A's vs. RAYS

The A's have split the first two meetings of 2012...won the season series last year, 5-2...went 2-1 in Tampa Bay and 3-1 in Oakland...have now won 10 of the last 15 games against the Rays...however, have lost the season series in three of the previous five years and are 23-24 against the Rays since 2007...all-time, the A's are 82-49 (.626) against Tampa Bay...that is the **best record by any American League team**...are 46-19 in Oakland and 36-30 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour recorded the 17th save of his career last night, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.

Ryan Cook has not allowed a run this year and his 14.1 innings pitched are the **most among American League relievers** that have not allowed a run...has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year.

Pedro Figueroa not allowed a run in 4.2 innings with the A's and 7.0 innings with Triple-A Sacramento after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings during spring training.

Brian Fuentes recorded the 200th save of his career Wednesday in Boston...became the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to record 200 saves.

Josh Reddick has five multiple hit games over his last nine contests...ranks second among AL outfielders with four assists.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1975** Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since Aug. 12, 1979.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games after losing a season-high tying three in a row...are 10-7 over the last 17 games after starting the season 4-7...are 14-14 for the season, the seventh time they have been exactly .500 this year...are in second place in the American League West and trail first-place Texas by 4½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 10 days in second, eight days tied for second, six days in third and seven days in fourth...are 3-1 in the month of May after going 10-12 in April and 1-1 in two games in Japan in March...are 11-3 when scoring first compared to 3-11 when their opponent scores first...are 12-2 when scoring four or more runs and 2-12 when scoring less than four runs.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 4-2 in one-run games with a 4-3, 12-inning win last night...last year, the A's went 20-25 in one-run games, which was the third worst record in the American League...are now 3-1 in extra inning games...the four extra inning games are tied for second most in the American League...were 8-11 in extra inning games last year and are 18-29 (.383) over the last four years...have two "walk-off" wins this season...both of the wins have come in extra innings on Wednesday on the last day of a homestand after the other team scored at least one run in the top of the inning.

DAY GAMES: The A's will play just their sixth day game of the season today, which is the fewest in the majors...are 3-2 in day games compared to 11-12 at night...last year, the A's were 32-31 during the day and 42-57 at night...had the second worst record under the lights in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting just .211 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also rank last in the majors in on-base percentage (.281), slugging percentage (.331) and batting with runners in scoring position (.189)...have scored seven runs or fewer in each game this year and 45 consecutive games dating back to last year, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...last scored more than seven runs Sept. 10 of last year at Texas when they had eight...have scored just 88 runs for the season...that is their fewest runs over the first 28 games of the season since scoring 92 runs in 1978...the fewest after 29 games is 87 in 1968 and the second fewest is 102 in 1978 and 2011...rank last in the American League in runs scored and have been shut out four times, which is tied with Seattle for second most in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 6).

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high tying four bases Tuesday night and now have an **American League-leading** 25 for the season...all four steals were of third base, becoming just the second team since 1969 to steal third base four times in a game (Montreal, July 28, 1988 against St. Louis)...lead the majors with eight steals of third...have a stolen base percentage of 78.1% (7 cs), which ranks second in the American League...A's opponents have been caught stealing 11 times, which leads the American League...the opponents stolen base percentage of 47.6% (10 for 21) ranks second best in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 41 runs in the last seven games (40 er in 62.1 ip, 5.78 ERA) after yielding just 25 runs over the previous 10 contests (2.08 ERA)...now have a 3.43 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have recorded four shutouts, which is tied with Los Angeles-AL for the **Major League lead**...have the third fewest strikeouts (162) and hit basemen (7) in the AL and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (24).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed 31 runs in the last seven games (30 er in 38.2 ip, 6.98 ERA) after yielding just 16 runs over the previous 10 contests (2.18 ERA)...now have a 3.78 ERA (73 er in 174.0 ip) for the season, which ranks seventh in the American League...have allowed seven home runs over the past five games...however, have not allowed a home run in 13 of the last 17 games and have surrendered 16 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 12 games after making just eight over the first 16 contests...now have 19 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is **tied for the most in the majors** (Arizona, Kansas City)...last year, the A's had 21 outfield assists the entire season.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this nine-game, 10-day trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...went 4-3 on the first road trip and are 8-7 on the road for the season...begin a six-game homestand against Toronto (two games) and Detroit (four games) Tuesday...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Chicago (2-1) and are 6-7 at home...last year, the A's went 43-38 (.531) in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 10-12 record, marking the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last nine years the A's have not posted a winning record in April...however, it was just the second time they were more than one game under .500 (8-11 in 2009) as they are 106-109 (.493) in April since 2004...batted a Major League low .211 in April, which was the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.210, April of 1979)...had the second lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.284), which was the A's lowest in a month since June of 1982 (.284)...scored 68 runs in 22 games, an average of 3.09 per game, which was second lowest in the majors...since 1979, the only time the A's averaged fewer runs per game in a month was August of 2008 (2.73)...hit 17 home runs, which was their best April total since 2007 when they had 18.

PLAYERS USED: Friday night, Michael Taylor became the 35th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...that is the most in the majors...12 of those 35 are rookies, which is also the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Figueroa, Miller, Milone, Parker, Recker, Taylor).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list six times and currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Crisp, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season, the 11th of his career...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 8-2 (.800) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in three of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in games started (5), ranks second in innings pitched (31.2) and is third in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Has tossed 8.0 shutout innings in each of his two starts in the Coliseum...is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back starts of at least 8.0 shutout innings at home since Joe Blanton in 2006 (May 31 and June 13)...is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (16.0 ip) and .122 (6 for 49) opponents batting average at home compared to 1-2 with a 7.47 ERA (13 er in 15.2 ip) and .284 (19 for 67) opponents average on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Did not allow a hit to a left-handed hitter over his first four starts...then surrendered two home runs to David Ortiz in his last start...lefties are 2 for 17 (.118) against him this year while right-handers are batting .232 (23 for 99)...allowed three home runs in last start after yielding just one over his first four starts (27.0 ip)...three of the four home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are batting .172 (5 for 29) when leading off an inning.

