A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 5-2...won the first game in Oakland last night and are 4-2 in Anaheim...have won 11 of the last 15 games in the Coliseum ...won the season series last year, 11-8...it was just their second season series win over the previous eight years (went 10-9 in 2007)...are now 76-83 (.478) against the Angels over the past nine seasons (since 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 381-306 against the Angels...that includes 197-143 in Oakland and 184-163 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 430-383 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has not allowed a run and his 21.2 innings pitched are the most consecutive scoreless innings to start a season by an Athletics pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1918...his 21.2 innings pitched are the most among ML relievers that have not allowed a run.

Josh Reddick hit his 11th home run of the season Sunday, which is tied for sixth in the American League...had 10 home runs in 143 career games entering the season

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1968** Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a major league record with two three-homer games...in **1997** George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the major league record for consecutive pinch hits in an inning...in **2004** Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight but are 3-4 over the last seven games and 6-7 over the last 13 contests...are 22-21 after 43 games for the second consecutive season...remain in second place in the American League West for the 21st consecutive day and trail first place Texas by four games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 26 days in second, eight days tied for second, six days in third and seven days in fourth...lost two of three at San Francisco over the weekend, the A's first series loss since dropping two of three at Baltimore April 27-29...had gone 2-0-4 over the previous six series.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third time in the last six days...are 8-5 in games started by a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League (Baltimore, 6-3)...are 14-16 against right-handers...are batting .224 (94 for 419) against left-handed pitching compared to .213 (219 for 1028) against right-handers.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 6-2 in one-run games with the win last night, which is the third best record in the American League...the eight one-run games are tied for the fewest...went 20-25 in one-run games last year, which was the third worst record...are 12-6 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 10-15 in all other games...are 7-3 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-2 in the last at bat...the six last at bat wins are tied for second most in the AL (Baltimore, 9)...are 4-1 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and third in games and winning percentage (.800)...had a 15-28 record in extra innings over the previous three years...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole two bases yesterday, snapping their season-high streak of five consecutive games without a steal...have 40 stolen bases for the season, which is the most in **the American League** and second most in the majors (Miami, 50)...have five double steals, which is two more than the season total from last year...10 of the A's steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors...have a stolen base percentage of 81.6% (9 cs), which is second best in the AL (Los Angeles, 81.8%)...Jemile Weeks was caught stealing in the first inning last Thursday at Texas, ending the A's streak of 20 consecutive successful stolen base attempts...that was the third longest streak in Oakland history and was two short of the record of 22 (Oct. 2, 1991-April 10, 1992 and July 19-Aug. 1, 1983)...A's opponents have been caught stealing 12 times, which is tied for third most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.54 ERA, which ranks second in the American League...have allowed just four home runs in the last 11 games and have surrendered 34 for the season, which is tied for second fewest...struck out a season-high-tying 12 batters Sunday but have just 253 strikeouts for the season, which is second fewest...A's starting pitchers have a 5.33 ERA (73 er in 123.1 ip) and .292 (146 for 500) opponents batting average over the last 22 games after posting a 2.86 ERA and .242 average over the first 21 contests.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit their 36th home run of the season Sunday in game 42...last year, the A's did not hit their 36th home run until game 67 (number 37 came in game 68)...18 of the A's 36 home runs have come with runners on base (nine two-run, seven three-run, two grand slams)...19 have come with two outs, which is tied for third in the American League...had just 35 two-out home runs all last year.

