A's vs. TWINS

This is the first of nine meetings between the A's and Twins this year...split the season series last year, 4-4...won two of three in Minnesota but were 2-3 in Oakland...have lost the season series in three of the previous six years and are 24-30 (.444) against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 273-285 against the Twins...that includes 152-124 in Oakland and 121-160 in Minnesota...are 330-354 all-time against the Twins and have a 977-990 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has not allowed a run and his 23.0 innings pitched are the **most consecutive scoreless innings** to start a season by an Athletics pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1918...his 23.0 innings pitched are the **most among Major League relievers** that have not allowed a run...has allowed a .056 opponents batting average, which is the **lowest among Major League relievers**.

Coco Crisp stole two bases yesterday and has now been successful in an **Oakland record** 29 consecutive stolen base attempts dating back to last year...broke the record of 28 set by Stan Javier in 1995.

Josh Reddick has nine home runs in May, which is tied for third most in the American League...the home runs are also the most by an Athletic in one month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1980** Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high five-game losing streak to fall a season-low four games under .500 at 22-26...were swept in three games by New York in their last series, the first time they have been swept in a series of three or more games since August 12-14, 2011 against Texas...have now dropped each of the last three series after going 2-0-4 over the previous six series...have lost seven of the last nine games and nine of the last 12 contests...are 22-26 after 48 games for the second consecutive season...are now a season-high eight games behind Texas in the American League West...have spent the past two days in third place after 25 consecutive days in second...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, eight days in third and seven days in fourth...are 8-7 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-19 against right-handers.

RUNS: The A's were shut out yesterday and have now been shut out four times in the last 12 games and eight times for the season, which is tied with the Angels for the most in the majors...have been held to two runs or fewer in eight of the last 12 games and have scored 26 runs total over that span (2.17 per game)...have scored 158 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's batted .157 (29 for 185) with eight runs scored in six games on their past homestand and have a .178 (79 for 444) average over the last 14 contests...rank last in the majors in batting (.209) and second to last in slugging (.332) and on-base percentage (.284)...are last in the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.215) and have the third most strikeouts (379)...have grounded into 26 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...are averaging 4.00 pitches per plate appearances, which is the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed seven home runs in the past three games after surrendering just five home runs over the previous 13 contests...have allowed 42 home runs for the season, which ranks fourth fewest in the American League...have the second fewest strikeouts (289)...have five shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Angels (7)...A's starting pitchers have tossed 5.0 innings or fewer in four of the last nine games and have a 5.17 ERA (27 er in 47.0 ip) over that stretch...A's starters now have a 5.33 ERA (89 er in 150.1 ip) and .302 (185 for 612) opponents batting average over the last 27 games after posting a 2.86 ERA and .242 average over the first 21 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders had an assist in three consecutive games from Tuesday through Friday and now have a **Major League leading** 11 for the season...last year, A's outfielders had 21 assists for the entire season...the A's have made 10 errors in the last 22 games after tallying 19 in the first 26 contests.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole two bases yesterday and rank second in the American League with 42 stolen bases for the season...11 of the A's steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors...have a stolen base percentage of 80.8% (10 cs), which is tied for the AL lead and tied for third best in the majors...have five double steals, which is two more than the season total from last year...A's opponents have been caught stealing 14 times, which ranks third in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Kansas City (three games) today...the trip begins a 16-game stretch where the A's will play 12 games on the road...went 1-5 on their last homestand against Los Angeles (1-2) and New York (0-3), their worst homestand since July 25-30, 2008 when they also went 1-5 against Texas and Kansas City...are now 10-15 at home compared to 12-11 on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League...the A's pitching staff has a 3.13 ERA (82 er in 235.2 ip) at home compared to 4.09 (91 er in 200.1 ip) on the road...the offense is batting .202 (166 for 820) at home compared to .217 (170 for 785) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-2 in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League...the eight one-run games are the fewest in the majors...went 20-25 in one-run games last year, which was the third worst record...are 12-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 10-18 in all other games...are 7-4 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-3 in the last at bat...the six last at bat wins are tied for third most in the AL...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...had a 15-28 record in extra innings over the previous three years...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

THE LONG BALL: Josh Reddick hit the A's 40th home run of the season Saturday in game 47...last year, the A's did not hit their 40th home run until game 75 (number 41 came in game 78)...20 of the A's 40 home runs have come with two outs...had just 35 two-out home runs all last year...18 have come with runners on base (nine two-run, seven three-run, two grand slams).

