ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Had a season-high tying three-game winning streak snapped last night...have won four of the last six and seven of the last 11 games to climb to 11-11 on the season...had risen above the .500 mark for the first time since May 18 (22-21) of last year after Friday's win...are 10-10 in the month of April...have finished April with a winning record just once in the previous eight seasons (16-11 in 2008)...are 8-0 when scoring first...the Yankees are the only other ML team that has not lost a game when scoring first (7-0)...are tied with Seattle for second place in the American League West, a season-high-tying 5½ games behind first place Texas...the last time the A's were 5½ games out of first place in April was in 2002...have not been more than 5½ out in April since 2001 when they finished the month 12 games behind Seattle...have spent one day tied for first this year, six days in second, five days tied for second, six days in third and seven days in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.78 ERA (29 er in 94.0 ip) over the last 10 games and now have a 3.02 ERA for the season...that is the **second lowest ERA in the American League**...also ranks second in the AL in slugging percentage (.368), third in on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in opponents batting average (.241)...tied for second fewest strikeouts (124)...have issued 35 walks over the past eight games after walking just 28 batters over the first 14 games...A's starting pitchers were 5-3 with a 2.10 ERA (14 er in 60.0 ip) over their last nine games prior to Tyson Ross being buffeted for nine runs (all earned) on 11 hits last night...starters now have a 3.36 ERA (52 er in 139.1 ip) for the season, which is also the **second lowest in the AL**.

SHUTOUT: The A's pitching staff tossed its Major League-leading fourth shutout of the season Tuesday night...it came one day after the offense was shut out for the fourth time, which is also the most in the majors...it marks the third time this year the A's have played back-to-back games where they have shut out an opponent in one game and been shut out in the other...there have been 21 shutouts in the American League this year and the A's have been involved in eight of them (38.1%).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored just 65 runs this season...that is the fewest in Oakland history over the first 22 games of a season...the fewest after 23 games is 73 in 1968...the last A's team to score fewer than 65 runs over the first 22 games is the 1966 Kansas City A's (47)...have scored the fewest runs in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are batting .204 (137 for 670) in the month of April...the lowest batting average in any month in Oakland history is .210 in April of 1979...for the season, **rank last in the majors** in batting (.203), on-base percentage (.271), slugging (.322), and batting with runners in scoring position (.181).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are playing only their fifth day game of the season, which is tied with Houston for the fewest in the majors...are 3-1 in day games compared to 8-10 at night...last year, the A's were 32-31 during the day and 42-57 at night...had the second worst record under the lights in the American League.

THE LONG BALL: Jonny Gomes hit the A's 18th home run of the season last night and it came in the 22nd game...last year, the A's did not hit their 18th home run until game 31...however, the 18 home runs are tied for fourth fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has allowed just four home runs in the last 10 games and has surrendered just 15 for the season, which is tied with Texas for the fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases last Sunday against Cleveland, topping the previous high of three from the night before...the A's now have 21 steals for the season, which is **most in the majors**...have a stolen base percentage of 75.0% (7 cs), which ranks tied for fourth in the AL...A's foes have been caught stealing 11 times, which ranks second in the majors to San Diego (12)...the opponents' SB percentage of 42.1% (8 for 19) is tied for second lowest in the majors behind the White Sox (27.3%).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last six games after making just eight over the first 16 contests...now have 15 errors in 2012, which is fourth most in the AL...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is the **most in the majors**...last year, the A's had 21 outfield assists the entire season.

ROOKIES: Jim Miller and Jarrod Parker made their A's debuts on Wednesday, the 10th and 11th rookies to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have seven rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Figueroa, Miller, Milone, Parker, Recker)...had seven rookies on the Opening Day roster, which were the A's most rookies on an Opening Day roster since that information was first available in 1992 (previous: 5, 2009).

