WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won three straight games and four of their last five as they continue a six-game trip tonight with the opener in Oakland ... right-hander Jake Peavy, who is 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA (3 ER/13.2 IP) in his last two starts, takes the mound for the White Sox.
- Following this three-game series, the Sox return to Chicago for a seven-game homestand vs. Boston (4/26-29) and Cleveland (5/1-3).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last homestand vs. Detroit (2-1) and Baltimore (1-3) and 3-2 on their season-opening trip to Texas (1-2) and Cleveland (2-0) from 4/6-11.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have won five straight road games, their longest streak since 7/24-8/9/11 (six).
- Jake Peavy makes his second career start against the A's.
- Sox pitchers own a 2.87 ERA (29 ER/91.0 IP) in the last 10 games, allowing 72 hits with 105 strikeouts ... the bullpen has thrown 12.2 consecutive scoreless IP in the last six games.
- Paul Konerko needs two home runs for 400 in his career.
- Alex Rios owns a 10-game hitting streak.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Alex Rios went 3-4 with a double, triple and three RBI, and the bullpen threw 3.0 scoreless IP as the White Sox rallied for a 7-4 victory to complete a three-game sweep in Seattle.
- Rios hit a two-run triple in the sixth inning to tie the game at 4-4 and added a RBI single in the eighth ... Paul Konerko went 2-4 with a double and run scored, Brent Lillibridge was 2-4 with two stolen bases and a run scored, and Kosuke Fukudome collected two RBI.
- Rookie Addison Reed and Matt Thornton each posted holds with 1.0 scoreless IP, and rookie Hector Santiago struck out two in the ninth for his fourth save in five chances.
- Starter John Danks (4 ER/6.0 IP) improved to 7-0 with a 1.31 ERA (9 ER/62.0 IP) in his last eight starts vs. Seattle.
- The Sox extended their winning streak in Seattle to eight games, matching the club record set from 5/12/93-6/26/94.

HUM-BELIEVABLE!

- Philip Humber threw the 21st perfect game in major-league history on Saturday, striking out nine batters in a 4-0 victory at Seattle ... Humber threw 96 pitches (67 strikes) and went to a three-ball count just twice in his first career complete game.
- For his efforts, Humber has been named American League Player of the Week for 4/16-22 ... it is his first career weekly honor and first for a Sox pitcher since Mark Buehrle from 7/20-26/09.
- Humber, who was claimed off waivers from Oakland on 1/18/11, joins Buehrle (7/23/09) and Charlie Robertson (4/30/22) as White Sox pitchers who have been perfect.
- His perfect game came in just his 30th major-league start . according to Elias, only Robertson (fourth) and Worcester's Lee Richmond (21st) achieved perfection in fewer career starts.
- Humber and Oakland's Dallas Braden (5/9/10 vs. Tampa Bay) are the only pitchers in major-league history whose first career complete game was a perfect game (Elias) \dots Humber's previous career-long outing was 7.2 IP.
- The White Sox and the Yankees are the only teams with three perfect games ... Chicago is tied with Boston for second all-time with 18 no-hitters, trailing only the Dodgers (20).
- Humber, the No. 3 overall pick in the 2004 draft, carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning on 4/25/11 at Yankee Stadium.
- A.J. Pierzynski became the ninth catcher in major-league history to be behind the plate for two no-hitters, including a perfect game (STATS) ... Ron Hassey is the only player in major-league history to catch two perfect games.

A CLOSER LOOK AT PERFECTION

- Some more details of Humber's perfect game, courtesy of SABR, who has pitch-by-pitch data of the last 14 games, except
- for Catfish Hunter's in 1968 (full list in box at right):

 Pitchers who went to 3-0 count at some point: Sandy Koufax (21st batter), Kenny Rogers (15th), David Wells (10th) and Humber (25th).
- Humber threw the fewest balls (29) since David Cone in 1999
- Only Mark Buehrle (7) threw more balls in the ninth than Humber (6). Humber and Dallas Braden (2010) are the only pitchers to go to a three-ball count on 27th batter.

HOME AND ROAD

- The White Sox are 6-2 on the road and 3-4 at home Sox and Mets were the only major-league teams in 2011 with a winning record on the road but a losing mark at home.
- Chicago went 43-38 (.531) on the road but was 36-45 (.444) at home, the second-lowest winning percentage in the AL

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Chicago went 6-4 against the A's in 2011 to improve to 2-8-1 in the last 11 season matchups.
- The White Sox batted .260 (87-335) with a 4.01 ERA (41 ER/92.0 IP) last season ... both teams scored 43 runs
- The Sox took two of three in Oakland on 5/13-15, their third series victory at The Coliseum in the last four seasons.
- Chicago trails all time vs. Oakland, 267-287 ... the Sox are 138-136 at home (50-54 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 129-151 at The Coliseum.

SOX PUTTING UP A FIGHT AT THE COLISEUM

- The White Sox have gone 8-6 in their last 14 games in Oakland, compared to 6-28 (.214) in their previous 34.

