AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will begin a three-game series at Oakland tonight...kicks off a nine-game road trip that also includes stops at Los Angeles-AL (Mon-Wed) and Detroit (6/1-3), with each team entering play today at or below .500...marks the Yankees' longest trip prior to the All-Star break...just concluded a 3-3 homestand vs. Cincinnati (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1).

- ▶ Have won two straight games for the first time since three wins in-a-row from 5/10-12...are 3-6 in their last nine games and 9-8 in their last 17 contests...have gone 22-18 since 4/9, after starting the season 0-3.
- ▶ Tonight begins a stretch in which the Yankees will play 15 of their next 21 games--and 18 of their next 27 contests--on the road...are looking to snap their current season high-tying three-game road losing streak.

WEDNESDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees won their second straight game with an 8-3 win vs. Kansas City...scored a season-high-tying three first-inning runs (fifth time)...Yankees 1-4 hitters were a combined 7-for-15 (.467) with 7R, 1 double, 3HR and 5RBI...**3B Alex Rodriguez** (2-for-4) recorded his 60th career multi-HR game and first since 5/17/11 at Tampa Bay...**CF Curtis Granderson** (2-for-4) started the scoring with a first-inning homer, his team-leading 14th...**SS Derek Jeter** (3-for-5) tied Paul Waner (3,152) for 15th place on Baseball's all-time hits list...**LHP Andy Pettitte** (7.0IP, 7H, 2ER, 1BB, 8K, 2HR) earned his 242nd career win, surpassing Herb Pennock (241) for sole possession of 52nd place on Baseball's all-time list.

ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: The Yankees have won six straight games at Oakland's O.co Coliseum dating back to 7/5/10, their longest such streak since the opening of the Coliseum in 1968...have also won 10 of their last 11 games at Oakland and are 21-9 there since the start of 2004.

GOING LONG: **3B Alex Rodriguez** (2-for-4) recorded his 60th career multi-HR game (56th two-HR contest) in Wednesday's win vs. Kansas City, and first since 5/17/11 at Tampa Bay (also 2HR)...his 60 career multi-HR games rank seventh all-time, two behind Hank Aaron (62) for sixth most all time.

- ▶ Was his eighth career multi-HR game vs. Kansas City (first since 3HR on 8/14/10 at Kauffman Stadium) and came just over 16 years since his first career multi-HR contest (also vs. Kansas City on 5/12/96).
- ▶ Snapped a 52AB homerless stretch with his first-inning home run (dating back to 5/6 at Kansas City)...had just 2HR over his previous 103AB.

ROADIE: **RHP Ivan Nova** is undefeated in his last 11 road starts dating back to 6/20/11, going 8-0 with a 3.30 ERA (71.0IP, 26ER) over the stretch...is two wins shy of the longest road winning streak by a Yankees pitcher since 1995 (Roger Clemens, 10, 5/26-9/19/01, and Andy Pettitte, 10, over two stints with the Yankees 6/20/03-5/3/07).

NEW BLOOD: The Yankees will face LHP Tommy Milone on Sunday, a pitcher they have never faced before...will be the ninth such pitcher the Yankees have opposed this season and fourth over a 10-game span from 5/17-27...overall this season, the Yankees have gone 4-4 in games when facing a starter they have never seen before, with those pitchers combining for a 4.37 ERA (45.1IP, 22ER).

FAMILIAR FACE: Saturday's Oakland starter RHP Bartolo Colon is the third starter the Yankees will face this season who used to pitch for the team: also Carl Pavano and Hector Noesi...the Yankees have scored at least 5R in each of their last five games against Colon and lost just three times in their last nine games in which he was the opposing starter (since 2001).

COMBINED GRAND: With **SS Derek Jeter** (on 5/3/12) and **3B Alex Rodriguez** (on 5/21/12) each reaching 500 career doubles this season, the pair have become the 10th set of teammates to each have at least 500 career doubles, and first since Los Angeles-NL in 2010 (Garret Anderson and Manny Ramirez) - credit: *Elias Sports Bureau*.

