### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight and six of the last nine games to return to the .500 mark for the fourth time this year (10-10)...have not been over .500 since May 18 of last year when they were 22-21...are 9-9 in the month of April...have finished April with a winning record just once in the previous eight seasons (16-11 in 2008)...are 8-0 when scoring first...the Yankees are the only other Major League team that has not lost a game when scoring first (6-0)...remain in sole possession of second place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day...are a season-high 5½ games behind first place Texas for the sixth consecutive day...the last time the A's were 5½ games out of first place in the month of April was in 2002...have not been more than 5½ out in April since 2001 when they finished the month 12 games behind Seattle...have spent one day tied for first this year, six days in second, three days tied for second, six days in third and seven days in fourth.

**WALK-OFF WEDNESDAYS:** The A's had their second "walk-off" win of the season on Wednesday against Chicago...both of the wins have come in extra innings on Wednesday on the last day of a homestand after the other team scored at least one run in the top of the inning...the only other time in Oakland history the A's had more than one extra-inning "walk-off" win after the opponent scored in top of the inning was in 1991 when they had three such victories...are now 2-1 in extra inning games...only the Orioles, with four, have more extra inning games among American League teams...were 8-11 in extra inning games last year and are 17-29 (.370) over the last four years...are 3-2 in one-run games.

**ROOKIES:** Jim Miller and Jarrod Parker made their A's debuts on Wednesday, the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> rookies to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have seven rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Figueroa, Miller, Milone, Parker, Recker)...had seven rookies on the Opening Day roster, which were the A's most rookies on an Opening Day roster since they are first available in 1992 (previous: 5, 2009).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 1.99 ERA (17 er in 77.0 ip) over the last eight games and now have a 2.71 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League to Texas (2.62)...also rank second in the AL in opponents slugging (.365), third in on-base percentage (.297) and fourth in batting (.236)...have the third fewest strikeouts (111)...issued 29 walks in six games on the homestand after walking just 28 batters over the first 14 games...A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 2.04 ERA (12 er in 53.0 ip) over the last eight games...have a 2.88 ERA (41 er in 128.1 ip) for the season, which is also second lowest in the AL to Texas (2.83).

**SHUTOUT:** The A's pitching staff tossed its Major League leading fourth shutout of the season Tuesday night...it came one day after the offense was shutout for the fourth time, which is also the most in the majors...it marks the third time this year the A's have played back-to-back games where they have shutout an opponent in one game and been shutout in the other...there have been 19 shutouts in the American League this year and the A's have been involved in eight of them (42.1%).

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored just 16 runs in six games on the homestand and have 59 overall...that is the fewest in Oakland history over the first 20 games of the season...the previous low was 64 in 1968 and 1970...the fewest after 21 games is 68 in 1968...the last A's team to score fewer than 59 runs over the first 20 games is the 1966 Kansas City A's (38)...have the second fewest runs scored in the majors ahead of Pittsburgh (41)...are batting .206 (125 for 605) in the month of April...the lowest batting average in any month in Oakland history is .210 in April of 1979...for the season, rank last in the majors in batting (.205), slugging (.318) and batting with runners in scoring position (.182) and second to last in on-base percentage (.274).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's stole a season-high four bases last Sunday against Cleveland, topping the previous high of three from the night before...now have 18 stolen bases for the season, which is second most in the majors to Miami (20)...have a stolen base percentage of 75.0% (6 cs), which is tied for third in the American League...A's opponents have been caught stealing 11 times, which is tied with San Diego for the most in the majors...the opponents stolen base percentage of 42.1% (8 for 19) is second lowest to the White Sox (27.3%).

**THE LONG BALL:** Yoenis Céspedes hit the A's 15<sup>th</sup> home run of the season Wednesday and it came in the 20<sup>th</sup> game...last year, the A's did not hit their 15<sup>th</sup> home run until game 29 (number 16 also came in game 29)...however, the 15 home runs are tied for third fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has allowed just three home runs in the last eight games and has surrendered just 14 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed six errors in the last four games after making just eight over the first 16 contests...now have 14 errors for the season, which is tied with Toronto for second most in the American League (Baltimore, 22)...A's outfielders have six assists, which is tied with Arizona for the most in the majors...last year, the A's had 21 outfield assists the entire season.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin their second road trip of the season tonight, a nine-game, 10-day trip to Baltimore (three games), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)... went 4-3 on the first road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles (3-1)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Chicago (2-1) and are 6-7 at home...last year, the A's went 43-38 (.531) in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have played just four day games, which is tied with Houston for the fewest in the majors...are 3-1 in day games compared to 7-9 at night...last year, the A's were 32-31 during the day and 42-57 at night...had the second worst record under the lights in the American League.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (Torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

