May 27, 1933: Trailing the White Sox and their starter (eventual Hall-of-Famer) Ted Lyons, 11-3, going into the bottom of the eighth at Yankee Stadium, the Yankees score 12R in the frame and go on to win, 15-11. The 'rally is capped by a grand slam from catcher Bill Dickey.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 28, 1946: Yankee Stadium hosts its first night game, as a crowd of 49,917 watches the Yankees lose to Washington, 2-1.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the finale of a three-game series at Oakland today...are 2-0 to begin this nine-game road trip that also includes stops at Los Angeles-AL (Mon-Wed) and Detroit (6/1-3), with each of those teams entering play today at or below .500...marks the Yankees' longest trip prior to the All-Star break...just concluded a 3-3 homestand vs. Cincinnati (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1).

- ▶ Have won four straight games, matching their season-high winning streak (also 4/9-13 and 4/19-4/23)...have won five of their last eight gms and are 11-8 in their last 19 gms...have gone 25-18 since 4/9, after starting the season 0-3.
- ▶ At four games over .500, are one game shy of their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Friday began a stretch in which the Yankees will play 15 of their next 21 games--and 18 of their next 27 contests--on the road.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees won their fourth straight game, defeating the A's, 9-2, at O.co Coliseum...hit 3HR, scored their most runs since 5/6 (a 10-2 win at Kansas City) and matched their second-most hits (14) in a game in 2012...**1B Mark Teixeira** (4-for-5) tied his career high in hits, recorded his 36th career multi-homer game (second this season) and drove in five runs...**SS Derek Jeter** (2-for-4) surpassed Paul Waner (3,152H) and tied George Brett (3,154H) for 14th place on Baseball's all-time hits list...**LHP CC Sabathia** won his team-high sixth game, holding the A's to 2ER in 7.0IP (7H, 2BB, 4K, 1HR)

ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: The Yankees have won seven straight games at Oakland's O.co Coliseum dating back to 7/5/10, their longest such streak since the opening of the Coliseum in 1968...have won 11 of their last 12 games at Oakland and are 22-9 there since the start of 2004.

- ▶ Overall, are now 30-11 (.732) against the A's since the start of the 2007 season...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, only one team has a higher winning pct. against one opponent over that span (min.: 40G): Milwaukee vs. Pittsburgh (58-20, .744).

DOUBLE-DOWN: The Yankees have recorded at least 10H in a game 19 times in 2012, tied for fourth-most such games in the AL...their 18 gms of at least 11H are most in the Majors.

SWEEPING SENSATION: The Yankees today are looking to complete their third series sweep of the season - all on the road (also 4/9-11 at Baltimore and 4/20-21 at Boston).

THREE THE EASY WAY: The Yankees have hit 3HR in each of their last three games, marking the second time this season they have hit at least three homers in three straight games (also 4/19-21) and matching their longest such stretch over the last 55 yrs (since 1957, 10th time)...are the first team since the 2008 Rangers to hit at least 3HR in back-to-back games at the Coliseum.

LITTLE LESS COUGH, LITTLE MORE ACTION: **1B Mark Teixeira** has gone 8-for-19 (.421) with 6R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI and 3BB in his last five starts since 5/21...had not started the previous three games from 5/18-20.

GO, GO, CANO: **2B Robinson Cano** has homered in each of his last two games, three of his last four and four of his last eight (4HR total)...hit 3HR total in his first 38 contests.

- ▶ Now has 151 career HR, two shy of tying Joe Gordon for the second-most by a Yankees second baseman (Tony Lazzeri, 169HR, owns the most home runs among those Yankees whose primary position was second base).
- ▶ Hit his 150th career HR in Friday's win at Oakland (in career game No. 1,098)...is the 15th second baseman all time to collect at least 300 doubles and 150HR (fourth left-handed hitter, joining Lou Whitaker, Joe Morgan and Charlie Gehringer)...*Elias* notes he became the sixth player all-time to collect at least 300 doubles and 150HR in under 1,100 games, joining Nomar Garciaparra, Hank Greenberg, Todd Helton, Albert Pujols and Al Simmons.
- ▶ Has hit safely in 19 of his last 23 games since 5/2, batting .337 (31-for-88) with 17R, 9 doubles, 6HR and 16RBI.
- ▶ His 17 doubles in 2012 are the second-most in the Majors behind Cincinnati's Joey Votto (21)...owns the most doubles (305) in the Majors since his ML debut on 5/3/2005 (Miguel Cabrera is second with 295).

