## A's vs. MARINERS

Last At Bat **Different Lineups** 

The A's trail in the season series, 1-3...were swept in a two-game series in Oakland last weekend after splitting a two-game series in Japan to open the season ... the A's lost the season series last year, 9-10...went 5-4 in Oakland but were 4-6 in Seattle...have now lost three of the previous five season series and are 43-56 (.434) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning** percentage by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 293-220 (.571) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 163-94 in Oakland, 129-125 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 53-61 at Safeco Field

#### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

Yoenis Céspedes is the only Athletic to reach base safely via hit walk in all seven games

Ryan Cook has not allowed a base runner in three appearances (3.1 ip).

Coco Crisp stole his first base of the season Monday night and has been successful in each of his last 24 stolen base attempts

Kurt Suzuki has tossed out 4 of 9 (44.4%) attempted base stealers this year after throwing out just 23 of 121 (19.0%) last year...has seven home runs and 39 RBI in his career against Seattle, both his best figures against any team.

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968 the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in 1994 the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners

### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Kansas City for their first series win of the season...are now 3-4 for the season, which is one game better than last year (2-5) and two games behind 2010 (5-2)...this is the A's 45<sup>th</sup> season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (17) and Atlanta Braves (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3629-3368 (.519) record over the previous 44 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...finished the 2011 season with a 74-88 record, which marked the A's fifth consecutive season without a winning record...this is the Athletics franchise 112<sup>th</sup> season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8344-8840 (.486) in their previous 111 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 2-1 in one-run games with a 5-4, 12inning win Wednesday against Kansas City...won the game when Jonny Gomes was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded...it was the third "walk-off" hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas)...Yoenis Céspedes was hit by a pitch prior to Gomes...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked the first time a game ended with back-to-back hit by pitches since September 2, 1966 when Stu Miller of the Baltimore Orioles hit Al Weis and Tommie Agee of the Chicago White Sox...it marked the A's second extra inning game of the season (lost the opener 3-1 to Seattle in 11 innings)...last year, the A's went 20-25 in one-run games, which was the third worst record in the American League...were 8-11 in extra inning games, which was fourth worst...are now 16-29 (.356) in extra inning games over the last four years...had just three "walk-off" wins last year.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit seven home runs, which is tied for fourth in the American League...it is their best total over the first seven games of the season since 2005 when they had nine...last year, the A's did not hit their seventh home run until the 12<sup>th</sup> game...number eight came in game 18 and numbers 9 and 10 came in game 21...hit three home runs against Seattle March 29...hit three home runs in a game just three times last year and have gone 276 consecutive games with three home runs or fewer, which is the longest active streak in the majors and second longest streak in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979)...the last time the A's hit more than three home runs in a game was June 3, 2010 at Boston (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's collected just six hits Wednesday and have tallied fewer than 10 hits in each of the first seven games...that is tied for the third longest streak in Oakland history to start a season...it is the longest since an eight game streak to start the 2001 season...the record is 10 straight games to start the 1978 campaign...are batting .195, which is the second lowest average in the American League...have scored just 21 runs, which is fourth fewest in the AL and the A's fewest over the first seven games of the season since 1978 when they had 16...have been hit by a pitch six times, which is the most in the majors...A's pitchers are one of two teams (Atlanta) that have not hit a batter.

HOME AND AWAY: The begin their first road trip of the season tonight, a seven-game trek to Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles (four games) ... went 2-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...last year, the A's compiled a 43-38 (.531) record in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (Torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

**ROSTER NOTES:** Seven players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Balfour, Blevins, Crisp, Fuentes, McCarthy, Pennington, Suzuki)...those are the **fewest returning players from a previous Opening** Day roster since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 8, 2008 and 2009)...had seven rookies on the Opening Day roster (Carignan, Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Godfrey, Recker), which were the A's most rookies on an Opening Day roster since they are first available in 1992 (previous: 5, 2009)...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Milone)...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.96 years.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-7-2 (.667) during the spring, which was the best record among Cactus League teams and third best in the majors...finished with a winning record for the first time since 2008 when they finished 18-8...after concluding the Arizona portion of their schedule on Wednesday, March 21, the A's led the majors in runs (133), hits (218) and walks (80) and topped the CL in doubles (52) and home runs (24)...finished the spring ranked third in the majors in on-base percentage (.356) and sixth in batting (.284) and slugging (.468).

