#### A's vs. ANGELS

The A's are 0-1 against the Angels this year following last night's loss...won the season series last year, 11-8...went 6-3 in Oakland and 5-5 in Los Angeles...was just their second season series win over the last eight years (went 10-9 in 2007)...are now 71-82 (.464) against the Angels over the past nine seasons...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 376-305 against the Angels...that includes 196-143 in Oakland and 180-162 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 425-382 against the Angels

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Grant Balfour** has not allowed a run in six games this season...the six appearances are tied for fifth most in the majors.

Ryan Cook has not allowed a hit in four appearances this season...is one of two qualifying American League relievers not to allow a hit.

Coco Crisp stole his second base of the season last night...has now been successful in each of his last 25 stolen base attempts, which is the longest streak of his career.

**Kurt Suzuki** has tossed out 4 of 9 (44.4%) attempted base stealers this year after throwing out just 23 of 121 (19.0%) last year.

**Seth Smith** has played 497 career games...is three away from the 500<sup>th</sup> of his career.

Jemile Weeks hit his second home run of the season Friday night in Seattle...went homerless over the first 90 games of his career but now has four home runs in his last 18 games.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1968 the A's play their first game in Oakland but lose to Baltimore, 4-1...Dave McNally limits the A's to two hits, including a pinch hit single by Tony La Russa in his first at bat as a member of the Oakland A's.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost a season-high three consecutive games after winning the previous two and three of four...are now 4-7 for the season and in fourth place in the American League West...have spent seven days in fourth place this season...have also spent one day tied for first, one day in second and four days in third...this is the A's 45<sup>th</sup> season in Oakland where they have won 14 AL West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (17) and Atlanta Braves (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3629-3368 (.519) record over the previous 44 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...finished the 2011 season with a 74-88 record, which marked the A's fifth consecutive season without a winning record...this is the Athletics franchise 112<sup>th</sup> season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8344-8840 (.486) in their previous 111 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were shut out 6-0 last night, the second time they have been shut out in the past three games...have now been shut out three times for the season, which is the most in the Major Leagues...have scored 28 runs this year, which is the fewest in the American League and second fewest in the majors...collected six hits last night and have now tallied fewer than 10 hits in each of the first 11 games...that is the longest such streak to start a season in Oakland history (previous: 10 games, 1978)...are batting .198, which is the lowest average in the AL and second lowest in the majors...have been hit by a pitch seven times, which is tied for the most in the majors (Detroit).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit nine home runs over the first 11 games...it is their best total over the first 11 games of the season since 2006 when they had 13...last year, the A's did not hit their ninth home run until the 21 st game...number 10 also came in game 21, number 11 came in game 24 and numbers 12 and 13 came in game 27...hit three home runs against Seattle March 29...hit three home runs in a game just three times last year and have gone 280 consecutive games with three home runs or fewer, which is the longest active streak in the majors and second longest streak in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979)...the last time the A's hit more than three home runs in a game was June 3, 2010 at Boston (4).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.25 ERA (36 er in 99.2 ip) through 11 games, which ranks third in the American League, and are holding opponents to a .230 batting average, which ranks second...that includes a 3.50 ERA (27 er in 69.1 ip) by starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth...as a staff, are tied for the fourth fewest walks (24) but have recorded the third fewest strikeouts (56)...recorded their first hit batsmen of the season yesterday (McCarthy)...had been the only pitching staff in the majors without a hit by pitch.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Are 1-3 on their first road trip of the season, a seven-game trek to Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles (0-1)...went 2-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...last year, the A's went 43-38 (.531) in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 2-1 in one-run games with a 5-4, 12-inning win Wednesday against Kansas City...won the game when Jonny Gomes was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded...it was the third "walk-off" hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas)...Yoenis Céspedes was hit by a pitch prior to Gomes...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked the first time a game ended with back-to-back hit by pitches since September 2, 1966 when Stu Miller of the Baltimore Orioles hit Al Weis and Tommie Agee of the Chicago White Sox...it marked the A's second extra inning game of the season (lost the opener 3-1 to Seattle in 11 innings)...last year, the A's went 20-25 in one-run games, which was the third worst record in the American League...were 8-11 in extra inning games, which was fourth worst...are now 16-29 (.356) in extra inning games over the last four years...had just three "walk-off" wins last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (Torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: Seven players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Balfour, Blevins, Crisp, Fuentes, McCarthy, Pennington, Suzuki)...those are the fewest returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 8, 2008 and 2009)...had seven rookies on the Opening Day roster (Carignan, Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Godfrey, Recker), which were the A's most rookies on an Opening Day roster since they are first available in 1992 (previous: 5, 2009)...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Milone, Wagner)...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.96 years.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 15-7-2 (.667) during the spring, which was the best record among Cactus League teams and third best in the majors...finished with a winning record for the first time since 2008 when they finished 18-8...after concluding the Arizona portion of their schedule March 21, the A's led the majors in runs (133), hits (218) and walks (80) and topped the CL in doubles (52) and home runs (24)...finished the spring ranked third in the majors in on-base percentage (.356) and sixth in batting (.284) and slugging (.468).