**FILLING IN:** Johnny Dostkow, long-time voice of the A's Triple-A affiliate in Sacramento, will join the club's radio broadcast on an interim basis while Ken Korach recovers from knee replacement surgery...Vince Cotroneo will assume Korach's primary broadcast duties.

### A's vs. ORIOLES

This is the first of nine meetings between the A's and Orioles in 2012...the A's won the season series last year, 5-4...went 5-1 in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series in Baltimore...have won the season series in each of the previous four seasons and have not lost a season series to Baltimore since 1998...have won 22 of their last 30 games against the Orioles and are 77-35 (.688) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season...that is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 244-241 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 122-125 in Oakland and 122-116 in Baltimore...including 55-42 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 980-921 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** has been successful in each of his last 25 stolen base attempts, which is the longest streak of his career and tied for fourth longest in Oakland history.

**Josh Reddick** leads American League outfielders with four assists...has hit five of his 12 career home runs against the Orioles.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1968** Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in **1981** former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in **2002** the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his Major League leading sixth start of the season...the A's are 1-4 (.200) in his starting assignments this year and are 12-18 (.400) in his two seasons with the A's...his teams are 39-47 (.453) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in three of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

**FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Has lost each of his first three decisions after losing his final start of 2011...the four-game losing streak is one short of his career high of five from April 21 to July 4, 2011...has a 3.60 ERA (16 er in 40.0 ip) during his current losing streak, which spans six starts dating back to September 26, 2011...his three losses this year are tied for second in the American League.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of three runs or fewer in all five of his starts this year, including one run or fewer three times...his season run support average of 1.97 is fifth lowest in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 1-12 with run support of three runs or fewer and 8-0 in 10 starts with run support of four runs or more.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** Is making his first start against an American League East team...went 4-0 with a 2.87 ERA in five starts against AL East teams last year and is 6-0 with a 3.59 ERA (29 er in 72.2 ip) in 11 starts against the East since 2009.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .308 opponents batting average, which includes .245 against right-handed hitters compared to .346 against left-handers...has issued all seven of his walks to lefties...opponents are batting .406 (28 for 69) with the bases empty compared to .197 (12 for 61) with runners on base...two of the three home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

**THREE OUT OF SEVEN:** Started three of the A's first seven games...since 1977, the only Oakland pitcher to start three of the A's first seven games is Joe Blanton, who did it in 2008, the last time the A's went to Japan...McCarthy also started two of the A's first three games, joining Blanton as the only pitchers in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games.

**WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS:** Has 18 strikeouts and seven walks over his first five starts this year for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 2.57...last year, he struck out 123 and walked just 25 to set an Athletics record (since 1901) for strikeout-to-walk ratio with a mark of 4.92...broke the previous record of 3.91 set by Dan Haren in 2006...averaged 1.32 walks per nine innings, which was the second-lowest mark in Athletics history...the record is 1.30 by Jim "Catfish" Hunter in 1974...ranked second in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio and was third in walks per nine innings.

**FIRST START:** Had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Seattle in Tokyo on March 28...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the seventh different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last seven years (Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on a Dustin Ackley home run in the fourth inning...Hernandez and the Mariners bullpen combined to limit the A's to a run on six hits.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Seattle April 6 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first two innings before allowing four runs in the third...an error by Donaldson made three of the runs unearned...Seager had a two-run single to highlight the scoring and McCarthy allowed another run in the fourth on a Figgins RBI single.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 12-inning win over Kansas City April 11 in Oakland...retired the first seven batters before Pena double and scored on a Gordon single in the third inning...also allowed a solo home run to Butler in the fourth...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead but Fuentes allowed a Gordon home run in the seventh inning for the blown save.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles April 21...allowed 11 hits in 7.0 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Morales in the first inning but then blanked the Angels on five hits and a hit batter over the next six innings...also yielded a RBI double to Morales in the eighth and was relieved by Carignan who allowed an inherited runner to score.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Cleveland last Saturday in Oakland...allowed 10 hits, his second consecutive start with 10 or more hits...surrendered at least one hit in each inning, including the first when Kipnis singled and later scored on a Hafner ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Kipnis in the sixth and left after seven innings trailing 2-1...Fuentes then allowed three runs in the eighth.