FILLING IN: Johnny Doskow, long-time voice of the A's Triple-A affiliate in Sacramento, will join the club's radio broadcast on an interim basis while Ken Korach recovers from knee replacement surgery...Vince Cotroneo will assume Korach's primary broadcast duties

career...tossed six or more innings in 16 of his starts last year, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 23 times.

**THREE STRAIGHT AGAINST SEATTLE:** Is scheduled to make his third consecutive start against Seattle...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation...Glenn Abbott made three consecutive starts against Kansas City in 1974 on May 14, June 23 and June 28, but he had a stint in the minors plus a relief appearance on June 18.

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed one home run in his first start, a solo shot by Smoak (left-hander)...last year, he yielded 15 of his 21 home runs to lefties...15 of his home runs came with the bases empty as have 28 of his 35 over his last three seasons.

**38 YEARS OLD:** His first start on March 29 against Seattle came at the age of 38 years, 310 days, making him the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti, who was 41 years, 275 days when he made his last start for Oakland on June 2, 1999...over the previous four seasons, the only Oakland pitcher 33 years or older to start a game was Brett Tomko, who made six starts in 2009 at the age of 36...Colón will turn 39 on May 24...only four pitchers in Oakland history have started a game at age 39 or older (Tommy John 42, Candiotti 41, Don Sutton 40, Jim Perry 39).

**ACTIVE LEADERS:** Ranks sixth among active pitchers in complete games (32), tied for seventh in shutouts (9), eighth in wins (162), ninth in strikeouts (1751) and 10<sup>th</sup> in game started (353) and innings pitched (2253.1).

**DOMINICAN LEADERS:** His 162 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (353), innings pitched (2253.1) and strikeouts (1751).

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Seattle in Tokyo March 29...retired each of the first 13 batters before Montero singled with one out in the fifth inning...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first six innings before Smoak homered to lead off the seventh inning...retired each of the final six batters that he faced.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland...yielded seven earned runs, which were his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...allowed a leadoff triple to Figgins in the first but retired the next nine batters with Figgins scoring on a fielders choice...then allowed six runs on seven hits in the fourth inning...Suzuki had a RBI triple, Smoak, Olivo and Kawasaki had RBI singles and Figgins had a two-run double.

**COLÓN vs. SEATTLE:** Is 15-12 with a 4.24 ERA (193.0 ip, 195 h, 101 r, 91 er, 46 bb, 132 so, 18 hr) in 31 career appearances, all starts...the 15 wins are tied with John Lackey for the most among active pitchers against the Mariners...the 12 losses are his most against any team...is 9-1 with a 2.09 ERA (18 er in 77.2 ip) in 11 career starts at Safeco Field...the .900 winning percentage is the best by any pitcher in this ballpark (min. 7 decisions) and the ERA is second best (min. 60 innings) to Brandon League (1.95 ERA)...is also 5-9 with a 5.44 ERA (62 er in 102.2 ip) in 17 starts in his home ballparks and 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (1 er in 8.0 ip) in one start in Tokyo...was 0-2 with a 19.29 ERA (10 er in 4.2 ip) in two starts in the Kingdome...is 1-1 with a 5.84 ERA (12.1 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year (see first start and last start above)...has three career complete games against the Mariners, most recently July 5, 2006 at Seattle, a four-hit shutout.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (6.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 5 so) in two starts this spring...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings...opponents were 7 for 28 (.250)...also pitched in a simulated game March 16 and a minor league game March