CASH FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Fans who would like to spend a game in Brian Cashman's suite can currently bid on the chance by going to www.charitybuzz.com and searching for item #306401...up for auction is six seats in the general manager's suite for a 2012 game at Yankee Stadium (food included) and the chance to meet Yankees GM Brian Cashman...all proceeds from the auction will benefit Covenant House, which Cashman supports

NEW BLOOD: The Yankees will face LHP Tommy Milone today, a pitcher they have never faced before...will be the ninth such pitcher the Yankees have opposed this season and fourth over their last 10 games since 5/17...overall this season, the Yankees have gone 4-4 in games when facing a starter they have never seen before, with those pitchers combining for a 4.37 ERA (45.1IP, 22ER).

ON A HOLIDAY: The Yankees are 22-17 on Memorial Day since 1971 (when the holiday first began to be celebrated on the last Monday in May following the National Holiday Act of 1971)...did not play on Memorial Day in 1973, 2004 or 2005...have won their last three Memorial Day games...this year marks the fifth time the Yankees will face the Angels on Memorial Day (also 1984, '86, '87 and '96), going 2-2 in those games.

- ▶ The Yankees will not play at home on Memorial Day (5/28), July 4 or Labor Day (9/3) in the same season for the first time since 2006.

BOMB SQUAD: The Yankees have hit 71 home runs this season, second-most in the Majors behind Baltimore (72)...are 25-11 when hitting at least 1HR and 0-10 when failing to hit a home run...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, are the only team in the Majors who have not won a game in which they have not homered, and marks the longest such losing streak to start a season in franchise history (prev. high was 0-8 to begin 2007).

- ▶ On the flip side however, Yankees pitchers have allowed 60HR this season, second-most in the Majors behind Minnesota (66), including 24 combined homers over their last 15 games...Yankees starters have surrendered a Major League-most 50HR.

CF Curtis Granderson has played in all 408.1 innings the Yankees have played this season, all in centerfield...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, is one of seven players in the Majors to appear in the field for every one his team's innings played thus far in 2012: also Seattle's Ichiro Suzuki, Baltimore's Adam Jones, Atlanta's Dan Uggla, Philadelphia's Shane Victorino, the Cubs' Starlin Castro and Cincinnati's Joey Votto.

CAPTAIN'S LOG: SS Derek Jeter leads the AL in hits (66), trailing only San Francisco's Melky Cabrera (69) for most in the Majors...is tied for third in the AL with 19 multi-hit games and ranks third with a .342 batting average...owns the Major's highest batting average vs. left-handed pitchers (.490, 25-for-51)...has hit safely in 15 of his last 18 games and 37 of 45 contests overall in 2012...has 5HRs in 2012 after hitting just 6HR in all of 2011...collected his seventh game with at least 3H this season in Wednesday's win vs. Kansas City...had 12 such games all of last year.

JAMMED WHEN JAMMED: The Yankees are batting .170 (8-for-47) with the bases loaded this season, the 26th-lowest such average in the Majors...have just 1H in their last 27 plate appearances with the bases loaded and 2H in their last 33PA, going 2-for-27 with 4BB, 1HP and 1SF...hit an AL-high .337 (55-for-163) with the bags full last season and a Major League-high .344 (64-for-186) in 2010.

FANDEMONIUM: Yankees pitchers have combined to strike out 383 batters this season, the fourth-most K's among all Major League teams behind Washington (398), Detroit (393) and Philadelphia (388).

SABATHIA'S SELECTION: Yankees **LHP CC Sabathia** is scheduled to be the team's representative at the first round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft on Monday, 6/4...the Yankees will have the 30th overall selection in the Draft, which will begin live on MLB Network and MLB.com at 7:00 p.m.

DUCKS ON THE POND: The Yankees own 13H in their last 101AB (.129) with runners in scoring position since 5/13...however, are 7-for-29 (.241), over their last four games, all wins...had a streak of 18 straight hitless at-bats with RISP come to an end with Dewayne Wise's bunt single in the fifth inning of Tuesday's win vs. Kansas City...went 0-for-13 with RISP in Monday's loss vs. Kansas City, their most at-bats with RISP without a hit in a nine-inning game since 1974.

GREEN LIGHT, GO: The Yankees have been successful in 11 of their last 13 stolen base attempts, and have been successful in 24 of 31 SB attempts (77.4%) overall in 2012—fifth-highest in the AL...**3B Alex Rodriguez** is 6-for-6 in SB attempts, his most SB in a season since 2009 (14)...has successfully stolen his last 10 bases (dating back to last year) without being caught.

GRANDISHING: CF Curtis Granderson owns a team-high 14HR this season, tied for fourth-most in the Majors...his 55HR over the last two years (2011-12) are tied with Jose Bautista for most in the Majors.

- ▶ Has 21HR off LHPs since the start of 2011, marking the most by any left-handed hitter off LHP in the Majors over the stretch...has 5HR off LHP in 2012.
- ▶ Has reached base safely (H, BB or HP) in 42 of 46 games in 2012...had a career-high 28-game streak of reaching safely from 4/7-5/8.
- ▶ Has hit 11 of his home runs at Yankee Stadium this season.