**FILLING IN:** Johnny Doskow, long-time voice of the A's Triple-A affiliate in Sacramento, will join the club's radio broadcast on an interim basis while Ken Korach recovers from knee replacement surgery...Vince Cotroneo will assume Korach's primary broadcast duties.

OCC' CAREER HIGHS

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today and is scheduled to make his first start of the season...was the A's final cut of the spring as he was optioned to Sacramento April 4...was one of the three inactive players in Japan...today is the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...the A's were 3-3 in his starting assignments last year and are 3-5 (.375) in his career...tossed at least six innings in four of his six starts last year, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer three times.

ROSS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-1 with a save and a 2.45 ERA (14.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, two starts...is 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA (4 er in 13.2 ip) in three games, two starts, in Anaheim and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (1.0 ip) in one appearance in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 2.53 ERA (3 er in 10.2 ip) in his two career starts...had a no decision in his only appearance last year, a start in the A's 2-1, 10-inning win at Los Angeles April 27...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed four hits and a walk...faced just two batters over the minimum as he was aided by three double plays...did not allow a runner past second base.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with Sacramento...allowed a .303 opponents batting average, including .176 (3 for 17) against right-handed hitters and .438 (7 for 16) against left-handers...tossed 4.0

16) against left-handers...tossed 4.0 innings in his first start April 8 at Las Vegas, a 10-3 River Cats win...allowed just one run on a Danny Perales RBI double in the fourth but did not qualify for the win...was the losing pitcher in his second start, a 5-0 loss at Tucson April 12...allowed two runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Sawyer Carroll and Vince Belnome, and another run in the fifth on a Blake Tekotte home run.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (15.0 ip, 15 h, 4 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 10 so) in five starts...did not allow a home run...opponents batted .263...did not allow a run in three consecutive starts from March 7-18 (9.0 ip)...also started the exhibition game against Hanshin in Japan and was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss on March 26 (4.0 ip, 10 h, 8 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 1 so).

**2011 RECAP:** Went 3-3 with a 2.75 ERA in nine games, six starts, with Oakland before going on the disabled list May 20 with a strained left oblique...made four rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 25... was 3-2 with a 7.61 ERA in nine starts overall with the River Cats...pitched for Phoenix in the Arizona Fall League following the season and was 1-3 with a 5.94 ERA in seven starts.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Surrendered just one home run in 36.0 innings and had a .298 opponents slugging percentage...allowed a .252 opponents batting average, which included a .250 (17-for-68) mark against left-handed hitters and .254 (16-for-63) against right-handers...issued nine of his 13 walks to lefties...opponents hit .315 with the bases empty, .172 with runners on, including .208 with runners in scoring position.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Was 2-2 with a 2.61 ERA in his six starting assignments and 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA in three relief appearances...is now 2-4 with a 3.49 ERA (15 er in 38.2 ip) in eight career starts, 2-3 with a 4.91 ERA (20 er in 36.2 ip) in 27 relief appearances...first batters faced were 2-for-3 in his relief appearances and he did not inherit any runners...first batters are now 10-for-24 (.417) with three walks (.481 on-base percentage) in his career.

**THIS AND THAT:** Compiled a 0.90 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over the first four innings of a game...had a 5.06 ERA and .290 opponents average from the fifth inning on...opponents were 13-for-35 (.371) with five walks (.450 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...was 2-1 with a 2.11 ERA in five games during the day, compared to 1-2 with a 3.68 ERA in four contests at night.

