Tonight is the first of 9 games between these clubs in 2012, but starts off the only series slated for the Bay area...KC is here thru Wednesday and then Oakland pays a couple of visits to Kauffman Stadium, on June 1-3 and August 14-16...the Royals were 4-5 vs. the A's last year, posting a 3-3 split here in the Coliseum...KC trails the all-time work by a 243-296 margin, 108-163 here.

SEASON OPENS WITH SERIES VICTORY-- The Royals rebounded quite nicely from their season opening defeat at the hands of the Halos on Friday night, taking the final two games of their visit to the Big A, capped with a 7-3 triumph yesterday...it marked the second straight season that KC dropped its opener to the Angels and then came back to win the series...yesterday's contest saw the Royals jump out to a 3-0 lead in the top of the first with Billy Butler's 2-run homer to center the big blow...Jonathan Sanchez, making his first start in a Kansas City uniform, allowed single tallies in the first and third innings, but Eric Hosmer got those runs back in a big way with his second fifth inning homer in as many days, a 2-run blast to the seats in right for a 5-2 KC lead...the Royals added tack-on runs in the sixth and seventh and left it to the bullpen, where another Jonathan (Broxton), struck out the side with the potential tying run on deck to record his 85th career big league save, first as a Royal...Butler and Hosmer each finished with 2 hits and 3 RBI as the Royals are above .500 for the first time since last May 14 (20-19).

JONATHAN'S JOIN KC'S FIRST LIST -- It was "Jonathan" day at the "Big A" on Sunday as Jonathan Sanchez recorded his first win as a Royal and Jonathan Broxton bookended the day by recording his first save with KC...for Sanchez, the win was the 39th of his big league career, but first

since last June 2 when he defeated the Cardinals in St. Louis as a member of the Giants...he became the 263rd different hurler to record a victory in a Royals' uniform...as for Brox, yesterday's 3-strikeout rescue was the 85th of his career but first since last May 2 against the Chicago Cubs in Dodger Stadium...he is the 136th different hurler to post a save for KC and his next save will jump him into a tie for 56th on the club's all-time list.

BROX RECORDS 3-K SAVE--Jonathan Broxton's first save as a Royal was a dominant performance, entering with two aboard and none out in the ninth he fanned Torii Hunter, Vernon Wells and Kendrys Morales to secure the series for Kansas City...of his 85 career saves, it was just the second time he's fanned all 3 hitters he faced, the other occurring on May 21, 2010, when he K'd all 3 Detroit Tigers in an interleague affair while with the Dodgers...yesterday was the 12th time that Brox recorded 3 strikeouts in an inning in his career, though he allowed runners in the other 10...according to STATS, Inc. it was also the eighth time in franchise history that a closer fanned all 3 men he faced to record a save joining Joakim Soria (4 times), Jeff Montgomery (twice) and Mike MacDougal (once).

<u>CLUTCH PITCHING</u>--The Royals played a fivesome yesterday against the Angels, with Jonathan Sanchez, Jose Mijares, Kelvin Herrera, Aaron Crow and Jonathan Broxton combining to stifle the Angels in the 7-3 win...the group excelled at recording clutch outs in the contest as the Halos went a combined 0-for-13 with runners in scoring position, stranding 12 runners in the contest...yesterday was the largest 0'fer an KC opponent has had with runners in scoring position since Detroit was 0-for-16 on August 16, 2009, in a 3-2 Kansas City victory at Comerica Park.

HEADING HOME SOON -- The Royals will finally get to see the friendly confines of Kauffman Stadium this weekend, opening the 2012 home slate at 3:10 p.m. on Friday when the Cleveland Indians come calling...the Friday affair will kickoff the first of three 10-game homestands for Kansas City in 2012 with Detroit (3) and Toronto (4) also visiting during the initial stay...festivities for Friday will include player introductions, a surprise Opening Day first pitch ceremony and the presentation of the 2011 Rawlings Gold Glove to leftfielder Alex Gordon...the Royals will workout in Kauffman Stadium on Thursday afternoon at 3:00 p.m.

LUIS MENDOZA makes his 2012 debut as he opens the season's second series here in Oakland...tonight is Luis' 39th career Major League appearance (17th start) and his fifth career outing (second start) against the Athletics...Mendoza, 28, was acquired in a trade with the Rangers on April 2, 2010.

