The A's shutout Yomiuri, 5-0 as five Oakland pitchers combined to the Giants on shutout hits...Tommy Milone started for the A's and picked up the win...he tossed 5.0 innings, allowed both of hits and struck seven...Ryan Cook, Brian Fuentes, Jordan Norberto and Grant Balfour tossed a scoreless inning of relief each...Jemile Weeks opened the scoring with a RBI single in the second inning and the A's scored the rest of their runs in a four-run seventh inning...Kurt Suzuki hit a two-run home run, Weeks added another RBI single and Coco Crisp walked with the bases loaded to force in the final run...the A's collected eight hits, including two each by Weeks and Josh Reddick.

JAPAN ROSTER

The A's travel roster to Japan has players...that includes players on the 40-man roster and invitees non-roster three (Schlichting, Scribner and Timmons)...the breakdown includes 14 pitchers, two catchers, breakdown infielders and outfielders...the A's 40-man roster currently has 30 active players as Daric Barton, Dallas Braden and Devine Joey remain must be Arizona...the roster reduced to 28 players by Opening Day and three players can be designated as inactive for the two against Seattle games Japan...the A's have 40 players on the 40-man roster plus Scott Sizemore, who was placed on the 60-day DL March 3 after tearing his left ACL February 25, and Brett Anderson, who was placed on the 60-day DL March 13 as continues his recovery from recovery Tommy John" surgery.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Went 10-2-1 over the final 13 games in Arizona and are 14-5-2 (.714) for the spring...through games of Saturday, March 24, that is the best record in the Cactus League and third best in the majors behind Toronto (18-4-1) and Detroit (14-4-3)...have three Spring Training games remaining against the Giants in the Bay Area, April 2-4...the two exhibition games here in Japan and against the A's Triple-A affiliate in Sacramento on March 31 do not count in the statistics...the A's have clinched a winning record during the spring for the first time since 2008 (18-8)...the .714 winning percentage is on pace to break the Oakland record of .692 set in 2008 (18-8)...the 14 wins are two more than the A's total from each of the previous two springs (12-21-1 in 2011, 12-17-3 in 2010...after concluding the Arizona portion of their schedule on Wednesday, March 21, the A's led the majors in runs (133), hits (218) and walks (80) and topped the CL in doubles (52) and home runs (24)...currently lead the majors in slugging (.476) and on-base percentage (.363) and top the CL in runs (133)..are third in the CL in batting (.293) and walks (80) and tied for third in home runs (24)...the pitching staff currently ranks third in the CL in walks (80)...this is the A's 44th Spring Training in Arizona, their 31st consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...are scheduled to play 24 games this spring, which will be the fewest since 1990 when they played just 16...played 26 games in 2008, the last time the A's opened the season in Japan.

JAPAN SERIES: The A's will open the regular season in Japan for the second time when they face the Seattle Mariners Wednesday, March 28 at 7:10 pm (3:10 am PT)...the two clubs will also square off Thursday, March 29 at 6:10 pm (2:10 am PT)...MLB Network will televise the games on a tape delayed basis at 6:00 am PT and 7:00 pm PT on both days...Brandon McCarthy is scheduled to face Felix Hernandez in the opener and Bartolo Colón will square off against Jason Vargas in the second game...the other time the A's opened the season in Japan was in 2008 when they split two games with Boston...lost the opener 6-5 in 10 innings and won game two 5-1...Kurt Suzuki is the only player on the roster who was on the A's Opening Day roster in Japan in 2008...Coco Crisp was on the Red Sox roster that year.

Yoenis Céspedes went 2 for 5 last Tuesday against the Cubs after going 1 for 18 over his previous six games...has started seven games in center field and one at designated hitter...Collin Cowgill was tied for the major league lead in hits (18) and triples (2) at the conclusion of the Arizona portion of the schedule, March 21...is still tied for the lead in triples...is tied for sixth in the CL in batting (.419), hits (18) and stolen bases (4) and ranks ninth in on-base percentage (.469)...had a 10-game hitting streak from March 8-19 (15 for 23, .652)...has made 13 appearances in center field, six in left and five in right...Coco Crisp reached base safely via hit or walk in all nine of his games before going 0 for 4 last Tuesday against the Cubs...started in left field Tuesday after making each of his first nine starts in center...is tied for the ML lead in triples (2)...**Josh Donaldson** is 3 for 21 (.143) over his last seven games after going 7 for 13 (.538) over his previous four contests...has appeared in 17 games, all at third base...Jonny Gomes had a pinch hit home run last Tuesday against the Cubs and each of his last four hits are for extra bases (three doubles, one home run)...has walked in each of his last six games and is tied for fourth in the CL with nine walks overall...is also tied for ninth in runs (10)...Kila Ka'aihue hit his third home run last Tuesday against the Cubs, which is tied for eighth in the CL...six of his eight hits are for extra bases (three doubles, three home runs)...Cliff Pennington is 0 for 7 over his last three games after reaching base safely in each of his first 10 contests...had a nine-game hitting streak March 4-17 (15 for 29, .518)...ranks seventh in the CL in on-base percentage (.477)... TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#66 TYSON ROSS RHP (2-0, 0.90 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the spring...has not allowed a run in his last three starts (9.0 ip) after allowing one run in 1.0 inning in his first start March 3 at Seattle...went 3-3 with a 2.75 ERA in nine games, six starts, with Oakland last year before going on the disabled list May 20 with a strained left oblique...surrendered just one home run in 36.0 innings and had a .298 opponents percentage...allowed a .252 opponents batting average, which included a .250 mark against left-handed hitters and .254 against right-handers...opponents hit.172 with runners on, including .208 with runners in scoring position...was 3-2 with a 7.61 ERA in nine starts with Sacramento...struck out 34 in 36.2 innings but also issued 22 walks...pitched for Phoenix in the Arizona Fall League following the season and was 1-3 with a 5.94 ERA in seven starts.

