ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight games...have lost six of the last 10 games and are 15 games under .500 at 71-86...have not finished a season more than 14 games under .500 since 1997 when they were 65-97...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish without a winning record, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 76-79 is on pace to be the fourth)...are 11-10 in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...there have been just three seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not post a winning record in any month (1979, 1982 and 1997)...are 32-33 (.492) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 49-66 (.426) since then...have spent 62 of the last 63 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 96 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 28-23 (.549) record on the weekend (15-12 on Saturday, 13-11 on Sunday) compared to 43-63 (.406) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with Bob Melvin...Melvin was given a three-year contract through the 2014 season on Wednesday.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles (1-0) and Seattle (three games)...have lost seven of the last 10 road games and are 28-48 (.368) on the road overall, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL and third worst in the majors...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 48 road losses match the most by an A's team over the last 14 years (also 2008)...have not lost more than 48 road games since going 30-51 in 1997...went 4-6 on the final homestand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (2-2) and Texas (1-2) and finished the home portion of the schedule with a 43-38 (.531) record...it marked the second consecutive season the A's posted a winning record at home...hit .249 at home and are batting .239 (633 for 2650) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have hit under .241 on the road just once in Oakland history (.230 in 1968)...posted a 3.18 ERA at home and have a 4.37 (324 er in 666.2 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.09) and the third highest road ERA.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff recorded five strikeouts yesterday and now has 1124 for the season which ties the Athletics franchise (since 1901) record set in 2009...1124 strikeouts rank sixth in the American League...has a 4.63 ERA (298 er in 579.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...was leading the AL in ERA at the break but has the fifth highest post-break ERA...now has a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.380), the fewest home runs (131) and ranks third in pickoffs (19)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.74 ERA (398 er in 958.1 ip), which is fourth lowest in the AL...Trevor Cahill has 14 losses and Gio Gonzalez has 12 losses...the A's have not had two pitchers lose 13 or more games since 1984 (McCatty 14, Sorensen 13).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .213 (79 for 374) with 34 runs scored over the last 12 games (2.83 runs per game)...have scored 626 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are averaging 3.99 runs per game, which is currently sixth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since the 1979 club averaged 3.54...were shutout for the 15th time last Sunday, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 19)...it is also third most in Oakland history and is the most since the 1979 club was blanked 17 times...the record is 19 in 1978...have hit 110 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...it is currently the sixth total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1976 club hit 113...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.369), which matches the lowest mark by an A's team over the last 29 years (.369 in 2008)...have the third lowest batting average (.244) and have hit under .248 just once over the last 29 years (.242 in 2008)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.312) and have not finished with a mark under .318 since 1982 (.309)...are hitting .302 (170 for 563) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star Break after hitting .239 before the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 123 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (130)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...the last time the A's led the American League in errors was 1998 (141)...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is also tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 81 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL, second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-25 (.432) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...the 25 one-run losses are the most by an A's team since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games, tied for second in losses and have the fourth worst record...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 16-28 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 11-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract for 2012 and beyond: Brett Anderson (2013, club options for 2014 and 2015), Grant Balfour (2012, club option 2013), Trevor Cahill (2015, club options 2016 and 2017), Brian Fuentes (2012, club option 2013) and Kurt Suzuki (2013, club option 2014)...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012...five players are eligible for free agency (Crisp, DeJesus, Harden, Matsui and Willingham) and seven more are eligible for arbitration (Bailey, Barton, Braden Breslow, Devine, McCarthy and Sweeney)...the A's top candidates to gain arbitration eligibility under Super Two status are Rosales (2 years, 171 days at end of season), Gonzalez (2 years, 162 days) and Powell (2 years, 144 days).

A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series 10-7 and clinch just their second season series win over the last eight years (went 10-9 in 2007)...are 70-80 (.467) against the Angels over that span...went 6-3 in Oakland this year and are 4-4 in Anaheim...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 375-303 against the Angels...that includes 196-143 in Oakland and 179-160 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 424-380 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 14 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 37 for 37 after the break in his career...is a perfect 7 for 7 in saves with a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Angels...has not allowed a run in seven career games at Angel Stadium (7.0 ip).

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in triples (8), is tied for second in stolen bases (21) and ranks third in hits (116), doubles (24) and multiple hit games (34).

Josh Willingham has career highs in home runs (27) and RBI (92)...the RBI are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Vida Blue wins his 21st game and Reggie Jackson hits two home runs as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 13-2 to clinch their fifth consecutive AL West title...in **2000** Jason Giambi hits the 5000th home run in Oakland history, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of a 3-2 A's loss at Seattle.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd appearance and 21st start of the season...the A's are 10-10 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings 12 times, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times.

