ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the past two games and three of the last four...are now 4-4 for the season, which is one game better than last year (3-5) and two games behind 2010 (6-2)...this is the A's 45th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (17) and Atlanta Braves (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3629-3368 (.519) record over the previous 44 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...finished the 2011 season with a 74-88 record, which marked the A's fifth consecutive season without a winning record...this is the Athletics franchise 112th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8344-8840 (.486) in their previous 111 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit eight home runs, which is tied for fifth in the American League...it is their best total over the first eight games of the season since 2006 when they had nine...last year, the A's did not hit their eighth home run until the 18th game...numbers 9 and 10 came in game 21 and number 11 came in game 26...hit three home runs against Seattle March 29...hit three home runs in a game just three times last year and have gone 277 consecutive games with three home runs or fewer, which is the longest active streak in the majors and second longest streak in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979)...the last time the A's hit more than three home runs in a game was June 3, 2010 at Boston (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's collected nine hits in last night's 4-0 win and have now tallied fewer than 10 hits in each of the first eight games...that is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history to start a season (2001)...the record is 10 straight games to start the 1978 campaign...are batting .205, which is the third lowest average in the American League...have scored 25 runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...have been hit by a pitch six times, which is the most in the majors...A's pitchers are one of two teams (Atlanta) that have not hit a batter.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 2-1 in one-run games with a 5-4, 12-inning win Wednesday against Kansas City...won the game when Jonny Gomes was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded...it was the third "walk-off" hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas)...Yoenis Céspedes was hit by a pitch prior to Gomes...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked the first time a game ended with back-to-back hit by pitches since September 2, 1966 when Stu Miller of the Baltimore Orioles hit Al Weis and Tommie Agee of the Chicago White Sox...it marked the A's second extra inning game of the season (lost the opener 3-1 to Seattle in 11 innings)...last year, the A's went 20-25 in one-run games, which was the third worst record in the American League...were 8-11 in extra inning games, which was fourth worst...are now 16-29 (.356) in extra inning games over the last four years...had just three "walk-off" wins last year.

HOME AND AWAY: Are 1-0 on their first road trip of the season, a seven-game trek to Seattle (1-0) and Los Angeles (four games)...went 2-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...last year, the A's compiled a 43-38 (.531) record in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (Torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: Seven players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Balfour, Blevins, Crisp, Fuentes, McCarthy, Pennington, Suzuki)...those are the **fewest returning players from a previous Opening Day roster** since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 8, 2008 and 2009)...had seven rookies on the Opening Day roster (Carrigan, Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Godfrey, Recker), which were the A's **most rookies on an Opening Day roster** since they are first available in 1992 (previous: 5, 2009)...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Milone)...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.96 years.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-7-2 (.667) during the spring, which was the best record among Cactus League teams and third best in the majors...finished with a winning record for the first time since 2008 when they finished 18-8...after concluding the Arizona portion of their schedule on Wednesday, March 21, the A's led the majors in runs (133), hits (218) and walks (80) and topped the CL in doubles (52) and home runs (24)...finished the spring ranked third in the majors in on-base percentage (.356) and sixth in batting (.284) and slugging (.468).

CHANGING THE CHANNEL: Due to the San Jose Sharks playoffs coverage, tonight's game will air on Comcast Sports Net Plus...channels are: Comcast (410 Standard, 780 High Definition), Dish (451 SD, 9576 HD), Direct (699 SD, 699-1 HD), ATT (768 SD, 1768 HD).

FILLING IN: Johnny Daskow, long-time voice of the A's Triple-A affiliate in Sacramento, will join the club's radio broadcast on an interim basis while Ken Korach recovers from knee replacement surgery...Vince Cotroneo will assume Korach's primary broadcast duties.

A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series, 2-3...lead this series 1-0, were swept in a two-game series in Oakland last weekend and split a two-game series in Japan to open the season...the A's lost the season series last year, 9-10...went 5-4 in Oakland but were 4-6 in Seattle...have now lost three of the previous five season series and are 44-56 (.440) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 294-220 (.572) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 163-94 in Oakland, 130-125 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 54-61 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has been successful in each of his last 24 stolen base attempts.

Kurt Suzuki has tossed out 4 of 9 (44.4%) attempted base stealers this year after throwing out just 23 of 121 (19.0%) last year...has seven home runs and 40 RBI in his career against Seattle, both his best figures against any team.

Jemile Weeks hit his second home run of the season last night...went homerless over the first 90 games of his career but now has four home runs in his last 15 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1971** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th home run in an Oakland uniform to become the first Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...he also hit his 101st in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota...in **1974** Jim Hunter strikes out Toby Harrah in the first inning of the A's 4-2 win against Texas...it is his 1000th strikeout as an Oakland Athletic, making him the first Oakland pitcher to reach that plateau.

LAST START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City last Monday in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...matched his career high with three walks...all three hits were doubles but no one advanced past second base...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

THIS SPRING: Was 2-1 with a 4.91 ERA in five appearances, four starts...that does not include two starts and wins in exhibition games...faced Yomiuri in Japan March 25 (5.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so) and tossed 6.0 perfect innings at Sacramento March 31 (6 so)...issued just one walk in 14.2 innings and none in 11.0 innings in the two exhibition games...his only relief appearance came in his first outing March 2 against Seattle.

