A's vs. ROYALS

The season series is tied 2-2...the A's lost last night in Kansas City after winning two of three in Oakland in April...have won each of the previous three season series against Kansas City and are 19-11 (.633) against the Royals since 2009...all-time, the A's are 298-245 against the Royals...that breaks down to 165-109 in Oakland and 133-136 in

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has the lowest opponents batting average among American League relievers (.080) and ranks second in ERA (0.75).

Collin Cowgill is 8 for 14 (.571) over his last four games...had back-to-back three hit games for the first time in his career last Saturday and Monday.

Coco Crisp is 7 for 7 in stolen bases and has been successful in each of his last 30 stolen bases attempts...that is the longest streak of consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing in Athletics history (since CS became an official stat in 1920).

Josh Reddick hit 10 home in May, which tied for third in the American League...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...has 14 home runs for the season and is the 10th player in Oakland history to the end of Mav.

Jemile Weeks has an A's seasonhigh eight-game hitting streak (11 for 34, .324)

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high nine-game losing streak and are 3-13 since May 15...are a season-low eight games under .500 at 22-30...remain a season-high tying nine games behind Texas in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day...have been swept in back-to-back series and have now lost each of the last four series after going 2-0-4 over the previous six series...dropped into a tie for last place in the West with the loss on Wednesday, the first time the A's have held at least a share of last place since April 16 when they were all alone in fourth...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 10 days in third, three days tied for third and seven days in fourth.

NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK: The A's have lost each of their last nine games, which is their fifth losing streak of eight or more games over the last six years...it is the longest since they lost 10 consecutive games last year from May 30 to June 9...have been outscored 39-12 during the current losing streak...are batting .165 (46 for 278), including .140 (6 for 43) with runners in scoring position...have committed six errors...the pitching staff has a 4.18 ERA (37 er in 79.2 ip).

SHUT OUT: The A's were shut out last night and have now been shut out in back-to-back games, three of the last five games and six of the last 16...were shut out five times in the month of May, the A's most in one month since September, 1991 when they were also blanked five times...have been shut out a Major League leading 10 times for the season...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...the pitching staff has five shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Angels (7).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .181 (102 for 563) with 38 runs scored over the last 18 games (2.11 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer 12 times over that stretch...rank last in the majors in batting (.208) and slugging (.329) and second to last in on-base percentage (.287), runs scored (164) and batting with runners in scoring position (.210)...the runs scored are the A's fewest over the first 52 games of the season since 1968 (163)...have grounded into six double plays in the last three games, including a season-high four on Monday, but have just 32 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...have just six doubles in the last 12 games and 70 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.00)...have hit 42 home runs in the first 52 games...last year, the A's did not hit their 42nd home run until game 82 on June 30 (also hit number 43 in that game)...22 of the 42 home runs have come with two outs...had just 35 two-out home runs all last year.

A's IN MAY: The A's went 11-16 (.407) in the month of May, which was the worst record in the American League...it marked the second consecutive season and sixth time in the last eight years the A's finished May with a losing record...went 10-12 in April and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...hit .2101 in May, which was the second lowest mark in the majors...it was also the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.2099 in April, 1979)...hit a Major League low .211 in April and that is the third lowest single-month average in Oakland history...struck out 230 times in May, which was the second highest single-month total in Oakland history (233 in August, 2008).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.34 ERA (132 er in 274.0 ip) over the last 31 games after posting a 2.68 ERA over the first 21 contests...have allowed at least one home run in six of the last seven games (10 total) after surrendering just five home runs over the previous 13 contests...have allowed 45 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...have the second fewest strikeouts (308)...A's starting pitchers have a 5.14 ERA (99 er in 173.1 ip) and .297 (207 for 696) opponents batting average over the last 31 games after posting a 2.86 ERA and .242 average over the first 21 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders are **tied for the Major League lead** with 11 assists (Texas)...last year, A's outfielders had 21 assists for the entire season...the A's have made 12 errors in the last 25 games after tallying 19 in the first 26 contests.

