A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 7-10 with two games remaining...are 2-6 and went Oakland...have now lost the season series three times in the past five years and are 40-53 (.430) against Seattle ...that is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 290-217 (.572), which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 163-93 in Oakland and 127.125 in Soath 127-125 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 15 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 38 for 38 after the break in his career.

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in hitting (.305) and triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (22) and is third in doubles (25) and multiple hit games (35).

Josh Willingham has career highs in home runs (28) and RBI (95)...the RBI are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 114 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1914 the A's defeat the St. Louis Browns 6-0 to clinch the American League pennant...in 1970 Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in 1989 Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship...in 1997 Jason Giambi breaks his own club record with his 41st double of the season in the A's 9-3 loss at Seattle...in 1998, one year after Giambi breaks the Oakland record for doubles in a season, Ben Grieve ties the mark with his 41st double in the A's 4-2 loss to Anaheim.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost eight of the last 13 games and are 16 games under .500 at 72-88...the season low is 17 games under .500 (69-86 on Sept. 21)...have not finished a season more than 14 games under .500 since 1997 when they were 65-97...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish without a winning record, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...had six consecutive seasons with a .500 record or lower from 1982-87 and 1993-98...entering play today, only three other teams have not posted a winning record over the last five years: Baltimore, Kansas City and Pittsburgh (Washington at 79-80 would be the fourth)...are 12-12 in the month of September...have gone seven consecutive months without a winning record and have not finished above .500 in a month since going 14-10 in July of 2010...there have been just three seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not post a winning record in any month (1979, 1982 and 1997)...are 33-35 (.485) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 50-68 (.424) since then...have spent 65 of the last 66 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 99 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 29-24 (.547) record on the weekend (15-13 on Saturday, 14-11 on Sunday) compared to 43-64 (.402) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with Bob Melvin...Melvin was given a three-year contract through the 2014 season on Wednesday.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles (2-1) and Seattle (0-1)...have lost nine of the last 13 road games and are 29-50 (.367) on the road overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...this is the fifth consecutive season the A's will finish with a losing record on the road and the 50 road losses are the most by an A's team since going 30-51 in 1997...went 4-6 on the final homestand against Los Angeles (1-2), Detroit (2-2) and Texas (1-2) and finished the home portion of the schedule with a 43-38 (.531) record...it marked the second consecutive season the A's posted a winning record at home...hit .249 at home and are batting .239 (658 for 2753) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have hit under .239 on the road just once in Oakland history (.230 in 1968)...posted a 3.18 ERA at home and have a 4.37 (336 er in 691.2 ip) on the road...have the third lowest home ERA in the AL and the fifth highest road ERA.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has recorded 1140 strikeouts for the season, which is a new Athletics franchise record (since 1901)...the previous high was 1124 in 2009...the 1140 strikeouts this season rank sixth in the American League...has a 4.62 ERA (310 er in 604.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...was leading the AL in ERA at the break but has the fifth highest post-break ERA...now has a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.381), ranks second in fewest home runs (136) and is third in pickoffs (20)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.76 ERA (408 er in 977.2 ip) this season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...Trevor Cahill has 14 losses and Gio Gonzalez has 12 losses...the A's have not had two pitchers lose 13 or more games since 1984 (McCatty 14, Sorensen 13).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .218 (104 for 447) with 44 runs scored over the last 15 games (2.93 runs per game)...have scored 636 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are averaging 3.98 runs per game, which is currently sixth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since the 1979 club averaged 3.54...have been shutout 15 times this season, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Diego, 19)...it is also third most in Oakland history and is the most since the 1979 club was blanked 17 times...the record is 19 in 1978...have hit 111 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...it is currently the sixth lowest total in Oakland history in a non-strike season and is the fewest since the 1994 club hit 113...have a .368 slugging percentage, which ranks third lowest in the AL...that is the lowest mark by an A's team since slugging .367 in 1982...have the third lowest batting average (.244) and have hit under .244 just once over the last 29 years (.242 in 2008)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.312) and have not finished with a mark under .312 since 1982 (.309)...are hitting .299 (175 for 586) with runners in scoring position since the All-Star Break after hitting .239 before the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 124 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (132)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...the last time the A's led the American League in errors was 1998 (141)...19 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and ranks fourth most in the majors...it is also tied for third most in Oakland history (22 in 1977, 20 in 1986, 19 in 1997)...the errors have led to 82 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL, second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2000 (83).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-25 (.444) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...the 25 one-run losses are the most by an A's team since 1987 when they went 20-27...have finished with a losing record in one-run games just once over the previous 12 seasons (15-23 in 2009)...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games, tied for second in losses and have the fourth worst record...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 17-28 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 12-20 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's recalled Joey Devine today and placed him on the 60-day disabled list...have used the disabled list 15 times and currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Barton, Braden, Devine and Magnuson)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was the second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract for 2012 and beyond: Brett Anderson (2013, club options for 2014 and 2015), Grant Balfour (2012, club option 2013), Trevor Cahill (2015, club options 2016 and 2017), Brian Fuentes (2012, club option 2013) and Kurt Suzuki (2013, club option 2014)...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012...five players are eligible for free agency (Crisp, DeJesus, Harden, Matsui and Willingham) and seven more are eligible for arbitration (Bailey, Barton, Braden, Breslow, Devine, McCarthy and Sweeney)...the A's top candidates to gain arbitration eligibility under Super Two status are Rosales (2 years, 171 days at end of season), Gonzalez (2 years, 162 days) and Powell (2 years, 144 days).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 34th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the 34 starts are the most by an Athletic since 2007 when Blanton, Gaudin and Haren all made 34 starts...the A's are 14-19 (.424) in his starting assignments this year and are 50-45 (.526) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 33 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 3-7 with a 6.35 ERA (52 er in 73.2 ip) and .320 (97 for 303) opponents batting average in 13 starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...is tied for the second in the American League and tied for third in the majors in losses since the break.

