#### A's vs. TIGERS

This is the first of seven meetings between the two clubs this year...the A's split the season series last year, 5-5...went 4-4 in Oakland and 1-1 in Detroit...have won two season series over the last six years, lost two and split two...are 28-25 (.528) against Detroit since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 236-228 against the Tigers...that includes 132-101 in Oakland, 102-125 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 904-981 against the Tigers.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Grant Balfour** recorded the 17<sup>th</sup> save of his career last Saturday night, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.

Ryan Cook has not allowed a run and his 15.2 innings pitched are tied for the most among Major League relievers that have not allowed a run...has a 16.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year.

Josh Reddick ranks second among American League outfielders with four assists.

Jemile Weeks stole his seventh base of the season yesterday, which is tied for second in the American League...four of the steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1992** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Mike Bordick all homer in the sixth inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York...in **1996** Ernie Young hits three home runs in the A's 15-5 win over Minnesota to tie an Oakland record...he adds a single and drives in six runs...Young, Geronimo Berroa and Brent Gates all homer in the fifth inning to tie an Oakland record...in **2007** Dan Johnson is a perfect 4 for 4 with two home runs, four RBI, four runs scored and two walks and Jack Cust also homers twice as the A's hit six home runs to defeat Kansas City, 17-3.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their season-high tying three-game winning streak snapped yesterday...are now 5-2 in May, which is tied with Baltimore for the best record in the American League and second best in the majors (Miami, 8-1)...are 12-8 over the last 20 games after starting the season 4-7...are 16-15 after 31 games for the third consecutive year...remain in second place in the American League West for the ninth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 4½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 14 days in second, eight days tied for second, six days in third and seven days in fourth...split the two-game series with Toronto after winning back-to-back series at Boston and Tampa Bay last week for the first time this year.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's stole two bases yesterday and have 30 for the season, which is the **most in the American League** and second most in the majors (Miami, 34)...both of the steals yesterday came on a double steal in the first inning, the A's fourth double steal of the season...had just three double steals all last year...nine of the A's steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors...have a stolen base percentage of 81.1% (7 cs), which ranks second in the AL...A's opponents have been caught stealing 11 times, which ranks second in the AL (KC, 12)...the opponents stolen base percentage of 56.0% (14 for 25) is second lowest in the AL (CHI, 41.2%).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 54 runs in the last 10 games (53 er in 89.1 ip, 5.34 ERA) after yielding just 25 runs over the previous 10 contests (2.08 ERA)...now have a 3.52 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...are **tied for the Major League lead** in shutouts (4)...have the second fewest strikeouts in the AL (178) and are tied for the third fewest hit batsmen (8)...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last five games (nine home runs total)...A's starting pitchers have allowed 41 runs in the last 10 games (40 er in 56.1 ip, 6.39 ERA) after yielding just 16 runs over the previous 10 contests (2.18 ERA)...have allowed 10 home runs over the past eight games.

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.215), second to last in slugging percentage (.336) and batting with runners in scoring position (.208) and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.290)...have scored 106 runs, which is second fewest in the American League (106), and have been shutout four times, which is tied for second most...are tied for the AL lead in hit by pitches (14) and have the fewest grounded into double plays (13)...have not scored a run in the first inning at home this year, a streak of 15 consecutive games...have not had a longer streak since June 4-July 13, 1998 when they had an 18-game streak...had their Oakland-record streak of 45 consecutive games with seven runs or fewer snapped on Sunday at Tampa Bay when they scored nine runs.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have a season-high five-game errorless streak...have committed just one error in the last seven games after making 18 over the first 24 contests...have 19 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is **tied for the most in the AL** (Kansas City)...last year, the A's had 21 outfield assists the entire season.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Toronto (1-1) and Detroit (four games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Chicago (2-1) and are 7-8 at home for the season...leave for a seven-game road trip to Los Angeles (two games), Texas (two games) and San Francisco (three games) following the game Sunday...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 9-7 on the road...have a 2.88 ERA (46 er in 143.2 ip) at home compared to 4.17 (65 er in 140.1 ip) on the road...last year, the A's went 43-38 (.531) in Oakland compared to 31-50 (.383) on the road...posted a winning record at home for the second consecutive season but finished with a losing mark on the road for the fifth consecutive season.