SHUTOUTS: The A's have been shutout twice in the last seven games and have scored just 20 runs over that span...have been blanked six times for the season, which is second most in the majors to the Angels (8)...have scored just 152 runs, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...the pitching staff has tossed five shutouts, which is tied with the Angels for the **most in the majors**.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .196 (56 for 285) with 26 runs scored over the last nine games...rank last in the majors in batting (.216), second to last in slugging (.343) and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.293)...are last in the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.219)...have struck out 120 times in the last 13 games (9.2 per game) and have fanned 345 times for the season, which is second most in the AL...have grounded into 23 double plays, which is second fewest in the majors...are averaging 4.00 pitches per plate appearances, which is the most in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last four games...have made six errors in the last 17 games after tallying 19 in the first 26 contests...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is tied for the most in the American League with Kansas City and Seattle.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Los Angeles (1-0) and New York (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (1-1) and Detroit (2-2) and are 10-10 at home...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-1), Texas (1-1) and San Francisco (1-2) and are 12-11 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 2.96 ERA (62 er in 188.2 ip) at home compared to 4.09 (91 er in 200.1 ip) on the road.

PLAYERS USED: Friday night, Travis Blackley became the 36th different player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is second most in the American League to Boston (38)...he is the fourth Australian (Grant Balfour, Luke Hughes, Rich Thompson)...the A's were already the first team in Major League history with three Australian born players...12 of the 36 are rookies, which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Godfrey, Miller, Milone, Parker, Recker).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times and currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Céspedes, Devine, Inge, McCarthy, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...the A's have lost each of his three starting assignments this year and are 2-5 (.286) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in one of his three starts allowed two runs or fewer once and

starts, allowed two runs or fewer once and walked two batters or fewer twice.

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the four spot in the starting rotation...lost each of his three starts (5.06 ERA) before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 21...went 3-0 with a 1.21 ERA in five starts with the River Cats before being recalled by the A's today.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Won the first decision of his career in his second start June 17, 2011...is 0-5 with a 4.25 ERA (29.2 ip, 32 h, 18 r, 14 er, 10 bb, 15 so) in six games, five starts, since then...has received no run support in three of those five starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Kansas City April 10 in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed two runs, both in the fourth inning...Moustakas had a RBI double and Quintero delivered a sacrifice fly...the A's were shutout on one hit by Duffy and Crow, in a game that was called because of rain in the top of the eighth inning with two outs.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle April 15...allowed a career-high tying five runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a two-run home runs to Ryan in the second and a solo home run to Smoak in the third...the A's tied the game with a three-run fifth inning but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth for the loss...Suzuki had a RBI double and Smoak an RBI ground out.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Cleveland April 20 in Oakland...issued a career-high five walks in 5.0 innings...allowed a sacrifice fly to Hannahan in the second inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...then allowed a two-run double to Hannahan in the fourth and a RBI single to Choo in the fifth.

GODFREY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 3-0 with a 1.21 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Sacramento...walked just five batters in 29.2 innings (1.52 per nine innings) and surrendered just one home run...allowed a .255 opponents batting average, which broke down to .109 (6 for 55) against right-handed hitters and .400 (22 for 55) against left-handers...opponents hit .071

(1 for 14) with runners in scoring position...tossed at least six innings in four of his starts, allowed one run or fewer four times and walked one batter or fewer four times...the River Cats were 4-1 in his starting assignments.

