WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the Angels 7-3 yesterday at the Big A, as club went 1-2 to begin this 10-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Oakland (4 games), and San Francisco (3 games)...yesterday's win snapped a season-high 4-game losing streak, longest since 2011 season-high 5-game losing streak, June 11-16, 2011...that was the only time last year the Rangers lost more than 3 in a row...the losing streak was preceded by club's 2nd-longest win streak of the year (4 G, May 25-28)...team is 6-5 last 11 and 9-8 last 17, 17-18 since a 15-4 start...the 17-18 (.486) mark beg. April 27 ranks 10th in A.L. in that span (Angels have best A.L. record at 22-14 in that span)...after losing the weekend series, team is 10-7-1 in series in '12, going 4-7-1 in last 12 after winning 1st 6 to open year...the Rangers' A.L.-best .593 winning pct. is 2nd in majors (LAD-.611, 33-21)...Texas was first A.L. team w/ 30 wins...team was season-high 13 games above .500 after last Monday's win...have majors' best win pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .621 (77-47).

IN THE LEAD: Texas leads Los Angeles-AL in the A.L. West by 4.5 games, gaining ground with yesterday's win for first time since May 26... current margin is largest for any division leader in majors, 1.5 games better than the Dodgers and Reds (both +3.0 GA)...Rangers have had a lead of at least 3.5 games for 48 straight days beginning April 17...team has had season-high 6.5-game lead for 4 days this season, last following a win last Monday...team has led by at least 5.0 games for 13 of last 17 days...Rangers have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 56 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 57 of 59 days in 2012 and for 193 of the last 195 days beginning May 16, 2011...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 343 of last 359 days.

AS ROTATION GOES, SO GO RANGERS: Matt Harrison posted the Rangers' 3rd consecutive quality start yesterday, longest such streak for the rotation since 4 in a row, May 5-8...starters have taken decisions in 6 straight, 12 of 13, and 23 of the last 26 beginning May 6...the rotation's 43 decisions this season are T2nd-most in the majors (NYY-44; OAK-43), and staff's 11 no decisions are also T2nd (NYY-9; OAK-11)...the .581 (25-18) winning pct. for Texas starters is best in the A.L., and is just shy of the club's overall winning pct. in 2012.

LUCKY SEVEN FOR HARRY: Matt Harrison retired the game's first 12 batters in order yesterday in Anaheim en route to his 7th victory, matching Yu Darvish for the team lead...Harrison has won 3 consecutive starts, joining Darvish (3 in a row, April 19-30) as the only Texas pitchers to accomplish that feat this season...there are 11 pitchers in the major leagues this season with 7+ wins, and the Rangers have 2 of the 11...Texas is the only ML team with multiple pitchers with 7+ wins.

HOW THEY DREW IT UP: In the first 2 games of this season, the Rangers employed the "standard" pitcher usage combination of starting pitcher-Alexi Ogando (7th)-Mike Adams (8th)-Joe Nathan (9th)...Ogando may have recorded only one out yesterday, but it marked just the 4th time all year for those 3 pitchers to follow the starter in an effort to close out a victory...outside of the first 2 games of the year, the only other time it had happened was May 10 at Baltimore (Game 2).

**SWING AWAY:** Nelson Cruz hit a 2-run HR in the 7th inning yesterday on a 3-0 count, estimated by hittrackeronline at 484 feet...it is one of just 8 3-0 HR in the majors in '12, 2nd by a Ranger (also Kinsler 4/9 vs. SEA)...Cruz had 2 previous 3-0 HR in his career: 9/6/08 vs. BOS and 2010 ALDS G1 at TB...Elias Sports Bureau notes that prior to this season, covering manager Ron Washington's first 5 seasons at the helm from 2007-11, the Rangers had a total of only 3 regular season HR on that count...marks first time for the Rangers to have a pair of 3-0 HR in one (regular) season since Brad Wilkerson and Kinsler both did it in 2006.

TREAT ME NICE: Elvis Andrus went 3-for-4 yesterday with a double, walk, 2 RBI, and sac bunt...it was just the 3rd time in Rangers history for a player to have 3+ hits, 2+ RBI, a walk, and sac bunt in a game...the others: Ian Kinsler, 7/30/06 vs. KC; and Mike Hargrove, 8/9/74 vs. DET...only other player in the majors with such a game in 2012 is Colorado's Dexter Fowler, May 28 vs. Houston (G2).

Since hitting .235 over his first 17 games through April 24, Andrus has batted .348 (45-118) with 12 doubles, 19 RBI, 26 runs, 18 walks, and 17 strikeouts in his last 35 games...among players w/ at least 109 PA's since April 25, Andrus ranks among A.L. leaders in average (2nd, .348), OBP (2nd, .427), runs (T3rd, 26), doubles (T5th, 12), and walks (T9th, 18).

