A's vs. RANGERS

The A's split a two-game series in Texas in May to open the season series...have lost 13 of the last 16 games to the Rangers, including five of the last six in Oakland...have lost five of the previous six season series and are 52-64 (.448) against Texas over that span (since 2006)...are 293-308 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 156-144 in Oakland and 137-164 in Texas...have an all-time record of 390-390 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has the lowest opponents batting average among American League relievers (.077) and ranks second in ERA (0.72).

Collin Cowgill is on a career-high six-game hitting streak (11 for 22, .500).

Coco Crisp is 7 for 7 in stolen bases and has been successful in each of his last 30 stolen bases attempts...that is the longest streak of consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing in Athletics history (since CS became an official stat in 1920).

Josh Reddick hit 10 home in May to become the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...has 14 home runs for the season and is the 10th player in Oakland history to hit at least 14 home runs before the end of May.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971 the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in 1972 Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...the future Hall of Famer would go on to win 224 games with the A's and the Yankees.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost 10 of the last 11 games...are now 4-14 since May 15 after going 19-17 over the first 36 games...are a season-high tying eight games under .500 at 23-31...that is the A's worst record after 54 games since 2005 when they were 21-33 (won game 55)...are a season-high tying nine games behind Texas in the American League West...remain in a tie for last place in the West for the fourth consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 10 days in third, five days tied for third and seven days in fourth...have not been all alone in fourth since April 16...have lost each of the last five series after going 2-0-4 over the previous six series...snapped a season-high nine-game losing streak on Saturday...the losing streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history and was the longest since a 10-game losing streak last year from May 30 to June 9.

ONE-THIRD: The A's have played 54 games, which is one-third of the season...are on pace to lose 93 games, which would be the A's most in a season since 1997 when they had 97...are on pace to score 519 runs, which would be the fewest in a non-strike season in Oakland history (532 in 1978)...are also on pace to strike out 1257 times, which would set an Oakland record (1226 in 2008)...are batting .209 with a .288 on-base percentage and .329 slugging percentage...the lowest marks in Oakland history are a .236 batting average (1982), .302 on-base percentage (1979) and .343 slugging percentage (1968).

SHUTOUT: The A's were shutout for the third time in the last four games yesterday, marking the first time they have been shutout three times over a four-game span since September 14-18, 1991...have been shutout four times in the last seven games, seven times in the last 18 contests and a Major League leading 11 times for the season...the A's pitching staff has allowed four runs or fewer in nine of the 11 games and have a 3.77 ERA (38 er in 90.2 ip) in those contests...the A's were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...were shut out five times in the month of May, the A's most in one month since September, 1991 when they were also blanked five times

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .188 (119 for 633) with 47 runs scored over the last 20 games (2.35 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer 13 times over that stretch...rank last in the majors in batting (.209), slugging (.329) and doubles (72) and second to last in on-base percentage (.288), runs scored (173) and batting with runners in scoring position (.209)...the runs scored are the A's fewest over the first 54 games of the season since the 1968 club had 170...have grounded into 33 double plays, which is the fewest in the American League...rank third in the AL in stolen bases (44)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.01).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's host Texas in a four-game homestand beginning tonight...these four games are the A's only home games over a 16-game stretch from May 28 to June 14...began the stretch by going 1-5 on a six-game road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Kansas City (1-2)...conclude the stretch with a six-game road trip to Arizona (three games) and Colorado (three games) beginning Friday...have a five-game losing streak at home, which is their longest single-season home losing streak since June 23-28, 2009, when they also lost five straight...have not lost more than five consecutive home games since September 16-29, 2007 when they lost six straight...are 10-15 at home compared to 13-16 on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League...the A's pitching staff has a 3.25 ERA (85 er in 235.2 ip) at home compared to 3.96 (110 er in 250.0 ip) on the road...the offense is batting .202 (166 for 821) at home compared to .216 (210 for 974) on the road.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.24 ERA (137 er in 291.0 ip) over the last 33 games (since April 28) after posting a 2.68 ERA over the first 21 contests...have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are tied for second in shutouts (5) and tied for third in fewest home runs (46), but have the second fewest strikeouts (320)...A's starting pitchers have a 4.97 ERA (103 er in 186.1 ip) and .299 (223 for 745) opponents batting average over the last 33 games after posting a 2.86 ERA and .242 average over the first 21 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Collin Cowgill recorded the 12th assist by an A's outfielder Saturday, which is **tied for the Major League lead** (Arizona)...last year, A's outfielders had 21 assists for the entire season.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-4 in one-run games and the 10 one-run decisions are the fewest in the majors...are 12-12 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 11-19 in all other games...are 7-6 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-5 in the last at bat...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

A's IN MAY: The A's went 11-16 (.407) in the month of May, which was the worst record in the American League...went 10-12 in April and have finished the first two months of the season with a losing record for the second consecutive year and third time in the last four years...hit .2101 in May, which was the second lowest mark in the majors...it was also the second lowest single-month batting average in Oakland history (.2099 in April, 1979)...struck out 230 times in May, which was the second highest single-month total in Oakland history (233 in August, 2008).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 36 players (not including Sean Doolittle, who was called up today), which is tied for third most in the American League behind Boston (39) and Tampa Bay (37)...12 of the 36 are rookies, which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Carignan, Cespedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Doolittle, Miller, Milone, Parker).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 10 times and currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Devine, Norberto, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season, the ninth of his career...the A's are 3-4 (.4290) in his starting assignments and his teams are 4-4 (.500) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in five of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer three times.

