A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail the season series 7-9 and with one more loss will lose the season series...are 2-5 in Seattle and went 5-4 in Oakland...each team has won two season series over the previous four years and the A's are 40-52 (.435) against Seattle since 2007...that is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 290-216 (.573), which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 163-93 in Oakland and 127-124 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 15 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 38 for 38 after the break in his career.

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in hitting (.305) and triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (22) and is third in doubles (24) and multiple hit games (35).

Josh Willingham has career highs in home runs (28) and RBI (94)...the RBI are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971 Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start of the season to bring his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell, who struck out 302 batters in 1903 and 349 the following season, as the only two Athletic pitchers to fan 300 in a single season...in 1974 Jim Hunter tosses a seven-hitter to defeat the Minnesota Twins 2-1...it is his 25th win, which establishes an Oakland record, and is also his fourth straight 20-win season...in 2002 the A's clinch their second AL West title in the last three years and win their 100th game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost seven of the last 12 games and are 15 games under .500 at 72-87...have not finished a season more than 14 games under .500 since 1997 when they were 65-97...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish without a winning record, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 76-80 is on pace to be the fourth)...are 12-11 in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...there have been just three seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not post a winning record in any month (1979, 1982 and 1997)...are 33-34 (.493) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 50-67 (.427) since then...have spent 64 of the last 65 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 98 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 29-24 (.547) record on the weekend (15-13 on Saturday, 14-11 on Sunday) compared to 43-63 (.406) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with Bob Melvin...Melvin was given a three-year contract through the 2014 season on Wednesday.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles (2-1) and Seattle (three games)...have lost eight of the last 12 road games and are 29-49 (.372) on the road overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 49 road losses are the most by an A's team since going 30-51 in 1997...went 4-6 on the final homestand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (2-2) and Texas (1-2) and finished the home portion of the schedule with a 43-38 (.531) record...it marked the second consecutive season the A's posted a winning record at home...hit .249 at home and are batting .239 (651 for 2720) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have hit under .239 on the road just once in Oakland history (.230 in 1968)...posted a 3.18 ERA at home and have a 4.37 (332 er in 683.2 ip) on the road...have the third lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth highest road ERA.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has recorded 1134 strikeouts for the season, which is a new Athletics franchise record (since 1901)...the previous high was 1124 in 2009...the 1134 strikeouts this season rank sixth in the American League...has a 4.62 ERA (306 er in 596.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...was leading the AL in ERA at the break but has the fifth highest post-break ERA...now has a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.380), is tied for the fewest home runs (134) and ranks third in pickoffs (20)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.75 ERA (404 er in 969.2 ip) this season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...Trevor Cahill has 14 losses and Gio Gonzalez has 12 losses...the A's have not had two pitchers lose 13 or more games since 1984 (McCatty 14, Sorensen 13).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .218 (97 for 444) with 42 runs scored over the last 14 games (3.00 runs per game)...have scored 634 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are averaging 3.99 runs per game, which is currently sixth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since the 1979 club averaged 3.54...have been shutout 15 times this season, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 19)...it is also third most in Oakland history and is the most since the 1979 club was blanked 17 times...the record is 19 in 1978...have hit 111 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...it is currently the sixth lowest total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1994 club hit 113...have a .369 slugging percentage, which ranks third lowest in the AL...that matches the lowest mark by an A's team over the last 29 years (2008)...have the third lowest batting average (.244) and have hit under .244 just once over the last 29 years (.242 in 2008)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.312) and have not finished with a mark under .312 since 1982 (.309)...are hitting .299 (174 for 581) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star Break after hitting .239 before the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 124 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (132)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...the last time the A's led the American League in errors was 1998 (141)...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and ranks fourth most in the majors...it is also tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 82 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL, second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-25 (.444) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...the 25 one-run losses are the most by an A's team since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games, tied for second in losses and have the fourth worst record...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 17-28 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 12-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract for 2012 and beyond: Brett Anderson (2013, club options for 2014 and 2015), Grant Balfour (2012, club option 2013), Trevor Cahill (2015, club options 2016 and 2017), Brian Fuentes (2012, club option 2013) and Kurt Suzuki (2013, club option 2014)...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012...five players are eligible for free agency (Crisp, DeJesus, Harden, Matsui and Willingham) and seven more are eligible for arbitration (Bailey, Barton, Braden, Breslow, Devine, McCarthy and Sweeney)...the A's top candidates to gain arbitration eligibility under Super Two status are Rosales (2 years, 171 days at end of season), Gonzalez (2 years, 162 days) and Powell (2 years, 144 days).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season, his 16th since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 11-13 (.458) in his starting assignments and his teams are 38-42 (.475) in his 80 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 20 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 23 times.

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA (5 er in 29.0 ip) and .185 (20 for 108) opponents batting average in four starts in September...has walked just three and struck out 24 in 29.0 innings...ranks third in the American League in ERA this month and fifth in opponents batting.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 8-3 with a 3.02 ERA (29 er in 86.1 ip) in 13 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for third in the American League in wins since the break.

