WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers conclude the roadtrip this afternoon...Texas has won 4 straight games since losing the opener of trip on Friday in Seattle, matching the Cardinals, Nationals and Yankees for the longest current win streak in the ML...club also won 4 in a row, Sept. 11-15 and last longer win streak was 6 games, Aug. 12-17...Texas has won 8 of 9 and 9 of 11, the longer span beginning Sept. 9...club has not had consecutive losses since 3 in a row, Aug. 23-25 vs. Boston...Texas is 13-5 (.722) in September and has won 15 of 21 and 29 of last 43...team is 39-24 (.619) since All-Star break, 3rd-best in A.L., and is 67-42 since May 22.

-At 90-65 (.581), Rangers is tied with Detroit for 2nd best record in A.L., T4th-best in majors...Texas is **25 games over .500 for the 1st time since the end of the 1999 season** (95-67) and just the 3rd season overall in team history: 1999 (high of 31 over) and 1977 (26)...the Rangers have been 20+ games over .500 for each of the last 8 days...club had not been as many as 20 over in any season since 1999...**Texas' current record is 2nd-best ever through 155 games** behind a 92-63 mark in 1999.

VICTORIES: The 90 wins for Texas in 2011 match 1996 and 2010 for the 3rd most in team history, the 5th time club has won 90+ games: 95--1999; 94--1977...it is the 1st time Texas has posted consecutive 90-win seasons, leaving 4 ML franchises who have not accomplished that (Padres, Rockies, Marlins, Rays)...over the last 2 seasons, Texas is 4th in the majors with 180 wins (195--PHI; 190--NYY; 181--TB), 3rd most in back-to-back years in club history (183 in 1998-99; 181 in 1977-78)...the Rangers have posted 3 consecutive winning seasons, matching longest such streak in franchise history (1977-79 and 1989-91). --Rangers need one victory for 4th straight year of improving win total, joining Philadelphia as only ML teams to do that from 2008-11.

ON TOP IN WEST: The Rangers have a 5.0-game lead in the A.L. West with 7 to play., the 3rd straight day with that advantage, the largest Aug. 20 (5.0 GA)...last bigger lead was 6.0 games on Aug. 19...the club has gained 3.5 games in the standings over the last 11 days...club has led by at least 2.0 games for 41 of last 42 days.

--Texas has had sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 115 of the last 117 days beginning May 16, including 77 straight days beginning July 6, as Texas has not been out of first since May 15 (-0.5 GB)...team has had at least a share of division lead for 161 of 173 days in 2011, club's 3rd-most days in first ever in a single season behind 179 in 1999 and 177 in 1996...has been in 1st for 279 of 293 days beginning June 8, 2010.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have clinched their 1st winning season on the road since 2006 (41-40), just 2nd in last 12 years...last season with nmore than 41 road wins was 1999 (44)...club has won 4 straight and 15 of the last 22 on the road...club is 25-15 (.625) away from home since June 17, the 2nd best road winning percentage in the ML behind Philadelphia at .667 (30-15)...overall road winning percentage of .553 (41-36) is 6th in A.L....club is as many as 5 games over .500 on the road on Sept. 5, 2006 (37-32)...last better mark was 30-24 on Aug. 4, 2006.

AGAINST THE A'S: Texas is 13-5 vs. Oakland this season, winning the last 3 and 12 of 13 beginning May 10...the 13 wins match Rangers' most ever vs. an opponent in one season: Chicago in 1975, Oakland in 1977, and Seattle in 2005...the Rangers are 16-5 in the series beginning Sept. 24, 2010...the Rangers are 6-3 at the Coliseum, winning the last 5 since a defeat on May 1...ties teams most wins ever here in a season, 6th time...in the all-time series, Texas leads, 307-291 overall with A's holding a 155-144 edge at the Coliseum.

VS. A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 34-16 (.680) vs. A.L. West opponents this season, winning 7 of 9, 14 of 18, 16 of 21, and 28 of last 36 games, the longer span beginning May 15...it is the 3rd best record by a club vs. a single division behind: .719 (23-9) by Philadelphia vs. the N.L. West and .681 (47-22) by Detroit vs. the A.L. Central...Texas' best record ever vs. the West was a 47-31 (.603) mark in 1986...Texas is 17-9 in A.L. West parks in 2011, winning 15 of 19 since the All-Star break...club was 32-25 vs. A.L. West, 14-14 on road, in 2010.