IMPRESSEIVE IN QUICK PROMOTION--Luis has his contract selected from Omaha (AAA) on September 18 last season and ended up winning 2 starts for KC...he defeated the Detroit Tigers, 10-2, on September 20 (7.0 IP, 6 H, 1 ER) and then won in Chicago against the White Sox, 2-1, on September 25 (7.2 IP, 5 H, 1 ER)...counting his Omaha work (playoffs included) and his two starts in the Majors, Mendoza

went a combined 16-5 last year with a 2.03 ERA (173.0 IP, 39 ER). PCL'S BEST IN 2011 -- Mendoza earned every award attainable last season with

Omaha, leading the offensive friendly Pacific Coast League with a 2.18 ERA in the regular season...he was PCL Pitcher of the Year, Omaha Pitcher of the Year as named

by the Royals organization, a part of the 12-member postseason All-PCL Team and a PCL All-Star...after compiling a 12-5 record in the regular season in 144.1 innings, he was even better in leading the Storm Chasers to the PCL title, winning the opening game of each post-season series and compiling a 1.29 ERA (14.0 IP, 2 ER)...he was named PCL Playoff MVP on September 17.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS -- Mendoza was initially signed by Boston as a non-drafted free agent prior to the 2000 campaign... in 2005, he was a waiver claim by the San Diego Padres on July 8, but returned to the BoSox organization just 19 days later via waivers...Luis was traded to Texas on July 30, 2006...from 2007-09, Mendoza made 32 appearances (14 starts) for the big league club in Texas, before being dealt to the Royals for cash considerations on April 2, 2010.

<u>CACTUS LEAGUE "CY YOUNG"</u>--Dubbed by ESPN's Buster Olney as the Cactus League Cy Young for 2021, Mendoza tuned up for tonight by tossing 2.2 innings last Wednesday afternoon in Lake Elsinore against the Padres, allowing 3 unearned runs on 4 hits and 2 walks, striking out 5...he was 4-0 with a Major League-leading 0.47 ERA in 6 Cactus League starts, allowing just 1 earned run (4 runs overall) on 15 hits and 5 walks in 19.1 innings, striking out 21...the 4 wins also tied him for the Major League lead with Detroit hurler Doug Fister and the Giants' Matt Cain.

VS. A'S--By virtue of his time with the Rangers, Luis has made 4 career appearances against Oakland, including 1 start...he is 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA (4.2 IP, 7 H, 3 ER), but has not pitched against the A's since September 22, 2008...his lone start came on September 8, 2007 in Arlington when he tossed 2.0 scoreless innings on 2 hits...he has made 2 relief stints here at the Coliseum, allowing 2 runs on 3 hits, a walk and a strikeout in 1.2 innings.

ROAD WORK--Mendoza won his one and only big league road start last season, 2-1, at U.S. Cellular Field over the White Sox on September 25...in that game, he pitched 7.2 innings, allowing the one run on 5 hits, walking 2 and striking out 4...the road win was his first in the Majors since June 25, 2008 at Houston...he is now 2-4 with a 6.70 career ERA (45.2 IP, 57 H, 34 ER) in 18 road affairs, including 7 road starts.

#### Tomorrow's Starter - Danny Duffy

- Danny will make his 2012 debut in the middle game of this set...the 23-year-old was 4-8 as a rookie in 2011, posting a 5.64 ERA in 20 starts (66 ER in 105.1 IP)...a graduate of Cabrillo High in Lompoc, Calif., Duffy was Kansas City's third-round pick in the 2007 June Free Agent Draft.
- The left-hander finished his spring with a dominant relief outing on Wednesday against the Padres at Lake Elsinore...he retired all 9 batters with 7 strikeouts while earning the win in a 7-6 contest...he was 1-2 for the spring, posting a 6.75 ERA (12 ER in 16.0 IP).
- Danny had success in Oakland as a rookie, going 2-0 with a 3.65 ERA in 2 starts (5 ER in 12.1 IP)...he notched his first Major League win here last June 14, limiting the Athletics to 2 runs on 4 hits and 2 walks over 6.0 IP...the second victory came in his final start of the season on September 6.
  - Duffy struck out 87 batters in 105.1 IP last year...the ratio of 7.43 per 9.0 innings ranks third-best all-time among Royals rookies.
  - This will be Danny's 12th career road start...he is 3-2, recording a 5.71 ERA (37 ER in 58.1 IP)...he won twice here and once in Cleveland.

  - He signed a one-year free agent contract with the Royals on November 30, 2011.
- Broxton was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in 14 relief outings for the Dodgers last season...he did not pitch after May 3 due to bone spurs in his right elbow.
- A two-time N.L. All-Star with the Dodgers in 2009 and 2010, Jonathan's 484 strikeouts are the third-most in baseball among relievers since 2006.