WITH OAKLAND: Was one of the A's final cuts during the spring as he was optioned to Sacramento March 30...did not pitch for the River Cats before being recalled April 6 when Michael Wuertz went on the disabled list...pitched in relief in each of his first three appearances, including his first outing April 11 at Chicago (AL) when he tossed 3.0 scoreless innings for the win in a 2-1 A's victory in 10 innings...moved into the starting rotation April 22 after Dallas Braden went on the DL...allowed a career-high-tying three runs on four hits and a career-high four walks in 4.1 innings that day at Seattle, absorbing the loss...then went 2-1 with a 2.03 ERA over his final five starts...tossed 7.0 shutout innings April 27 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning win...that began a career-high 13.0 inning scoreless streak...allowed a career-high eight hits May 3 against Cleveland...won consecutive starts May 8 at Kansas City and May 14 against Chicago (AL), the first winning streak of his career...struck out a career-high eight against the White Sox and also had bests in innings pitched (7.1) and pitches (102)...made his final start May 19 against Minnesota...allowed a single to start the game to Denard Span but left after facing one batter and throwing just seven pitches...Span scored and he was charged with the loss in an 11-1 decision...since Stats, Inc. began tracking pitch counts in 1987, the seven pitches were the fewest by an A's starting pitcher...the previous low was 10 by Omar Olivares June 16, 2000 at Kansas City...was placed on the 15-day disabled list the next day with a strained left oblique.

2011 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 30 and went 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA in two starts...was transferred to Single-A Stockton July 10, allowing one run in 1.0 inning before he was removed from the game with right shoulder tightness...his rehab assignment was halted but an MRI revealed no structural damage...resumed his rehab with Sacramento July 24 against Reno, allowing five runs on four hits in 3.0 innings...was reinstated from the disabled list and optioned to Sacramento the next day...then went 3-1 with a 5.72 ERA in six starts the rest of the way...was 3-2 with a 7.61 ERA in nine starts overall with the River Cats...struck out 34 in 36.2 innings but also issued 22 walks, an average of 5.40 per nine innings...allowed a .325 opponents batting average, which included a .260 (20-for-77) mark against left-handed hitters and .386 (32 for 83) against right-handers...yielded four of his five home runs to righties...opponents hit .323 with runners in scoring position...was 2-1 with a 5.63 ERA in four starts at home, compared to 1-1 with a 9.15 ERA in five starts on the road...struck out a season-high nine batters in 5.0 innings against Round Rock Aug. 15...allowed just one unearned run for the win...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.1 innings Aug. 25 at Fresno...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings and allowed just one run for the win in his final start, Aug. 30 against Las Vegas...went 0-2 with an 8.31 ERA in two postseason starts (8.2 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Bartolo Colón (2-1, 3.72 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...his first start on March 29 against Seattle came at the age of 38 years, 310 days, making him the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti, who was 41 years, 275 days when he made his last start for Oakland on June 2, 1999...ranks sixth among active pitchers in complete games (32), tied for seventh in wins (163) and shutouts (9), ninth in strikeouts (1756) and 10<sup>th</sup> in games started (354) and innings pitched (2260.1)...earned the win in his last start, tossing seven shutout innings in a 4-0 decision over Seattle Friday...is 8-5 with a 3.69 ERA in 18 career starts against the Angels (117.0 ip, 114 h, 50 r, 48 er, 36 bb, 87 so, 13 hr)...including 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts last year (18.1 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 2 hr).

#### **ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS**

#### 1-1, 2.67 ERA (30.1 ip, 19 h, 9 r, 9 er, 11 bb, 19 so, 3 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 2/3 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen has a 2.67 ERA, which ranks fourth in the American League, and has tossed 30.1 innings, which ranks sixth...has the lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.184) and ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.261) and opponents slugging percentage (.301)...compiled a 3.74 ERA last year, which ranked eighth in the AL...had 39 saves, which tied for fourth, but had 18 blown saves for a save percentage of 68.4...that ranked seventh in the AL...also ranked sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.371), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.323) and 10th in opponents batting average (.247)...allowed 70 of 208 (33.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the fourth highest percentage in the AL...first batters faced hit .250, which was fifth highest in the AL...had the third most first batter strikeouts (101).

- Has not allowed a run in six games this season (7.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 5 so)...the six appearances are tied for fifth most in the majors
- Has held opponents to a .091 (2 for 22) batting average, which ranks sixth among American League relievers.
- Is on his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster (last year with Oakland, 2009-10 with Tampa Bay) but this is his ninth season in the majors.
- Had a win and a 5.40 ERA in seven appearances against Los Angeles last year (6.2 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 2 hr)...is 2-3 with a 6.14 ERA and a blown save in 22 games in his career (22.0 ip, 19 h, 15 r, 15 er, 13 bb, 28 so, 4 hr).
- Compiled a 6.75 ERA in seven spring training appearances...did not allow a run over his final five outings (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Was used mostly as a set-up man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).