WALK-OFF WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their third "walk-off" win of the season Tuesday night, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning...Brandon Inge won the game with a grand slam, the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008)...the A's are now 6-2 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 5-2 in the last at bat...the five last at bat wins are tied second most in the American League (Baltimore, 7)...are 3-1 in extra inning games and the four extra inning games are third most in the AL...were 8-11 in extra inning games last year and are 18-29 (.383) over the last four years...are 4-2 in one-run games, which is the third best record in the American League...had the third worst one-run record last year (20-25)...are 9-4 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 7-11 in all other games.

**PLAYERS USED:** Last Friday night, Michael Taylor became the 35<sup>th</sup> player to appear in a game for the A's this year...that is second most in the majors to Boston (36)...12 of those 35 are rookies, which is also the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Figueroa, Miller, Milone, Parker, Recker, Taylor).

**DAY GAMES:** The A's have played just seven day games, which is the fewest in the majors...are 4-3 in day games compared to 12-12 at night...last year, the A's were 32-31 during the day and 42-57 at night...had the second worst record under the lights in the American League.

**IN APRIL:** The A's finished April with a 10-12 record, marking the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last nine years the A's have not posted a winning record in April...batted a Major League low .211 in April, which was the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.210, April of 1979)...had the second lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.284) and averaged the second fewest runs scored (3.09).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list six times and currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Crisp, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments and his teams are 201-157 (.561) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in five of his seven starts and allowed two runs or fewer five times.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 2-1 with a 1.78 ERA (7 er in 35.1 ip) over his last five starts...received no run support in the

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in starts (7), tied for seventh in innings pitched (47.2) and ranks eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.263)...averages 13.8 pitches per inning, which is the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked one batter or fewer in five of his seven starts and has issued just six eight passes for the season...is averaging 1.51 walks per nine innings, which ranks sixth in the American League...has issued all eight of his walks to left-handed hitters...walked three batters April 23, snapping a streak of 18 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer dating back to July 14 of last year...that was the second longest streak of his career (19, September 15, 2005 to May 12, 2007).

THE FOURTH INNING: Has allowed nine of his 15 runs this year in the fourth inning (7.0 ip, 11.57 ERA)...has a 1.33 ERA (6 er in 40.2 ip) in all other innings...including 0.86 (2 er in 21.0 ip) with a .151 (11 for 73) opponents batting average over the first three innings.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three home runs in his last start, his most in a start since June 7, 2009 against Cleveland when he vielded four...all three of the home runs were solo shots...each of his six home runs this year and 33 of his 40 over his last three seasons have come with the bases empty...five have been hit by left-handed hitters as have 30 of his 40 over his last three years...five have been hit by a batter leading off a innina.

HOME AND AWAY: IS 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (5 er in 28.1 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts at home...his road ERA is fourth lowest in the American League...over the last two years, he is 6-5 with a 3.01 ERA (40 er in 119.2 ip) in 20 games on the road compared to 5-7 with a 4.68 ERA (48 er in 92.1 ip) in 16 games in his home ballparks.

**ACTIVE LEADERS:** Ranks sixth among active pitchers in complete games (32), seventh in wins (164), tied for seventh in shutouts (9), ninth in strikeouts (1770) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in innings pitched (2288.2).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 164 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (358), innings pitched (2288.2) and strikeouts (1770).

38 YEARS OLD: His first start on March 29 against Seattle came at the age of 38 years, 310 days, making him the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti, who was 41 years, 275 days when he made his last start for Oakland on June 2, 1999...over the previous four seasons, the only Oakland pitcher 33 years or older to start a game was Brett Tomko, who made six starts in 2009 at the age of 36...Colón will turn 39 on May 24...only four pitchers in Oakland history have started a game at age 39 or older (Tommy John 42, Candiotti 41, Don Sutton 40, Jim Perry 39).

