WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four straight games and five of their last six as they continue a six-game trip tonight in Oakland ... right-hander Gavin Floyd takes the mound for the White Sox, who have moved into a first-place tie with Detroit in the American League Central.
- Following this three-game series, the Sox return to Chicago for a seven-game homestand vs. Boston (4/26-29) and Cleveland (5/1-3).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last homestand vs. Detroit (2-1) and Baltimore (1-3) and 3-2 on their season-opening trip to Texas (1-2) and Cleveland (2-0) from 4/6-11.
- The schedule includes a pair of three-city trips and four visits to the west coast ... the Sox play the Cubs (twice), Houston, St. Louis, the Dodgers and Milwaukee during interleague play.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are off to their best 16-game start since 2008 when they also were 10-6.
- Paul Konerko needs one home run for 400 in his career.
- The White Sox have won six straight road games, their longest streak since 7/24-8/9/11 (also six) ... their last seven-game road winning streak came on 8/30-9/6/10.
- Gavin Floyd is 3-1 with a 2.35 ERA (10 ER/38.1 IP) and 35 strikeouts in seven career starts against the A's.
- Sox pitchers own a 2.61 ERA (29 ER/100.0 IP) in the last 11 games, allowing 75 hits with 110 strikeouts.
- Alex Rios owns an 11-game hitting streak, the second-longest active streak in the American League behind Derek Jeter (13).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Jake Peavy recorded his sixth career shutout and 10th career complete game as the White Sox won their fourth consecutive game and sixth straight on the road, 4-0, at Oakland.
- Peavy allowed three hits, walked two and struck out five to improve to 3-0 with a 1.88 ERA this season ... all three of his complete games with the Sox have been shutouts.
- Adam Dunn and Paul Konerko hit back-to-back home runs off Bartolo Colon in the fourth inning, the first time they have accomplished that feat ... Konerko's homer was the 399th of his career, tying Andres Galarraga and Al Kaline for 48th all-time.
- Alex Rios (3-5) extended his hitting streak to 11 games, recording back-to-back three-hit games for the first time since 6/24-25/08 with Toronto.
- Alejandro De Aza and Brent Morel each collected two hits.

PAULIE! PAULIE!

■ Paul Konerko is tied with Andres Galarraga and Al Kaline for 48th place all-time with 399 home runs ... Konerko is attempting to become the fourth player in White Sox history to hit a milestone homer of 400 or more (see box at right) ... he has hit 392 of his 399 homers in a Sox uniform.

FIRING BLANKS

- Philip Humber recorded his first career complete-game shutout on Saturday at Seattle, and Jake Peavy threw his sixth last night.
- It is the first time White Sox pitchers have thrown completegame shutouts in a span of three games or less since Jack Mc-Dowell and Alex Fernandez accomplished the feat in back-to-back games vs. Milwaukee on 7/1-2/94.

ARMS RACE

- White Sox pitchers lead the American League in opponents average (.213), complete games (2), shutouts (2) and strikeout-to-walk ratio and rank second in ERA (2.96), strikeouts (143), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9.00) opponents on-base (.277) and slugging (.369) percentage.
- The Sox have allowed three runs or less in 10 of their 16 games and one or no runs four times.

STARTING POINT

- White Sox starting pitchers lead the American League in strikeouts (99), shutouts (2), complete games (2) and opponents average (.208), rank third in ERA (3.22) and tied for third in quality starts (10).
- Sox starters own a 2.70 ERA (22 ER/73.1 IP) over the last 10 games, allowing 48 hits with 77 strikeouts.

BULLPEN RELIEF

■ The White Sox bullpen, which includes three rookies, ranks second in the American League in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9.98) and fourth with a 2.27 ERA (10 ER/39.2 IP) ... the bullpen has thrown 12.2 consecutive scoreless IP in its last seven games.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox lead the season series, 1-0, after last night's 4-0 victory, their first shutout in Oakland since 4/25/05 (6-0).
- Chicago went 6-4 against the A's in 2011 to improve to 2-8-1 in the last 11 season matchups ... the Sox took two of three in Oakland on 5/13-15, their third series victory at The Coliseum in the last four seasons.
- Chicago trails all time vs. Oakland, 268-287 ... the Sox are 138-136 at home (50-54 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 130-151 at The Coliseum.

HUM-BELIEVABLE!

- Philip Humber threw the 21st perfect game in major-league history on Saturday, striking out nine batters in a 4-0 victory at Seattle ... Humber, who was claimed off waivers from Oakland on 1/18/11, joins Buehrle (7/23/09) and Charlie Robertson (4/30/22) as White Sox pitchers who have been perfect.
- The White Sox and the Yankees are the only teams with three perfect games ... Chicago is tied with Boston for second all-time with 18 no-hitters, trailing only the Dodgers (20).
- Humber has returned to Chicago to join his wife for the expectant birth of their first child.

