A's vs. TWINS

The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2012...split the season series last year, 4-4...won two of three in Minnesota but were 2-3 in Oakland...have lost the season series in three of the previous six years and are 24-32 (.429) against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 273-287 against the Twins...that includes 152-125 in Oakland and 121-162 in Minnesota...are 330-356 all-time against the Twins and have a 977-992 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook had his season-opening scoreless streak end at 23.0 innings Monday...it was the **longest scoreless streak** to start a season by an Athletics pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1918...has the **lowest opponents batting average** among Major League relievers (.080) and ranks second among AL relievers in ERA (0.75).

Coco Crisp stole a base last night and has now been successful in an **Oakland record** 30 consecutive stolen base attempts dating back to last year...broke the record of 28 set by Stan Javier in 1995.

Josh Reddick has 10 home runs in May, which is tied for third in the American League...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...now has 14 home runs for the season and is the 10th player in Oakland history to hit at least 14 home runs before the end of May...the last was Nick Swisher (16 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1982** Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in **1988** Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high seven-game losing streak and are now a season-low six games under .500 at 22-28...have also lost nine of the last 11 games and 11 of the last 14 to fall a season-high nine games behind Texas in the American League West...have lost the first two games of this series after being swept in three games by New York over the weekend, the first time they have been swept in a series of three or more games since August 12-14, 2011 against Texas...have now dropped each of the last four series after going 2-0-4 over the previous six series...are in third place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day after 25 consecutive days in second...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 10 days in third and seven days in fourth...are 8-8 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-20 against right-handers.

SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's have lost each of their last seven games and have been outscored 33-12 during the streak...are batting .180 (40 for 222), including .167 (6 for 36) with runners in scoring position...have committed seven errors...the pitching staff has a 3.96 ERA (28 er in 63.2 ip).

A's IN MAY: The A's are 11-15 in the month of May, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record in May for the second consecutive season and sixth time in the last eight years...went 10-12 in April and this will mark the second consecutive season and third time in the last four years the A's finished with a losing record in each of the first two months...are batting an American League low .213 (184 for 862) in May...hit a Major League low .211 in April, which was the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.210, April of 1979)...have struck out 220 times in May...have fanned more than 223 times in a month just once in Oakland history and that was in August, 2008 when they had 233.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .189 (96 for 507) over the last 16 games and have a Major League low .212 batting average for the season...also have the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.335) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.289)...are last in the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.214) and have the fourth most strikeouts (388)...grounded into two double plays last night after grounding into a season-high four yesterday...however, have just 32 for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...are averaging 4.01 pitches per plate appearances, which is the most in the majors...have hit 42 home runs in the first 50 games...last year, the A's did not hit their 42nd home run until game 82 on June 30 (also hit number 43 in that game)...22 of the 42 home runs have come with two outs...had just 35 two-out home runs all last year.

RUNS: The A's have been held to two runs or fewer in nine of the last 14 games and have scored 32 runs total over that span (2.29 per game)...have scored 164 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have been shutout four times in the last 13 games and eight times for the season, which is tied with the Angels for the most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed nine home runs in the past five games after surrendering just five home runs over the previous 13 contests...have now allowed 44 home runs for the season, which ranks fourth fewest in the American League...have the second fewest strikeouts (299)...have five shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Angels (7)...A's starting pitchers have a 5.02 ERA (90 er in 161.1 ip) and .295 (192 for 650) opponents batting average over the last 29 games after posting a 2.86 ERA and .242 average over the first 21 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders are **tied for the Major League lead** with 11 assists this year (Texas)...last year, A's outfielders had 21 assists for the entire season...the A's have made 13 errors in the last 24 games after tallying 19 in the first 26 contests.