**McCARTHY vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 1-1 with a 4.97 ERA (29.0 ip, 36 h, 17 r, 16 er, 14, bb, 16 so, 8 hr) in seven career appearances, five starts...is 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (6 er in 6.0 ip) in two games at Camden Yards and 1-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in four games at his other home ballparks...is 1-1 with a 4.00 ERA (12 er in 27.0 ip) in his five starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year, a 6-5 A's victory in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Jones sacrifice fly and a Guerrero RBI double but the A's came back with three runs in the bottom of the first to take the lead for good...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the next four innings and had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Markakis in the sixth...also allowed a RBI single to Bell in the seventh.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 0-0 with a 4.63 ERA (11.2 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 6 so) in three starts this spring...did not allow a home run in 11.2 innings...opponents were 13 for 46 (.283)...also started a Triple-A game March 15, allowing two runs on five hits and no walks while striking out six in 5.0 innings.

**2011 RECAP:** Had the best season of his six-year Major League career as he was 9-9 with a 3.32 ERA in 25 starts...had career highs in wins, starts, complete games (5), innings pitched (170.2) and strikeouts (123)...his ERA was the lowest of his career as was his .281 opponents on-base percentage and .377 opponents slugging percentage...also had career highs in hits (168), runs (73) and earned runs (63)...tied for second in the American League in complete games, tied for eighth in shutouts (1) and ranked ninth in on-base percentage...also ranked third in home runs per nine innings (0.58) and fewest pitches per inning (14.6)...a stint on the disabled list and a lack of run support limited him to a 1-5 record despite a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 8-4 with a 3.15 ERA in 14 starts after the break...tied for third in the AL in post-break wins and was eighth in ERA.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Tyson Ross (1-0, 2.13 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17, the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's win over Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 11.12 ERA in five career appearances against Baltimore, all in relief and all in 2010...went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with Sacramento this year...was 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA in five spring training starts...went 3-3 with a 2.75 ERA in nine games, six starts, with Oakland last year before going on the disabled list May 20 with a strained left oblique...made four rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 25...was 3-2 with a 7.61 ERA in nine starts overall with the River Cats.

**3-1, 2.35 ERA (57.1 ip, 44 h, 18 r, 15 er, 26 bb, 40 so, 5 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 5/7 (71.4%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 12 of the past 13 games (7 er in 35.0 ip, 1.80 ERA)...has a 2.35 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...ranks second in opponents batting average (.218) and third in opponents slugging percentage (.356)...has 40 strikeouts, which is second fewest...has seven opponents grounded into double plays, which is tied for second most...is 5 for 7 (71.4%) in save opportunities, with all five saves belonging to Balfour.

**First Hitters: 2-11 (0 bb)**

- Was charged with his first blown save of the season Wednesday after allowing a lead-off home run to Konerko in the ninth inning.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (11) and is tied for fifth in saves (5)...is tied for fifth among AL relievers in innings pitched (12.0).
- Has held opponents to a .125 batting average, which is sixth lowest among AL relievers...that breaks down to .080 (2 for 25) against left-handed hitters and .200 (3 for 15) against right-handers.
- Has 15 career saves, which is second most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher (Graeme Lloyd, 17).
- Did not allow a run in five games against Baltimore last year (5.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 2-0 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA (8 er in 28.1 ip) in 26 career appearances against the Orioles.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's are 2-0 in his starting assignments this year and are 5-5 (.500) in his career...tossed at least six innings in four of his six starts last year, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer three times.

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17, the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...was the A's final cut of the spring as he was optioned to Sacramento April 4...was one of the three inactive players in Japan...went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Los Angeles on Tuesday...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings and the A's scored once in the fifth to take a 1-0 lead...allowed a run to score in the bottom of the fifth on a Bourjos ground out and also allowed a Hunter RBI single in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 2-1 but the A's scored four times in the eighth for the win.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 victory over Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland...the victory came on his 25<sup>th</sup> birthday and he became the first Oakland pitcher to start and win on his birthday since Todd Stottlemyre in 1995 (May 20 vs. Kansas City)...issued a career-high five walks in 6.2 innings but was aided by two double plays and a caught stealing...allowed his only run in the first inning on back-to-back two-out doubles by Choo and Hafner.