WALK-OFF WEDNESDAYS: The A's had their second "walk-off" win of the season on Wednesday against Chicago...both of the wins have come in extra innings on Wednesday on the last day of a homestand after the other team scored at least one run in the top of the inning...the only other time in Oakland history the A's had more than one extra-inning "walk-off" win after the opponent scored in top of the inning was in 1991 when they had three such victories...are now 2-1 in extra inning games...only the Orioles, with four, have more extra inning games among American League teams...were 8-11 in extra inning games last year and are 17-29 (.370) over the last four years...are 3-2 in one-run games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this nine-game, 10-day trip to Baltimore (1-1), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 4-3 on the first road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles (3-1)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Chicago (2-1) and are 6-7 at home...last year, the A's went 43-38 (.531) in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FILLING IN: Johnny Doskow, long-time voice of the A's Triple-A affiliate in Sacramento, has joined the club's radio broadcast on an interim basis while Ken Korach recovers from knee replacement surgery...Vince Cotroneo will assume Korach's primary broadcast duties.

A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's have split the first two games of the 2012 series after winning the season series last year, 5-4...went 5-1 in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series in Baltimore...have won the season series in each of the previous four seasons and have not lost a season series to Baltimore since 1998...have won 23 of their last 32 games against the Orioles and are 78-36 (.684) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season...that is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 245-242 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 122-125 in Oakland and 123-117 in Baltimore, including 56-43 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 981-922 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has 16 career saves and is one save away from tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.

Ryan Cook became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning Friday night.

Coco Crisp has been successful in each of his last 27 stolen base attempts, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history.

Josh Reddick leads American League outfielders with four assists, which is second-best in the majors (Kubel, Arizona, 5)...has hit six of his 13 career home runs against the Orioles.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1998**, Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000**, Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments and his teams are 200-156 (.562) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in four of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked one batter or fewer four times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in starts (5), ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.239) is tied for third in wins (3), ranks seventh in innings pitched (34.1), 10th in opponents batting (.209) and 11th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.20).

BASES ON BALLS: Walked three batters in his last start after issuing just two free passes over his first four starts...it snapped a streak of 18 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer dating back to July 14 of last year...that was the second longest streak of his career to a 19-start stretch from September 15, 2005 to May 12, 2007...the three walks were his most in a game since July 7, 2011 against Tampa Bay when he walked four...is averaging 1.31 walks per nine innings this year, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has issued all five of his walks to left-handed hitters.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed two home runs in his last start (back-to-back by Dunn and Konerko) after surrendering just one over his first four starts...all three home runs have been solo shots as have 30 of his 37 over his last three seasons...two of his three home runs this year and 17 of his 24 over the last two years have been hit by left-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (15.0 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts at home...over the last two years, he is 6-5 with a 2.96 ERA (35 er in 106.1 ip) in 18 games on the road compared to 5-7 with a 4.68 ERA (48 er in 92.1 ip) in 16 games in his home ballparks.

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks sixth among active pitchers in complete games (32), seventh in wins (164), tied for seventh in shutouts (9), ninth in strikeouts (1763) and 10th in game started (356) and innings pitched (2275.1).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 164 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (355), innings pitched (2275.1) and strikeouts (1763).

THROWING STRIKES: Tossed 108 pitches April 18 at Los Angeles, including 82 strikes (75.9%)...that included a streak of 38 consecutive strikes...that is the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998.

38 YEARS OLD: His first start on March 29 against Seattle came at the age of 38 years, 310 days, making him the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti, who was 41 years, 275 days when he made his last start for Oakland on June 2, 1999...over the previous four seasons, the only Oakland pitcher 33 years or older to start a game was Brett Tomko, who made six starts in 2009 at the age of 36...Colón will turn 39 on May 24...only four pitchers in Oakland history have started a game at age 39 or older (Tommy John 42, Candiotti 41, Don Sutton 40, Jim Perry 39).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Seattle in Tokyo March 29...retired each of the first 13 batters before Montero singled with one out in the fifth inning...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first six innings before Smoak homered to lead off the seventh inning...retired each of the final six batters that he faced.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss to Seattle April 7 in Oakland...yielded seven earned runs, which were his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...allowed a leadoff triple to Figgins in the first but retired the next nine batters with Figgins scoring on a fielders choice...then allowed six runs on seven hits in the fourth inning...Suzuki had a RBI triple, Smoak, Olivo and Kawasaki had RBI singles and Figgins had a two-run double.