CAPTAIN'S LOG: **SS Derek Jeter** leads the AL in hits (64), trailing only San Francisco's Melky Cabrera (67) for most in the Majors...is tied for sixth in the Majors with 18 multi-hit games and eighth with a .348 batting average...owns the Major's highest batting average vs. left-handed pitchers (.510, 25-for-49)...has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games and 36 of 43 contests overall in 2012...has 5HRs in 2012 after hitting just 6HR in all of 2011...collected

his seventh game with at least 3H this season in Wednesday's win vs. Kansas City...had 12 such games all of last year.

CANOTABLE: **2B Robinson Cano** has hit safely in 17 of his last 21 games since 5/2, batting .346 (27-for-78) with 12R, 8 doubles, 4HR and 14RBI over the stretch...has raised his season average more than 40 points from .255 over the stretch.

- ▶ His 16 doubles are most in the AL and trail only Cincinnati's Joey Votto (17) among all Major Leaguers...owns the most doubles (302) in the Majors since his ML debut on 5/3/2005 (Miguel Cabrera is second with 294).

JAMMED WHEN JAMMED: The Yankees are batting .178 (8-for-45) with the bases loaded this season, the 12th-lowest average in the AL...have just 1H in their last 25 plate appearances with the bases loaded and 2H in their last 31PA, going 2-for-26 with 4BB and 1SF...hit an AL-high .337 (55-for-163) with the bags full last season and a Major League-high .344 (64-for-186) in 2010.

IF I RAULED THE WORLD: **OF/DH Raul Ibanez** is tied for the team lead with 27RBI this season (also Nick Swisher)...has come on 31H...his 15RBI in May are the most by a Yankee this month.

- ▶ Six of Ibanez's last 13H have been home runs...of his nine total homers in 2012, six have come in the sixth inning or later, and four have given the Yankees the lead.

FANDEMONIUM: Yankees pitchers have combined to strike out 370 batters, fourth-most among all Major League teams behind Washington (379), Philadelphia (373) and Detroit (371).

THE GRANDY MAN CAN EVERY DAY

CF Curtis Granderson has played in all 390.1 innings the Yankees have played this season, all in centerfield...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, is one of seven players in the Majors to appear in the field for every one his team's innings played thus far in 2012: also Seattle's Ichiro Suzuki, Baltimore's Adam Jones, Atlanta's Dan Uggla, Philadelphia's Shane Victorino, the Cubs' Starlin Castro and Cincinnati's Joey Votto.

SABATHIA'S SELECTION: Yankees LHP CC Sabathia is scheduled to be the team's representative at the first round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft on Monday, 6/4...the Yankees will have the 30th overall selection in the Draft, which will begin live on MLB Network and MLB.com at 7:00 p.m.

DUCKS ON THE POND: The Yankees own 9H in their last 85AB with runners in scoring position since 5/13...had a streak of 18 straight hitless at-bats with RISP come to an end with Dewayne Wise's bunt single in the fifth inning of Tuesday's win vs. Kansas City...went 0-for-13 with RISP in Monday's loss vs. Kansas City, their most at-bats with RISP without a hit in a nine-inning game since 1974...snapped a stretch of 22 consecutive hitless at-bats with RISP when Swisher singled in a run in the ninth inning of Saturday's loss vs. Cincinnati...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, marked the 10th straight year (2003-12) the Yankees have endured a stretch of 20-or-more consecutive hitless at-bats with runners in scoring position.

15 AND CLIMBING: SS Derek Jeter has 3,152 career hits, tied for 15th place all time with Hall of Famer Paul Waner, who is the only player in Major League history with as many hits as Jeter and who also played for the Yankees... nicknamed "Big Poison," Waner had 3,152 career hits -- of which just one was with the Yankees (9/1/44 vs. Washington in first AB with the club)...Waner played in 10 combined games for the Yankees during the war years of 1944-45, going 1-for-7 in 10 plate appearances.

BOMB SQUAD: The Yankees have hit 65 home runs this season, second-most in the Majors behind Baltimore (69)...are 23-11 when hitting at least 1HR and 0-10 when failing to hit a home run...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, are the only team in the Majors who have not won a game in which they have not homered, and marks the longest such losing streak to start a season in franchise history (prev. high was 0-8 to begin 2007).

▶ On the flip side, Yankees pitchers have allowed 57HR this season, second-most in the Majors behind Minnesota (66), including 21 combined homers over their last 13 games...Yankees starters have surrendered 47HR, second-most behind the Twins (49).

