FIRST OPENER

Although it seems like forever ago, the following players were listed of their first Opening Day roster: pitchers **Blake Beavan, Steve Delabar, Charlie Furbush, Hisashi Iwakuma, Lucas Luetge, Hector Noesi, Erasmo Ramirez**, catcher **Jesús Montero**, infielders **Dustin Ackley, Munenori Kawasaki, Alex Liddi**, **Kyle Seager**, outfielder **Mike Carp**.

THE ROSTER

The Mariners had to trim the 28-man roster for Opening Day in Japan to 25 players earlier this week...LHP **Charlie Furbush**, RHP **Shawn Kelley** and OF **Carlos Peguero** were optioned to AAA Tacoma as the final roster moves...the current active roster includes 12 pitchers, 3 catchers, 7 infielders and 3 outfielders...additionally, 3 players are currently on the disabled list (Mike Carp, Franklin Gutierrez, Adam Moore)...the youngest player on the roster is RHP **Erasmo Ramirez** (5/2/90) at 21 years, 10 months+...the oldest is OF **Ichiro Suzuki** (10/22/73) at 38 years, 5 months+.

OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener on Friday, April 13 (Friday the 13th) hosting the Oakland A's at Safeco Field (7:10 pm)...Seattle is 21-14 all-time in the first home game of the season, including going 6-4 after starting the season on the road.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners (1-1) resume the regular season tonight with the first of a two-game series vs. the A's (1-1)...Seattle will travel to Texas for a four-game series with the Rangers following Saturday's game and take a rare Sunday off...the Mariners and A's split a pair of games to open the 2012 season March 28-29 at the Tokyo Dome as part of the **Gloops Japan Opening Series 2012**...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT Sports** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

SPRING TRAINING ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners finished with a 16-9-1 record (.635), the 12th winning spring in club history...3rd-best spring winning percentage in club history (21-9/.700 in 1994, 18-10-1/.638 in 2004)...see more on spring training on pages 9-10 of the game notes.

- Seattle led all MLB teams with a .297 spring batting average (269x907, 2B - 55, 3B - 11, HR - 28).
- **Munenori Kawasaki** won spring batting title, leading both the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues with a .455 batting average (20x44, 2B, 3B, 13 RBI).
- 7 players hit over .300 in Cactus League play (Kawasaki - .455, Ichiro - .415, Smoak - .378, Liddi - .370, Seager - .360, Saunders - .356, Montero - .326).
- **What Jet Lag?** - in the four games featuring the *regular* players after returning from Japan, the Mariners combined to bat .353 while averaging over 7 runs and 10 hits per game.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY...today is the official 35th Anniversary of the Mariners first game in club history, April 6, 1977 vs. the California Angels...throughout the 2012 season, the Mariners will celebrate the 35th Anniversary of Mariners baseball in Seattle.

DOWN ON THE FARM...the Mariners four full-season minor league affiliates opened the 2012 season yesterday and combined to go 2-2...AA **Jackson** (3-2 over Birmingham) and A **High Desert** (9-7 over Lancaster) recorded Opening Day victories, while AAA **Tacoma** (3-2 loss vs. Salt Lake) and A **Clinton** (8-2 loss vs. Burlington) dropped to 0-1.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the third (1-1) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2012...will open home schedule against A's on April 13-15...the Mariners went 10-9 against the A's last season, including 4-5 at Oakland Coliseum...have dropped 5 of last 7 games...Seattle is 54-42 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 218-293, including a 92-163 mark at Oakland Coliseum.

ROAD WARRIORS...18 of the Mariners first 27 games of the 2012 season will be played on the road (and 28 of first 43)...Seattle will play 8 road games before playing a game at Safeco Field.

OPENING DAY WINNING STREAK...with the 3-1 win over the A's on Opening Day March 28 in Tokyo, the Mariners have won 6 consecutive season openers (a club record), the longest current streak in the Majors...the D-backs carry an active 5-game Opening Day win streak into today.

KING FELIX...**Felix Hernandez** made his 5th career Opening Day start for Seattle on March 28 in Tokyo (also 2007 vs. A's, 2009 vs. Twins, 2010 at A's, 2011 at A's)...Felix joins Randy Johnson (6 - 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998) as the only pitcher in franchise history to make 5 or more Opening Day starts...Felix's 3 career Opening Day wins are the most in Mariners history (R. Johnson - 2)...**in his 5 OD starts, Felix is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (7 ER, 39.2 IP) with 33 strikeouts.**

NOW BATTING 3RD...**Ichiro** will be the Mariners #3 hitter this season, a role that will be new to him...he has played in 1,751 games with the Mariners, making 1,735 starts (including 2 games this season), and batted leadoff in 1,720 of those games...has made **15** starts batting 3rd in his Major League career, last (prior to this season) being June 23, 2004 at Texas...although we don't have accurate records, we have been told Ichiro batted 3rd more than leadoff during his 9-year career with Orix in Japan...when he started batting 3rd on Opening Day vs. the A's, it snapped a string of 1,203 consecutive starts batting leadoff...that was the longest streak of a player batting leadoff dating back to 1974, with the previous long being Kenny Lofton (1,078).