**2011 RECAP:** Went 8-10 with a 4.00 ERA in 29 games, 26 starts, with the New York Yankees...allowed a .267 opponents batting average, including .238 (76-for-320) against right-handed hitters compared to .297 (96-for-323) against left-handers...was 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA and 79 strikeouts in 15 games, 12 starts, prior to the All-Star Break...it marked his lowest ERA prior to the break since a 2.74 ERA with Cleveland and Montreal in 2002...had his most strikeouts in the first half of a season since recording 89 with Los Angeles (AL) in 2005...went 2-6 with a 4.96 ERA after the break...made 10 starts on four days rest, going 1-5 with a 4.62 ERA...was 7-4 with a 3.59 ERA in 16 starts on five or more days rest...went 6-1 with a 3.00 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 2-8 with a 4.78 ERA in 16 starts at night...over half of his strikeouts (75-of-135, 55.6%), were on called third strikes...walked just three of the 172 batters that he faced to lead off an inning...was on his 12th career Opening Day roster with New York last year...was named as a member of the Yankees bullpen March 26 and was signed to a Major League contract and added to the 25-man roster March 30

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (1-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City in his first start last Monday in Oakland in his A's debut (8.0 ip, 3 h, 3 bb)...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, 1975) and the third to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, 1980; Catfish Hunter, 1973)...has never faced the Mariners in his career...was 2-1 with a 4.91 ERA in five appearances, four starts, this spring...that does not include two starts and wins in exhibition games (11.0 ip, 2 h, 13 so)...went 1-0 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts for Washington in his Major League debut last year...was also 12-6 with a 3.22 ERA in 24 starts in his Triple-A debut with Syracuse...was named to the *Baseball America* Triple-A All-Star team.

 The A's bullpen has a 3.22 ERA, which is tied for sixth in the American League, and has tossed 22.1 innings, which is tied for third...also ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.271), fourth in opponents batting average (.218) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.359)...compiled a 3.74 ERA last year, which ranked eighth in the AL...had 39 saves, which tied for fourth, but had 18 blown saves for a save percentage of 68.4...that ranked seventh in the AL...also ranked sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.371), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.323) and 10th in opponents batting average (.247)...allowed 70 of 208 (33.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the fourth highest percentage in the AL...first batters faced hit .250, which was fifth highest in the AL...had the third most first batter strikeouts (101).

**2010**—Combined to hit .298 with 16 doubles, nine home runs and 42 RBI in 90 games between the Dodgers and White Sox...was hitting .311 in 66 games with the Dodgers when he was claimed off waivers by the Sox Aug. 30...batted .261 with the White Sox strictly as a designated hitter...was limited to 73 starts (46 in left field, 27 at designated hitter) due to three stints on the disabled list...was on the DL from April 23 to May 8 and again from July 17–Aug. 20 with a strained right calf...was also out from June 30 –July 15 with a strained right hamstring...only two of his 18 hits with Chicago went for extra bases...did not reach double-digits in home runs for the first time since 1993...collected his 2,500th hit April 10 at Florida, a single off Josh Johnson...registered his 549th career home run May 28 at Colorado

off Jeff Francis to pass Mike Schmidt for sole possession of 14th place on the all-time list...was ejected by home plate umpire Gary Cederstrom one pitch into his final at-bat with the Dodgers Aug. 29 at Colorado (arguing balls and strikes)...made his White Sox debut Sept. 1 at Cleveland, going 1-for-3... ended an 84 at-bat homerless streak Sept. 18 with a solo homer off Detroit's Max Scherzer...it was the second-longest drought of his career behind an 89 at-bat stretch from July 6 to Aug. 1, 1997.

**2009**—Helped lead the Dodgers to their second consecutive National League West Division championship...his season was limited to 104 games due to his 50-game suspension for a violation of Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...the Dodgers went 62-42 (.596) in games which he appeared and 33-25 (.569) in all others...fell one homer shy of his 15th consecutive season with at least 20 homers...is still one of only seven players with 20 or more homers in 14 consecutive seasons...batted .348 with six homers, 20 RBI, 26 walks, and a .492 on-base percentage in 27 games before the suspension May 7...hit .269 (70-for-260) with 13 homers and 43 RBI in 77 games after the suspension...at the time of his suspension, he led the NL in on-base percentage (second in the majors to Boston's Kevin Youkilis'.505) and ranked fifth in hitting...tied for third in the majors with Milwaukee's Prince Fielder with 21 intentional walks, trailing St. Louis' Albert Pujols (44) and San Diego's Adrian Gonzalez (22)...belted a pinch hit grand slam July 22 off Cincinnati's Nick Masset...the sixth inning blast snapped a 2-2 tie and gave the Dodgers a 6-2 victory on Manny bobblehead night...was 2-for-2 with three walks in the Dodgers postseason-clinching win Sept. 26 at Pittsburgh.

