WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's 2-0 last night and are 2-4 on this 10-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Oakland (1-2), and San Francisco (3 games)...club has is 2-2 last 4 games after a season-high 4-game losing streak, which was longest since 2011 season-high 5-game losing streak, June 11-16, 2011...that was the only time last year the Rangers lost more than 3 in a row...the losing streak was preceded by club's 2nd-longest win streak of the year (4 G, May 25-28)...team has lost 6 of 8, but is 7-7 last 14, 10-10 last 20, and 18-20 since a 15-4 start...the 18-20 (.474) mark beg. April 27 ranks 10th in A.L. in that span...team is 10-7-1 in series in '12, going 4-7-1 in last 12 after winning 1st 6 to open year...the **Rangers' A.L.-best .579 winning pct. is 3rd in majors** (see chart)...Texas was first A.L. team w/ 30 wins...team was season-high 13 games above .500 after May 28 win...have majors' best win pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .614 (78-49).

IN THE LEAD: Texas leads Los Angeles-AL in the A.L. West by 4.5 games for a 4th straight day...current margin is largest for any division leader in majors, half-game better than the Dodgers (+4.0 GA)...Rangers have had a lead of at least 3.5 games for 51 straight days beginning April 17...team has had season-high 6.5-game lead for 4 days this season, last following a win May 28...Rangers have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 59 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 60 of 62 days in 2012 and for 196 of the last 198 days beginning May 16, 2011...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 346 of last 362 days.

MORE TOUGH LUCK FOR COLBY: Colby Lewis took a complete game loss last night, as 2 of his 4 career CG efforts have been losses (also 5/5/11 at SEA)...it was the 2nd consecutive quality start loss for Lewis, who also posted a quality outing to begin this road trip on Friday in Anaheim...the last Texas starter to suffer 2 defeats while posting consecutive quality starts in a season?: also Lewis, 7/28/10 vs. OAK and 8/3/10 at SEA.

Lewis has not received 3-runs-of-support-or-fewer in 10 of his 12 starts in 2012...if you take away the game April 17 at Boston when Lewis netted 16 runs of support, his run support average for all other starts is 3.33, which would rank as 6th-lowest in the A.L.

TOUGH TRIP: The Texas rotation entered this road trip with 2 quality start losses all year, and now have 3 quality defeats in the first 6 games of the trip...the Rangers have 2-runs-or-less in all 4 losses on this trip.

STARTERS TAKING IT DEEP: Both starters in last night's game tossed 8.0 innings, just the 10th time that has happened in the majors this season, just the 5th instance in the A.L...it was the first time for Texas to be involved in a game with both starters pitching 8.0 frames in over a year, since June 1, 2011 at Tampa Bay...in that contest, Lewis tossed 8.0 SHO innings to beat David Price (8.0 IP, 3 R-ER).

- ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** Some notes from last night's loss:
- It was the Rangers' 2nd complete-game loss this season, the other by Neftali Feliz on April 21 at DET (G2)...Texas is the first team with multiple CG losses in 2012, as there have been just 4 other CG losses in the majors all year.
 - Last night was first Texas loss all year when allowing 2-runs-or-less.
 - Texas was held to 2-R-or-less 4 times in April and 4 times in May, but have scored 2-or-fewer 4 times in the first 6 games in June.
 - It was just the 3rd time all year for Texas to not have an extra-base hit, first time in over a month (others 4/21 at DET-G2, which was Feliz's CG loss, and also 4/29 vs. TB).
 - Final 12 batters were retired in order last night, one hit last 6 innings.

NAPOLI SURGE: Mike Napoli had the Rangers' only multi-hit game last night, joining Yoenis Cespedes (3-for-3) as the only players with multiple hits in the contest...Napoli has hit safely in a season-high 7 straight at .474 (9-19)...he is batting .429 (12-28) with 3 HR, a double, 10 RBI, 8 walks, and 7 runs over his current 10 consecutive starts to rise from .230 to .264, his highest figure since April 29 (.273)...his .568 OBP since May 27 leads the majors, while .429 avg. ranks 2nd in the A.L. to only Seattle's Michael Saunders (.475).

POINTS FOR BREVITY: Last night's game lasted just 2:04, the shortest 9-inning game by time in the A.L. this season...only shorter game in the majors this season was a 2:02 affair on May 3, Philly at Atlanta...this was the Rangers' shortest game since April 15, 2010 at Cleveland (2:03).

