WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the A's 6-3 last night, as club is 2-3 on this 10-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Oakland (1-1), and San Francisco (3 games)...club has won 2 of last 3 after a season-high 4-game losing streak, which was longest since 2011 season-high 5-game losing streak, June 11-16, 2011...that was the only time last year the Rangers lost more than 3 in a row...the losing streak was preceded by club's 2nd-longest win streak of the year (4 G, May 25-28)...team has lost 5 of 7, but is 7-6 last 13, 10-9 last 19, and 18-19 since a 15-4 start...the 18-19 (.486) mark beg. April 27 ranks 10th in A.L. in that span...team is 10-7-1 in series in '12, going 4-7-1 in last 12 after winning 1st 6 to open year...the Rangers' A.L.-best .589 winning pct. is 2nd in majors (LAD-.625, 35-21)...Texas was first A.L. team w/ 30 wins...team was season-high 13 games above .500 after May 28 win...have majors' best win pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .619 (78-48).

**ON THIS DATE:** On June 6, 1944, all major league games were canceled as the country's focus turned toward Europe while allied forces invaded occupied France...today is the 68th anniversary of the D-Day invasion.

IN THE LEAD: Texas leads Los Angeles-AL in the A.L. West by 4.5 games for a 3rd straight day...current margin is largest for any division leader in majors, half-game better than the Dodgers (+4.0 GA)...Rangers have had a lead of at least 3.5 games for 50 straight days beginning April 17...team has had season-high 6.5-game lead for 4 days this season, last following a win May 28...Rangers have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 58 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 59 of 61 days in 2012 and for 195 of the last 197 days beginning May 16, 2011...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 345 of last 361 days.

HELLO BARTOLO: A pair of Rangers have had past success against tonight's Oakland starter, Bartolo Colon...Adrian Beltre's 13 RBI off Colon are T3rd-most of any player behind only Alex Rodriguez (18) and Jacque Jones (16)...his 4 HR are T2nd-most, trailing only Alex Rodriguez (8)...Beltre's 17 career hits are T5th-most of any player against Colon...among players with at least 45 career PA's against Colon, Michael Young's .357 average is 6th-highest.

**GO DOWN SWINGING:** The Rangers accomplished a rare feat last night, as all 9 starters had both a hit and strikeout in the win...just one other team has seen such a game since the start of 2009, as the Pirates did it April 3, 2011 at Wrigley...the last A.L. team to do it?: also the Rangers on July 10, 2008 vs. LA of Anaheim, a game that lasted 11 innings...Texas also did it April 11, 1998 vs. Toronto, and according to baseball-reference.com the Rangers own 3 of the 10 instances in the major league since 1918.

OGANDO'S K'S: Alexi Ogando posted 4 strikeouts last night, matching his highest total ever in a relief outing (4 K's, 6/17/10 at FLA in his 2nd career appearance)...it was just the 12th time in club history for a reliever to record 5-or-fewer outs in a scoreless appearance with 4+ K's, as no Ranger had done it since Frank Francisco on 5/13/10 vs. Oakland in Arlington (1.1 IP, 4 SO, 4 BF).

Ogando now has 33 strikeouts in 31.2 innings this season, ranking 4th among A.L. relievers behind only KC's Tim Collins (42), SEA's Tom Wilhelmsen (36), and DET's Joaquin Benoit (34)...

**FINISH IT OFF:** The Rangers has now used their "standard" pitcher usage combination of starting pitcher-Alexi Ogando (7th)-Mike Adams (8th)-Joe Nathan (9th) in an attempt to finish off a win 5 times in 2012, including in each of the past 2 victories.

NATHAN SAVES: Joe Nathan has finished each of the Rangers' last 3 wins, although last night was his first save since May 28 vs. Seattle...he has retired 27 of his last 31 batters faced, 10.0 shutout innings with 13 strikeouts in his last 10 appearances...he owns the best strikeout-to-walk ratio (14.00 - 28 SO / 2 BB) of any major league reliever...over the last 8 weeks since Nathan suffered his lone blown save on April 11 vs. Seattle, Nathan has compiled a 0.46 ERA (1 ER/19.2 IP) with 2 walks and 23 strikeouts in 21 games and 17.0 innings...his 0.46 ERA beginning April 12 ranks 4th among all big league relievers with at least 12.0 innings in that span, 2nd-lowest of any right-hander in that span behind only Angels' Ernesto Frieri.