CAREER BESTS: Has career highs this year in wins (9), games started (24), innings pitched (162.2), strikeouts (117) and complete games (4)...has a 3.26 ERA

and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.68) and third in walks per nine innings (1.38)...is on pace to break the all-time Athletic record for strikeout to walk ratio...the current mark is 3.91 by Dan Haren in 2006...currently has the fourth best walk per nine inning mark in Athletics history...also ranks third in the AL in home runs per nine innings (0.50) and fewest pitches per inning (14.7), tied for third in complete games (4) and ninth in on-base percentage (.283).

HOME AND AWAY: is 6-3 with a 2.65 ERA (25 er in 85.0 ip) in 13 starts in Oakland compared to 3-5 with a 3.94 ERA (34 er in 77.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road...ranks seventh in the American League in home ERA

OPPONENTS BATTING: Eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has allowed a .357 (25 for 70) batting average and four of his nine home runs to the opponents number three hitter.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 4-2 with a 4.19 ERA (31 er in 66.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest and 5-6 with a 2.63 ERA (28 er in 96.0 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

BACK-TO-BACK: Tossed back-to-back complete games August 29 and September 3 and is just the second Oakland pitcher to do that over the last seven years (Braden, May 9-14, 2010)...is the first A's righthander to toss back-to-back complete games since Bobby Witt had three straight (June 23-July 3, 1994)...struck out 10 batters in each start and is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back 10 strikeout games

GOING THE DISTANCE: Tossed his fourth complete game of the season September 3 against Seattle, a three-hit shutout...it was his first complete game win...it was the low-hit game of his career and his second career shutout...did not walk a batter and struck out a career high 10 for the second consecutive start...is the 10th pitcher in Oakland history with no walks and 10 or more strikeouts in a complete game...is just the third Athletics pitcher over the last 98 years with a complete game shutout, three or fewer hits, no walks and 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Witt, June 23, 1994 vs. Kansas City; Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota)...had complete game losses April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City and August 29 at Cleveland...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

since Mark Mulder (July 24-29, 2003)...is the first righty to do it since Todd Stottlemyre (Sept. 20-26, 1995).

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 8-4 with a 3.18 ERA (35 er in 99.0 ip) in 15 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed just one run in seven innings...Young singled to lead off the second, went to third on a Beltre single and then scored when Napoli grounded into a double play...the A's scored twice in the fifth inning to take a 2-1 lead and he was relieved by Balfour to start to the eighth inning...Balfour allowed solo home runs to Kinsler and Hamilton for the blown save and loss...it was the fourth time this year he left the game with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save.

McCARTHY vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-4 with a 4.15 ERA (52.0 ip, 47 h, 24 r, 24 er, 10 bb, 45 so, 10 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts...is 2-1 with a 2.95 ERA (12 er in 36.2 ip) in six games in his home ballparks and 0-3 with a 7.04 ERA (12 er in 15.1 ip) in four games at Safeco Field...is 2-3 with a 4.10 ERA (22 er in 48.1 ip) in his eight starting assignments...is 1-2 despite a 1.14 ERA (23.2 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in three starts, including two complete games, this year...the last A's pitcher with two complete games against the Mariners in one season was Ron Darling in 1994...the first loss came in a 1-0 decision at Seattle April 21...tossed a complete-game four-hitter but Hernandez, Wright and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...allowed the only run of the game on a one-out home run by Kennedy in the fourth inning...then lost 2-1 in Oakland July 4...allowed a two-out solo home run to Bard in the sixth and a RBI double to Smoak in the seventh...the A's were limited to a run on three hits by Pineda and the Mariners bullpen...then tossed his second career shutout, a three-hitter in the A's 3-0 win September 3 in Oakland...it was the low-hit game of his career and his fifth career complete game...did not walk a batter and struck out a career high 10.

RHP Trevor Cahill (11-14, 4.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 34th start of the season...is 3-7 with a 6.35 ERA (52 er in 73.2 ip) and .320 (97 for 303) opponents batting average in 13 starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in wild pitches (15), ranks third in walks (80) and is tied for fourth in losses (14) and stolen bases allowed (28)...has career highs this year in strikeouts (140), innings pitched (200.2), games started (33), hits (210) and earned runs (96)...has allowed a .193 (17 for 88) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is fifth lowest in the AL...is 3-4 with a 3.30 ERÁ (21 er in 57.1 ip) in 10 career starts against Seattle, including 2-1 with a 3.71 ERA (11 er in 26.2 ip) in five starts this season.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 5.71 ERA (56 er in 88.1 ip) and .279 (98 for 351) opponents batting average over the last 28 games (since August 25)...is 2-5 with five saves and three blown saves over that span...now has a 4.71 ERA (103 er in 197.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (15) and is tied for the third most losses (25)...ranks third in the AL in first batter strikeouts (101)...has allowed 70 of 208 (33.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL

- Has converted all 15 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is fourth in the AL in saves since the break...is now a perfect 38 for 38 in save chances following the break in his career.
- Has allowed at least one run in seven of his last 16 appearances (10 er in 16.1 ip, 5.51 ERA).