#50 GRANT BALFOUR RHP (0-0, 7.94 ERA)

Has made six appearances this spring, not including a scoreless ninth inning yesterday against Yomiuri...has not allowed a run in his last four outings (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 2 so) after allowing at least two runs in each of his first two outings (5 er in 1.2 ip, 27.00 ERA)...his last appearance was Monday against Arizona (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 1 so)...posted a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 relief appearances with the A's last year.

#13 JERRY BLEVINS LHP (1-0, 5.40 ERA)

Has made six appearances this spring...allowed two runs in the eighth inning in his last outing last Monday against Arizona (1.0 ip, 1 1 bb, 1 hr)...did not allow a run in his previous four outings (3.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so)...opponents are 3 for 18 (.167) with one walk...had no decisions, a 2.86 ERA and .235 opponents batting average in 26 appearances over six stints with Oakland last year.

#38 ANDREW CARIGNAN RHP (0-0, 2.45 ERA)

Has made six appearances this spring...has not allowed a run in five of his six outings, including his last appearance Tuesday against the Cubs (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so)...has not walked a batter in 7.1 innings and has struck out nine...was 1-0 with eight saves and a 1.85 ERA in 33 appearances in the A's farm system last year and also posted a 4.26 ERA in six relief appearances with Oakland in his debut

#48 RYAN COOK RHP (0-0, 3.86 ERA)

Has made six appearances this spring, not including a scoreless sixth inning yesterday against Yomiuri...opponents are 2 for 23 (.087) with two walks...has not allowed a run in four of his six outings, including his last appearance Tuesday against the Cubs (1.0 ip, 1 so)...has not allowed a baserunner in those four outings...was one of three players acquired from Arizona in the Trevor Cahill trade, December 9...posted a 7.04 ERA in 12 appearances over three stints with Arizona in his ML debut last year.

#60 FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS RHP (0-0, 1.42 ERA)

Has made seven appearances this spring...has not allowed an earned run in his last six outings (5.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 3 bb, 5 so) after allowing one run in 1.0 inning in his first outing...his last outing was Tuesday against the Cubs (1.0 ip, 1 so)...made his Major League debut with the A's in 2011, logging a 3-2 record with a 4.32 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in 34 games over three stints.

#40 BRIAN FUENTES LHP (0-0, 7.50 ERA)

Has made six appearances this spring, not including a scoreless seventh inning yesterday against Yomiuri (1 so)...has not allowed a run in four of his last five outings, including his last appearance Monday against Arizona (1.0 ip, 2 so)...allowed four runs in 1.0 inning March 13 against Milwaukee...was 2-8 with a 3.70 ERA in 67 appearances with the A's last year.

#45 GRAHAM GODFREY RHP (1-2, 7.11 ERA)

Has made five appearances, including three starts, this spring...is 1-2 with a 6.23 ERA (6 er in 8.2 ip) in his three starts (March 2, 16 and 21) and 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (4 er in 4.0 ip) in his two relief appearances...was 1-2 with a 3.96 ERA in five games, four starts, with Oakland last year...was also 14-3 with a 2.68 ERA in 19 games, 18 starts, with Sacramento...led the PCL in wins

#77 JORDAN NORBERTO LHP (1-0, 3.12 ERA)

Has made a team-leading eight appearances this spring, not including a scoreless eighth inning yesterday against Yomiuri (2 so)...has not allowed a run in six of his those outings...his last appearance was Wednesday at Kansas City (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...was acquired from Arizona at the trading deadline last year, posting an 8.10 ERA in six relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was 6-2 with two saves and a 3.79 ERA in 47 minor league appearances with Reno and Sacramento.

#39 TRAVIS SCHLICHTING RHP (2-0, 6.52 ERA)

including made five appearances, one spring...allowed four runs in his last outing Wednesday at Kansas City (0.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb)...yielded one run in three of his first four outings, including a start March 17 against the Cubs...the nonroster invitee signed a minor league contract with the A's December 20...was 5-3 with four saves and a 7.10 ERA in 51 relief appearances with Triple-A Albuquerque last year.

#58 EVAN SCRIBNER RHP (1-0, 1.64 ERA)

Has made seven appearances this spring...has not allowed a run in six of his outings, including each of his last four (7.0 ip, 4 h, 3 bb, 6 so)...his last appearance was Wednesday at Kansas City (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so)...the non-roster invitee made his Major League debut with San Diego last year, posting a 7.07 ERA in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the Padres...was 2-3 with a 4.71 ERA in 28 relief appearances with Tucson.