ON THE BASES: The A's rank third in the American League in stolen bases (43)...11 of the steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors...have five double steals, which is two more than the season total from last year...have been successful in 5 of the last 11 stolen base attempts after a streak of 20 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing...A's opponents have been caught stealing 15 times, which is tied with Detroit for second in the AL (Kansas City, 20).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-4 on this six-game road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Kansas City (0-1) and have lost eight of the last 10 road games...return home following the game Sunday for a four-game homestand against Texas, the A's only home games over a 16-game stretch that began Monday...are 10-15 at home compared to 12-15 on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League...the A's pitching staff has a 3.25 ERA (85 er in 235.2 ip) at home compared to 4.06 (105 er in 233.0 ip) on the road...the offense is batting .202 (166 for 821) at home compared to .213 (193 for 904) on the road...went 1-5 on their last homestand against Los Angeles (1-2) and New York (0-3), their worst homestand since July 25-30, 2008 when they also went 1-5 against Texas and Kansas City.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-4 in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 10 one-run games are tied for the fewest in the majors...are 12-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 10-19 in all other games...are 7-6 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-5 in the last at bat...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...the A's are 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments and are 16-18 (.471) in his two seasons with the A's...his teams are 43-47 (.478) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in five of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the disabled list today...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 18 with a strained right shoulder...it was his seventh career stint on the DL.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA (7 er in 26.0 ip) and .222 (22 for 99) opponents batting average over his last four starts...the winning streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: July 15 to August 6, 2011).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 despite a 1.97 ERA (7 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 4.15 ERA (12 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 7-5 with a 2.46 ERA (32 er in 117.0 ip) in 18 starts at home compared to 5-7 with a 4.03 ERA (50 er in 111.2 ip) in 16 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .271 opponents batting average, which includes .219 (23 for 105) against right-handed hitters compared to .315 (39 for 124) against left-handers...has issued 11 of his 16 walks and surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...opponents are batting .331 (43 for 130) with the bases empty compared to .192 (19 for 99) with runners on base...including .175 (10 for 57) with runners in scoring position...the mark with RISP is fourth lowest in the AL.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in seven of his nine starts this year, including one run or fewer three times...his season run support average of 3.41 is sixth lowest in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 2-12 with run support of three runs or fewer and 10-0 in 12 starts with run support of four runs or more.

THREE OUT OF SEVEN: Started three of the A's first seven games...since 1977, the only Oakland pitcher to start three of the A's first seven games is Joe Blanton, who did it in 2008, the last time the A's went to Japan...McCarthy also started two of the A's first three games, joining Blanton as the only pitchers in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Seattle in Tokyo on March 28...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the seventh different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last seven years (Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on a Dustin Ackley home run in the fourth inning...Hernandez and the Mariners bullpen combined to limit the A's to a run on six hits

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Seattle April 6 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first two innings before allowing four runs in the third...an error by Donaldson made three of the runs unearned...Seager had a two-run single to highlight the scoring and McCarthy allowed another run in the fourth on a Figgins RBI single.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 12-inning win over Kansas City April 11 in Oakland...retired the first seven batters before Pena double and scored on a Gordon single in the third inning...also allowed a solo home run to Butler in the fourth...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead but Fuentes allowed a Gordon home run in the seventh inning for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Los Angeles April 21...allowed 11 hits in 7.0 innings...allowed a three-run home run to Morales in the first inning but then blanked the Angels on five hits and a hit batter over the next six innings...also yielded a RBI double to Morales in the eighth and was relieved by Carignan who allowed an inherited runner to score.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Cleveland April 21 in Oakland...allowed 10 hits, his second consecutive start with 10 or more hits...surrendered at least one hit in each inning, including the first when Kipnis singled and later scored on a Hafner ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Kipnis in the sixth and left after seven innings trailing 2-1...Fuentes then allowed three runs in the eighth.