2011 RECAP: Spent the entire season at Triple-A Syracuse before being called up by Washington in September to make his Major League debut...went 1-0 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts for the Nationals...walked just four batters in 26.0 innings (1.38 per nine innings)...allowed a .283 opponents batting average, which included a .281 (25 for 89) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .300 (3 for 10) against lefthanders...held the opposition to a .208 average with runners in scoring position...yielded a .385 batting average and .429 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .175 the first time through the lineup, .293 the second time through and .500 after that...was rated as the A's third-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade

WITH WASHINGTON: Was selected from Syracuse Sept. 3 and made his Major League debut with a start that day against New York (NL)...allowed four runs on six hits in 4.1 innings (0 bb, 2 so) and had a no decision in the Nationals 8-7 win...fanned Angel Pagan with one out in the second inning for his first strikeout...hit a three-run home run off Dillon Gee on the first pitch of his first big league at bat in the second inning...earned his first ML win in his third start Sept. 15 at New York (NL), a 10-1 victory (5.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...tossed a season-high 6.0 shutout innings in his fourth start, a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning win at Philadelphia Sept. 20.

SYRACUSE: Was 12-6 with a 3.22 ERA in 24 starts in his Triple-A debut with Syracuse...was named to the *Baseball America* Triple-A All-Star team...ranked second in the International League in strikeouts (155), tied for third in wins and was sixth in ERA...averaged 0.97 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest among IL starters...also ranked second in strikeouts per nine innings (9.40) and fourth in opponents batting average (.241)...walked just 16 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 9.69...led the Chiefs in wins, innings pitched (148.1) and strikeouts and tied for the team lead in games started...matched his minor league bests in wins and strikeouts...was 4-5 with a 3.81 ERA over his first 12 starts through June 17...then went 8-1 with a 2.60 ERA over his final 12 starts...his opponents batting average included a .230 (28 for 122) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (109 for 446) against right-handers...allowed a .216 average to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .209 with runners in scoring position and two outs...allowed just three first inning runs for a 0.75 ERA...was 9 for 26 (.346) with a double and three RBI as a hitter...that included 0 for 2 with two sacrifices in four pinch hitting appearances...Syracuse was 16-8 (.667) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 17 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked one batter or fewer 20 times.

MORE WITH SYRACUSE: Combined on a six-hit shutout in his Triple-A debut, a 2-0 win at Lehigh Valley April 10...tossed seven innings and allowed five of the hits without walking a batter...lost each of his next three starts, including April 28 against Toledo when he allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 3.2 innings...struck out a season-high 11 May 5 at Durham...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings but had a no decision in a 4-3 loss as the bullpen allowed two runs in the eighth and one in the ninth...walked just two batters over a 10-start stretch from May 10 to July 2 (67.1 ip)...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA in four starts in May...tossed a season-high 8.0 shutout innings in an 11-2 win at Rochester June 27...allowed just one run in 6.1 innings in his next start at Buffalo July 2...earned IL Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 27 to July 3 (1-0, 0.63 ERA, 14.1 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 12 so)...was named to the IL Midseason All-Star team...pitched a scoreless sixth inning against the Pacific Coast League All-Stars in the Triple-A All-Star Game July 13 at Salt Lake (1 h, 1 so)...allowed one run in 7.1 innings and went 3 for 3 at the plate in an 8-4 win over Lehigh Valley July 17...yielded five runs in a season-low 2.1 innings July 28 against Colorado Springs...was placed on the disabled list the next day with a strained left quadriceps...was reinstated from the DL Aug. 8 and went 4-0 with a 1.72 ERA in August...struck out 10 batters in 6.2 innings against Gwinnett Aug. 19...was rated as having the Best Control and Best Changeup among Nationals prospects in *Baseball America's* Best Tools survey following the season.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Went 37-22 with a 3.05 ERA (175 er in 516.2 ip) in 91 games, 86 starts, over four seasons in the minors in the Washington Nationals farm system...struck out 465 batters and walked just 84 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.54...won 12 games in each of the last three seasons...was named the Nationals' Minor League Pitcher of the Year after going 12-5 with a 2.85 ERA in 27 starts with Double-A Harrisburg in 2010...led the Eastern League in strikeouts (155) that year...led the Carolina League with 12 wins in 2009.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Graham Godfrey (0-1, 3.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Kansas City last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed two runs, both in the fourth inning...Moustakas had a RBI double and Quintero delivered a sacrifice fly...has never faced the Mariners in his career...was 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA in six appearances, including four starts, during spring training...led the A's in innings pitched (17.2) and strikeouts (13)...made Major League debut in 2011 and was 1-2 with a 3.96 ERA in five games, four starts, over three stints with the A's...combined for a 2.59 ERA with Sacramento and Midland last year, which was the lowest ERA in the A's farm system...also led the A's farm system in wins (14).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

1-1, 2.96 ERA (24.1 ip, 17 h, 8 r, 8 er, 8 bb, 15 so, 3 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 2/3 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen has a 2.96 ERA, which ranks fifth in the American League, and has tossed 24.1 innings, which is tied for third...also ranks third in opponents batting average (.205) and on-base percentage (.272) and fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.337)...compiled a 3.74 ERA last year, which ranked eighth in the AL...had 39 saves, which tied for fourth, but had 18 blown saves for a save percentage of 68.4...that ranked seventh in the AL...also ranked sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.371), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.323) and 10th in opponents batting average (.247)...allowed 70 of 208 (33.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the fourth highest percentage in the AL...first batters faced hit .250, which was fifth highest in the AL...had the third most first batter strikeouts (101).