CLOSE CALL: The 3-2 win on Wednesday was Texas' 2nd one-run win on this trip (7-6 on Sept. 17 at SEA)...prior to that, club had not won a one-run game since Aug. 17, losing the last 4...club is 18-23 in one-run games, 7-19 on the road...last night was 2nd time this season club has won on road when trailing after 7 innings...was the team's 25th come-from-behind win of 2011.

SEPTEMBER STREAKS: The Rangers are 13-5 (.722) this month, the 3rd best September winning percentage in the majors behind .789 (15-4) for Detroit and .737 (14-5) for St. Louis...Texas leads the majors with a .321 (209-652) batting average, a .375 OBP, a .546 SLG PCT, 34 homers, and 122 runs (T1st with BOS) in the month...club's highest winning percentage ever for September is .704 (19-8) in 1979.

<u>IT'S A 30 FOR KINSLER:</u> Ian Kinsler tied Wednesday's game in the 8th inning with his 30th homer of the season, one shy of his 2009 career best...he is just the 7th Ranger ever with 30+ homers in multiple seasons, joining: 6--Juan Gonzalez and Rafael Palmeiro; 3--Alex Rodriguez and Mark Teixeira; 2--Josh Hamilton and Dean Palmer.

--Kinsler has 30 HR, 33 2B, 114 R, and 84 BB in 2011 and becomes the just the 2nd Ranger ever with 30 HR, 30 doubles, 100 runs scored, and 80 walks in a season, joining Alex Rodriguez in his 2003 MVP season.

--Kinsler is the first 2nd baseman (minimum 50% of games played at the position) in American League history with that combination of numbers, joining just 3 players (4 instances) in the N.L.: Rogers Hornsby (1925 and 1929), Jay Bell (1999), and Jeff Kent (2000)...lan is just the 13th player ever to compile all of those figures in a 25-steal season.

--Kinsler becomes just the 4th A.L. 2nd baseman ever with 30+ homers in multiple seasons, joining: 3--Alfonso Soriano (2002-03-05), 2-Joe Gordon (1940-48); and 2-Bret Boone (2001-03).

--Kinsler leads the majors with 9 homers in September, most for a Ranger in this month since Mark Teixeira (9 in 2006) and his 17 HR since the All-Star break ties Jacoby Ellsbury and Evan Longoria for most in the A.L.

MORE IAN: Kinsler extended his own record Wednesday with his 25th consecutive stolen base since he was caught on April 15 at New York...that is the longest current streak over one season or multiple seasons in the majors...last player with a longer such streak was TB's Carl Crawford, who was successful on 30 straight steal tries in 2009 (Elias Sports Bureau).

GAME-WINNERS: Josh Hamilton's game-winning homer in the 8th inning on Wednesday produced his 20th game-winning RBI of the season, 2nd in the majors (Ryan Howard-23) and tying the single season club record set by Rafael Palmeiro in 1999...of Hamilton's 92 RBI, 21.7% have been game-winners.

CHECKING THE LEADERBOARDS: With 2 hits on Wednesday, Michael Young has 203 for the season, matching Palmeiro and Ruben Sierra (both in 1991) for the 7th most in club history, one behind Young's 2003 total...lan Kinsler's 115 runs also tie Palmeiro's 1991 figure for the 7th most ever for a Ranger, one back of Ivan Rodriguez' totals in both 1996 and 1999.

MIKE NAPOLI has hit safely in his last 8 overall games at .552 (16-29) and in 12 of last 13 (all 12 starts) at .533 (24-45) with 4 HR and 9 RBI...he leads the majors in both batting since the All-Star break at .392 (76-194) and in September at .480 (24-50)...Napoli's also leads the majors with a .476 on-base percentage since the All-Star break...no A.L. player has had a figure that high in the 2nd half of a season (200+ PA) since Cleveland's Jim Thome posted a .481 figure in 2002....the Rangers have won the last 8 games with Napoli behind the plate and are 39-15 (.722) in his 54 catching starts in 2011.

PITCHING PATTER: Texas has allowed just 4 runs in 27.0 innings in the last 3 games and has a 2.72 ERA (35 ER/116.0 IP) in the last 13 games to go from 3.93 to 3.82, 5th in the A.L. and lowest since Aug. 23 (3.77)...rotation has allowed 13 hits and 3 runs in 19.2 IP in the last 3 games...the starters are 9-2, 2.41 (23 ER/86.0 IP) over last 13 games ...the Rangers' 71 starting wins are tied with Milwaukee for 2nd most in the majors, 2 behind Philadelphia and match the 3rd most in club history (75–1996; 72–1974; 71–1968)...Texas is tied with TB for A.L. lead with 95 quality starts, T4th most ever and most since 1992 (95).