COME STEAL AWAY: Texas was 2-for-2 in steal attempts yesterday, including a steal by Craig Gentry in the 9th inning on a pitch out...after going just 20-for-31 (64.5%) in steal attempts to begin the year, the club is 21-for-its-last-23 (91.3%) beginning May 12...one of those caught stealings was Michael Young on a missed swing hit-and-run on Saturday in Anaheim...Rangers are 4th in the A.L. with 41 steals in 2012, just 5 off the leader (Cleveland-46).

"BIG" INNINGS: Texas scored 2 runs in both the 7th and 9th innings of yesterday's win in Anaheim...prior to that, club had gone 26 consecutive innings of scoring one or zero runs, including the first 24 frames of the series at the Big A...it was a rare drought for the Rangers, as club enters today with the 2nd-most multi-run innings (74) in baseball this season, trailing only St. Louis (75)...Oakland and Pittsburgh (38) are tied for fewest such innings.

ON THE ROAD: Current 10-game road trip matches longest in 2012 (one of 3 such trips)...club has dropped 3 of 4, 4 of 6, and 5 of last 8 on the road...the Rangers' .607 (17-11) road winning percentage is still 2nd-best in the majors behind only Chicago-AL (17-9, .654)...the 17 wins are tied with White Sox and Braves for most in the majors...this matches Rangers' 2nd-best 28-game road record in team history (18-10 in 1992)...win tonight would match best 29-game road start ever for Texas (18-11 in '77, '92, '99)...Texas tops majors on road in average (.293), on-base percentage (.353), slugging (.460), ranking among ML leaders in hits (2nd, 288), runs (2nd, 302) and homers (5th, 35)...just 2 HR last 5 road games.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas is scheduled to begin a week's worth of games against Oakland (4) and San Francisco (3) tonight at the Coliseum...Oakland is the last A.L. West city for Texas to visit this season...teams split a 2-game series in Arlington on May 16-17, with Rangers losing the latter game 5-4 in 10 innings...Texas went 13-6 last year vs. A's in '11, matching club's 2nd-most wins ever against one opponent in a single season (15-4 vs. SEA in '11)...have won 13 of last 16 vs. A's beg. 5/10/11...Texas was 6-4 at the Coliseum last year, and has won 9 of last 13 in Oakland dating to 9/24/10...Rangers lead all-time series, 308-293.

VS. A.L. WEST: Rangers are 9-9 vs. West in 2012, 2-4 on the road...club has lost 4 of 5, 5 of 7, and 7 of last 10 to West opponents overall...team is 2-4-1 in series against the division this year, having lost both road series (one each to SEA and LAA)...Rangers have still won 15 of 24, 22 of 34, and 43 of last 61 games vs. division, latter stretch beg. May 15, 2011...on the road against the West, Rangers have won 9 of 14 and 15 of 21, and are 20-8 since the '11 All-Star break...Rangers have won 5 of last 7 road series vs. A.L. West clubs.

MISCELLANEOUS: Yesterday was 2nd Texas win this season despite 14-or-more left on base (also 4/19 at DET)...Angel batters in first 5 innings of the weekend series: 3-for-50 (.060), including 0-for-28 in the first 3 frames (one reached on error)...Michael Young's 120 hits at the Coliseum are 6th-most by an opponent at this facility (Garret Anderson is 5th at 125)...Adrian Beltre has hit safely in 11 straight vs. A's at .426 (20-47) and has .396 (21-53) avg. in 13 G at the Coliseum since start of 2010.

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 5th start of the season, 10th appearance overall in 2012, in tonight's series opener against the Athletics...will be working on extended 5 days' rest due Thursday's off day...has dropped 3 straight starts, most recently in a 10-3 loss to the Mariners on Tuesday...has exited one or 2 outs shy of completing 5.0 innings in each of his last 3 starts...has twice extited after E5's on Adrian Beltre that could have ended the inning, including his last start...has been charged with 4 unearned runs in those 2 outings...in 4 starts this year: 0-3, 4.76 (9 ER/17.0 IP)...has made just 8 starts in the majors since being moved to bullpen in late July 2010...slotted as long man in the bullpen when the season began, he has hardly been needed in that role, making 5 appearances in relief despite being on the roster all year...moved into the rotation following the placement of Neftali Feliz on the disabled list on May 24 (retro to May 19).

LAST START: Dropped his 3rd straight decision in a 10-3 loss to the Mariners on Tuesday (4.2 IP, 4 H, 4 R-2 ER, 3 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 88 pitches/52 strikes)...exited one out shy of completing 5.0 innings for the 2nd time in his last 3 starts (also 5/14 vs. KC)...an E5 on Adrian Beltre could have ended the 5th inning, but led to a pair of unearned runs...exited trailing 4-1 with 2 runners on, but Robbie Ross induced an inning-ending dround out from Kyle Seager.