ROAD WARRIORS

■ The White Sox have won six straight road games to improve to 7-2 overall, their best start away from home since 2005 when they won 10 of their first 12 on their way to a franchise-best 52-29 record.

SOX PUTTING UP A FIGHT AT THE COLISEUM

- The White Sox have gone 9-6 in their last 15 games in Oakland, compared to 6-28 (.214) in their previous 34.

WINNING ON THE WEST COAST

- The White Sox are 33-22 playing at Seattle (14-7), Los Angeles-AL (10-8) and Oakland (9-7) since 2008, including a 20-10 record since 2010 ... by contrast, the Sox were 24-64 (.273) on the road vs. those three teams from 2001-07.
- Sox are 5-2 vs. the American League West in 2012 and 48-31 (.608) since 2010.

ON THE TRIP

- The White Sox are 4-0 on this six-game trip to Seattle (3-0) and Oakland (1-0), hitting .291 (41-141) with a 1.75 ERA (7 ER/36.0 IP) and 22-7 edge in runs scored.
- The Sox opened the trip with a three-game sweep of the Mariners, highlighted by Philip Humber's perfect game on Saturday ... Adam Dunn hit a pair of homers on Friday.

GRAB SOME BENCH

- White Sox pitchers rank second in the American League in strikeouts (143) and strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9.00) ... the Sox have fanned eight or more batters in 11 of their last 12 games.
- Chicago recorded a franchise-record 1,220 strikeouts in 2011, eclipsing the mark of 1,149 set in 2010 ... Sox pitchers registered 10 or more strikeouts 41 times in 2011 (four with 15-plus), their most since at least 1919 and 10 more than their previous high set in 2010

SLOW DOWN

- White Sox catchers have thrown out 75.0 percent (6-8) of attempted basestealers, the best percentage in the major leagues ... Tyler Flowers has thrown out all four attempted baserunners, while A.J. Pierzynski has thrown out 2-4.
- Sox catchers threw out 14.0 percent (22-157) of runners in 2011, the lowest percentage in the AL.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

■ Since the start of the 2003 season, White Sox pitchers lead the major leagues with 804 quality starts, five more than the Angels ... the Sox are tied for third in the American League with 10 quality starts in 2012.

AT THE HELM

- Robin Ventura was named the 39th manager in White Sox history on 10/6/11 ... he earned his first major-league victory on 4/7 at Texas.
- Ventura batted .267 with 294 home runs and 1,182 RBI in 16 major-league seasons ... he won six Gold Gloves (1991-93, 1996, 1998-99) and was a two-time All-Star (1992 and 2002).

FLOYD AT A GLANCE

- The 29-year-old right hander makes his fourth start of 2012 tonight at Oakland ... made his fifth consecutive Opening Day roster and is in his sixth season overall with the White Sox.
- Won double-digit games and made 30 starts for the fourth straight season in 2011, going 12-13 with a 4.37 ERA (94 ER/193.2 IP) and 151 strikeouts in 31 games (30 starts).
- Struck out at least 145 batters for the fourth straight season, the first Sox pitcher to accomplish the feat since Jack McDowell from 1990-93.
- Ranks among the American League right-handed leaders since 2008 in quality starts (6th, 73), wins (7th, 51) and strikeouts (8th, 626) ... see box at right.
- Was acquired from Philadelphia with left-handed pitcher Gio Gonzalez on 12/6/06 in exchange for right-hander Freddy Garcia.
- Selected by the Phillies in the first round (fourth overall) of the June 2001 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START

- Suffered the loss on 4/19 vs. Baltimore, allowing five runs off six hits over 6.0 IP ... walked three and struck out a season-high seven
- Surrendered a two-run homer to Adam Jones in the fifth inning ... has allowed at least one home run in four of his last six starts dating back to last season.
- Departed with the Sox trailing, 5-2, after throwing 117 pitches (73 strikes) ... Sox lost, 5-3.