MORE SACRAMENTO: Won each of his first three starts with the River Cats, posting a 0.45 ERA...allowed his only earned run over that stretch in his first start April 26 against Tucson when he struck out a season-high seven batters in 7.0 innings...allowed a season-high 10 hits in 7.0 innings May 6 at Tucson but did not allow a run...allowed three of his five runs in one start, May 12 against Iowa...left with the scored tied at 3-3 and Sacramento scored once in the bottom of the ninth for a 4-3 win.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: Tossed just 3.2 shutout innings in his final start last Friday at Albuquerque, a 9-8 Sacramento loss in 10 innings...was removed early in preparation for a possible call-up to Oakland...tossed 48 pitches.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (17.2 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 6 bb, 13 so) in six appearances, including four starts...led the A's in innings pitched (17.2) and strikeouts (13)...went 1-2 with a 3.95 ERA (6 er in 13.2 ip) in his four starts and 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (4 er in 4.0 ip) in two relief appearances...posted a 9.00 ERA over his first three games and a 3.09 ERA over his final three outings.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut in 2011 and was 1-2 with a 3.96 ERA in five games, four starts, over three stints with the A's...walked just five batters in 25.0 innings (1.80 walks per nine innings)...allowed a .305 batting average, which included a .267 mark against left-handed hitters and .356 against right-handers...allowed seven of his 10 extra-base hits to righties for a .600 slugging percentage...allowed a .222 average with runners in scoring position...had a .381 opponents average and all three of his home runs the first time through the lineup, .254 after that...was 1-2 with a 4.71 ERA in his four starting assignments...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his only relief appearance...began the minor league season at Double-A Midland and made one start, a no decision in a 10-2 win over Arkansas April 7...allowed two unearned runs in 4.0 innings and struck out six...was promoted to Sacramento April 12 and went 14-3 with a 2.68 ERA in 19 games, 18 starts with the River Cats...led the Pacific Coast League and tied for fifth in all of minor league baseball in wins...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his ERA would have been second best in the PCL...combined for a 2.59 ERA with Sacramento and Midland, which was the lowest ERA in the A's farm system...also led the A's farm system in wins (14)...his wins were a career-high and his ERA was the lowest of his career...was named the A's Organizational Pitcher of the Year and was also named to the Baseball America Triple-A All-Star Team...led Sacramento in wins and ranked second in strikeouts (89)...allowed just six home runs in 107.1 innings, an average of 0.50 per nine innings...allowed a .227 opponents batting average, which included a .223 mark against left-handed hitters and .230 against right-handers...held the opposition to a .198 batting average when leading off an inning and .146 with runners in scoring position and two outs...four of the six home runs he allowed were solo shots...went 0-1 with a 5.73 ERA and .340 opponents batting average in two postseason starts for Sacramento (11.0 ip, 16 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 4 so, 2 hr)...made four starts for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 1-0 with a 3.31 ERA.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 43-34 with a 3.99 ERA (300 er in 676.2 ip) in 134 games, 117 starts, in six minor league seasons...including 17-3 with a 2.30 ERA (36 er in 141.0 ip) in 25 games, 24 starts, over the last two seasons...was a Texas League Midseason and Postseason All-Star at Midland in 2009...was a member of league champions at Midland in 2009 and Stockton (California League) in 2008...was originally drafted by Toronto in the 34th round of the 2006 draft...was traded to the Oakland organization in the Marco Scutaro deal following the 2007 season.

RHP Jarrod Parker (1-2, 3.90 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...allowed six runs in 2.0 innings in his last start, an 8-6 A's loss at San Francisco last Friday (2.0 ip, 4 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 0 so)...allowed six runs total over the first five starts of his career (31.1 ip, 1.72 ERA)...has walked at least four batters in each of his last three starts (13 bb in 14.2 ip)...has now issued 17 walks while striking out 18 in 33.1 innings for the season (4.59 walks per nine innings)...opponents are 5 for 28 (.179) with two walks (.233 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .190 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .125 with RISP and two outs...has never faced the Angels in his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 after going 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts with the River Cats.

• Was the A's Opening Day starter at first base March 28 but went for 7 with five strikeouts in three games before he was designated for assignment April 9...was claimed off waivers by the Tampa Bay Rays April 19.

BRETT ANDERSON

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

DARIC BARTON

• Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.

JERRY BLEVINS

• Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field... doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career... the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

RYAN COOK

• Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

JOEY DEVINE

Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).

BRIAN FUENTES

• Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

GRAHAM GODFREY

Godfrey was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he
was optioned to Sacramento April 21.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

LUKE HUGHES

• Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blaton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

• Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.

TOMMY MILONE

 Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

JORDAN NORBERTO

 Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).

ADAM ROSALES

• Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was optioned to Sacramento April 2.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.

ERIC SOGARD

• Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

 Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.

JEMILE WEEKS

 Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span... since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