WINNING ON THE WEST COAST

■ The White Sox are 32-22 playing at Seattle (14-7), Los Angeles-AL (10-8) and Oakland (8-7) since 2008, including a 19-10 record since 2010 ... by contrast, the Sox were 24-64 (.273) on the road vs. those three teams from 2001-07.

ON THE TRIP

- The White Sox are 3-0 on this six-game trip to Seattle (3-0) and Oakland (4/23-25), hitting .282 (29-103) with a 2.33 ERA (7 ER/27.0 IP) and 18-7 edge in runs scored.
- In Friday's opener in Seattle, Adam Dunn went 3-4 with a double, two home runs and five RBI, and Chris Sale struck out a career-high 11 batters in 6.1 IP as the Sox won, 7-3.

- The White Sox have allowed three runs or less in nine of 15 games this season and rank third in the American League with a 3.16 ERA (47 ER/134.0 IP).
- Sox starters rank third in AL with a 3.53 ERA (37 ER/94.1 IP), and the bullpen also is third with a 2.27 mark (10 ER/39.2 IP).

GRAB SOME BENCH

- White Sox pitchers rank second in the American League in strikeouts (127) and strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9.27) ... the Sox have fanned eight or more batters in 11 straight games and 10 or more in three of the last four, including 15 twice
- Chicago recorded a franchise-record 1,220 strikeouts in 2011, eclipsing the mark of 1,149 set in 2010 ... Sox pitchers registered 10 or more strikeouts 41 times in 2011 (four with 15-plus), their most since at least 1919 and 10 more than their previous high set in 2010

SLOW DOWN

- White Sox catchers have thrown out 75.0 percent (6-8) of attempted basestealers, the best percentage in the major leagues . Tyler Flowers has thrown out all four attempted baserunners. while A.J. Pierzynski has thrown out 2-4
- Sox catchers threw out 14.0 percent (22-157) of runners in 2011, the lowest percentage in the AL.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

■ Since the start of the 2003 season, White Sox pitchers lead the major leagues with 803 quality starts, four more than the Angels ... the Sox are tied for fourth in the American League with nine quality starts in 2012.

PAULIE! PAULIE!

■ Paul Konerko is tied with Dale Murphy for 50th all-time with 398 home runs, one behind Andres Galarraga and Al Kaline Konerko has hit 391 of his 398 homers in a White Sox uniform.

AT THE HELM

- Robin Ventura was named the 39th manager in White Sox history on 10/6/11 ... he earned his first major-league victory on 4/7 at Texas.
- Ventura batted .267 with 294 home runs and 1,182 RBI in 16 major-league seasons ... he won six Gold Gloves (1991-93, 1996, 1998-99) and was a two-time All-Star (1992 and 2002).

HOMEGROWN TALENT

■ The White Sox Opening Day roster featured nine homegrown players, tied for the fifth-highest total in the American League only Minnesota (14), the Angels (12), Kansas City and Tampa Bay (11 each) opened the season with more homegrown talent.

PEAVY AT A GLANCE

- The 30-year-old right-hander makes his fourth start of the season and second on the road ... is in his third full season with the White Sox and fourth overall.
- Is 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA (3 ER/13.2 IP) in his last two starts, allowing six hits with one walk and 16 strikeouts ... has allowed three runs in his last 16.2 IP dating back to 4/7 at Texas.
- \blacksquare Is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER/6.0 IP) in one road start in 2012 and 56-41 with a 3.88 ERA (318 ER/737.2 IP) in 120 career starts.
- Has gone 5-5 with a 4.23 ERA (45 ER/95.2 IP) in 16 career starts vs. the American League West.
- der during his start on 7/6/10 vs. Angels ... underwent season-ending surgery on 7/14/10 at Rush University Medical Center (performed by Dr. Romeo, Dr. Greg Nicholson and Dr. Charles-Bush Joseph).
- Was traded by San Diego to the Sox on 7/31/09 for pitchers Aaron Poreda, Clayton Richard, Dexter Carter and Adam Russell ... was selected by the Padres in the 15th round of the 1999 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START

■ Improved to 2-0 with a victory on 4/18 vs. Baltimore, allowing one run on four hits over 7.0 IP ... did not issue a walk and struck out eight ... gave up a RBI double to Endy Chavez in the second inning but held the Orioles scoreless on two hits over his final 5.0 IP ... left with a 8-1 lead after throwing 108 pitches (72 strikes) ... Sox won. 8-1

2012 SEASON QUICK HITS

■ Ranks among the American League leaders in numerous categories (see box above) ... Sox are 3-0 in his starts after going 10-8 in 2011 ... is averaging 9.6 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (21 SO/19.2 IP) with a 10.5:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio (2 BB) ... opponents are hitting .200 (14-70), down from .268 in 2011 ... right-handers are hitting .195 (8-41) and lefties are at .207 (6-29) ... all three of his starts have been quality ... has lasted at least 6.0 IP in all three of his starts ... opponents are 0-3 in stolen-base attempts ... is averaging 6.6 IP and 98.7 pitches per start ... is receiving 6.41 runs of support per 9.0 IP (14 R/19.2 IP).