2011 SEASON

- Recorded his fourth consecutive season with at least 10 wins and 30 starts, going 12-13 with a 4.37 ERA (94 ER/193.2 IP) and 151 strikeouts over 31 appearances (30 starts).
- Went 6-4 with a 4.06 ERA (37 ER/82.0 IP) after the All-Star Break, compared to 6-9 with a 4.59 ERA (57 ER/111.2 IP) in the first half ... was 8-6 with a 3.41 ERA (42 ER/110.0 IP) on the road and 4-7 with a 5.66 ERA (52 ER/82.2 IP) at U.S. Cellular Field.
- Won his 50th career game on 5/7 at Seattle, tossing 8.0 scoreless IP ... recorded his fifth career complete game on 6/15 at Minnesota.
- Made his first relief appearance since 2007 on 5/28 at Toronto, suffering the loss in 1.0 IP.
- Walked two or less 27 times, tied with Jered Weaver for seventh most in the American League.

SPRING SWINGS

- Went 3-1 with a 3.60 ERA (14 ER/35.0 IP) in five April starts in 2011, but is 12-11 with a 5.60 ERA (111 ER/178.1 IP) lifetime in April.
- Struck out 33 and issued just eight walks in his five April outings last season, including 10 strikeouts in a win on 4/26 at New York-AL.

WHEN IT RAINS, IT POURS

- Has allowed seven homers over his last five starts dating back to last season, including three homers in two of those outings (9/20/11 at Cleveland and 4/8/12 at Texas).
- Surrenderd a career-high four homers twice (6/13/08 vs. Colorado and 7/6/07 at New York-AL) and at least three home runs nine times.
- Served up 22 homers in 2011 (six multi-homer games), compared to just 14 in 2010 (two multi-homer games) ... ranked ninth in the American League in fewest HR/9.0 IP (0.67) in 2010.
- Has allowed 91 homers since 2008, tied with the Angels' Jared Weaver for sixth-most among active AL right-handers.

TOP-HEAVY

- Opposing 1-4 hitters are a combined .367 (11-30) this season, compared to a combined .097 (3-31) for hitters 5-9 ... the No. 4 hitter is .500 (4-8) with two homers and five RBI.
- Hitters 1-4 batted a combined .281 (499-1,772) in 2011, compared to .238 (472-1,980) for No. 5-9.

CONTROLLED CHAOS

- His streak of 55 consecutive games with three walks or less ended on 9/13/11 vs. Detroit when he issued four ... his streak lasted from 4/18/10-9/8/11, the longest by a Sox starter since Mark Buehrle from 6/15/06-5/17/08 (58 games).
- Issued two walks or less in 27 of his 30 starts last year, tied for seventh most in the American League, and 92 of 124 starts dating back to 2008.
- By contrast, set career highs in HBP (11) and wild pitches (12) in 2011 ... previous career high in both categories was nine.

NEAR NO HITTERS

- Has thrown at least 5.2 hitless IP four times in his career, including 6.2 IP on 6/13/10 at Cubs.
- Retired the first 17 batters he faced on 9/5/09 vs. Boston ... also struck out a career-best 11 batters.
- Became the first White Sox pitcher in 2008 to toss at least 7.0 hitless IP twice in a season since Ken Brett in 1976 (4/12/08 vs. Detroit and 5/6/08 vs. Minnesota).
- Is 0-2 with a 4.37 ERA (11 ER/22.2) in four starts following his no-hit bids.

VS. OAKLAND ATHLETICS

- Will make his eighth career start vs. Oakland and fifth at The Coliseum ... is 3-1 with a 2.35 ERA (10 ER/38.1 IP) lifetime vs. the A's and 1-1 with a 3.71 ERA (7 ER/17.0 IP) in Oakland.
- Suffered the loss in his last start on 5/14/11 at Oakland, allowing five runs on nine hits over 4.1 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 ER/7.0 IP) over two starts in 2010 ... left after seven pitches on 9/20/10 at The Coliseum with right shoulder tightness and missed the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

- Chris Sale (2-1, 3.50) will make his fourth career start tomorrow afternoon at Oakland.
- Earned the win in his last start on 4/20 at Seattle, allowing three runs on seven hits over 6.1 IP ... recorded a career-high 11 strikeouts, the most by a Sox lefty since Mark Buehrle fanned 12 on 4/16/05 vs. Seattle.
- His first 79 major-league appearances came as a reliever, going 5-3 with a 2.50 ERA (28 ER/101.0 IP), 12 saves and 116 strikeouts.
- Went 2-2 with a 2.79 ERA (22 ER/71.0 IP), 79 strikeouts and eight saves in 58 relief appearances in 2011 ... ranked among the American League relief leaders in IP (6th), strikeouts (6th), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (8th, 10.01) and inherited runners scored percent (8th, 18.4).
- Is 1-0 with a 8.31 ERA (4 ER/4.1 IP) and one save in five career relief appearances vs. the A's ... earned a hold is his last outing vs. Oakland on 6/10/11, surrendering a run over 1.0 IP with one strikeout.