**LEADERBOARD:** Texas enters today with 3 of the A.L.'s top 10 in batting average, as Rangers are the only team in baseball to have 3 players with qualifying averages of .300-or-better...Josh Hamilton ranks 2nd in the A.L. with a .345 mark, while Elvis Andrus (.308) and Adrian Beltre (.307) rank 9th and 10th.

<u>DOUBLE DUTY:</u> Texas had 4 doubles last night and have multiple doubles in 10 of the last 12 games...the Rangers' 32 doubles in that 12-game span beginning May 23 are tied with Detroit for most in the majors, as team ranks 3rd in the majors with 110 doubles in 2012, trailing only Boston (141) and Kansas City (116).

**POWER OUTAGE:** Last night was just the Rangers' 3rd win of the year without a home run (also 4/10 vs. SEA and 5/22 at SEA), as club is now 3-9 when not going deep in a game...offense has hit 2 HR in the past 6 games, lowest total in any 6-game span in 2012, and fewest in any 6-game span for the club in nearly a year, since a stretch to end a 10-game road trip June 9-19, 2011 to Minnesota, New York-AL, and Atlanta.

ON THE ROAD: Current 10-game road trip matches longest in 2012 (one of 3 such trips)...club has won 2 of last 3, but has dropped 4 of 6, 5 of 8, and 6 of last 10 on the road...the Rangers' .600 (18-12) road winning percentage is still 3rd-best in the A.L. and majors behind Chicago-AL (.654, 17-9) and Baltimore (.607, 17-11)...the 18 wins are tied with Atlanta for most in the majors...this matches Rangers' 2nd-best 30-game road record in team history, best road start since opening 18-12 in 2006...Texas tops majors on road in average (.289) and on-base percentage (.350), ranking among ML leaders in slugging (2nd, .455), hits (2nd, 316), runs (2nd, 165) and HR (T4th, 36)...just 3 HR last 7 road games.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas is scheduled for a week's worth of games against Oakland (4) and San Francisco (3)...Texas is 2-2 against A's this season, 1-1 in Oakland...Texas went 13-6 last year vs. A's in '11, matching club's 2nd-most wins ever against one opponent in a single season (15-4 vs. SEA in '11)...have won 14 of last 18 vs. A's beg. 5/10/11...Texas was 6-4 at the Coliseum last year, and has won 10 of last 15 in Oakland dating to 9/24/10...Rangers lead all-time series, 309-294.

VS. A.L. WEST: Rangers are 10-10 vs. West in 2012, 3-5 on the road...club has lost 5 of 7, 6 of 9, and 8 of last 12 to West opponents overall...team is 2-4-1 in series against the division this year, having lost both road series (one each to SEA and LAA)...Rangers have still won 16 of 26, 23 of 36, and 44 of last 63 games vs. division, latter stretch beg. May 15, 2011...on the road against the West, Rangers have won 10 of 16 and 16 of 23, and are 21-9 since the '11 All-Star break...Rangers have won 5 of last 7 road series vs. A.L. West clubs.

MISCELLANEOUS: Josh Hamilton's appearance on the cover of this week's Sports Illustrated is 7th ever by a Ranger: Bump Wills, Nolan Ryan-2, Ivan Rodriguez, Nelson Cruz, and Hamilton-2...Hamilton's other cover was June 2, 2008...lan Kinsler's 20 doubles this season are tied for the A.L. lead, as he has 8 in the last 11 games...just 7th Ranger ever with 20 doubles in team's first 56 games, first since Michael Young in 2009...starters have taken decisions in 8 straight, 14 of 15, and 25 of the last 28 beg. May 6...rotation leads the majors with 26 wins.

