2 years, 162 days) and Powell (2 years, 144 days).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 33rd start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 13-19 (.406) in his starting assignments this year and are 49-45 (.521) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 32 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 3-7 with a 6.58 ERA (49 er in 67.0 ip) and .315 (87 for 276) opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...has the second highest post-break ERA in the majors (Penny, DET 6.65) and is tied for second in losses (Lowe, ATL 9).

6-0 THEN 5-14: Is 5-14 with a 5.27 ERA (83 er in 141.2 ip) and .289 (159 for 551) opponents batting average over his last 24 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but leads the majors in losses since May 15

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in wild pitches (15), third in walks (80) and tied for fourth in losses (14) and stolen bases allowed (27)...the 27 stolen bases are the most allowed by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded 32 in 1987...the 15 wild

pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when Blake Stein also had 15...the last with more than 15 is Mike Moore, who had 22 in 1992...the 14 losses match Braden's team leading total from last year...the last A's pitcher to lose more than 14 games is Greg Smith (16 in 2008)...his losses are the most by an A's right-hander since Tom Candiotti lost 16 games in 1998.

WINS: Has 11 wins this year after winning 18 games a year ago and 10 in his first season in 2009...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 39 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

CAREER HIGHS: Has career highs this year in strikeouts (139), losses (14), hits (200), earned runs (93) and walks (80) and has matched his bests in games started (32) and runs (99)...his 194.0 innings pitched are 2.2 innings shy of his best from last year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-8 with a 3.15 ERA (36 er in 103.0 ip) and .249 (96 for 385) opponents batting average in 16 starts at home compared to 5-6 with a 5.64 ERA (57 er in 91.0 ip) and .288 (104 for 361) opponents average in 16 starts on the road...is now 24-18 with a 3.22 ERA (112 er in 312.2 ip) in 49 career starts in Oakland and 15-17 with a 4.84 ERA (138 er in 256.2 ip) in 45 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .176 (15 for 85) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is third lowest in the American League...has yielded a .261 (47 for 180) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .311 (42 for 135) over his last 22 starts (since May 25)...has allowed 19 home runs, 13 of which have been hit by left-handed hitters...has surrendered 41 of his 65 career home runs to lefties.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-6 with a 3.61 ERA (35 er in 87.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day and 6-8 with a 4.89 ERA (58 er in 106.2 ip) in 19 starts at night...his career numbers are 14-12 with a 3.36 ERA (76 er in 203.1 ip) in 32 career starts during the day and 25-23 with a 4.28 ERA (174 er in 366.0 ip) in 62 starts at night.

INNING-BY-INNING: Has a 1.69 ERA (6 er in 32.0 ip) and .176 (19 for 108) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 5.12 ERA (80 er in 140.2 ip) and .288 average (161 for 560) in innings two through six and a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) and .256 (20 for 78) average from the seventh inning on.

CAREER TRENDS: Went 10-14 with a 4.80 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over the first 33 starts of his career...then went 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over a 37-start stretch from May 5, 2010 to May 9, 2011...is 5-14 with a 5.27 ERA (83 er in 141.2 ip) and .289 (159 for 551) opponents batting average in 24 starts since then.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Detroit last Friday...the A's scored a run in the first inning but he allowed a RBI single to Kelly in the third inning...also allowed a RBI triple to Peralta in the sixth and a solo home run to Kelly in the seventh.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 9-4 with a 2.69 ERA (90.1 ip, 80 h, 31 r, 27 er, 24 bb, 54 so, 9 hr) in 14 career starts...has no more than four wins against any other team...the only pitcher in Oakland history with more wins against the Texas Rangers is Barry Zito (17)...only Zito, Catfish Hunter (17) and Vida Blue (11) have more wins against the Rangers/Senators in Athletics franchise history...is 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts in Texas and 5-3 with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in eight starts in Oakland...is 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA (34.0 ip, 31 h, 12 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 21 so) in five starts this year...the first win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland April 29...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, scattering seven hits and four walks...also picked up the win in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas May 9...the Rangers scored their only run off him on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was the losing picker in a 2-0 loss at Texas July 10...allowed a two-out, two-run home run to Beltre in the sixth and Harrison and Lowe combined to shutout the A's on six hits and a walk...also lost in a 7-1 decision in Oakland August 13...retired 15 of the first 16 batters before Torrealba singled with one out in the sixth inning to break up the no-hitter...win number three came in the A's 8-7 win at Texas September 10...Kinsler scored on a wild pitch in the third and he alllowed a two-run double to Moreland in the fourth inning to tie the game...the A's scored five times in the sixth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER



OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed just one hit in his last start and has allowed three hits or fewer in eight of his 20 starts...since 1990, the only Oakland pitcher to have that many starts with three hits or fewer in a season is Tim Hudson, who also had eight in 2000...the most in Oakland history is nine by Mike Norris in 1976...now has a .213 opponents batting average, which is sixth lowest among American League pitchers with at least 100 innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also has the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.273) and the 10th lowest slugging percentage (.349)...has a .192 (65 for 339) opponents average the first two times through the lineup and .274 (32 for 117) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has been the starting pitcher in two of the A's three 1-0 losses and five of the 15 shutouts...has received no run support in seven of his 20 starts...has eight runs of support in his eight losses as a starter (44.2 ip, 1.61 RSA)...is 8-3 when he receives at least one run of support...has received 42 runs of support in his last nine starts (61.1 ip, 6.16 RSA) after receiving just 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (1.97 RSA).

BY INNING: Has a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .159 (11 for 69) opponents batting average in the first inning...has allowed 19 of his 55 runs in the fifth inning for a 7.71 ERA (16 er in 18.2 ip) and .286 (22 for 77) opponents average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-3 with a 2.42 ERA (20 er in 74.1 ip) and .183 (50 for 273) opponents batting average in 12 starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) and .257 (47 for 183) opponents average in 10 games, eight starts, on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA (4 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts against American League West teams this year and is 3-0 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in nine career appearances against the AL West.

30 IN A ROW: Retired the first 17 batters he faced September 7 against Kansas City after setting down the final 13 batters he faced in his previous start September 2 against Seattle...the 30 consecutive batters retired set an Oakland record, topping the mark of 29 set by Catfish Hunter (May 3-8, 1968) and Dallas Braden (May 9-14, 2010) when they tossed their perfect games...did not allow a hit over the first seven innings against the Royals, giving him a streak of 11.0 consecutive hitless innings...that matched the second longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Ken Holtzman also had an 11.0 inning streak from June 4-8, 1975.

BRIEFLY: Is 5-5 with a 4.18 ERA (33 er in 71.0 ip) and .231 (63 for 273) opponents batting average in 12 starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19 after going 3-4 with a 2.16 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over his first 11 games, nine starts...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit last Sunday in Oakland...matched his career high with eight strikeouts (also June 29, 2011 vs. Florida)...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just one hit, a leadoff home run by Jackson in the sixth inning...is the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow one hit in a game with the one hit being a home run...the last to do it also took the loss (Rich Harden, August 14, 2005 vs. Minnesota.

MOSCOSO vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, two starts...is 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA (10.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the win came May 24 at Los Angeles in the A's 6-1 win, his first Major League win...tossed 6.0 shutout innings...did not allow a run and allowed just three runners into scoring position...then had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss September 13 in Oakland...did not allow a run over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 15.2 innings...then allowed three runs in the third inning on an Allen error and a two-run home run by Kendrick...was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and the A's trailing 3-2, but Oakland tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth to get him off the hook...his other oppearance came in relief on September 29, 2009 at Los Angeles...relieved Rangers starter Scott Feldman in the fourth inning with two outs, runners on first and third, and Texas trailing 4-1...tossed 2.1 scoreless innings, walked one and struck out two in a 5-2 loss.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

Robert Paul Melvin Named as A's interim manager, June 9, 2011 **Birthdate:** October 28, 1961

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9 and had the interim title removed Sept. 21 when he agreed to terms on a three-year contract through 2014. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