C.J. AND COLBY: C.J. Wilson fanned 8 on Wednesday to give him 206 strike-out for the season, just the 7th 200-K season for a Ranger, 1st by a lefty and 1st overall since Nolan Ryan (203) in 1991...current total is most since Bobby Witt (221) in 1990...Wilson also induced his 31st GIDP, a new club record. --Colby Lewis is 4-0 in 5 starts against Oakland this season...the only Texas pitcher to defeat one team as many as 5 times in a season was Ferguson Jenkins, who recorded 5 wins apiece vs. Minnesota and Oakland in 1974.

FINAL THREE: The Rangers play their final 3 home games of the regular season this weekend against Seattle...Texas is 12-4 vs. Seattle in 2011, its most wins ever in a single season against the M's...club has won 2 straight and 8 of 10 and is 5-1 in Arlington in the 2011 series...Rangers have won 9 of 12 at home and are 49-29 overall in Arlington this season...club record for home wins in a season is 52 in 1978...Texas enters the series 125,919 shy of the all-time single season home attendance mark of 2,945,244 set in 1997.

SHORTS: Texas is 24-21 in day games, 15-15 on the road, winning the last 3 overall...Rangers have won all games of a series 9 times this season (6 3-game series...club has had one trip in 2011 with only one loss, 6-1 to TB and CLE, May 30-June 5...Texas leads the A.L. with 160 double plays turned, 2nd in majors (STL-162)...club has been successful on last 12 steal tries.

#48 Colby Lewis, RHP (13-10, 4.45 ERA)

TODAY: The 31-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 31st start in Thursday afternoon's series finale here in Oakland...is in search of his 5th win against the A's in 2011, as Lewis has a chance to join Fergie Jenkins ('74) as just the 2nd pitcher in Texas history to notch 5 wins against the same opponent in a single season (more below)...earned his career-best 13th win in a 7-6 victory over the Mariners on Saturday at Safeco Field, surpassing his previous high from 2010 (12-13)...has won 2 straight starts with the help of 15 combined runs of support, going 2-2 over his last 5 trips to the mound, but is carrying a 7.94 ERA (25 ER/28.1 IP) in that 5-start span to rise from 3.83 to 4.45, highest since June 17 (4.80)...was 3-1, 2.37 (8 ER/30.1 IP) over his final 5 regular season starts in 2010...will be starting on regular 4 days' rest for the 16th time in 2011, going 4-6, 4.61 (49 ER/95.2 IP) in 15 previous outings (9-4, 4.29 ERA in 15 starts on 5+ days rest)...was given 7 days off between starts of Sept. 9 & 17 to grant additional rest and now lines up behind C.J. Wilson...has at least 6.0 innings in 14 of last 16...has allowed A.L.-leading 34 HR, 2nd-most in the majors (Bronson Arroyo-44 HR)...Texas is 16-14 in his 30 starts.

10 WINS AGAIN: This is his 3rd career 10-win season, all with the Rangers (also 2003 and 2010)...since 2000, the only other Rangers with 3-or-more 10-win seasons are Kenny Rogers (4) and Kevin Millwood (3)...now has 10 wins in 2 straight seasons, joining just 4 other Rangers to do that since 2000: Rick Helling (2000-01), Kenny Rogers (2004-05), Kevin Millwood (2006-07), and C.J. Wilson (2010-11).

REVERSAL OF FORTUNE: Has received an avg. of 8.68 runs of support in his 13 wins, getting one-or-zero runs of support in 7 of 10 losses...his 5.94 run support avg. through 30 starts in 2011 is nearly a run-and-a-half higher (1.37) than 4.57 figure from last season, when he received 2 runs of support or less in 16 of 32 outings, including one-or-zero runs 11 times...has 16 combined losses (8)/no decisions (8) in 37 quality starts since beg. of 2010.

<u>THE LONG BALL:</u> His A.L.-high 34 HR allowed are 2nd-most in majors behind Reds' Bronson Arroyo (44)...has 6 HR allowed last 5 starts...his 22 HR allowed in Arlington are 2nd-most in team history (Charlie Hough allowed 24 HR at home in 1987)...of the 34 HR, 22 have been solo, nine 2-run, and three 3-run...lefties have accounted for 20 of the 34...has allowed at least one HR in 22 of 30 outings, incl. 21 over his last 19 starts since a season-high 4 HR's June 6 vs. DET...streak of 7 straight w/ a HR allowed to start season for Lewis was longest in Texas history to begin a season (Opening Day rotation members only) and longest overall single-season streak by a Texas pitcher since Vicente Padilla served up HR's in 9 straight in '08 to match a club record, done twice by Charlie Hough in 1984 and 1987.