2012 STARTS OF NOTE

■ Earned his first victory in the Sox home opener on 4/13 vs. Detroit ... limited the Tigers to two runs on two hits over 6.2 IP ... walked one and struck out eight ... carried a one-hit shutout into the seventh inning ... posted a no decision on 4/7 at Texas (3 ER/6.0 IP).

2012 SPRING RECAP

■ Went 1-2 with a 8.78 ERA (13 ER/13.1 IP) in four starts this spring ... allowed 19 hits, walked four batters and struck out 13 ... posted a no decision in his final start on 4/1 at Cincinnati, giving up four runs on seven hits over 4.0 IP ... walked one and struck out five.

2011 SEASON

- Went 7-7 with a 4.92 ERA (61 ER/111.2 IP) in 19 games (18 starts) ... the 18 starts and 111.2 IP were his most since 27 and 173.2 in 2008 with San Diego ... did not pitch after 9/6 due to a tired right arm.
- Averaged a career-best 1.9 walks per 9.0 IP, and his 3.96 strikeout-to-walk ratio was his best since 2005 (4.32).
- Was 4-1 with a 3.35 ERA (18 ER/48.1 IP) on the road, compared to 3-6 with a 6.11 ERA (43 ER/63.1 IP) at home ... won his final three starts away from home, allowing two runs on 14 hits over 20.1 IP (0.89 ERA).
- Began the season on the disabled list while recovering from surgery on 7/14/10 to repair a detached latissimus dorsi muscle in his right posterior shoulder.
- Made his season debut on 5/11 at the Angels (4 ER/6.0 IP) ... tossed his fifth career shutout (ninth complete game) on 5/18 vs. Cleveland ... became the first Sox pitcher to throw a shutout with three hits or less, no walks and eight strikeouts since Melido Perez in 1988 ... left start on 6/4 vs. Detroit after 4.0 IP with a strained right adductor and was on the 15-day disabled list from 6/8-22.
- Earned the win in his first major-league relief appearance on 6/25 vs. Washington, tossing 4.0 scoreless IP with seven strikeouts ... the seven strikeouts were the most by a Sox reliever since Brandon McCarthy on 9/11/05 vs. the Angels (8 SO/5.2 IP) ... went 3-6 with a 5.28 ERA (43 ER/73.1 IP) in 12 starts after his relief outing.
- Recorded his 1,500th career strikeout on 7/10 vs. Minnesota (Drew Butera) ... tossed 6.1 scoreless IP with a season-high nine strikeouts in his final start (250th of career) on 9/6 at Minnesota ... did not yield a run over his last 10.1 IP of the season.

ROUGH ROUTE FOR RIGHTIES

■ Has limited right-handed hitters to a .216 (644-2,975) average and a .273 on-base percentage during his career (2002-present) ... the .216 opponents average ranks third among active pitchers, and the .274 on-base percentage is fourth.

WITH THE WHITE SOX

- Is 19-13 with a 4.35 ERA (125 ER/258.1 IP), two shutouts and 227 strikeouts in 42 games (41 starts) with the White Sox ... has made 20 quality starts and compiled three, three-game winning streaks.
- Has gone 9-4 with a 4.09 ERA (56 ER/123.1 IP) in 19 starts on the road and 10-9 with a 4.60 ERA (69 ER/135.0 IP) in 23 games (22 starts) at U.S. Cellular Field.

STRIKEOUT STATISTICS

- Has struck out at least 10 batters on 30 occasions (last, 10 on 5/22/09 at the Cubs) ... struck out a career-high 16 on 5/22/06 vs. Atlanta and 4/25/07 at Arizona.
- Double-digit strikeout performances: 10 K (15x), 11 K (8x), 12 K (1x), 13 K (3x), 14 K (1x), 16 K (2x).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Is a two-time National League All-Star (2005 and 2007) and was the unanimous selection for the NL Cy
 Young Award in 2007, going 19-6 with a 2.54 ERA and 240 strikeouts in 34 starts with San Diego.
- Won the major-league ERA title in 2004 (2.27) and 2007 ... led the majors in strikeouts in 2007 and ranked second (first in the NL) with 216 in 2005.
- Went 92-68 with a 3.29 ERA (491 ER/1,342.2 IP) in 212 starts with San Diego (2002-09) ... is the Padres all-time leader with 1,348 strikeouts and is tied with Randy Jones for second in wins.
- Was a member of Team USA in the inaugural World Baseball Classic in 2006 and also participated in 2009.
- Led all NL pitchers with 1,258 strikeouts from 2002-09 ... suffered the loss in his major-league debut on 6/22/02 vs. New York-NL.