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's are 11-13 in the month of May after going 10-12 in April...have posted a losing record in the first two months of the season twice over the previous three years...are batting .209 (167 for 799) in May, which is the lowest mark in the majors...hit a Major League low .211 in April, which was the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.210, April of 1979).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 36 players, which is tied with Tampa Bay for second most in the American League to Boston (39)...12 of the 36 are rookies, which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have seven rookies on the roster (Carignan, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Miller, Milone, Parker)...four have been Australians (Balfour, Blackley, Hughes and Thompson)...no other team in Major League history had more than two Australians.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Céspedes, Devine, McCarthy, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and first start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his eighth appearance overall this year...has made eight career starts and his teams are 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...has tossed 5.2 innings or fewer in each of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer once and walked two batters or fewer three times.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15 and has not allowed an earned run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has made seven appearances this year, all in relief, and is 0-0 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip)...first batters faced are 0 for 6 with a sacrifice hit and he allowed 1 of 2 inherited runners to score...had eight career appearances entering this season and all were starts...is 1-3 with a 9.35 ERA (36 er in 34.2 ip) in his career as a starter...made six starts with Seattle in 2004 and two with San Francisco in 2007.

LAST OUTING: He tossed 3.2 innings in relief of Graham Godfrey last Tuesday in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles in Oakland...entered the game to start the fourth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and did not allow a run on three hits over his first three innings...retired the first two batters to start the seventh before Morales reached on an error...was relieved by Miller who allowed the unearned run to score.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision for San Francisco in a 6-5 loss in 10 innings at Los Angeles (NL) on September 29, 2007 (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 0 so)...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the third inning on a RBI ground out and a Kemp RBI double...then allowed a Martin home run and a Pierre RBI single in the fourth inning to give the Dodgers a 5-4 lead...the Giants came back to tie the game with a run in the fifth.

ONLY MAJOR LEAGUE WIN: Started and won his Major League debut for Seattle on July 1, 2004 against Texas, an 8-4 decision (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...is 0-3 with an 8.33 ERA (37 er in 40.0 ip) in 14 games, seven starts, since then.

BLACKLEY vs. MINNESOTA: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH FRESNO: Was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, with Triple-A Fresno in the San Francisco organization...walked just three batters in 23.1 innings (1.16 per nine innings) and allowed one home run...allowed a .163 opponents batting average, including .153 (9 for 59) against right-handed hitters and .190 (4 for 21) against left-handed hitters...opponents were 1 for 27 (.037) with runners on base, including 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position...tossed at least 4.0 innings in each of his four outings...did not allow a run over his final two starts and finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign with a 15.1-inning scoreless streak.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Pitched for the KIA Tigers of the Korean Baseball Organization...appeared in 25 games, including 22 starts, and posted a 7-5 record with a 3.48 ERA...struck out 115 and walked 62 in 126.2 innings.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Was originally signed by Seattle as a non-drafted free agent on October 29, 2000 and is 69-57 with a 3.91 ERA (476 er in 1094.2 ip) in 227 career appearances, including 176 starts, over 10 minor league seasons...traded to San Francisco April 1, 2007...was a Rule 5 draft selection by Philadelphia prior to the 2008 season, was signed by Arizona as a free agent for 2009 and inked a minor league deal with the New York Mets for 2010...was released by the Mets May 1, 2010 and signed a minor league contract with the A's May 14...posted a 2-1 record and a 2.43 ERA in 17 games, six starts, with Single-A Stockton and Double-A Sacramento...was released December 20 to play in Korea...returned to the United States after signing a minor league contract with San Francisco February 19, 2012.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (1-2, 3.38 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, the eighth of his career...allowed one run or fewer in four of his seven career starts and two runs or fewer in all but one...allowed one run or fewer in each of the first three starts of his career from September 27, 2011 to May 1, 2012...tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of those outings to become just the second pitcher since 1990 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of five or more innings and one run or fewer... had a no decision in his last start, the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Los Angeles last Wednesday in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings...retired the first six batters before Callaspo walked to lead off the third...he scored on an Izturis single...blanked the Angels on three hits over his final four innings and left with the scored tied at 1-1...is making his first career appearance against Minnesota.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-3, 2.45 ERA (150.1 ip, 106 h, 47 r, 41 er, 66 bb, 117 so, 11 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 12/15 (80.0%)

