A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series 3-City 1-1 in Kansas following yesterday's win and won two of three in Oakland in April...have won each of the previous three season series against Kansas City and are 20-11 (.645) against the Royals since 2009...all-time, the A's are 299-245 against the Royals...that breaks down to 165-109 in Oakland and 134-136 in Kansas

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has the lowest opponents batting average among American League relievers and ranks second in ERA

Collin Cowgill is on a career-high five-game hitting streak (9 for 18, .500).

Coco Crisp is 7 for 7 in stolen bases and has been successful in each of his last 30 stolen bases attempts...that is the longest streak of consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing in Athletics history (since CS became an official stat in 1920).

Josh Reddick hit 10 home in May, which tied for third in the American League...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a Athletic to hit 10 nome runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...has 14 home runs for the season and is the 10th player in Oakland history to hit at least 14 home runs before the end of May.

Jemile Weeks has an A's season-high nine-game hitting streak (13 for 36, .361).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1980 trailing 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland, Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs but the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in 2004 the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high nine-game losing streak yesterday...it was their longest losing streak since they lost 10 consecutive games last year from May 30 to June 9...are now 4-13 since May 15...are seven games under .500 at 23-30 and the season-low is eight games under .500...are eight games behind Texas in the American League West after spending the previous five days a season-high nine games out of first place...were swept in the previous two series against New York and Minnesota and have lost each of the last four series after going 2-0-4 over the previous six series...have spent the past four days tied for last place, the first time the A's have held at least a share of last place since April 16 when they were alone in fourth...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 10 days in third, four days tied for third and seven days in fourth.

OFFENSE: The A's scored nine runs yesterday, their most since scoring a season-high 11 runs May 11 vs. Detroit...however, are batting .186 (112 for 601) with 47 runs scored over the last 19 games (2.47 runs per game) and have scored two runs or fewer 12 times over that stretch...rank last in the majors in batting (.209) and slugging (.331), second to last in on-base percentage (.288) and runs scored (173) and have the third lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.214)...the runs scored are the A's fewest over the first 53 games of the season since 1979 (178)...have grounded into six double plays in the last four games, including a season-high four on Monday, but have just 32 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...have just eight doubles in the last 13 games and now have 72 for the season, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the fewest in the majors...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.01)...have hit 42 home runs in the first 53 games...last year, the A's did not hit their 42nd home run until game 82 on June 30 (also hit number 43 in that game)...22 of the 42 home runs have come with two outs...had just 35 two-out home runs all last vear.

SHUTOUTS: The A's have been shut out in two of the last three games, three of the last six and six of the last 17...were shut out five times in the month of May, the A's most in one month since September, 1991 when they were also blanked five times...have been shut out a Major League leading 10 times for the season...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...the pitching staff has five shutouts, which is tied for third most in the majors.

A's IN MAY: The A's went 11-16 (.407) in the month of May, which was the worst record in the American League...it marked the second consecutive season and sixth time in the last eight years the A's finished May with a losing record...went 10-12 in April and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...hit .2101 in May, which was the second lowest mark in the majors...it was also the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.2099 in April, 1979)...hit a Major League low .211 in April and that is the third lowest single-month average in Oakland history...struck out 230 times in May, which was the second highest single-month total in Oakland history (233 in August, 2008).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.29 ERA (135 er in 283.0 ip) over the last 32 games after posting a 2.68 ERA over the first 21 contests...have allowed at least one home run in six of the last eight games (10 total) after surrendering just five home runs over the previous 13 contests...have allowed 45 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...have the second fewest strikeouts (314)...A's starting pitchers have a 5.07 ERA (101 er in 179.1 ip) and .299 (215 for 718) opponents batting average over the last 32 games after posting a 2.86 ERA and .242 average over the first 21 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Collin Cowgill recorded the 12th assist by an A's outfielder yesterday, which is tied for the Major League lead (Arizona)...last year, A's outfielders had 21 assists for the entire season...the A's have made 12 errors in the last 26 games after tallying 19 in the first 26 contests.

ON THE BASES: The A's rank third in the American League in stolen bases (43)...11 of the steals have been of third base, which is the most in the majors...have five double steals, which is two more than the season total from last year...have been successful in 5 of the last 11 stolen base attempts after a streak of 20 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing...A's opponents have been caught stealing 15 times, which is tied with Detroit for second in the AL (Kansas City, 20).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this six-game road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Kansas City (1-1) and have lost eight of the last 11 road games...return home following the game today for a four-game homestand against Texas, the A's only home games over a 16-game stretch that began Monday...are 10-15 at home compared to 13-15 on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League...the A's pitching staff has a 3.25 ERA (85 er in 235.2 ip) at home compared to 4.02 (108 er in 242.0 ip) on the road...the offense is batting .202 (166 for 821) at home compared to .215 (203 for 942) on the road...went 1-5 on their last homestand against Los Angeles (1-2) and New York (0-3), their worst homestand since July 25-30, 2008 when they also went 1-5 against Texas and Kansas City.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-4 in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 10 one-run games are tied for the fewest in the majors (Atlanta)...are 12-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 10-19 in all other games...are 7-6 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-5 in the last at bat...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments and his teams are 11-4 (.733) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in seven of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in wins (6) and innings pitched (64.1), tied for second in games started (10) and is sixth in strikeouts (35)...is the first rookie pitcher in Oakland history to have six wins before

the end of May...his six wins are tied for fifth among all AL pitchers...his 10 starts are the most among Major League pitchers without a no decision.

