### A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series 10-8...is just their second season series win over the last eight years (went 10-9 in 2007)...are 70-81 (.464) against the Angels over that span...went 6-3 in Oakland this year and are 4-5 in Anaheim...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 375-304 against the Angels...that includes 196-143 in Oakland and 179-161 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 424-381 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 14 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 37 for 37 after the break in his career...is a perfect 7 for 7 in saves with a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Angels...has not allowed a run in seven career games at Angel Stadium (7.0 ip).

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in triples (8), is tied for second in stolen bases (22) and ranks third in hits (119), doubles (24) and multiple hit games (35).

Josh Willingham has career highs in home runs (27) and RBI (92)...the RBI are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48<sup>th</sup> of the year...he would go on to hit an Oakland and major league rookie record 49 home runs...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22<sup>nd</sup> game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost seven of the last 11 games and are 16 games under .500 at 71-87...have not finished a season more than 14 games under .500 since 1997 when they were 65-97...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish without a winning record, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 76-79 is on pace to be the fourth)...are 11-11 in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...there have been just three seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not post a winning record in any month (1979, 1982 and 1997)...are 32-34 (.485) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 49-67 (.422) since then...have as 90 the last 64 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 97 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 28-24 (.538) record on the weekend (15-13 on Saturday, 13-11 on Sunday) compared to 43-63 (.406) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with Bob Melvin...Melvin was given a three-year contract through the 2014 season on Wednesday.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles (1-1) and Seattle (three games)...have lost eight of the last 11 road games and are 28-49 (.364) on the road overall, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL and third worst in the majors...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 48 road losses match the most by an A's team since going 30-51 in 1997...went 4-6 on the final homestand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (2-2) and Texas (1-2) and finished the home portion of the schedule with a 43-38 (.531) record...it marked the second consecutive season the A's posted a winning record at home...hit .249 at home and are batting .239 (641 for 2685) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have hit under .241 on the road just once in Oakland history (.230 in 1968)...posted a 3.18 ERA at home and have a 4.36 (327 er in 674.2 ip) on the road...have the third lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.08) and the fourth highest road ERA.

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff recorded three strikeouts yesterday and now has 1127 for the season which is a new Athletics franchise (since 1901) record (previous 1124 set in 2009)...1127 strikeouts rank sixth in the American League...has a 4.61 ERA (301 er in 587.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...was leading the AL in ERA at the break but has the fifth highest post-break ERA...now has a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.397), the fewest home runs (132) and ranks third in pickoffs (20)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.75 ERA (401 er in 963.2 ip), which is fourth lowest in the AL...Trevor Cahill has 14 losses and Gio Gonzalez has 12 losses...the A's have not had two pitchers lose 13 or more games since 1984 (McCatty 14, Sorensen 13).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .213 (87 for 409) with 36 runs scored over the last 13 games (2.77 runs per game)...have scored 628 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are averaging 3.97 runs per game, which is currently sixth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since the 1979 club averaged 3.54...were shutout for the 15<sup>th</sup> time a week ago today, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 19)...it is also third most in Oakland history and is the most since the 1979 club was blanked 17 times...the record is 19 in 1978...have hit 110 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...it is currently the sixth total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1976 club hit 113...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.369), which matches the lowest mark by an A's team over the last 29 years (.369 in 2008)...have the third lowest batting average (.244) and have hit under ..248 just once over the last 29 years (.242 in 2008)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.312) and have not finished with a mark under ..318 since 1982 (.309)...are hitting .300 (172 for 574) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star Break after hitting .239 before the break.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 124 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (132)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...the last time the A's led the American League in errors was 1998 (141)...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...it is also tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 82 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL, second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 19-25 (.432) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...the 25 one-run losses are the most by an A's team since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games, tied for second in losses and have the fourth worst record...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 16-28 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 11-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have five players under contract for 2012 and beyond: Brett Anderson (2013, club options for 2014 and 2015), Grant Balfour (2012, club option 2013), Trevor Cahill (2015, club options 2016 and 2017), Brian Fuentes (2012, club option 2013) and Kurt Suzuki (2013, club option 2014)...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012...five players are eligible for free agency (Crisp, DeJesus, Harden, Matsui and Willingham) and seven more are eligible for arbitration (Bailey, Barton, Braden Breslow, Devine, McCarthy and Sweeney)...the A's top candidates to gain arbitration eligibility under Super Two status are Rosales (2 years, 171 days at end of season), Gonzalez (2 years, 162 days) and Powell (2 years, 144 days).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 5-9 (.357) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 96-63 (.604) in his starting assignments in his career. including 63-40 (.612) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in six of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...is 42-0 in 59 career starts with run support of four or more