**2008**—Enjoyed one of the most productive final two months of a season in baseball history, carrying the Dodgers to their first NLCS appearance since 1988...after being acquired from Boston moments before the July 31 trade deadline, batted .396 for the Dodgers with 17 homers, 53 RBI, 14 doubles, a .469 on-base percentage and .743 slugging percentage in 53 regular-season games...finished fourth in the National League MVP voting despite playing in only 53 games after the trade...hit safely in each of the club's eight postseason games, batting .520 (13-for-25) with four home runs, 10 RBI, 11 walks and a .667 on-base percentage...the average was the best postseason mark in Dodgers history (min. 20 PA)...from Aug. 1 through season's end, he led the majors in batting average, RBI, on-base percentage and slugging percentage...liso ranked third in homers behind only Detroit's Miguel Cabrera (18) and Philadelphia's Ryan Howard (18)...his 21 homers as a Dodger – including postseason – led the team... his .396 average with the Dodgers is the second highest ever for an in-season acquisition behind only Cesar Cedeño, who hit .434 in 28 games in 1985 after his trade to the Cardinals from the Reds...hit .332 in a combined 153 games with Boston and Los Angeles to rank third in all of baseball behind Atlanta's

Chipper Jones (.364) and St. Louis' Albert Pujols (.357)...also tied for fourth in the majors with 37 home runs and tied for sixth with 121 RBI...ranked second in the big leagues with a .601 slugging percentage, behind Pujols (.651)...ranked fourth in the majors with a .430 on-base percentage...hit homer No. 500 off Chad Bradford May 31 at Baltimore, accomplishing the feat in his 7,263rd at-bat, eighth-fewest all-time...began the season with 490 career homers, and went on to surpass seven Hall of Famers on the all-time home run list: Lou Gehrig (493), Eddie Murray (504), Mel Ott (511), Eddie Mathews (512), Ernie Banks (512), Willie McCovey (521) and Ted Williams (521)...recorded 53 RBI with the Dodgers and 68 with Boston...joined Carlos Beltran as the only players in ML history to record at least 50 RBI in both leagues in the same season...Beltran did it in 2004, collecting 51 RBI with Kansas City and 53 with Houston... in his first month in the NL was named the league's Player of the Month for August... batted .415 (44-for-106), with nine home runs, 25 RBI and 21 runs scored in 29 games...in his first 16 games with the club, collected 25 hits, six home runs and 21 RBI...since RBI became an official stat in 1920, only one other player reached Ramirez's totals in each of those categories over his first 16 games with a team – in 1925, Mandy Brooks had 25 hits, six home runs and 24 RBI in his first 16 games with the Chicago Cubs.

**2007**—Ranked third on the World Champion Red Sox with 20 homers and 88 RBI, his lowest totals in a season since the strike-shortened 1994 campaign...tied Los Angeles' Vladimir Guerrero for the American League lead with 17 game-winning RBI...started 120 games in left field and 11 as designated hitter...endured the slowest start of career, hitting .188 (16-for-85) in his first 23 games through April 28... appeared in 127 of Boston's first 132 games through Aug. 28...left that game at Yankee Stadium with a strained left oblique muscle and missed the next 24 contests before returning to action for the team's final six games from Sept. 25-30...drove in a team-high 16 runs in Boston's 14 postseason games.