6-0 THEN 5-14: Is 5-14 with a 5.22 ERA (86 er in 148.1 ip) and .292 (169 for 578) opponents batting average over his last 25 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but leads the majors in losses since May

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in wild pitches (15), ranks third in walks (81), tied for fourth in losses (14) and stolen bases allowed (28) and 10th in hits (210)...the 28 stolen bases are the most allowed by an

A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded 32 in 1987...the 15 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when Blake Stein also had 15...the last with more than 15 is Mike Moore, who had 22 in 1992...the 14 losses match Braden's team leading total from last year...the last A's pitcher to lose more than 14 games is Greg Smith (16 in 2008)...his losses are the most by an A's right-hander since Tom Candiotti lost 16 games

WINS: Has 11 wins this year after winning 18 games a year ago and 10 in his first season in 2009...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 39 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

CAREER HIGHS: Has career highs this year in strikeouts (140), innings pitched (200.2), games started (33), losses (14), hits (210), runs (102), earned runs (96) and walks (81).

HOME AND AWAY: Went 6-8 with a 3.20 ERA (39 er in 109.2 ip) and .257 (106 for 412) opponents batting average in 17 starts at home and is 5-6 with a 5.64 ERA (57 er in 91.0 ip) and .288 (104 for 361) opponents average in 16 starts on the road...is now 24-18 with a 3.24 ERA (115 er in 319.1 ip) in 50 career starts in Oakland and 15-17 with a 4.84 ERA (138 er in 256.2 ip) in 45 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .193 (17 for 88) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has yielded a .258 (48 for 186) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .305 (43 for 141) over his last 23 starts (since May 25)...has allowed 19 home runs, 13 of which have been hit by left-handed hitters...has surrendered 41 of his 65 career home runs to lefties.

INNING-BY-INNING: Has a 1.64 ERA (6 er in 33.0 ip) and .172 (19 for 111) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 5.13 ERA (83 er in 145.2 ip) and .296 average (169 for 571) in innings two through six and a 3.00 ERA (7 er in 21.0 ip) and .272 (22 for 81) average from the seventh inning on.

CAREER TRENDS: Went 10-14 with a 4.80 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over the first 33 starts of his career...then went 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over a 37-start stretch from May 5, 2010 to May 9, 2011...is 5-14 with a 5.22 ERA (86 er in 148.1 ip) and .292 (169 for 578) opponents batting average in 25 starts since then.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Texas last Thursday in Oakland....the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two runs in the second inning on a Beltre RBI double and a Cruz sacrifice fly...also allowed a RBI single to Murphy in the sixth inning and left trailing 3-2...the A's scored once in the seventh inning to get him off the hook and added another run in the eighth for the win.

CAHILL vs. SEATTLE: Is 3-4 with a 3.30 ERA (57.1 ip, 61 h, 23 r, 21 er, 21 bb, 37 so, 4 hr) in 10 career starts...is 2-2 with a 4.88 ERA (15 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts in Seattle and 1-2 with a 1.82 ERA (6 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts in Oakland...is 2-1 with a 3.71 ERA (26.2 ip, 33 h, 12 r, 11 er, 10 bb, 21 so) in five starts this year...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day April 1 in Oakland...walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning and left with a 2-1 lead...pitched just 4.2 innings...picked up the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle April 23...allowed a run in the second on a Wilson RBI single but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss in Oakland July 5... allowed an unearned run in the second and a lead off home run to Ackley in the seventh and left trailing 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the eighth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Seattle August 1...allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in just 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the second inning and a RBI single to Oliva in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win September 4 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Suzuki in the fifth...was relieved by Outman to start the sixth inning with a 4-1 lead.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (15-12, 3.25 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 32nd start of the season...has won each of his last three starts (4 er in 21.0 ip, 1.71 ERA) and the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: August 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...is now 6-1 with a 2.89 ERA (15 er in 46.2 ip) over his last seven starts after going 0-5 with a 7.90 ERA over his previous five starts...won his 15th game of the season in his last start, which is tied for ninth in the American League...that matches his career high from last year and he is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games in back-to-back seasons since Mark Mulder won 17 games in 2004 and 15 in 2003...the last A's left-hander to win more than 15 games is Barry Zito, who won 16 games in 2006...is 5-2 with a 3.68 ERA (63.2 ip, 61 h, 28 r, 26 er, 36 bb, 61 so, 5 hr) in 11 career appearances, nine starts, against Seattle, including 1-1 with a 4.73 ERA (13.1 ip, 16 h, 7 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 13 so) in two starts this year.