# #48 Colby Lewis, RHP (4-4, 3.50)

TONIGHT: The 32-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 12th start in tonight's game at the Coliseum...Bakersfield native has quality starts in 2 of last 3, allowing 4 ER-or-less in all 3, posting 3.15 ERA (7 ER/20.0 IP) in those outings to drop season figure from 3.63 to 3.50...is 1-4, 4.81 ERA (21 ER/39.1 IP) in 6 starts since beginning of May after going 3-0, 1.93 in 5 starts in April...has issued just 1.3 walks-per-9, 2nd-lowest ratio in the A.L...his 14 HR allowed are 2nd-most in A.L., despite just 2 G with multiple HR allowed...scheduled HP ump today, Scott Barry, had the plate when Lewis allowed 5 HR in Baltimore...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest after tough-luck loss on Friday in Anaheim...has received 3 runs of support or fewer in 9 of 11 starts.

2012: Is 2nd in the majors with 14 HR allowed behind LAA's Ervin Santana (16), and ranks among league leaders in strikeouts (T12th, 64) and fewest BB per 9 (2nd, 1.25)...after leading A.L. in HR allowed (35), has surrendered home runs in 9 of his 11 starts in 2011, including 2012 MLB single-game-high-tying 5 on May 10 at BAL...only Phil Hughes has allowed HR in more starts (11 of 11)...opposing batters are hitting .163 (8-49) w/ 18 K's w/ RISP, 3rd-lowest figure in the A.L...catcher for 8 of 11 starts has been Torrealba (4-1, 3.06) with Napoli catching 3 times (0-3, 4.74)...has a 2.84 ERA (6 ER/19.0 IP) in his 2 no decisions...opponents batting .340 (17-50) in the first inning, but .230 (54-210) in all other innings...batters leading off an inning are hitting .320 (24-75) with 7 HR, 6 doubles, a triple, and .707 SLG...1st time thru order, opponents are hitting .281 (27-96) with 6 HR; after that, hitting .239 (44-184)...has received 3 runs of support or fewer in 9 of 11 starts, the exceptions being an 18-3 win 4/17 at BOS and the 6-1 win on 5/20 at HOU...was a member of Rangers Opening Day rotation for 3rd straight season and 5th time overall (also 2003-04-10-11)...was the 23rd different Opening Day starter in club history.

LAST START: Took tough luck loss in last start on Fri. at LAA (6.2 IP, 4 H, 4 R-2 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 102 pitches/70 strikes), a 4-2 defeat in which he exited with game tied 2-2...retired game's first 10 batters and gave up just one hit thru 5 inn., but Angels tied game with 2 runs in the 6th...retired first 2 batters in 7th, then permitted single and hit Erick Aybar on an 0-2 pitch...Ogando entered w/ 2 outs and Izturis reached on Kinsler's E4 that would have ended the inning...Trout followed w/ 2-run single for game's decisive runs.

VS. OAKLAND: Faced A's in all 12 series in 2010-11, but did not see them in Arlington series last month...is 7-3, 3.23 (37 ER/103.0 IP) in 18 games/16 starts, including 5-3, 3.19 (28 ER/79.0 IP) in 12 starts since return from Japan...last 7 starts vs. A's beg. 9/26/10: 5-0, 2.85 (15 ER/47.1 IP)...career 5-2, 2.84 (23 ER/73.0 IP) in 23 G/9 GS at the Coliseum, 5-1, 2.60 (16 ER/55.1 IP) in the 9 starts, all 9 starts against the A's...pitched w/ Oakland in 2007 before going to Japan.

**ON THE ROAD:** Will be making his 7th road start, and has gone 2-3, 4.04 (19 ER/42.1 IP) in his first 6 away outings...has at least 6.2 IP in all 6 road starts, and has 4 outings of 2 ER-or-less and 2 starts of 6 R allowed away from home...was 9-5, 3.43 (41 ER/107.2 IP) in 17 road starts in 2011.