THIRD START: He combined with Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three hits while walking one...allowed just one base runner as far as third base and retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...the start was his third consecutive start against Seattle...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

FOURTH START: He combined with De Los Santos on a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...tossed eight inning and allowed all four of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base until Aybar doubled and went to third on a ground out in the eighth inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss to Chicago last Monday in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 18.1 innings...that fell 1.2 innings short of his career high of 20.0...then allowed back-to-back home runs to Dunn and Konerko to start the fourth inning, the only runs he would allow in 7.0 innings.

COLON vs. BALTIMORE: Is 11-8 with a 3.26 ERA (151.2 ip, 144 h, 57 r, 55 er, 59 bb, 107 so, 10 hr) in 24 career appearances, 23 starts...is 4-7 with a 3.67 ERA (34 er in 83.1 ip) in 13 starts at Camden Yards and 7-1 with a 2.77 ERA (21 er in 68.1 ip) in 11 games, 10 starts, at his home ballparks...was 1-1 with a 1.52 ERA (23.2 ip, 18 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 20 so) in four games, three starts, last year...the relief appearance came April 14 at Yankee Stadium when he tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in a 6-5 New York win in 10 innings (3 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his first start, a 4-1 Yankees win in 15 innings at Baltimore May 18...did not allow a run and yielded just three hits in 8.0 innings...was relieved by Rivera to start the ninth inning with a 1-0 lead but he allowed a run in the bottom of the ninth...was the winning pitcher in an 8-3 win at New York July 30...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed both of his runs in the fourth inning on a fielders choice and a ground out...took the loss in a 2-0 decision at Baltimore August 28...shutout the Orioles on two hits over the first six innings...then allowed a RBI single to Guerrero in the seventh and a Hardy RBI single in the eighth...Britton, Johnson and Gregg shutout the Yankees on five hits.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (6.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 5 so) in two starts this spring...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings...opponents were 7 for 28 (.250)...also pitched in a simulated game March 16 and a minor league game March 21.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (3-1, 2.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, the 10th of his career... the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 8-1 (.889) in his career... is tied for third among all AL pitchers in wins (3), and ranks fifth in ERA (2.00) and opponents batting (.185)...leads American League rookies in innings (27.0) and is tied for second in wins (3) and games started (4)...his ERA (2.00) is the lowest among rookies with 23 or more innings...**is attempting to become the first rookie in Oakland history to win four games in the month of April...** in his last start on Tuesday in Oakland, he combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago ...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits (8.0 ip, 3 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 5 k, 98 pitches)...will be making his first career appearance and start vs. Boston.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

3-1, 2.27 RA (63.1 ip, 47 h, 19 r, 16 er, 28 b, 48so, 6 r) Save/Save Opportunities: 6/8 (75.0%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 14 of the past 15 games (8 er in 41.0 ip, 1.76 ERA)...has a 2.27 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...ranks third in opponents batting average (.211) and opponents slugging percentage (.350)...has 48 strikeouts, which is tied for third fewest...has eight opponents grounded into double plays, which is tied for second most...is 6 for 8 (75.0%) in save opportunities, with all six saves belonging to Balfour.

- Recorded the save Friday night after being charged with his first blown save Wednesday...now has six saves for the season, which is tied for fourth among American League relievers.
- Is tied for the AL lead in games pitched (12) and tied for third among relievers in innings pitched (13.0).
- Has held opponents to a .116 batting average, which is fifth lowest among AL relievers...that breaks down to .077 (2 for 26) against left-handed hitters and .176 (3 for 17) against right-handers.
- Has 16 career saves and is one save away from tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Did not allow a run in five games against Baltimore last year (5.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 2-0 with three saves and a 2.45 ERA (8 er in 29.1 ip) in 27 career appearance against the Orioles.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).