ON THE BASES: The A's rank second in the American League in stolen bases (43)...11 of the A's steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors...have a stolen base percentage of 78.2% (12 cs), which ranks fourth in the AL...have five double steals, which is two more than the season total from last year...A's opponents have been caught stealing 14 times, which ranks third in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Minnesota (0-2) and Kansas City (three games)...this trip begins a 16-game stretch where the A's will play 12 games on the road...went 1-5 on their last homestand against Los Angeles (1-2) and New York (0-3), their worst homestand since July 25-30, 2008 when they also went 1-5 against Texas and Kansas City...are now 10-15 at home compared to 12-13 on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League...the A's pitching staff has a 3.13 ERA (82 er in 235.2 ip) at home compared to 4.11 (99 er in 217.0 ip) on the road...the offense is batting .202 (166 for 821) at home compared to .221 (187 for 848) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-4 in one-run games following last night's loss, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 10 one-run games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are 12-10 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 10-18 in all other games...are 7-6 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-5 in the last at bat...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 36 players, which ranks third most in the American League...12 of the 36 are rookies, which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have seven rookies on the roster (Carignan, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Miller, Milone, Parker)...four have been Australians (Balfour, Blackley, Hughes, Thompson)...no other team in Major League history had more than two Australians.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Céspedes, Devine, McCarthy, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments this year and 7-9 (.438) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 1-5 with a 7.36 ERA (24 er in 29.1 ip) and .375 (48 for 128) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 1-0 with a 2.13 ERA and .239 opponents average over his first two starts.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has tossed 42.0 innings...based on a minimum of 40 innings pitched, he has the highest opponents batting average in the majors (.339)...has the fourth highest ERA in the American League (5.79)...his five losses are tied for third most among all AL pitchers...has four losses in May, which are tied for the AL lead.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three home runs in his last start, the first time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in an outing...has surrendered five home runs for the season...four have come at home, four have been off left-handed hitters and four have come with runners on base.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .339 opponents batting average breaks down to .253 (22 for 87) against right-handed hitters and .425 (37 for 87) against lefties...the mark against lefties is second highest in the majors (Jurjens, ATL .471)...has a .273 (18 for 66) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .348 (23 for 66) the second time and .429 (18 for 42) the third time.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 2.38 ERA (8 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts when pitching on four days rest and 0-3 with a 14.66 ERA (19 er in 11.2 ip) in three starts on five days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) and .299 (20 for 67) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.11 ERA (20 er in 25.1 ip) and .364 (39 for 107) opponents average in five starts on the road...his career splits are 2-5 with a 3.17 ERA (19 er in 54.0 ip) and .268 (55 for 205) opponents average in 21 games at home compared to 4-7 with a 6.11 ERA (43 er in 63.1 ip) and .311 (76 for 244) opponents average in 22 contests on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-2 with a 2.95 ERA (6 er in 18.1 ip) and .242 (16 for 66) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 7.99 ERA (21 er in 23.2 ip) and .398 (43 for 108) opponents average in five starts at night...his career splits are 3-4 with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in 14 day games compared to 3-8 with a 6.01 ERA (45 er in 67.1 ip) in 29 games at night.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17, the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...was the A's final cut of the spring as he was optioned to Sacramento April 4...was one of the three inactive players in Japan...went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats.

2012 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Los Angeles **April 17**...left after six innings trailing 2-1 but the A's scored four times in the eighth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 victory over Cleveland **April 22** in Oakland...the victory came on his 25th birthday and he became the first Oakland pitcher to start and win on his birthday since Todd Stottlemire in 1995 (May 20 vs. Kansas City)...issued a career-high five walks in 6.2 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Baltimore **April 28**...allowed a career-high nine runs on a career-high 11 hits in 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the fifth inning on a Davis RBI single, a Paulino two-run single, an Andino RBI single and a Hardy sacrifice fly...also allowed a Betemit RBI double in the third and was charged with three runs in the fifth...surrendered a Jones RBI single and was relieved by Blevins with runners on first and second...Blevins allowed a two-run single to Davis...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Tampa Bay **May 4**...allowed seven runs on nine hits in 3.1 innings after yielding nine runs on 11 hits in 4.0 innings in his previous start...the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed three runs in the third on a RBI double by Upton and a two-run single by Scott...then allowed four runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Molina, a RBI double by Upton and a RBI single by Joyce...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-2 loss to Toronto **May 9** in Oakland...allowed a hit and walked three over the first three innings but did not allow a run until Lind hit a two-run home run in the fourth inning...also allowed a RBI single to Rasmus in the sixth inning...combined with Balfour, Norberto and Cook on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles **May 14**...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed five of the hits...stranded runners in scoring position in three of the six innings and retired the side in order just twice...was charged with his fourth loss of the season in the A's 4-0 loss at San Francisco **May 19**...tossed a career-high 108 pitches in 6.0 innings...blanked the Giants on six hits and four walks over the first six innings...then allowed a single to Burris and hit Vogelsong to start the seventh inning and was relieved by Balfour...he allowed both inherited runners to score plus two of his own...Vogelsong, Lopez and Hensley combined to shutout the A's on one hit.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to New York last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 11 hits and yielded a career-high three home runs...was charged with three unearned runs in the third inning when Granderson scored on a Crisp error with two outs...Teixeira added a two-run homer later in the inning...allowed three more runs in the fifth inning on a solo home run by Cano and a two-run home run by Swisher.