FIRST FOUR, LAST SIX: Went 3-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .185 opponents batting average over his first four starts and yielded just one home run in 27.0 innings...is 3-3 with a 4.82 ERA (20 er in 37.1 ip) and .268 (40 for 149) opponents average over his last six starts and has allowed six home runs in 37.1 innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-3 with a 7.16 ERA (22 er in 27.2 ip) and .295 (33 for 112) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 4-1 with a 0.98 ERA (4 er in 36.2 ip) and .186 (24 for 129) opponents average in five starts at home...has allowed six of his seven home runs on the road...has the second highest road ERA in the American League and the third lowest home ERA...won each of his first four career starts at the Coliseum before taking the loss in his last start...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum...the previous best was three by Tim Hudson in

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 4-2 with a 2.70 ERA (12 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.18 ERA (14 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Five of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has issued seven walks in 46 plate appearances against left-handed hitters compared to nine walks in 214 plate appearances against right-handers.

FIRST START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...all three hits were doubles but no one advanced past second base...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle April 14...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first five innings but that was a solo home run by Montero in the second inning...then allowed three runs in the sixth on a bases loaded walk by Smoak and a two-run double by Montero...Noesi and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win at Los Angeles April 19...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first three innings before allowing his only two runs in the fourth...Pujols doubled and scored on a Wells double...Wells scored on a Trumbo single...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

FOURTH START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...did not allow a hit until Ramirez singled to lead off the fifth...did not allow a runner past first base and faced just two batters over the minimum as he was aided by two double plays and a caught stealing...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-6 loss at Boston April 30...allowed a career-high eight runs on eight hits, including a career-high three home runs...allowed four runs in the second inning, including a lead-off home run to Ortiz and RBI singles by Byrd and Aviles...McDonald hit a two-run home run in the third and Ortiz added a solo shot in the fifth.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win at Tampa Bay May 6...allowed five runs in five innings and walked a career-high four batters...allowed four runs in the first inning...walked the first three batters he faced...Keppinger followed with a sacrifice fly and after hitting Scott to reload the bases, he allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez and a two-run single to Joyce...the A's then scored five times in the third and three more times in the fifth to take an 8-4 lead...also allowed an Upton solo home run in the fifth.

SEVENTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-4 win over Detroit May 11 in Oakland...struck out a career-high six batters in 7.0 innings...allowed a run to score in the first inning when Jackson led off with a double and later scored on a double play...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the inning before he allowed an unearned run in the third on a Cabrera RBI double...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Texas May 16...allowed four runs in 7.0 innings pitched and all four runs came in the fourth inning...allowed a two-run home run to Beltre, a RBI single to Gentry and a RBI single to Andrus...surrendered a career-high nine hits.

NINTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first four innings before allowing his only run on a Trout RBI double in the fifth inning...retired each of the final six batters that he faced.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to New York a week ago today in Oakland...allowed just one run over the first six innings, a lead off home run by Jones in the second inning...also allowed a RBI double to Teixeira in the seventh...Kuroda and Soriano combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk.

MILONE vs. KANSAS CITY: Was the winning pitcher in his only career start earlier this year (see first start above).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (1-2, 2.88 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season, the ninth of his career...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight career starts and two runs or fewer in all but one...allowed one run or fewer in each of the first three starts of his career from September 27, 2011 to May 1, 2012...tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of those outings to become just the second pitcher since 1990 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of five or more innings and one run or fewer...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss in Minnesota Tuesday...tossed six scoreless innings before the A's scored once in the seventh and eighth innings to take a 2-0 lead...Fuentes then allowed a three-run "walk off" home run to Willingham in the ninth...has not faced Texas in his career.

The A's bullpen is 0-3 with no saves, three blown saves and a 4.05 ERA (12 er in 26.2 ip) over the past nine games after going 1-0 with two saves, no blown saves and a 1.20 ERA in its previous nine games...now has a 2.71 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...ranks first in opponents batting average (.201) and opponents slugging percentage (.321) and fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.294)...has allowed just 12 home runs, which is tied for second fewest among AL bullpens...ranks fifth in opponents grounded into double plays (16)...is tied for the second most walks (76) and has recorded the second fewest strikeouts (129).

- Has allowed a .213 opponents batting average...that includes .200 (11 for 55) against left-handers and .231 (9 for 39) against right-handers...first batters faced are 8 for 23 (.348) with four walks (.444 on-base percentage).
- Has a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) in 13 appearances at home and a 6.39 ERA (9 er in 12.2 ip) in 14 outings on the road.
- Is tied third in the American League in games pitched (27) and tied for seventh in blown saves (2).