TIME TRAVELERS...Tom Verducci (*SI.com*) points out that after the Mariners trip to Japan "...Seattle goes to Arizona to play five more spring training games, then leaves for two games in Oakland and then four more in Texas. That's a 19-game, 22-day, 14-time zone trip. The Mariners finally get to Seattle for their home opener April 13 -- two months and two days after their first spring training workout."

FOUR!...**Ichiro** went 4-for-5 in the March 28 season opener vs. the A's in Tokyo, becoming just the second player in Mariners history to collect 4 hits in the season opener...he joins Ken Griffey Jr., who had 4 hits on OD, 1990...**Ichiro** now has 17 career Opening Day hits, most in Mariners club history (Griffey Jr. is 2nd all-time with 14).

AS YOU KNOW...**Jason Vargas** makes his second start of the season tonight vs. the A's...he also started the Mariners last game March 29 vs. the A's in Tokyo...**DID YOU KNOW?**...he becomes the first **Mariner** to start consecutive team games since Gil Meche July 9 & July 14, 2006 (surrounding the All-Star break)...he will become just the 5th pitcher since 1980 to start back-to-back team games vs. the **same opponent**, last being the Rangers Aaron Myette vs. the Orioles Sept. 3-4, 2002...Freddy Garcia started consecutive games for the Mariners vs. the Angels Sept. 10 & 18, 2001 due to the 9/11 cancellations.

ABOUT VARGAS...pronounced VAR-gus.

- 28-year-old lefty is making his 2nd start of the season vs. Oakland tonight, both starts have come against the A's.
- Acquired from the Mets in 3-team, 12-player trade 12/10/08.
- Selected by Marlins in 2nd round, 68th overall in '04 draft.
- Made ML debut w/1.0 shutout inning of relief 7/14/05 at PHI (with FLA)...first ML start 7/18/05 at Arizona (5.0,4,3,2,4,3).
- Did not pitch during 2008 season, spending year recovering from surgery to repair the labrum in left hip...had surgery March 17, 2008 & spent summer rehabbing at Mets minor league facility in Port St. Lucie, FL.
- Played in college at LSU (2002), Cypress JC (2003) and Long Beach State (2004)...as junior at LBSU, went 7-4, 4.14 on mound & hit .354 with 14 doubles, 5 home runs as the DH.
- Is 4-4, 4.97 (46 ER, 83.1 IP) in 15 starts in April.

LAST START...recorded a ND in Mariners 4-1 loss to the Athletics on March 29 in Tokyo, Japan...allowed only 1 run on 2 hits in 6.1 innings (2 BB, 3 K)...after tossing 6.0 shutout innings, allowed a lead off walk in the 7th before Shawn Kelley came in and allowed a 2-run home run to Cespedes.

IT DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN...Vargas will start in back-to-back games tonight vs. the Athletics...he will be only the 5th pitcher in the Major Leagues since 1980 to start back-to-back starts vs. the same team...the last pitcher to start in back-to-back games was Rangers pitcher Aaron Myette vs. BAL on Sept. 3 & 4, 2002...also done by: Freddy Garcia, SEA (9/10 & 18, 2001 vs. ANA), Jon Lieber, CHI (9/10 & 18, 2001 vs. CIN) and Steve McCatty, OAK (4/14 & 15 vs. SEA).

SPRING TRAINING...was 0-1, 12.46 ERA (12 ER, 8.2 IP) with 6 strikeouts in 3 Cactus League starts...in last appearance on 3/19 vs. CHI 0.2 IP, 8 H, 7 R/ER, BB, K...also appeared in 2 Intrasquad games on 2/24 & 2/28 (5.1,4,1,1,0,5)...appeared in MiLB game 3/14 (6.1,8,2,2,1,5,HR).

MINI WIN STREAK...has won each of his last 3 decisions (Mariners have won each of his 4 of last 5 starts...had a career-high 4-game winning streak May 9-June 22, 2010...his current 3-game winning streak is his fifth winning streak of at least 3 games (last: April 29-May 18, 2011).

SHUTOUT. GET YOUR SHUTOUT...T3rd in AL with 3 shutouts (4 led league) and T4th with 4 CG...tossed 3 shutouts over a 6-start span from June 3-July 1: June 3 vs. TB, June 19 vs. PHI and July 1 vs. SD.