2012 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Seattle in Tokyo March 29...retired each of the first 13 batters before Montero singled with one out in the fifth inning...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first six innings before Smoak homered to lead off the seventh inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss to Seattle April 7 in Oakland ... yielded seven earned runs, which were his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...allowed a run in the first and then surrendered six runs on seven hits in the fourth inning...combined with Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Seattle April 13 ... tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three hits while walking one ... allowed just one base runner as far as third base and retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...the start was his third consecutive start against Seattle...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation...combined with De Los Santos on a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18 ... tossed eight innings and allowed all four of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base until Aybar doubled and went to third on a ground out in the eighth inning...three 38 consecutive strikes at one point, the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss to Chicago April 23 in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 18.1 innings...that fell 1.2 innings short of his career high of 20.0...then allowed back-to-back home runs to Dunn and Konerko to the start the fourth inning, the only runs he would allow in 7.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Baltimore April 29...shutout the Orioles on five hits and a walk over the first eight innings and took a 2-0 lead into the ninth...left with runners on second and third and one out...was relieved by Balfour who allowed a Wieters two-run double for the blown save and a Betemit three-run home run for the loss.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 4-3, 12-inning win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Johnson to lead off the bottom of the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth to make the score 3-1 but he allowed a lead off home run to Zobrist in the fourth and a lead off home run to Pena in the fifth.

COLÓN vs. DETROIT: Is 8-9 with a 5.25 ERA (142.1 ip, 176 h, 88 r, 83 er, 49 bb, 133 so, 20 hr) in 24 career appearances, including 23 starts...is 0-6 with a 6.93 ERA (47 er in 61.0 ip) over his last 11 games, 10 starts...has not defeated the Tigers since April 13, 2003...is 4-4 with a 4.91 ERA (36 er in 66.0 ip) in 11 games, 10 starts, in his home ballparks, 4-4 with a 5.76 ERA (45 er in 70.1 ip) in 12 starts at Comerica Park and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA in one start at Tiger Stadium...was 0-0 with a 5.73 ERA (11.0 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 12 so) in two games, one start, last year...the relief appearance came April 3 at Yankee Stadium in a 10-7 loss (4.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...relieved Phil Hughes to start the fifth inning and allowed a tworun home run to Boesch...also allowed two runs in sixth on a Santiago RBI double and a Boesch sacrifice fly...had a no decision in his start on May 2 at Detroit, a 5-3 Yankees win...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Avila in the second and a Cabrera RBI single in the third...also allowed a solo home run to Avila in the seventh and left after seven innings with the score tied at 3-3.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (6.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 5 so) in two starts this spring (March 5 and 10)...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings...opponents were 7 for 28 (.250)...also pitched in a simulated game March 16 and a minor league game March 21.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (4-2, 4.42 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has allowed at least five runs in each of his last two starts and is 1-1 with a 11.17 ERA (12 er in 9.2 ip) over that span...went 3-1 with a 2.00 ERA over his first four starts...is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (4) and games started (6) and ranks second in innings pitched (36.2)...the wins are tied for fourth among all AL pitchers...is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (16.0 ip) and .122 opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 7.84 ERA and .286 opponents average in four starts on the road...the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's win at Tampa Bay last Sunday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Tigers in his career.

#### **BRETT ANDERSON**

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

#### DARIC BARTON

• Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.

#### JERRY BLEVINS

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

#### DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

#### YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field... doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career... the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.

#### **BARTOLO COLÓN**

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

#### RYAN COOK

• Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).

#### COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

#### FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

#### JOEY DEVINE

Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.

#### JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.

#### **BRIAN FUENTES**

• Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

#### **GRAHAM GODFREY**

Godfrey was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he
was optioned to Sacramento April 21.

#### JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

#### LUKE HUGHES

• Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30.

#### **BRANDON INGE**

Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.

#### **KILA KA'AIHUE**

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

#### **BRANDON MCCARTHY**

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blaton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

#### JIM MILLER

 Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.

#### TOMMY MILONE

 Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

#### JORDAN NORBERTO

• Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

#### JOSH REDDICK

· Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.

#### ADAM ROSALES

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 2.

#### SCOTT SIZEMORE

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

#### SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.

#### ERIC SOGARD

• Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.

#### KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

#### **RICH THOMPSON**

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

#### **NEIL WAGNER**

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.

#### JEMILE WEEKS