BLANKED: Texas was shut out last night for the first time this year in the club's 57th game of the year...the 56 games without being shut out to begin the campaign was 6th-longest season-opening streak in team history.

ON THE ROAD: Current 10-game road trip matches longest in 2012 (one of 3 such trips)...club has dropped 5 of 7, 6 of 9, and 7 of last 11 on the road...the Rangers' .581 (18-13) road winning percentage is still 5th-best in the A.L...the 18 wins are T2nd-most in majors (also BAL) behind only Atlanta (19)...this matches Rangers' 2nd-best 30-game road record in team history, best road start since opening 18-13 in 2006...Texas tops majors on road in average (.286) and on-base percentage (.346), ranking among ML leaders in slugging (2nd, .447), hits (2nd, 321), runs (2nd, 165) and HR (T5th, 36)...just 3 HR last 8 road games.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas is 2-3 against A's this season, 1-2 in Oakland...have won 14 of last 19 vs. A's beg. 5/10/11...Texas was 6-4 at the Coliseum last year, and has won 10 of last 16 in Oakland dating to 9/24/10...Rangers lead all-time series, 309-295.

VS. A.L. WEST: Rangers are 10-11 vs. West in 2012, 3-6 on the road...club has lost 6 of 8, 7 of 10, and 9 of last 13 to West opponents overall...team is 2-4-1 in series against the division this year, having lost both road series (one each to SEA and LAA)...on the road against the West, Rangers have won 10 of 17 and 16 of 24, and are 21-10 since the '11 All-Star break...have won 5 of last 7 road series vs. A.L. West clubs.

INTERLEAGUE UPCOMING: Beginning tomorrow night in San Francisco, the Rangers are scheduled to begin a stretch of 5 consecutive Interleague series...Texas is 2-1 vs. N.L. in '12, taking 2 of 3 in Houston May 18-20...Texas has won 24 of its last 35 games against the National League beg. June 12, 2010 with a 25-14 (.641) mark since the start of 2010...Texas is 137-132 all-time in interleague games, 55-38 since start of 2007.

On The Road: The Rangers have captured 7 of 10 and 15 of the last 20 Interleague road games and are a ML best 16-6 beginning 2010...team has a 64-73 lifetime mark on the road vs. N.L...in road series vs. the N.L., Texas has won 3 straight, 7 of 8, 8 of 10, and 9 of last 12, the latter span beginning June 20, 2008.

By the Numbers: The Rangers have the most runs scored (1427) and 2nd-most home runs (360) all-time in Interleague play...Texas has a .276 team batting average and a 4.59 ERA all-time in interleague play.

THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS: Texas is facing SF for first time since Game 5 of the 2010 World Series...club has gone just 7-15 in regular season Interleague games all-time against the Giants, including just 2-12 in San Francisco...if you include the 2010 World Series, all-time record is 8-19 against Giants, 2-14 in SF...the Rangers are 0-9 all-time at AT&T Park (0-11 if you include '10 WS)...overall in the regular season, Rangers have dropped 7 straight to the Giants, longest active losing streak to one opponent...Rangers won 6 of first 10 all-time meetings with Giants, but, beginning July 16, 2000, have dropped 10 of 12 in regular season and 14 of 17 overall...in SF, Texas has lost 11 reg. season games in a row.

TEAM PITCHING: Rangers have allowed 3 ER-or-less in 5 of last 6, but still have 6.71 ERA (44 ER/59.0 IP) last 7 G to rise from 3.32 to 3.71, still 5th in A.L....have allowed 3 different 8-run innings in that span...have 4.20 ERA (170 ER/364.0 IP) over last 41 G to rise from 2.48...ranks among A.L. leaders in opp. avg. (4th, .239), fewest walks (3rd, 158), and strikeouts (3rd, 439)...staff has fanned 283 in 316.0 innings last 35 G, as 15 G of 10+ K's are T3rd-most in A.L....on 5/30 vs. SEA, allowed season highs in runs (21) and hits (20), also 2nd-most HR allowed (4)...after a 2.81 ERA in April that ranked 2nd in club history (2.45 in 1983), staff posted 4.30 ERA (120 ER/251.0 IP) in May, 11th in A.L....team had 2.55 road ERA in April, but has 4.12 (82 ER/179.0 IP) figure since start of May to raise season away ERA to 3.50, still 2nd in the A.L.