RUNS ALLOWED: Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his seven starts and two runs or fewer in all but one...has a 2.88

ERA, which is the lowest among American League rookies with at least 40 innings pitched...also has the lowest opponents batting average (.228)...allowed one run or fewer in each of the first three starts of his career from September 27, 2011 to May 1, 2012...tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of those outings to become just the second pitcher since 1990 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of five or more innings and one run or fewer...the other is Rich Harden, who did it for the A's from July 21 to 31, 2003

RUN SUPPORT: Has received just one run of support in each of his last four starts and two runs or fewer in all but one of his starts...his season RSA of 2.88 (13 rs in 40.2 ip) is fourth lowest among American League pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 6 for 40 (.150) with three walks (.209 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .152 (5 for 33) batting average with runners in scoring position...has surrendered just one home run in 40.2 innings...however, has issued 21 walks, an average of 4.65 per nine innings

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA (3 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more and 0-2 with a 4.29 ERA (10 er in 21.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest or fewer.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning this year (7.0 ip) or his career (8.0 ip)...has yielded seven of his 13 runs this year in the third inning (6.0 ip, 10.50 ERA) and has a 1.56 ERA (6 er in 34.2 ip) in all other innings.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 after going 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts with the River Cats...replaced Graham Godfrey in the starting rotation.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Fukudome in the seventh inning...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning...Pedroia led off with single, went to second on wild pitch, third on a ground out and then scored on an Ortiz ground out...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win over Toronto May 8 in Oakland...tossed a career-high seven innings but issued a career-high five walks...allowed his only runs on a two-run home run by Johnson in the third inning, the first home run he allowed in his career.

FOURTH START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 3-1 loss to Detroit May 13 in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits and two walks over the first four innings before allowing a RBI single to Cabrera in the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a two-out double Boesch and then walked the bases loaded in the sixth...was relieved by Balfour, who walked in the go-ahead run.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-6 loss at San Francisco May 18...allowed a careerhigh six runs in a career-low 2.0 innings...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed two runs in the second on a Belt RBI single and an Arias sacrifice fly...did not retire a batter in the third inning, allowing each of the first five batters to reached base...yielded a RBI double to Crawford and was relieved by Blevins after walking Belt with the bases loaded...Blevins allowed two inherited runners to score.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss to Los Angeles May 23 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings...retired the first six batters before Callaspo walked to lead off the third...he scored on an Izturis single...blanked the Angels on three hits over his final four innings and left with the scored tied at 1-1.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Minnesota May 29...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and four walks...the A's scored a run in the seventh to take a 1-0 lead and he was relieved by Blevins to start the bottom of the seventh...the A's had a 2-0 lead entering the ninth but Fuentes allowed a three-run "walk-off" home run to Willingham for the blown save and loss.

PARKER vs. TEXAS: Is making his first career appearance and start.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA in four starts...struck out 21 batters in 20.2 innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .271 (13 for 48) against right-handed hitter and .281 (9 for 32) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...opponents were 4 for 29

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Travis Blackley (0-0, 0.82 ERA): Is scheduled to make fifth appearance and second start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his ninth appearance overall this year...began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at Minnesota May 28 (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Texas, a start in his Major League debut on July 1, 2004, an 8-4 Mariners win in Seattle (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...the win is the only victory of his ML career.

The A's bullpen is 0-3 with no saves, three blown saves and a 3.90 ERA (12 er in 27.2 ip) over the past 10 games after going 1-0 with two saves, no blown saves and a 1.20 ERA in its previous nine games...now has a 2.69 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...ranks first in opponents batting average (.203) and opponents slugging percentage (.322) and tied for fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.295)...has allowed just 12 home runs, which is tied for the fewest among AL bullpens...is tied for third in opponents grounded into double plays (17)...is tied for second in most walks allowed (76) and has recorded the second fewest strikeouts (129)

JERRY BLEVINS

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he
 was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...
 doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot
 off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...

 the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).

RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
 for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
 runs.

LUKE HUGHES

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
 Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
 a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
 RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
 his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one
 sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas,
 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history
 to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24,
 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player
 in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust
 (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin...
 it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a
 strained left groin.

TOMMY MILONE

• Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

JORDAN NORBERTO

Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod
Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same
game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

ANTHONY RECKER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28..

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17.

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left

- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.

ERIC SOGARD

- · Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- · Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

JEMILE WEEKS

Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span...
since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career