- Yuni had yesterday off after going 1-for-3 in each of the first two games of the Angels series...Friday night was his first career Opening Day assignment as a second baseman and the first time he's played that position in a big league game since August 29, 2005, while with Seattle vs. the Yankees.
- He signed as a free agent last December after a season in Milwaukee where he served as the starting shortstop for the N.L. Central champs...he was part of the 6-man deal that sent Zack Greinke to the Brewers in December, 2010 in exchange for Alcides Escobar, Lorenzo Cain, Jeremy Jeffress and Jake Odorizzi.
  - Batted .268 with 5 doubles and 3 home runs in the spring in 24 games, walking 4 times and striking out just 3 times in 56 at bats.
  - Hit .252 with 13 home runs and 68 RBI last season after batting .259 for KC in 2010 with a career-high 16 home runs and 78 RBI.
  - Recorded a .310 average in 11 postseason games with Milwaukee driving in 6.

- Jason did not appear in the weekend series...he makes his second consecutive Opening Day roster and his first with the Royals after being acquired with catcher Humberto Quintero from the Astros on March 20 in exchange for minor league pitcher Kevin Chapman and a player to be named.
  - Hit .262 overall this spring, including .333 with Kansas City...stole 8 bases in 9 attempts (tied for first in A.L.), including 7 following the trade.
- Posted his best season to date in 2011 for Houston, batting .294 with 31 stolen bases in 37 attempts, ranking ninth in the NL in thefts...also hit .396 with a .430 on-base pct. against left-handers, leading all MLB hitters in batting average vs. LHP (min. 100 plate appearances vs. lefties).

LAA Series: 3-for-11, run, 2B, HR, 3 RBI, BB This Road Trip: 3-for-11, run, 2B, HR, 3 RBI, BB **Billy Butler** 

- Billy had a banner offensive game yesterday, hitting a 2-run homer to the center in the first and a RBI double in the seventh...with a MLB-leading 141 doubles over the last 3+ seasons (Yankees' R. Cano is second w/ 136), has moved into ninth on the Royals all-time list with 186, just 1 back of David DeJesus.
  - He batted .414 with 8 doubles, 4 homers and 15 RBI in 26 spring games.
  - Entered 2012 as 1 of 10 players in baseball since 2009 with at least 500 hits, 200 runs, 50 home runs and a greater than .300 average.
- Among Royals players with at least 2,000 plate appearances, his current .297 career average is third all-time behind George Brett (.305) and Mike Sweeney (.299)...also 10th all-time in slugging (.458), on-base percentage (.360) and OPS (.818).
  - Finished the 2011 campaign on a tear hitting 13 of his 19 home runs after the break and driving in 57, which tied for the third-most in baseball.

# This & That

**STARTERS SOLID IN ANAHEIM**—The first series of the year witnessed solid starting pitching for the Royals as the trifecta of Bruce Chen, Luke Hochevar and Jonathan Sanchez combined for a 2.08 ERA in the 3-game visit to Anaheim, allowing a combined 4 earned runs in 17.1 innings, limiting the Halos to a collective .200 batting average (12-for-60)...Chen started things strong on Friday, working 6.0 shutout innings allowing 3 hits with no walks and 4 K's...Hochevar followed with 6.0 scoreless of his own before being charged with a pair of runs after he left the mound with one out in the seventh...Sanchez, in his KC debut on Sunday, gave up 2 runs on 4 hits in a 5-inning stint.

HOS GOES YARD AGAIN—The fifth inning, the Big A and Eric Hosmer had a lot in common over the last two days, as the 22-year old first baseman went deep in that frame both Saturday and Sunday in helping the Royals take the series from the Angels...he led off Saturday's fifth with his first blast of the year to up KC's lead at the time to 4-0 and then yesterday hit a carbon-copy (old timers term) shot to the seats in right for a 2-run blast to extend KC's lead to 5-2...this is the fourth time in Hosmer's young career that he's homered on consecutive days, joining May 11-12 in New York's Yankee Stadium as he clubbed the first two homers of his career...he later homered on July 3-4 in Colorado and August 31-September 1 in Detroit, hitting 3 home runs in 2 games...he now has 21 career home runs, 18 of which have been hit on the road.

**YOUNGEST SQUAD IN THE MAJORS**--The 2012 Opening Day edition of the Kansas City Royals was the youngest in Major League Baseball at 27 years, 155 days, which is actually up from 27 years and 6 days a season ago...next on the list is Houston at 27 years, 301 days and Atlanta at 28 years, 99 days...the average service time on this year's Opening Day roster is 3.16 years...Bruce Chen is the longest tenured player with 8 years, 171 days, and the oldest player on the roster at 34 years, 292 days of age...reliever Kelvin Herrera has the least amount of experience at 8 days of service time and 22 years, 97 days of age.