LAST START: Earned his career-best 13th win in a 7-6 victory over the Mariners on Saturday at Safeco Field...was unabled to get through 6.0 full innings and was charged with all 6 runs (5.2 IP, 8 H, 6 R-ER, 1 HR, 1 BB, 7 SO, 94 pitches/66 strikes), but still exited ahead 7-6 before turning things over to the Texas bullpen...was tagged for 4 runs on 4 hits in the second and also allowed a 2-run HR to Mike Carp in the fifth...4 Rangers relievers combined for 3.1 scoreless frames, retiring all 10 batters faced, including 6 by way of the strikeout.

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> Slated for his 6th start against Oakland this season, going a perfect 4-0 with a 2.83 ERA (11 ER/35.0 IP) in 5 previous tilts vs. the A's...his 4 victories are T2nd-most ever in a single season against the A's since they moved to Oakland in '68, as Lewis looks to join former Ranger Fergie Jenkins (5-0, 0.60 ERA in '74) as the only pitchers to do so 5 times in a single campaign...Jenkins is currently the only pitcher in Texas history to notch 5 wins against any opponent in a single season, doing so twice in '74 against both Oakland AND Minnesota...Lewis has won 5 consecutive decisions vs. Oakland dating back to last season, going 5-3, 3.10 (25 ER/72.2 IP) in 11 starts total from 2010-11...is 5-2, 2.70 (20 ER/66.2 IP) in 22 games/8 starts here at the Oakland Coliseum, incl. wins in 3 straight outings in the Bay Area, going 3-1, 2.23 (8 ER/32.1 IP) in 5 starts over the past 2 seasons for Texas (2010-11).

. WEST: Is 6-2, 3.46 (29 ER/75.1 IP) in 11 starts vs. A.L. West clubs this season and 9-7, 3.04 (52 ER/154.0 IP) in 23 starts from 2010-11...Rangers have won 7 of his last 8 starts against the division, as he has gone 5-0, 3.31 (20 ER/54.1 IP) in those 8 starts beg. May 10.

ON THE ROAD: is 8-5, 3.40 (36 ER/95.1 IP) in 15 road starts this season, allowing more than 4 ER just twice, incl. his start Saturday in Seattle...has won 5 of his last 6 decisions away from Arlington...has the 15th-lowest road ERA in the A.L. at 3.40, over 2 runs lower than home figure (5.54)...his 8 road wins are tied for most on staff with Wilson and Holland.

2011: Club's no. 2 starter to open season...Texas is 16-14 in his 30 starts, losing 14 of 17 games in which Lewis did not record a win...has held RH batters to a .204 (65-319) avg., 6th-lowest in A.L., 79 points lower than LH batters (.283)...has pitched at least 5.0 innings in 26 of 30 games...has pair of 10-strikeout games in 2011...has 17 quality starts, including career-best 5 straight from April 30-May 21...threw at least 7.0 innings in 4 straight starts from April 30-May 16, longest such streak of his career...has logged at least 6.0 innings in 21 of his last 26 starts, including 8.0-or-more innings 5 times...Torrealba has caught 25 of 30, with Napoli behind the plate in the other 5...has posted a quality start in 12 of his 13 victories with a 2.31 ERA (24 ER/93.1 IP), while sporting a 8.59 ERA (49 ER/51.1 IP) in his 10 losses...was the first player placed on MLB's new Paternity Leave List from April 15-17 following birth of his daughter in Bakersfield, Calif. on April 13...his spot in the rotation was essentially skipped while he was away.

COMPLETE IT: Has 2 CG/one SHO for Texas in '11, joining Holland (4) and Wilson (3) as Rangers with multiple CG...posted CG's in consecutive road starts, May 5 at SEA and May 16 at CWS, with one home outing in between...was first Texas starter to record a complete game in back-to-back <u>road</u> starts since Kenny Rogers, May 18-24, 1994...Lewis had the first of the club's 7 individual CG SHO's in '11, a 4-0 win on May 16 at Chicago-AL (9.0 IP, 5 H, 0 R-ER, 0 HR, 1 BB, 7 SO, 110 pitches/74 strikes)...was first CG SHO by a Texas pitcher since Derek Holland's 3-hitter Aug. 9, 2009 at LAA and first CG SHO by a Texas righty in an A.L. park since Vicente Padilla on April 27, 2008 vs. MIN.