BACKUP SANDMAN: With **RHP Mariano Rivera** and **RHP David Robertson** on the disabled list, **RHP Rafael Soriano** has been anointed the club's closer...Soriano is 94-for-114 in career save opportunities, including 4-for-4 this season...his 45 saves with Tampa Bay in 2010 led the American League...has converted all six save opportunities with the Yankees that have occurred in the ninth inning or later, combining to allow just 1ER in 5.2IP (4H, 4K, 1BB).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Yankees have committed the fewest errors (19) among all Major League teams this season...rank third in the Majors with a .989 fielding percentage in 2012...since Joe Girardi took over as manager in 2008, the Yankees have combined for a .986 fielding pct. in his four-plus years at the helm, tops in the AL over the stretch and second in the Majors behind only Philadelphia (.987).

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will begin a three-game series at Los Angeles-AL on Monday, Memorial Day...is the second of three meetings between the teams this season...their 52-59 record vs. the Angels since 2000 is their only losing mark vs. any AL team over the span...in 2011, went 5-4 against the Angels, marking their first winning season series against them since 2003 (6-3)...went 4-4 against Los Angeles-AL in 2010 and 5-5 in 2009 on the heels of five straight losing season series from 2004-08.						
AT ANGEL STADIUM: The Yankees are making their lone trip to Angel Stadium this season with a three-game series starting on Monday...are 7-14 at Angel Stadium since 2008 and have lost 23 of their last 34 games at Angel Stadium since 2005...in 2011, went 3-3 at Los Angeles-AL...in season series play, have had seven straight non-winning season series at Angel Stadium since 2005.						

MONDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER at LOS ANGELES-AL: RHP PHIL HUGHES (4-5, 4.94)

RHP Phil Hughes, 25 from Mission Viejo Calif., will make his 10th start of the season on Monday vs. the Los Angeles Angels at Angel Stadium...will be his fifth career start (eighth appearance), and second this season, vs. Los Angeles-AL...**last started** on 5/22 vs. Kansas City and earned the win in the 3-2 Yankees' victory, allowing 2ER in 6.0IP (5H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...marked his fourth career victory vs. the Royals, tying for his most against any Major League opponent (also four wins vs. Baltimore, Seattle and Tampa Bay)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (23rd overall) of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft...is signed through the 2012 season.

VS. LOS ANGELES-AL: Is 3-2 with a 7.61 ERA (23.2IP, 20ER) in seven career appearances (four starts) vs. the Angels...has allowed 5ER in three of his four career starts vs. Los Angeles-AL, going 1-2 with an 8.61 ERA (19.2IP, 19ER) during the stretch, with the Yankees going 1-3...his 7.61 career ERA against the Angels is his highest vs. any AL opponent.

TODAY'S STARTER: RHP HIROKI KURODA (3-6, 4.56 ERA)

RHP Hiroki Kuroda, 37, will make his 10th start of the year today vs. the Oakland Athletics at the O.co Coliseum... will be his second career start vs. Oakland and first as a member of the Yankees... **last started** on 5/21 vs. Kansas City and recorded the loss in the 6-0 Yankees' defeat, allowing 3ER in 5.1IP (7H, 3BB, 4K, 1HR)...lost at home for just the second time this season and became the first Yankees starter to lose twice to the Royals in the same season since Andy Pettitte in 1999, credit: *Elias*...signed a one-year contract with the Yankees on 1/26/12.

STRUGGLING OUT THE GATE: 12 of his 30 total runs allowed this season have come in the first inning, including two in his last start on 5/21 vs. Kansas City...has given up at least one run in the first frame of a game in six of his nine starts this year, with opponents hitting .310 (13-for-42) with 4HR and 12RBI...from the second inning on, opponents are batting .269 (45-for-167) with 6HR and 18RBI.

ROAD WOES: Is 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA (21.2IP, 15ER) in four road starts this season, with opponents batting .297 (27-for-91) with 5HR and 18RBI...at home, has won three of his five starts this year, going 3-2 with a 3.41 ERA (31.2IP, 12ER), with opposing batters hitting .269 (32-for-119) with 5HR and 12RBI.

◦ Ranked fifth in the National League with a 2.85 ERA (94.2IP, 30ER) in 2011, posting a 7-7 record in 15 starts away from Dodger Stadium, as opposed to going 6-9 with a 3.27 ERA (107.1IP, 39ER) in 17 home starts.

THE BUCK STOPS HERE: According to *Elias*, Kuroda has not allowed a run in 9.0 innings immediately following a run-scoring inning by the Yankees.

ONE WAY OR THE OTHER: Along with his starting pitching counterpart today, Oakland's Tommy Milone (9GS, 6-3), is one of three Major League starters this season to have recorded a decision in each of their starts to begin the season... is joined on that list by teammate Phil Hughes (9GS, 4-5).