<u>VS. TRIBE</u>--The Royals will open their 44th home season on Friday when A.L. Central rival Cleveland hits town for a weekend visit...the Royals are in need of flipping their fortunes against the Indians, going just 6-12 vs. the Tribe last year, including a 3-6 mark in Kauffman Stadium, as well as 3-6 in Progressive Field...KC trails the all-time body of work by a 278-295 margin, but holds a 148-136 advantage in Kansas City, 136-124 in Kauffman Stadium.

ROYALS HOLD FOREIGN BORN MARK—Of the 243 foreign born players on Major League opening day rosters (including disabled list players), the Royals have the highest individual club number with 13...the KC list includes: Bruce Chen (Panama), Kelvin Herrera & Felipe Paulino (Dominican Republic), Luis Mendoza & Joakim Soria (Mexico), Jose Mijares, Alcides Escobar, Humberto Quintero, Salvador Perez & Manny Pina (Venezuela), Brayan Pena & Yuniesky Betancourt (Cuba) and Jonathan Sanchez (Puerto Rico)...next on the list are the Colorado Rockies and the New York Yankees, who each have 12 foreign born ballplayers...the Dominican Republic leads the pack with 95 players, including 2 with the Royals, while Venezuela is next with 66, 5 with KC.

SEASON OPENING DISABLEMENTS—The Royals were hit hard by the injury bug this spring and started 2012 with 5 players on the disabled list...KC placed catchers Salvador Perez and Manny Pina on the 60-day D.L. on March 20 due to left knee and right knee surgeries, respectively...the most recent additions were pitchers Felipe Paulino, Blake Wood and Joakim Soria who were placed on the 15-day disabled list, retroactive to March 26...Paulino is out with a right forearm strain, Wood with right ulnar nerve irritation and Soria had "Tommy John" surgery on April 3...each are eligible for reinstatement on April 10, though Soria is lost for the season.

**NED'S SECOND FULL SEASON BEGINS**--The 16th full-time manager in franchise history, Ned Yost, was named to his post on May 13, 2010 and has recorded a 128-164 ledger since taking the reins...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).

<u>THE COACHING STAFF</u>--The Royals made a couple of changes in the 2012 coaching assignments with the addition of Dave Eiland as pitching coach and Chino Cadahia as the bench coach...returning for a second season is Doug Sisson as the first base, outfield and baserunning coach...Eddie Rodriguez is back for his third full-time season on the staff as the third base and infield coach...Kevin Seitzer is back for his fourth year as the hitting coach, and Steve Foster is in his third season as the bullpen coach.

GORDO JOINS LONG-TERM LIST—Alex Gordon became the latest member of the Royals to agree to a multi-year deal as the 28-year old leftfielder signed a four-year contract on March 29 with a player option for a fifth year...Gordon, who had a career campaign in 2011 capped by capturing his first career Rawlings Gold Glove in his first outfield season, joins Salvador Perez and Alcides Escobar in inking long term deals this spring...Perez is signed to a 5-year deal with 3 club options and Escobar has a 4-year contract with a pair of club options.

SPRING RECAP--The Royals finished their 32-game spring exercise with a 16-16 ledger, hitting at a .295 clip which was good for second best among all clubs, trailing only Seattle's .297 team mark...individually, Eric Hosmer dominated in run production, knocking home a Major League high 29 runs in the 28 games he participated in, 8 more RBI than the nearest A.L. player (Delmon Young with 21) and 11 more than any National Leaguer...Hos closed the spring by hitting safely in 13 consecutive games before incurring an 0-for-2 in Wednesday's finale vs. the Padres at Lake Elsinore...Eric also finished the spring with a big league leading 56 total bases and 33 hits, while finishing tied for second in the A.L. in runs scored (18), tied for second in doubles (8), sixth in hitting (.398), eighth in slugging pct. (.675) and tied for ninth in on-base pct. (.453)...Lorenzo Cain, who was among baseball's best throughout the spring, finished with a big league leading 11 doubles and 20 runs scored, second in total bases (52), thrid among A.L. players in slugging pct. (.743) and tied for fifth in hits (26)...Billy Butler finished fourth in the A.L. spring batting race with a .414 mark, second in hits (29), tied for second in doubles (8), fourth in total bases (49), sixth in on-base pct. (.461) and seventh in slugging pct. (.700)...leadoff man Alex Gordon wrapped up his spring with a .366 average that finished just out of the top 10, but he was tied for fifth in hits (26), tied for seventh in total bases (43) and tied for eighth in runs scored (15)...finally, Jason Bourgeois tied for the lead in thefts with 8.