OTHER STARTS: Was club's Opening Day starter, 9 K's in 6.0 IP in a 3-2 win 4/6 vs. CWS, matching Nolan Ryan's club record for K's in an opener...on 4/11 vs. SEA, held M's scoreless over 6.2 IP and departed with 1-0 lead, but bullpen allowed 3 runs over final 2 frames in 4-3 loss...earned 18-3 win on 4/17 at Fenway, 6.0 SHO IP after allowing a 2-run HR to Pedroia on 2nd batter of the 1st inning...took no-decision in Rangers' 3-2, 11-inning win 4/22 at DET (7.0 IP/2 R-ER)...gave up go-ahead solo HR to Boesch in the 6th but Texas tied it in 8th on a Hamilton sac fly and won it in the 11th on a Gonzalez suicide squeeze bunt single...permitted a season-low 3 hits but a season-high 3 walks on 4/28 vs. TB to earn his 3rd win in 7-2 victory (6.0 IP, 1 R-ER)...dropped first decision of the season and snapped 6-game win streak dating back to 9/9/11 in 6-3 loss on 5/4 at CLE...took loss 5/10 at BAL (G1) despite careerhigh 12 K's, as he also permitted career-high 5 HR...became first pitcher in ML history to allow at least 5 HR while recording 10+ K's in the same game...permitted 3 consecutive HR to open the game and retired the next 18 batters before a solo home run to lead off the 7th inning...according to baseball-reference.com, Lewis became just

the 5th pitcher since 1918 to allow at least 5 hits in a game with each hit going for a home run...3 of the 5 to do it have come with the Washington/Texas franchise...the others (all 5 H/HR): Senators' Denny McLain (6/16/71 at OAK), Cubs' Steve Stone (7/9/74 vs. CIN), Rangers' Charlie Hough (6/24/89 vs. CLE), and Athletics' Ted Lilly (6/11/03 vs. ATL)...took loss on 5/15 vs. KC in Rangers' 7-4 loss (5.2 IP, 7 R-2 ER), when he fell victim his own 2 errors which led to 5 unearned runs...the 5 unearned runs were most allowed by a Texas pitcher since Scott Feldman permitted 6 unearned on 8/12/08 at BOS, a 19-17 Texas loss...carried shutout into the 9th inning before Lowrie HR in 6-1 win 5/20 at HOU, adding 2 hits and 2 RBI to help his own cause...took ND 5/26 vs. TOR (5.1 IP, 4 R-ER) despite exiting trailing 4-2.

WALK STREAK SNAPPED: Had a 25.2-inning streak without issuing a walk ended in his start on April 28 vs. Tampa Bay when he gave free pass to Ben Zobrist, the 2n d hitter of the game...it was the 6th-longest streak in club history, just 4.0 innings shy of matching Jon Matlack's Rangers record of 29.2 innings in 1978...faced 103 batters without a free pass...he joins MIN's Carl Pavano as the only pitchers to make 3 straight starts without issuing a walk in 2012.

<u>APRIL:</u> Ranked among A.L. leaders for the month of April in ERA (2nd, 1.93), wins (T6th, 3), strikeouts (T11th, 29), K/BB ratio (1st, 7.25), walks per 9 innings (2nd, 1.10), and WHIP (9th, 1.04).

**2011:** Spent second straight season in the rotation, going 14-10, 4.40 (98 ER/200.1 IP) in 32 games/starts...ranked 2nd on the staff in innings (200.1), strikeouts (169), and starts (32-tied), was 3rd in complete games (2), and tied for 3rd in wins (14), the latter tied for 13th in the A.L...had career bests for wins and complete games while matching high for starts...topped the A.L. in homers allowed (35), the 2nd-most in the majors behind Cincinnati's Bronson Arrovo (44).

<u>POSTSEASON</u>: Was 4-1, 2.34 (13 ER/50.0 IP) in 8 playoff starts in 2010-11...has the most career postseason wins of any pitcher in franchise history and is 2nd in innings and strikeouts (44)...his 2.34 ERA in the playoffs is the 2nd-lowest among all active pitchers with 50.0 or more innings to Mariano Rivera (0.70).