RUN SUPPORT...received 2 or fewer runs of support in 20 of 33 starts, including 11 of last 16 GS...since start of 2009, has the lowest run support average in AL (3.44); has started 78 games since 2009, and his team has scored 2 runs or less in 50 of them.

2011 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- Went 10-13 with a 4.25 ERA (95 ER, 201.0 IP) in 32 starts with 4 complete games and 3 shutouts.
- Set career highs in K's (prev: 116 in 2010), W (prev:8 in 2010), IP (prev: 192.2 in 2010) and GS (prev: 31 in 2010).
- T3rd in AL with 3 shutouts (4 led league) and T4th with 4 CG.
- Finished season 3-0, 2.03 in final 4 starts Sept. 8-26 (26.2 IP, 6 ER, 5 BB, 23 SO); team was 4-0...followed stretch of 11 starts July 6-Sept. 2 in which was a combined 1-8, 6.49 ERA (44 ER, 61.0 IP)...began year 6-5, 3.57 ERA (17 GS, 113.1 IP, 45 ER).
- Recorded career-high 10 strikeouts in final start of year 9/26 vs. OAK.
- Tossed 9.0 shutout innings 5/12 at BAL (9.0,7,0,0,1,4) but recorded ND in 2-1 loss (12 innings)...joins Tim Belcher (6/4/95 at BOS), Erik Hanson (10.0 IP, 8/1/90 at OAK) & Mike Moore (6/29/88 vs. TEX) as only pitchers in club history with at least 9.0 shutout innings to not earn a win.
- Snapped career-high 9-game losing streak with W#1 April 29 at Boston (7.0,8,4,4,2,4,2 HR)...was first win since Aug. 14, 2010 at Cleveland.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (0-0, 1.13 ERA)

25-year-old (turns 26 Sunday) right-hander is scheduled make his 2nd start of the season tomorrow at Oakland...recorded ND in Mariners 3-1 extra-inning win over the A's March 28 in Tokyo (8.0,5,1,1,0,6)...**2012 SPRING TRAINING** -- went 3-2 with a 3.68 ERA (9 ER, 22.0 IP) in 5 official Spring Training starts...recorded the win in final ST start on 4/2 vs. COL (4.0,2,0,0,0,6)...**2011 RECAP** -- went 14-14 with a 3.47 ERA (90 ER, 233.2 IP) in 33 starts with Seattle...ranked amongst AL starters in several pitching categories: complete games (5, T2nd), strikeouts (222, 4th), innings (233.2, 6th), Starts (33, T6th), K/9.0 IP (8.55, 7th), quality starts (22, T7th), ERA (3.47, 16th) and wins (14, T13th)...named Mariners MVP pitcher by the Seattle chapter of the BBWA...4th consecutive year to win the award...first pitcher in club history with 3 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011) with at least 30 starts, 200 strikeouts, 200.0 innings and an ERA under 3.50...combined to go 46-31 with a 2.73 ERA (219 ER, 722.0 IP) and 671 strikeouts over the last 3 seasons...**CAREER** -- is 85-67 with a 3.24 ERA in 205 career starts...85 career wins currently ranks 3rd on the Mariners all-time wins list, tops among RHP...also ranks 2nd in franchise history in ERA (3.24) and strikeouts (1,264)...**vs. OAK** -- is 12-4, 2.47 ERA (42 ER, 153.1 IP) in 22 starts... has a current 5-game winning streak vs. the A's dating back to the start of the 2009 season (10 GS, CG, 2.36 ERA, 72.1 IP, 73 K)...Seattle 9-1 in last 10 starts...went 3-0, 1.45 ERA (5 ER, 31.0 IP) in 4 GS in 2011.

2012 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

WINNING WAYS...the Mariners finished their 36th spring in the Cactus League with a 16-9-1 record...recorded back-to-back winning springs (went 16-13-2 in '11) for first time since a three-year streak from 1997-99...12th spring overall with a .500 or better record (2012, 2011, 2004, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1994, 1993, 1991, 1989, 1988, 1984)...3rd-best spring winning percentage in club history trailing only 1994 (21-9/.700) and 2004 (18-10-1/.638)...finished T2nd in the Cactus League standings, a half game behind the A's, and T4th among AL teams in the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues.

SAYONARA...the Mariners had an unusual spring, playing 21 Cactus League games before packing their bags and heading to Japan to open the 2012 regular season with a pair of games vs. the A's...in addition to the two games vs. the A's in 2012 Japan Opening Series, Seattle also played a pair of exhibition games against the Hanshin Tigers & Yomiuri Giants...the Mariners went 0-2 in the exhibition games, and 1-1 vs. the A's.