**ROSS vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 0-1 with a 11.12 ERA (5.2 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, all in relief...all five appearances came in 2010...the first two came in Oakland on April 15 and 18 (1 er in 3.0 ip)...allowed two runs in each of his three appearances at Baltimore, including May 25 when he took the loss (1.2 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb)...his last outing was on June 30 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments and his teams are 200-156 (.562) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in four of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked one batter or fewer four times.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for the American League lead in wins (3), tied for second in starts (5), ranks fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.239) tied for sixth in innings pitched (34.1) and 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents batting (.209) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.20).

**BASES ON BALLS:** Walked three batters in his last start after issuing just two free passes over his first four starts...it snapped a streak of 18 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer dating back to July 14 of last year...that was the second longest streak of his career to a 19-start stretch from September 15, 2005 to May 12, 2007...the three walks were his most in a game since July 7, 2011 against Tampa Bay when he walked four...is averaging 1.31 walks per nine innings this year, which is eighth lowest in the American League...has issued all five of his walks to left-handed hitters.

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed two home runs in his last start (back-to-back by Dunn and Konerko) after surrendering just one over his first four starts...all three home runs have been solo shots as have 30 of his 37 over his last three seasons...two of his three home runs this year and 17 of his 24 over the last two years have been hit by left-handers.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (15.0 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts at home...over the last two years, he is 6-5 with a 2.96 ERA (35 er in 106.1 ip) in 18 games on the road compared to 5-7 with a 4.68 ERA (48 er in 92.1 ip) in 16 games in his home ballparks.

**DOMINICAN LEADERS:** His 164 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (355), innings pitched (2275.1) and strikeouts (1763).

**THROWING STRIKES:** Tossed 108 pitches April 18 at Los Angeles, including 82 strikes (75.9%)...that included a streak of 38 consecutive strikes...that is the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998.

**38 YEARS OLD:** His first start on March 29 against Seattle came at the age of 38 years, 310 days, making him the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti, who was 41 years, 275 days when he made his last start for Oakland on June 2, 1999...over the previous four seasons, the only Oakland pitcher 33 years or older to start a game was Brett Tomko, who made six starts in 2009 at the age of 36...Colón will turn 39 on May 24...only four pitchers in Oakland history have started a game at age 39 or older (Tommy John 42, Candiotti 41, Don Sutton 40, Jim Perry 39).

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Seattle in Tokyo March 29...retired each of the first 13 batters before Montero singled with one out in the fifth inning...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first six innings before Smoak homered to lead off the seventh inning...retired each of the final six batters that he faced.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss to Seattle April 7 in Oakland...yielded seven earned runs, which were his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...allowed a leadoff triple to Figgins in the first but retired the next nine batters with Figgins scoring on a fielders choice...then allowed six runs on seven hits in the fourth inning...Suzuki had a RBI triple, Smoak, Olivo and Kawasaki had RBI singles and Figgins had a two-run double.

# 2012 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

## BRANDON ALLEN

- Was the A's Opening Day starter at first base March 28 but went for 7 with five strikeouts in three games before he was designated for assignment April 9...was claimed off waivers by the Tampa Bay Rays April 19.

## BRETT ANDERSON

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

## DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.

## JERRY BLEVINS

- Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

## DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

## YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Leshner, who did it in 14 games in 1996.

## BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

## COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.

- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game error-less streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

### **FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before he option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

### **JOEY DEVINE**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.

### **JOSH DONALDSON**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.

### **GRAHAM GODFREY**

- Godfrey was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was optioned to Sacramento April 21.

### **JONNY GOMES**

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)... it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

### **KILA KA'AIHUE**

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).

### **BRANDON MCCARTHY**

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

### **TOMMY MILONE**

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

### **JOSH REDDICK**

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.

### **ADAM ROSALES**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was optioned to Sacramento April 2.

### **SCOTT SIZEMORE**

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

### **SETH SMITH**

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.

### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.

### **KURT SUZUKI**

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.

### **RICH THOMPSON**

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

### **NEIL WAGNER**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.

### **JEMILE WEEKS**

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span...since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