**2006**—Was among several offensive category leaders in the American League, ranking first with a .439 on-base percentage and 2nd with a 1.058 OPS...was also eighth in batting average (.321) and home runs (35)...finished second in the AL in home batting average with a .355 mark (78-for-220) at Fenway Park...started 124 games in left field and five as the designated hitter...played in 122 of season's first 126 games but just eight (seven starts) of the final 36 contests beginning Aug. 24 due to right knee tendinitis...was hitting .330 Aug. 21, but with right knee problems was just 4-for-25 (.160) with a homer and two RBI in 10 games the rest of the year...produced a career-best 27-game hitting streak from July 15 to Aug. 12, batting .400 (40-for-100) with eight homers and 28 RBI...it was the longest streak in the AL in 2006...homered off Brian Moehler July 1 at Florida, becoming the 13th player to earn his 2,000th hit in a Boston uniform, the first since Wade Boggs in 1992.

**2005**—Ranked third in the American League with 45 homers and 144 RBI...combined with David Ortiz (47 home runs, 148 RBI) to join Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig (1930-31) as the only teammates in baseball history with consecutive 40-homer, 140-RBI seasons...led AL hitters and ranked second in the majors to Atlanta's Andruw Jones with one homer every 12.3 at-bats...led the majors with one RBI every 3.8 at-bats...had a .353 average (112-for-317) in Boston's 95 wins and a .211 mark (50-for-237) in the team's 67 losses.

**2004**—Led the American League with 43 homers, a .613 slugging percentage and a 1.010 OPS...also ranked second in the AL with 87 extra-base hits and third with 130 RBI...homered once every 13.2 at-bats, the best ratio in the AL...matched a career high with 26 homers before the All-Star break...hit safely in all 14 games during Boston's World Series run, batting .350 (21-for-60) with two homers and 11 RBI...was named World Series MVP while batting .417 (7-for-17) with a home run and four RBI in Boston's four-game sweep of St. Louis...was a member of the MLB All-Star Team that went to Japan after the season.

**2003**—Banged out a career-high 185 hits and led the American League with a .427 on-base percentage and 28 intentional walks...finished second in the league with a 1.014 OPS and a .325 batting average, one point behind teammate Bill Mueller...led the AL with a .385 average (55-for-143) against left-handed pitchers.

**2002**—Won the American League batting title with a .349 batting average...appeared in just 120 total games, which was the fewest for an AL batting champ since Kansas City's George Brett hit .390 in 117 games in 1980...also led the circuit with a .450 on-base percentage...finished second in the AL with a

.647 slugging percentage and a 1.097 OPS...was on the disabled list from May 14 to June 25 with a fractured left index finger, which he sustained sliding into home May 11 at Seattle...played in 10 games at Triple-A Pawtucket on a rehab assignment before returning to the Red Sox June 25 against Cleveland... batted .414 (67-for-162) with 15 homers and 47 RBI in his final 44 games beginning Aug. 13, raising his average from .310.

**2001**—In his first season with Boston, he ranked fourth in the American League with 41 homers, 125 RBI, a .609 slugging percentage and a 1.014 OPS...also ranked sixth with 76 extra-base hits, 322 total bases and a .405 on-base percentage...led the AL with 25 intentional walks including an AL-record four in an extra-inning game, June 5 against Detroit...missed seven games with a right hamstring strain August 20-26, and sat out the season's last six contests with a sore left wrist.

**2000**—Was the American League leader with a career-best .697 slugging percentage, which was second highest in Indians history...also led the AL with a 1.154 OPS...ranked third in the AL with a career-high .351 batting average and a career-best .457 on-base percentage...tied an Indians club record with an RBI in nine straight games from May 5-13...reached base safely via a hit or walk in 49 straight games from July 29–Sep 23...was on the disabled list from May 30 to July 12 with a strained left hamstring... in his final three seasons with Cleveland (1998–2000) averaged more than one RBI per game (432 RBI in 415 games)...also had 127 HR and a .649 slugging percentage...signed an eight-year, \$160 million free agent contract with the Red Sox, Dec. 13.