GETTING OFFENSIVE...Seattle led all MLB teams with a .297 spring batting average (269x907, 2B - 55, 3B - 11, HR - 28)...also led the American League spring circuit in on-base percentage (.362), slugging percentage (.474), OPS (.836) and runs per game (6.23).

KAWASAKI WINS BATTING TITLE...**Munenori Kawasaki** won spring batting title, leading both the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues with a .455 batting average (20x44, 2B, 3B, 13 RBI)...also ranked 2nd in on-base percentage (.489)...he finished the spring on a tear going 12-for-19 (.632) with 5 RBI over his final five games.

BALANCED POWER...the Mariners hit 28 home runs, with 17 players hitting at least one longball...**Carlos Peguero** (5 HR), **Kyle Seager** (4 HR), **Miguel Olivo** (2), **Jesus Montero** (2 HR), **Vinnie Catricala** (2 HR) and **Ichiro** (2 HR) all recorded multiple homers in Cactus League play...Peguero was T8th in the Cactus League in HR.

RED HOT ICHIRO...**Ichiro** finished the spring with 13 hits in his last 27 at-bats (.481), and batted .415 (17x41) with 2 home runs and 9 RBI in 13 Cactus League games...marked Ichiro's 12th spring training with the Mariners (since 2001), and he is a career .339 hitter (234x690) in spring play.

BIG ROSTER...the Mariners used 88 players during Cactus League play, including 36 pitchers and 52 position players...the 88 players used are the 2nd-most in club spring history, trailing only 89 in 2006...the 52 position players are the most in club history, surpassing the 50 used in 2003.

HOPE YOU ENJOY THE VIEW...The City of Peoria -- joined by representatives from the Mariners, Padres, Cactus League and AZSTA -- announced on March 5 that the city and the two teams have extended their agreement to play in Peoria...the Mariners began training in Peoria in 1993, and now plan to stay at least an additional 20 years...renovations of the Mariners clubhouse space will begin after the spring of 2013, to be completed by spring of 2014.

DOWN ON THE FARM...the Mariners four minor league affiliates compiled a 31-14-3 record in spring training play...the organization also recognized RHP **Brandon Maurer** and OF **Guillermo Pimentel** with the "C the Z" Awards (Control the Zone), and C **Carlton Tanabe** with the SEATTLE Award (awarded annually in spring training to the minor league player that exemplifies the qualities of Skill, Effort, Attitude, Tenacity, Teamwork, Loyalty and Enthusiasm).

TOP PROSPECTS...the Mariners opened camp with five players listed on *Baseball America's* annual list of top 100 minor league prospects -- **Jesus Montero** (#6), **Taijuan Walker** (#20), **Danny Hultzen** (#21), **James Paxton** (#52) and **Nick Franklin** (#77)...the Mariners were also ranked 6th by *Baseball America* in the annual organizational rankings, up from 18th in 2011...the five players were also listed on MLB.com's list of top 100 prospects -- Montero (#12), Hultzen (#16), Walker (#18), Franklin (#52), Paxton (#77).

ATTENDANCE MARKS...the Mariners topped 100,000 fans in home Spring attendance for the 9th consecutive spring...despite being limited to 13 home dates by international travel and a rainout, Seattle drew 102,681 fans to the Peoria Sports Complex...the Mariners and Angels were the only two AL clubs in the Cactus League averaging above 7,600 fans per game...overall, Seattle finished 7th in Cactus League average attendance (only games played in AZ), trailing San Francisco (12,361), Arizona (11,679), Colorado (10,698), the Angels (10,202), the Cubs (9,836) and the Dodgers (8,118) despite having missed a prime weekend while in Japan.

SPRING ODDS AND ENDS...

- The Mariners opened camp with 67 players on the roster (40 roster players, 27 non-roster players)...INF **Carlos Guillen** retired from baseball on March 6.
- **Alex Liddi** was named the Peoria Sports Complex Rookie of the Year after batting .370 (17x46, 13 R, 7 2B, HR, 11 RBI).
- **Felix Hernandez** went 3-2, 3.68 (9 ER, 22.0 IP) in 5 starts and was T9th in the Cactus League with 23 strikeouts.
- **Kyle Seager** ended the spring with a 8-game hitting streak (.400/12x30)...overall hit .360 (18x50, 12 R, 4 2B, 3B, 4 HR, 7 RBI) in 15 Cactus League games.
- **Jesus Montero** tied for the team lead with 13 RBI (with Kawasaki/Peguero), batting .326 (14x43) with 5 extra base hits (2B - 3, HR - 2) in 13 games.