TWO-FOR-ONE: Has induced six double-play ground balls this season (five of which ended the inning), the second-most on the Yankees' staff behind Ivan Nova's eight...has yet to yield a double-play grounder in the month of May this year, after recording six in four of his five April starts...the Yankees last turned a double-play behind him in the second inning of his start on 4/30 vs. Baltimore.

STOP RIGHT THERE: With runners on base this season, has limited opposing batters to a .259 (22-for-85) batting average with 4HR and 24RBI...held opponents to a .194 (30-for-155) batting average with runners in scoring position in 2011, the fifth best mark in the NL.

TURF TOE: Made just his second career start this season on an artificial playing surface (also 4/7 at Tampa Bay) in his start on 5/16 at Toronto...over those two outings, has combined to go 0-2 with a 9.28 ERA (10.2IP, 11ER)...his 7ER allowed at Toronto tied a career-high and marked his most earned runs allowed in a start since also allowing 7ER on 7/28/08 vs. San Francisco (w/ Los Angeles-NL).

LEARNING CURVE: Has made just 20 career starts vs. American League opposition, combining to go 6-14 with a 4.43 ERA, allowing 60ER in 122.0IP...is 3-6 with a 3.43 ERA (57.2IP, 22ER) in nine career starts vs. AL Central teams.

BATTERY-MATE: *Elias* notes that Kuroda has appeared in a game with Russell Martin as his catcher for over half of his 123 career starts...is 26-27 with a 3.84 ERA (410.1IP, 175ER) in 69 career starts with Martin behind the plate, compared to 18-25 with a 3.06 ERA in 54 career starts with other catchers.

MAKING 'EM COUNT: Recorded at least 7.0IP and 2ER or less for the third time this season in his start on 5/11 vs. Seattle...in 41 career starts in which he has registered at least 7.0IP, is 29-4 with a 1.47 ERA (305.1IP, 50ER), with his team winning 34 of those 41 contests...in 35 career starts in which has recorded at least 7.0IP and allowed 2ER or less, is 26-2 with a 1.03 ERA (262.1IP, 30ER), with his team going 30-5.

MADE IN JAPAN: Faced Rangers starting pitcher Yu Darvish in his start on 4/24 at Texas, marking the seventh time in Major League Baseball history that two Japanese-born starters faced off against each other...was the first time ever that Kuroda and Darvish squared off in a game vs. one another (Japanese careers included).

◦ The game was distributed to 36 countries and territories including Australia, Canada, Japan, Latin America, South America, Mexico, Taiwan and Singapore.

LASTING FIRST IMPRESSION: With his start on 4/13 vs. Los Angeles-AL, Kuroda became the first Yankees starter to throw at least 8.0 scoreless innings in a home season opener since Rick Rhoden on 4/5/88 vs. Minnesota (9.0IP)...he became the first Yankees starter with at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his first start at Yankee Stadium (old or current) since Bob Shirley on 4/27/83 vs. Kansas City (9.0IP) - credit: *Elias*.

KONNICHIWA: With his start on 4/7 at Tampa Bay, became just the fourth Japan-born player and third such pitcher to ever appear in a Major League game for the Yankees...joined Hideki Matsui (2003-09), Kei Igawa (2007-08), and Hideki Irabu (1997-99) as the only players to do so.

2011 RECAP: Went 13-16 with a 3.07 ERA (202.0IP, 69ER) in 32 starts with Los Angeles-NL...established career bests in wins, ERA, games started, innings pitched and strikeouts (161)...recorded the third-lowest single-season ERA among Japan-born pitchers who qualified for an ERA title in the Majors, behind only Hideo Nomo (2.54 in 1995 w/Los Angeles-NL) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (2.90 in 2008 w/Boston).

SPRING RECAP: Made six starts in his first spring training with the Yankees going 2-1 with a 2.92 ERA (24.2IP, 8ER)...led the staff in official innings pitched and tied for second in strikeouts (with Nova)...issued just 1HR and 4BB total in the spring, including only two free passes over his final four outings (19.2IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Was originally signed as a free agent by Los Angeles-NL in 2007.
- Spent 11 seasons (1997-2007) pitching for the Hiroshima Toyo Carp of the Japanese Central League, going 103-89 with a 3.69 ERA (1,700.1IP, 697ER) in 271 appearances (244 starts) for the Carp.
- Was a member of the bronze medal-winning Japanese Olympic Team in 2004 and pitched in the International Cup in Sydney, Australia in 1999, earning a win against Korea and tossing a complete-game shutout over Taiwan.
- He and his wife, Masayo, have two daughters, Hinatsu and Wakana...father, Kazuhiro Kuroda, was a professional baseball player for the Nankai Hawks.