SIXTH START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-2 win at Baltimore April 27...it snapped a four-game losing streak dating back to last year...allowed a Markakis sacrifice fly in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the second to take the lead for good...he blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk in innings two through six before allowing a RBI single to Jones in the sixth.

SEVENTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 win at Boston May 2...blanked the Red Sox on three hits and two walks over the first six innings and had a 4-0 lead entering the bottom of the seventh...allowed a sacrifice fly to Byrd and was relieved by Cook with runners on first and second and two outs...Cook escaped the jam and the bullpen allowed a run in the ninth.

EIGHTH START: He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit May 12 in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...it was his third career 10-strikeout game and the second time he did not walk a batter or allow a run in those games...allowed only one base runner past second base...retired each of the final nine batters he faced.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win at Texas May 17...the A's scored three times in the first inning and he blanked the Rangers on two hits and three walks over the first three innings...Moreland then hit a two-run home run in the fourth and a solo shot in the sixth to tie the game...another run scored in the sixth inning when Gentry scored from third on an Andrus sacrifice hit...A's manager Bob Melvin was ejected by home plate umpire Laz Diaz for arguing the call.

McCARTHY vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 1-1 with a 4.94 ERA (27.1 ip, 24 h, 15 r, 15 er, 11 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in 11 career appearances, including three starts...is 0-1 with a 4.63 ERA (6 er in 11.2 ip) in four appearances, one start, in Kansas City and 1-0 with a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) in seven games in his home ballparks...including 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in the Coliseum...is 0-1 with a 5.68 ERA (12 er in 19.0 ip) in his three starting assignments...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's win in 12 innings April 11 in Oakland...retired the first seven batters before Pena doubled and scored on a Gordon single in the third inning...also allowed a solo home run to Butler in the fourth...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead but Fuentes allowed a Gordon home run in the seventh inning for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (6-4, 3.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...leads American League rookies in innings pitched (64.1), is tied for the lead in games started (10), ranks second in wins (6) and is sixth in strikeouts (35)...is the first rookie pitcher in Oakland history to have six wins before the end of May...his six wins are tied for fifth among all AL pitchers...went 3-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .185 opponents batting average over his first four starts and is 3-3 with a 4.82 ERA (20 er in 37.1 ip) and .268 (40 for 149) opponents average over his last six starts...is 2-3 with a 7.16 ERA (22 er in 27.2 ip) and .295 (33 for 112) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 4-1 with a 0.98 ERA (4 er in 36.2 ip) and .186 (24 for 129) opponents average in five starts at home...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Kansas City earlier this year, April 9 in Oakland...combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in his A's debut...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits.

- Snapped a 0 for 17 streak with a RBI single in the eighth inning Monday in Minnesota.
- Batted .237 with 14 home runs and 44 RBI in 134 games with the A's last year...the batting average was a career low, as was his .301 on-base percentage...however, his 14 home runs were the second-best total of his career and second most on the A's.

- Has an A's season-high eight-game hitting streak (11 for 34, .324) after going 5 for 29 (.172) over his previous eight contests.
- Batted .250 in May after hitting .186 in April.
- Is tied for the American League lead in triples (3) and tied for fourth in stolen bases (10)...is the fifth player in Oakland history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first two seasons, the first since Jason McDonald in 1997...four of his steals have been of third base, which is second most in the Al.
- Is 6 for 16 (.375) on the road trip but is batting .191 (18 for 94) on the road for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL.
- Is 4 for 16 (.250) against Kansas City earlier this year but is a .381 (16 for 42) career hitter against the Royals.
- Has gone 23 consecutive games without a RBI...his last RBI came on May 1 at Boston...his average of 38.0 at bats per RBI is the highest ratio in the majors.
- Batted .303 with 26 doubles, eight triples, two home runs, 36 RBI and 22 stolen bases in 97 games last year...his batting average led Major League rookies and was second best by a rookie in Oakland history...also hit .321 in 45 games at Sacramento.