RECENTLY: Is 2-1 with a 1.71 ERA (5 er in 26.1 ip) and .138 (13 for 94) opponents batting average in four starts in September...ranks second in the American League in opponents batting average in September and is in ERA...is now 4-3 with a 2.86 ERA (16 er in 50.1 ip) and .179 (33 for 184) opponents batting average over his last eight starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Has a 3.35 ERA, which ranks second in the American League among rookies with 100 or more innings pitched...ranks fifth among AL rookies in wins (8), sixth in innings pitched (121.0), tied for sixth in games started (20) and ninth in strikeouts (72).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed just one hit in his last start and has allowed three hits or fewer in eight of his 20 starts...since 1990, the only Oakland pitcher to have that many starts with three hits or fewer in a season is Tim Hudson, who also had eight in 2000...the most in Oakland history is nine by Mike Norris in 1976...now has a .213 opponents batting average, which is seventh lowest among American League pitchers with at least 100 innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also has the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.273) and the ninth lowest slugging percentage (.349)...has a .192 (65 for 339) opponents average the first two times through the lineup and .274 (32 for 117) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has been the starting pitcher in two of the A's three 1-0 losses and five of the 15 shutouts...has received no run support in seven of his 20 starts...has eight runs of support in his eight losses as a starter (44.2 ip, 1.61 RSA)...is 8-3 when he receives at least one run of support...has received 42 runs of support in his last nine starts (61.1 ip, 6.16 RSA) after receiving just 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (1.97 RSA).

BY INNING: Has a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .159 (11 for 69) opponents batting average in the first inning...has allowed 19 of his 55 runs in the fifth inning for a 7.71 ERA (16 er in 18.2 ip) and .286 (22 for 77) opponents average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-3 with a 2.42 ERA (20 er in 74.1 ip) and .183 (50 for 273) opponents batting average in 12 starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) and .257 (47 for 183) opponents average in 10 games, eight starts, on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA (4 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts against American League West teams this year and is 3-0 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in nine career appearances against the AL West.

30 IN A ROW: Retired the first 17 batters he faced September 7 against Kansas City after setting down the final 13 batters he faced in his previous start September 2 against Seattle...the 30 consecutive batters retired set an Oakland record, topping the mark of 29 set by Catfish Hunter (May 3-8, 1968) and Dallas Braden (May 9-14, 2010) when they tossed their perfect games...did not allow a hit over the first seven innings against the Royals, giving him a streak of 11.0 consecutive hitless innings...that matched the second longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Ken Holtzman also had an 11.0 inning streak from June 4-8, 1975.

BRIEFLY: Is 5-5 with a 4.18 ERA (33 er in 71.0 ip) and .231 (63 for 273) opponents batting average in 12 starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19 after going 3-4 with a 2.16 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over his first 11 games, nine starts...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Detroit last Sunday in Oakland...matched his career high with eight strikeouts (also June 29, 2011 vs. Florida)...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just one hit, a leadoff home run by Jackson in the sixth inning...is the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow one hit in a game with the one hit being a home run...the last to do it also took the loss (Rich Harden, August 14, 2005 vs. Minnesota).

MOSCOSO vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, two starts...is 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA (10.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the win came May 24 at Los Angeles in the A's 6-1 win, his first Major League win...tossed 6.0 shutout innings...did not allow a run and allowed just three runners into scoring position...then had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss September 13 in Oakland...did not allow a run over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 15.2 innings...then allowed three runs in the third inning on an Allen error and a two-run home run by Kendrick...was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and the A's trailing 3-2, but Oakland tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth to get him off the hook...his other appearance came in relief on September 29, 2009 at Los Angeles...relieved Rangers starter Scott Feldman in the fourth inning with two outs, runners on first and third, and Texas trailing 4-1...tossed 2.1 scoreless innings, walked one and struck out two in a 5-2 loss.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Harden (4-4, 5.17 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 7.99 ERA (21 er in 23.2 ip) and .362 (38 for 105) opponents batting average over his last five starts... Has 78 strikeouts since the All-Star Break, which ranks tied for eighth in the American League...has allowed a .218 (31 for 142) average against left-handed hitters and .304 (48 for 158) against right-handers...is 0-4 with a 7.20 ERA (24 er in 30.0 ip) in six starts against American League West teams...last time out, lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (3.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...is 6-4 with a 3.83 ERA (103.1 ip, 89 h, 47 r, 44 er, 39 bb, 83 so, 9 hr) in 17 career appearances, 16 starts, against the Angels.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen has compiled a 5.83 ERA (54 er in 83.1 ip) and .282 (96 for 340) opponents batting average over the last 26 games (since August 25)...is 1-5 with four saves and three blown saves over that span...now has a 4.71 ERA (101 er in 193.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (14) and is tied for the third most losses (25)...is tied for second in first batter strikeouts (100)...has allowed 70 of 207 (33.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.

- Is 22 for 24 (91.7%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League and the fourth best single season mark in Oakland history...is 73 for 82 (89.0%) in his career, which is the best mark in Oakland history...ranks sixth on the Oakland career saves list (Isringhausen is 5th, 75).
- Has converted all 14 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is tied for third in the AL in saves since the break...is now a perfect 37 for 37 in save chances following the break in his career.
- Has allowed at least one run in seven of his last 15 appearances (10 er in 15.1 ip, 5.87 ERA).
- First batter faced are hitting .132 (5 for 38), which is the fifth lowest mark in the AL.