GREEN LIGHT, GO: The Yankees have been successful in 10 of their last 11 stolen base attempts and have been successful in 23 of 29 SB attempts (79.3%)--third-highest in the AL overall in 2012...had their streak of eight straight SB come to end when Jayson Nix was caught stealing second base in the third inning of Saturday's loss vs. Cincinnati...**3B Alex Rodriguez** is 5-for-5 in SB attempts, his most SB in a season since 2009 (14)...has successfully stolen his last nine bases (dating back to last year) without being caught.

GRANDISHING: CF Curtis Granderson owns a team-high 14HR this season, trailing only Texas' Josh Hamilton (18HR) for most in the AL...his 55HR over the last two years (2011-12) are tied with Jose Bautista for most in the Majors.

- ▶ Has 21HR off LHPs since the start of 2011, marking the most by any left-handed hitter off LHP in the Majors over the stretch...has 5HR off LHP in 2012.
- ▶ Has reached base safely (H, BB or HP) in 40 of 44 games in 2012...had a career-high 28-game streak of reaching safely from 4/7-5/8.
- ▶ Has hit 11 of his home runs at Yankee Stadium this season.

BACKUP SANDMAN: With RHP Mariano Rivera and RHP David Robertson on the disabled list, RHP Rafael Soriano has been anointed the club's closer...Soriano is 93-for-113 in career save opportunities, including 3-for-3 this season...his 45 saves with Tampa Bay in 2010 led the American League...has converted all five save opportunities with the Yankees that have occurred in the ninth inning or later, combining to allow just 1ER in 4.2IP (3H, 2K, 1BB).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Yankees rank third in the Majors with a .988 fielding percentage in 2012...their 19E this season are third-fewest among all teams (trailing Boston and Seattle, 18E each)...since Joe Girardi took over as manager in 2008, the Yankees have combined for a .986 fielding pct. in his four-plus years at the helm, tops in the AL over the stretch and second in the Majors behind only Philadelphia (.987).

NYY ALL-TIME RECORD vs. OAKLAND: 261-221 (.541)

NYY ALL TIME at OAKLAND (O.co Coliseum): 118-120 (.496)

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will begin a three-game series at Oakland tonight, in the first of 10 meetings between the clubs in 2012...will travel back to Oakland from 7/19-22 and will welcome the A's to Yankee Stadium from 9/21-23...have won 27 of their 34 games between these two teams since the start of the 2008 season, including a 13-3 mark in the last 16 matchups...established their longest-ever winning streak vs. the A's with 11 straight victories from 7/5/10-7/22/11...in 2011, went 6-3 to win their fourth straight season series against Oakland.

AT O.co COLISEUM: The Yankees are making their first of two trips to Oakland this season for a three-game series...will return for a four-game set from 7/19-22...swept the A's in their only visit to O.co Coliseum last year (3-0)...are 21-9 (.700) at the A's since the start of the 2004 season, marking the highest winning percentage by any AL team in Oakland over the span...have recorded four straight winning road season series at the A's and 10 in the last 14 years (since 1998).

BACK IN THE BAY: INF Eric Chavez was selected by Oakland in the first round (10th overall) of the 1996 First-Year Player Draft...played 13 years with the A's organization, batting .267 (1,276-for-4,783) with 730R, 282 doubles, 230HR and 787RBI...left the Athletics after the 2010 season ranked in the top 10 in nearly every offensive category since the team's relocation to Oakland prior to the 1968 season...**RF Nick Swisher** was also a first-round pick by the A's (16th overall) in the 2002 First-Year Player Draft...played four years at the Major League level with the A's, batting .251 (406-for-1,617) with 267R, 96 doubles, 80HR and 255RBI.

SATURDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER at OAKLAND: LHP CC SABATHIA (5-2, 3.78)

LHP CC Sabathia, 31 from nearby Vallejo, Calif., will make his 10th start of the season on Saturday vs. the Oakland Athletics at the O.co Coliseum...will be his 23rd career start vs. Oakland...**last started** on 5/20 vs. Cincinnati and recorded the loss, allowing 3ER in 7.0IP (6H, 5BB, 6K, 2HR, 1HP)...held the Reds hitless through their first 15 batters of the game (13 outs, 1BB, 1HP), before allowing a one-out fifth-inning single to Todd Frazier...is in the fourth year of an eight-year contract (with a vesting option for 2017) re-signed with the Yankees on 10/31/11.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 7-8 with a 4.96 ERA (138.0IP, 76ER) in 22 career starts vs. Oakland, one of four Major League teams he has a sub-.500 record against (also 7-9 vs. Boston, 6-8 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 1-8 vs. the Yankees)...his career ERA vs. Oakland (4.96) is his second-highest vs. any AL club (6.16 ERA vs. the Yankees).
 ✦ Is 5-1 with a 2.63 ERA (61.2IP, 18ER) in his last eight starts against Oakland dating back to 5/14/08, with his team going 6-2 in those outings.

WORKHORSE: According to *Elias*, has thrown at least 100 pitches in each of his last 17-regular season starts, the third-highest active streak in the Majors behind Detroit's Justin Verlander (62 starts) and James Shields (21 starts).

SABATHIA vs. OAKLAND

✦ **Last start vs. Oakland:** on 8/24/11 at Yankee Stadium, recording a no-decision in the 6-4 Yankees' defeat (7.1IP, 7H, 3ER, 1BB, 7K, 1HR)... marked his 350th career start at age 31 yrs, 34 days, making him the youngest pitcher to reach the milestone since Vida Blue in 1980 (31 yrs, 5 days) credit: *Elias*.

RHP Ivan Nova, 25, will make his ninth start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...will be his first career start vs. Oakland...**last started** on 5/19 vs. Cincinnati and recorded the loss in the 6-5 Yankees' defeat, allowing 5ER in 6.0IP (7H, 2BB, 12K, 1HR, 1HP)...has now allowed 5ER or more in four of his last five starts...fell to 2-1 with a 3.98 ERA (31.2IP, 14ER) in five career Interleague outings...was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 7/15/04.

PUNCH-OUT: Recorded 12K in his last start on 5/19 vs. Cincinnati, marking a career-high and the most by a Yankee since CC Sabathia on 7/26/11 vs. Seattle (14K)...10 of his 12K came on swinging third strikes...each of his first seven outs-and eight of his nine- came via strikeout.

- Became the first Yankee since Don Brennan on 5/19/33 vs. the St. Louis Browns (8.1IP, 5ER, 12K) to strike out at least 12 batters while also allowing at least 5ER, and the fourth Yankee in the Live Ball Era with at least 12K in 6.0IP or less (also A.J. Burnett and Joba Chamberlain in 2009 and Scott Sanderson in 1991).

EXTRA TROUBLE: Has allowed 35 extra-base hits this season (22 doubles, 3 triples, 10HR), the most among all Major League hurlers...according to *Elias*, has also allowed 10HR over his first 10 starts this season after yielding just 3HR over his last 10 starts in 2011.

STARTING EARLY: According to *Elias*, Nova's 21-5 (.808) record as a starter, over the first 40 starts of his Major League career, was the highest winning percentage for any pitcher over their first 40 career starts since Tim Hudson from 1999-2000 (also 21-5).

- Is 21-1 in 34 career starts in which he has pitched with a lead...the Yankees are 29-5 in those outings (credit: *Elias*).

WE GOT YOUR BACK: *Elias* also notes that the Yankees have not made an error with Nova on the mound this season, spanning a stretch of 49.0 innings.

QUALITY OUTINGS: Three of his first eight starts this season have been "quality starts" (at least 6.0IP, 3ER or fewer)...has registered 20 such outings in 42 career starts, combining to go 15-1 with a 2.24 ERA (136.1IP, 34ER) over the stretch...made 16 quality starts in 2011, lasting 7.0-or-more innings in 10 of those outings and holding his opponent to 1ER or less in seven of those appearances.

SUPER NOVA: With his loss on 5/2 at Baltimore, had his 15-game winning streak dating back to 6/10/11 snapped... posted a 3.61 ERA (129.2IP, 129H, 52ER, 36BB, 94K, 13HR) in 20 starts over the stretch, with the team going 17-3 in those games...marked the Majors' longest winning streak since Jose Contreras won 17 straight games from 8/21/05-7/4/06 with the White Sox.