ROSS vs. MINNESOTA: Is 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, one start...the start came in his only outing last year, an 11-1 A's loss in Oakland May 19...allowed a single to start the game to Span but left after facing one batter and throwing just seven pitches...Span scored and he was charged with the loss in an 11-1 decision...since Stats, Inc. began tracking pitch counts in 1987, the seven pitches were the fewest by an A's starting pitcher...was placed on the 15-day disabled list the next day with a strained left oblique...his other two appearances came in relief in 2010...retired the only two batters he faced June 4 in Oakland (0.2 ip, 1 so) and then allowed a home run to the only batter he faced (Young) two days later.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with Sacramento...allowed a .303 opponents batting average, including .176 (3 for 17) against right-handed hitters and .438 (7 for 16) against left-handers...tossed 4.0 innings in his first start April 8 at Las Vegas, a 10-3 River Cats win (5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...allowed just one run on a Danny Peralta RBI double in the fourth but did not qualify for the win...was the losing pitcher in his second start, a 5-0 loss at Tucson April 12 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...allowed two runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Sawyer Carroll and Vince Belnome, and another run in the fifth on a Blake Tekotte home run.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Bartolo Colon (4-5, 4.52 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...took the loss in his last start, a 9-2 decision against the Yankees in Oakland...allowed six runs on nine hits (two home runs) in six innings...he is now 1-4 with a 5.80 ERA (26 er in 40.1 ip) and .341 (58 for 170) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA and .194 opponents average over his first four starts...has walked one batter or fewer in eight of his 11 starts and has issued just 10 free passes for the season...is averaging 1.33 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the American League...is 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 1-4 with a 7.48 ERA (23 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts at home...is 15-9 with a 4.92 ERA (166.1 ip, 163 h, 96 r, 91 er, 52 bb, 129 so, 26 hr) in 27 career starts against Kansas City...the wins are his third most against any team (Texas 17, Seattle 16).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-5, 2.77 ERA (156.0 ip, 112 h, 54 r, 48 er, 74 bb, 120 so, 12 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 12/18 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen is 0-3 with no saves, three blown saves and a 5.03 ERA (11 er in 19.2 ip) over the past six games after going 1-0 with two saves, no blown saves and a 1.20 ERA in its previous nine games...now has a 2.77 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...ranks first in opponents batting average (.205), second in opponents slugging percentage (.327) and fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.298)...has allowed just 12 home runs, which is third fewest among AL bullpens, and is tied for third in opponents grounded into double plays (16)...leads the AL in walks (74) and has recorded the third fewest strikeouts (120).

- Has not allowed a run in nine of his past 10 games (2 er in 10.0 ip, 1.80 ERA)...allowed seven runs in his previous six games (14.54 ERA) after yielding just one run over his first 10 contests (0.82 ERA).
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (26) and tied for eighth among relievers in innings (25.1 ip).
- Has allowed a .200 opponents batting average...that includes .173 (9 for 52) against left-handers and .237 (9 for 38) against right-handers...first batters faced are 7 for 22 (.318) with three walks (.423 on-base percentage).
- Has allowed 5 of 10 (50.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- Has a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) in 13 appearances at home and a 6.17 ERA (8 er in 11.2 ip) in 13 outings on the road.
- Has not allowed a run in seven appearances against Minnesota over the past two years (7.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 7 so) and has a 2.19 ERA in 13 games in his career (12.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 14 so).
- Recorded the 17th save of his career May 5, tying Graeme Lloyd for the most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher.
- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).