**1999**—Led the majors with an Indians single season club-record 165 RBI...that remains the highest total in the majors in the last 73 years...averaged an RBI every 3.164 at bats, which currently is the thirdbest ratio in a season in baseball history behind Hack Wilson (1930) and Babe Ruth (1921)...topped the American League in slugging (.663) and OPS (1.105) and was among the league leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .442), homers (3rd, 44), extra-base hits (3rd, 81), runs (4th, career-best 131), total bases (4th, 346) and average (5th, .333)...led the Indians to their fifth consecutive AL Central Division title, but went 1-for-18 in the ALDS loss to the Red Sox...was elected to his second All-Star Game, his first as a starter...hit cleanup and played right field in a starting lineup that included four Indians: also first baseman Jim Thome, second baseman Roberto Alomar and left fielder Kenny Lofton.

**1998**—Ranked third in the American League with 45 homers and fourth in the circuit with 145 RBI... also ranked fourth in the AL with 82 extra-base hits and a .599 slugging percentage...added four homers and seven RBI in the postseason...the Tribe got past the Red Sox in the ALDS, but fell to the Yankees in the ALCS...was a member of MLB All-Star Team that went to Japan after the season.

**1997**—Ranked fourth in the American League with a .328 average...hit two home runs in the ALCS and two more in the World Series, but batted only .191 in the postseason as the Indians fell to the Marlins in the World Series in seven games.

**1996**—Ranked fifth in the American League with 81 extra base hits and sixth with a career-high 45 doubles...led the AL with a career-high 19 outfield assists...added two doubles and two home runs in the ALDS, but the Indians lost to Baltimore in four games.

**1995**—Became the 25th player in Major League history to produce 30 homers and 100 RBI in a season at the age of 23 or younger...was just the second Indian to do it joining Hal Trosky (1934 and 1936)... helped lead the Indians to their first World Series since 1954 with a lineup that also included Albert Belle (50 home runs), Eddie Murray (21) and Jim Thome (25)...was named to his first All-Star Game... entered as pinch-hitter and walked twice.

**1994**—Placed second in the BBWAA American League Rookie of the Year voting behind Kansas City's Bob Hamelin...ranked second among AL rookies with 78 hits, 22 doubles, 17 homers and 60 RBI.

**1993**—Selected as *Baseball America*'s Minor League Player of the Year after hitting a combined .333 with 31 home runs and 115 RBI in 129 games with Double-A Canton-Akron and Triple-A Charlotte... had his contract purchased by Cleveland from Charlotte on Sept. 1...went 0-for-4 in his Major League debut the following day at Minnesota...but the next day, Sept. 3 at New York (AL), he went 3-for-4 with a double, two homers and three RBI...his first hit (double) and homer both came off Melido Perez.

**1992**—Appeared in 81 games at Single-A Kinston before being sidelined for the season in early July with a severely bruised hamate bone in his left hand.

**1991**—Was selected as the Appalachian League Player of the Year at Rookie-level Burlington in his pro debut...also named the Short-A Player of the Year by *Baseball America*...led the league with 19 homers, 63 RBI, 146 total bases and a .679 slugging percentage...ranked third in the league with a .326 average.

Manuel Aristedes Ramirez was originally signed by Indians scout Joe DeLucca...is married, Juliannna, and has three sons...graduated from George Washington High School in Bronx, N.Y., in 1991...was a three time All-City selection in baseball...named New York City Public Schools High School Player of the Year in 1991, when he batted .615 with 14 homers in 22 games...was inducted into the New York City Public Schools Athletic Hall of Fame in October 1999...missed a game May 10, 2004 to become a United States citizen...the next day, prior to the game against the Indians, he placed a small American flag in the outfield at Fenway Park...appeared on *The Tonight Show with Jay Leno* in November 2007 ... is the subject of *Becoming Manny: Inside the Life of Baseball's Most Enigmatic Slugger*, by Jean Rhodes and Shawn Boburg...the authorized biography, was published in 2009...donated his red 1994 Porsche 911 Turbo 3.6 to charity in July, 2010...it sold for \$50,100 in an online auction and the proceeds were split between ThinkCure!, the official charity of the Dodgers, and Maryvale, a placement home for girls in Los Angeles.