The A's bullpen has a 1.64 ERA (8 er in 44.0 ip) and .168 (26 for 155) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...now has a 2.45 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...ranks second in opponents batting average (.200), opponents on-base percentage (.290) and opponents slugging percentage (.319)...has allowed just 11 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...is tied for first among AL bullpens in opponents grounded into double plays (16) and tied for fifth in saves (12)...has allowed the third most walks (66) and recorded the third fewest strikeouts (117).

- Has not allowed a run in seven of his past eight games (2 er in 7.2 ip, 2.35 ERA)...however, is 1-1 with two saves, two blown saves and a 6.75 ERA (9 er in 12.0 ip) over his last 14 games after yielding just one run over his first 10 contests (0.82 ERA).
- Is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (24)...is also 10th in saves (7) and tied for sixth in blown saves (2).
- Has allowed a .217 opponents batting average...that includes .184 (9 for 49) against left-handers and .265 (9 for 34) against right-handers...first batters faced are 7 for 21 (.333) with three walks (.417 on-base percentage).
- Has allowed 5 of 9 (55.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL.
- Has a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) in 13 appearances at home and a 7.71 ERA (8 er in 9.1 ip) in 11 outings on the road.
- Did not allow a run in five appearances against Minnesota last year (4.2 ip, 2 h, 6 so) and has a 2.70 ERA in 11 games in his career (10.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 13 so).

- Has not allowed an earned run in 12 of his past 14 games (3 er in 18.2 ip, 1.45 ERA) after allowing two earned runs in his first three games (5.40 ERA).
- Has allowed 5 of 11 (45.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the American League...has now allowed 13 of 25 (52.0%) to score over the past two seasons.
- His opponents have a .197 batting average...right-handed hitters are batting .194 (7 for 36) and lefties are hitting .200 (7 for 35).

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and had a 6.23 ERA in five games before he was optioned to Sacramento April 17...returned May 11 and appeared in two games (2.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so) before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- His opponents have a .276 batting average this season...lefties are 1 for 7 (.143) but right-handers are 7 for 22 (.318).
- Has never faced the Twins in his career.
- Allowed a .158 average against both left-handed hitters and right-handers in seven games with the River Cats...issued just one walk in 11.0 innings and struck out 17...his complete 2012 statistics:

- Has not allowed a run in 21 games and his 23.0 innings pitched are the **most consecutive scoreless innings** to start a season by an Athletics pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1918...broke the previous mark of 21.0 innings set by Alex Kellner in 1953 (see chart).
- His 23.0 innings pitched are the **most among Major League relievers** that have not allowed a run.
- Now has a 24.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year, which is an on-going career-high.
- Has allowed a .056 opponents batting average, which is the **lowest among Major League relievers**...also has the lowest slugging percentage (.085) and third lowest on-base percentage (.193)...left-handed hitters are 1 for 32 (.031) and right-handers are 3 for 39 (.077)...has not allowed a hit with a runner on base (30 ab).
- His first batters faced are hitting .056 (1 for 18), which is tied for the lowest average in the AL.
- Is tied for 10th among AL relievers in opponents grounded into double plays (3).
- Has not faced Minnesota in his career.
- Made his Major League debut with Arizona in 2011, posting a 7.04 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in 12 relief appearances over three stints...led the Diamondbacks farm system with 19 saves after being used exclusively as a starter over his first three professional seasons.