OTHER STARTS: Took a no-decision on April 25 vs. New York-AL in that series finale (3.1 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER), when Rangers posted a 7-3 win after the quartet of Ross/Feliz/Adams/Nathan combined to permit just one run over the final 5.2 innings...that start was a product of April 21 day/night doubleheader in Detroit...took loss in Rangers' 3-1 defeat on May 14 vs. KC (4.2 IP, 3 H, 2 R-0 ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 0 HR, 81 pitches/44 strikes)...pitching with a 1-0 lead with 2 outs in the 5th inning, and in line for the win, induced a ground ball from Chris Getz, which 3B Adrian Beltre fielded and threw wide of the bag for an error...gave up a 2-run single to the next batter, Alcides Escobar, and exited trailing 2-1 to take the loss...suffered 2nd straight defeat in 5-3 loss on 5/23 at SEA, keeping the Rangers within one at 1-0 before loading the bases in the 5th and surrendering Alex Liddi's first career grand slam

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-5, 5.65 (41 ER/65.1 IP) in his 17 career games/9 starts vs. Oakland, including 3-5, 6.27 (36 ER/51.2 IP) over 9 starts...the Bay Area native has gone 1-4 with an 8.23 ERA (25 ER/27.1 IP) over 5 career starts at the Coliseum...each of his last 5 appearances against the A's have come here at the Coliseum, going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (18 ER/18.0 IP) in 5 games/2 starts dating back to Sept. 24, 2009...opened career with quality starts in 5 of first 6 outings against Oakland, but has lost 3 straight starts with a 11.02 ERA (20 ER/16.1 IP) in that span.

RELIEF IN 2012: Has a 3.86 ERA (3 ER/7.0 IP) in 5 relief appearances this season, pitching more than 1.1 innings just one time despite being slotted as the long man in the bullpen...has allowed runs in just one of those 5 outings...has not pitched in relief since May 8 at Baltimore.

BREAKDOWN: Holding LHB to .163 average (8-49), 6th-lowest in A.L. (min. 45 AB vs. LHB)...opponents are 7-for-22 with 3 walks leading off an inning...holding batters to .200 (3-15) and only 4 walks with a full count...on first pitch: 6-for-10, 2 HR, 7 RBI...has not allowed a hit to hitters in the 3-hole in 9 AB (2 walks)...first time through order: .194 (6-31), 2nd time: .290 (9-31), and 3rd time: .333 (1-3)...opposition batting .182 (4-22) with RISP.

**INCOMPLETE:** Has yet to pitch a complete game in 84 career starts, the most in Rangers history and the T11th-most starts in ML history without a complete game.

delayed by rehab for right knee surgery, Feldman was a key member of the bullpen for Texas in the 2011 playoffs...went 1-1, 3.27 (4 ER/11.0 IP) in his 2 starts last season, both series openers against Tampa Bay in the span of one week...first start was Aug. 30 vs. Tampa Bay, tossing 6.0 shutout innings for the win in place of Matt Harrison, who was being given extra rest...was his first win as a starter since June 18, 2010 at Houston, and it was his first start since Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Seattle...lost Sept. 5 at Tropicana Field (5.0 IP, 4 R-ER) in 4-1 Texas defeat as James Shields tossed a complete game...was the 7th and final different starter used by Texas last season, as club had not seen a new starter since Dave Bush made his Texas debut on April 13 at Detroit.

CAREER AS A STARTER: Has gone 29-31, 4.70 (252 ER/483.0 IP) in 84 career starts...has made just 8 starts in the majors since being moved to bullpen in late July 2010...beginning Sept. 24, 2009 (since his 17th win in 2009), is 6-18 with a 5.71 ERA (107 ER/168.2 IP) in his last 31 starts for Texas, losing 9 of his last 10 decisions.

2011: On the disabled list for the first 3 1/2 months of the season, Feldman rejoined the club after the All-Star break as a reliever and made 2 spot starts toward the end of the year...went 2-1 with a 3.94 ERA (14 ER/32.0 IP) in 11 games/2 starts for Texas...opponents batted just .216 (25-116) with 10 walks against 22 strikeouts...was 2-0, 2.33 (5 ER/19.1 IP) in 6 games/one start at home and 0-1, 6.39 (9 ER/12.2 IP) in 5 games/one start on the road.

POSTSEASON: Went 1-0, 3.29 (5 ER/13.2 IP) over 9 appearances in the 2011 playoffs for Texas...over his first 5 games through World Series Game 1, tossed 10.1 scoreless innings with no walks and 10 K's...opponents were just 4-for-33 (.121) with one extra-base hit (double) in that span...posted 4.1 shutout innings in club's ALCS Game 2 win against Detroit (Cruz walk-off slam) and earned the win in ALCS Game 4 at Detroit with a scoreless 10th ahead of a 4-run 11th inning...appeared in 5 of the 7 games in the World Series...gave up 3 runs in 1.1 innings in 16-7 defeat in Game 3...was charged with one of Rangers' 3 blown saves in the Game 6 loss, as he was on the mound when both St. Louis runs in the 10th scored (charged to Darren Oliver)...charged with 2 runs in 0.2 inning in Game 7