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 0-2 with a 7.99 ERA (21 er in 23.2 ip) and .362 (38 for 105) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the two-game losing streak is one short of his career high of three (three times, last: May 17-June 24,

2009)...went 4-2 with a 3.91 ERA and .210 opponents average over his first nine starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 78 strikeouts since the All-Star Break, which ranks tied for eighth in the American League...has 86 strikeouts in 76.2 innings for the season, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...that is the best mark in the AL among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched and eighth best in the majors...struck out 42 batters in August, which ranked fifth in the AL...it was the most by an Athletic in once month since he also struck out 42 in June, 2008...it was third most in August in Oakland history (Blue, 55 in 1971; Stewart, 44 in 1987)...has two games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and 12 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .218 (31 for 142) average against left-handed hitters and .304 (48 for 158) against right-handers...has surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs to righties for a .544 slugging percentage...lefties are slugging .394...has allowed eight of his home runs after his 75th pitch of a game...nine have been solo shots...opponents are 3 for 24 (.125) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-4 with a 7.20 ERA (24 er in 30.0 ip) in six starts against American League West teams and 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA (20 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-3 with a 6.46 ERA (33 er in 46.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-1 with a 3.23 ERA (11 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts on six days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: is 2-2 with a 4.78 ERA (23 er in 43.1 ip) and .244 (40 for 164) opponents batting average in eight starts at home and 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA (21 er in 33.1 ip) and .287 (39 for 136) opponents average in six starts on the road...is now 21-12 with a 3.20 ERA (123 er in 345.2 ip) in 59 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.09 ERA (262 er in 576.2) in 110 career appearances in all other parks.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 944 strikeouts in 922.1 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.21 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 900 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.89)...has a .227 (773 for 3402) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 900 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221).

WITH THE A'S: Is 40-23 with a 3.64 ERA (250 er in 618.1 ip) in 111 games, 103 starts, in an A's uniform...his .635 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...began his career with the A's in 2003 and was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008...went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 21/2 seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...it was his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008 and his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Texas **August** 

14 in Oakland...did not allow a home run, snapping a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to his final outing of 2010...combined with Bailey and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Toronto **August 19** in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying 11...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 16-inning loss at Cleveland August 31 ... it was his 100th career start as an Athletic and he is the 21<sup>st</sup> pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had a no decision in the A's 11-6 loss to Kansas City **September 5** in Oakland...struck out 10 batters in 5.0 innings...is just the third pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 or more in 5.0 innings or fewer (Tim Hudson and Kirk Saarloos).

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...lasted a season-low 3.0 innings and surrendered a season-high six runs...Beltre hit a three-run home run in the first inning and Cruz scored on a wild pitch in the second...he also allowed RBI singles to Young and Napoli in the third.

HARDEN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 6-4 with a 3.83 ERA (103.1 ip, 89 h, 47 r, 44 er, 39 bb, 83 so, 9 hr) in 17 career appearances, 16 starts...is 2-3 with a 4.05 ERA (24 er in 53.1 ip) in nine games, eight starts, in Oakland and 4-1 with a 3.60 ERA (20 er in 50.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...is 0-1 with a 4.38 ERA (12.1 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 10 so) in two starts this year...the no decision came in a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings in the second game of the doubleheader July 16 in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Trumbo in the second inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...the A's scored twice in the fourth and once in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...left after seven innings with the score tied 3-3...took the loss in the A's 4-1 loss September 14 in Oakland...blanked the Angels on five hits and a hit batter over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the sixth inning...allowed a RBI double to Abreu and a two-run home run to Trumbo and left with one out in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1.

Is 8-3 with a 3.02 ERA (29 er in 86.1 ip) in 13 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is 6-3 with a 2.65 ERA (25 er in 85.0 ip) in 13 starts in Oakland compared to 3-5 with a 3.94 ERA (34 er in 77.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road...in his last outing, had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...is 2-4 with a 4.15 ERA (52.0 ip, 47 h, 24 r, 24 er, 10 bb, 45 so, 10 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts, against the Seattle Mariners.