FIRST START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...matched his career high with three walks...all three hits were doubles but no one advanced past second base...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle April 14...struck out a career-high five batters in 6.0 innings...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first five innings but that was a solo home run by Montero in the second inning...then allowed three runs in the sixth on a bases loaded walk by Smoak and a two-run double by Montero...Noesi and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win at Los Angeles April 19...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first three innings before allowing his only two runs in the fourth...Pujols doubled and scored on a Wells double...Wells scored on a Trumbo single...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

FOURTH START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...matched his career-high with five strikeouts...did not allow a hit until Ramirez singled to lead off the fifth...did not allow a runner past first base and faced just two batters over the minimum as he was aided by two double plays and a caught stealing...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-6 loss at Boston last Monday...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying eight hits, including a career-high three home runs...matched his best with five strikeouts...allowed four runs in the second inning, including a lead-off home run to Ortiz and RBI singles by Byrd and Aviles...McDonald hit a two-run home run in the third and Ortiz added a solo shot in the fifth.

MILONE vs. TAMPA BAY: Is making his first career appearance and start.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-1 with a 4.91 ERA in five appearances, four starts...that does not include two starts and wins in exhibition games...faced Yomiuri in Japan March 25 (5.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so) and tossed 6.0 perfect innings at Sacramento March 31 (6 so)...issued just one walk in 14.2 innings and none in 11.0 innings in the two exhibition games...his only relief appearance came in his first outing March 2 against Seattle.

TRADE: Was acquired from the Washington Nationals with A.J. Cole, Derek Norris and Brad Peacock for Gio Gonzalez and Rob Gilliam, December 23, 2011.

2011 RECAP: Spent the entire season at Triple-A Syracuse before being called up by Washington in September to make his Major League debut...went 1-0 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts for the Nationals...walked just four batters in 26.0 innings (1.38 per nine innings)...allowed a .283 opponents batting average, which included a .281 (25 for 89) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .300 (3 for 10) against lefthanders...held the opposition to a .208 average with runners in scoring position...yielded a .385 batting average and .429 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .175 the first time through the lineup, .293 the second time through and .500 after that...was rated as the A's third-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade

SYRACUSE: Was 12-6 with a 3.22 ERA in 24 starts in his Triple-A debut with Syracuse...was named to the *Baseball America* Triple-A All-Star team...ranked second in the International League in strikeouts (155), tied for third in wins and was sixth in ERA...averaged 0.97 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest among IL starters...also ranked second in strikeouts per nine innings (9.40) and fourth in opponents batting average (.241)...walked just 16 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 9.69...his opponents batting average included a .230 (28 for 122) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (109 for 446) against right-handers...allowed a .216 average to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .209 with runners in scoring position and two outs...allowed just three first inning runs for a 0.75 ERA.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Went 37-22 with a 3.05 ERA in 91 games, 86 starts, over four seasons in the minors in the Washington Nationals farm system...struck out 465 batters and walked just 84 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.54...was named the Nationals' Minor League Pitcher of the Year after going 12-5 with a 2.85 ERA in 27 starts with Double-A Harrisburg in 2010.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (1-0, 1.38 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and fourth of his career...has allowed one run or fewer in each of the first three starts of his career and has tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of his three outings...is just the second pitcher since 1990 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of five or more innings and one run or fewer...the other is Rich Harden, who did it for the A's from July 21 to 31, 2003...since 1918, no pitcher has begun his career with four consecutive outings of five innings or more and one run or fewer...earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston Tuesday...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning and tossed 6.2 innings...will be making his first career appearance against Toronto.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

4-2, 2.71 ERA (83.0 ip, 61 h, 28 r, 25 er, 36 bb, 64 so, 8 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 9/12 (75.0%)

The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in 11.2 innings over the past two games after allowing one or more runs in each of the previous five games (7.50 ERA, 12.0 ip)...has a 2.71 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League, and has a .210 opponents batting average, which ranks third...is tied for the third most walks (36) and has recorded the fifth fewest strikeouts (64)...ranks second in opponents grounded into double plays (10)...has allowed 11 of 33 (33.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.

- Recorded the 17th save of his career last night, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Is 0-1 with two saves, two blown saves and a 16.20 ERA (6 er in 3.1 ip) over his last five games after yielding just one run over his first 10 contests (0.82 ERA, 11.0 ip).
- His seven saves are tied for fourth most in the American League but his two blown saves are tied for the league lead...is also tied for second in games pitched (15).
- Has allowed a .212 opponents batting average...including .133 (4 for 30) against left-handers and .318 (7 for 22) against right-handers.
- Had a blown save in four appearances against Tampa Bay last year (4.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 so, 1 hr, 4.50 ERA)...spent parts of four seasons with the Rays from 2007-10 before signing with the A's as a free agent, Jan. 19, 2011.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).

- Has allowed just three hits this season...his .070 opponents batting average is the lowest among AL relievers and second lowest in the majors (Choate, MIA .043)...left-handed hitters are 1 for 23 (.043) and right-handers are 2 for 20 (.100).
- First batters faced are 0 for 9 and the at bats are tied for second most among AL relievers that have not allowed a first batter hit (Dotel, DET 10).
- Faced Tampa Bay for the first time in his career last night.