STARTERS: ML-high 2nd CG loss last night...have quality starts in 4 of last 6, but a pair of 1.2-IP starts in last 7...starters have taken decisions in 9 straight, 15 of 16, and 26 of last 29 beg. May 6...3 QS losses on this trip after just 2 total QS losses in April & May...starters have gone less than 6.0 IP in 11 of 19 and 13 of last 22...have 7.18 ERA (29 ER/36.1 IP) last 7 G to rise from 3.78 to 4.14, still 5th in A.L....starters have a 4.79 ERA (130 ER/244.1 IP) last 42 G to raise ERA from 2.54...rotation ranks among A.L. team leaders in wins (T1st, 26), win pct. (T3rd, .565), strikeouts (4th, 290), and quality starts (T3rd, 31)...have limited opp. to 2 ER-or-less in 32 of 57 starts...starters have gone at least 5.0 IP in 48 of 57 and at least 6.0 in 36 of 56.

RELIEVERS: Last night was 2nd game off all season...bullpen has 2.40 ERA (4 ER/15.0 IP) on this trip...bullpen last 7 G: 28.0 IP, 23 R/19 ER (6.11 ERA), .325 (37-114) opp. avg. to raise season ERA from 2.15 to 2.83, still 4th in the A.L....14 of last 29 IR have scored, this after just 10 of first 43 IR scored...the 13 runs allowed 5/30 vs. SEA were T4th-most in club history, most since 14 R-ER on 4/23/08 at DET...relievers still lead majors with 1.00 WHIP, .259 OBP, and 4.38 SO/BB ratio...rank among A.L. leaders in slugging (3rd, .351) and avg. (2nd, .219)...have allowed multiple runs just 10 times, but 5 of last 10 G...bullpen's 149 games in relief are 6th-fewest in A.L....Nathan and Adams have all 4 bullpen's losses (2 each), while Ross has 5 of 7 relief wins (Adams and Tateyama)...has converted 14 of 18 save opps., T7th in A.L. in saves...just 2 of last 6 Texas wins have netted a save.

 Has 2.0 SHO IP last 2 G after allowing 3 R in consecutive games 5/29-30 vs. SEA (6 R/4 ER)...has allowed runs in 2 of 4 to raise season ERA from 2.08 to 3.60, this after 4 total runs allowed his first 20 appearances in 2012...walks in season-high 3 straight after 2 BB first 21 G and 17.1 IP...had both of bullpen's relief losses in May (5/1 at TOR; 5/17 vs. OAK)...is 0-2, 6.55 (8 ER/11.0 IP) last 15 G to rise from 1.00...ranks among A.L. leaders in holds (T7th, 10)...has allowed a run in 6 of 24 appearances...issued 2 walks 5/10 at BAL-G2, his first walks of 2012 and first 2-walk appearance since 7/17/11, a span of 46 games...allowed walk-off HR to first batter faced (Lawrie) in 9th 5/1 at TOR, 4th career walk-off HR allowed...earned lone save on 4/12 vs. SEA, his first since 8/7/11 vs. CLE and 4th in ML career...since the start of '09, has the most holds (95), lowest ERA at 1.64 (36 ER/197.1 IP), and 2nd-lowest WHIP (0.90) among all ML relievers w/ 150 IP...opened career w/ 4.1 SHO IP in first 5 G vs. OAK, but has allowed runs in 3 of last 7 vs. A's.

 Appeared in 5 overall (7.1 IP, 11 R-9 ER) since recall on 5/21 (Feliz went on DL)...allowed 8 R in 0.2 IP 5/30 vs. SEA, T5th-most ever by Texas reliever, fewest outs ever by Texas reliever allowing 8+ runs...last ML reliever w/ 8+ runs on 0.2 IP-or-less was BAL's Brian Burres (8 R/0.2 IP) on 8/22/07 vs. TEX-G1...recorded final out in 13th on 5/26 vs. TOR for first win since 8/19/11 at CWS...on Rangers 15-day DL March 30-April 13 w/ low back muscle strain, optioned to Round Rock 3/14...was 1-0 with a save and 0.54 ERA (1 ER/16.2 IP) in 12 G for Express, a .200 (12-60) opp. avg. w/ 4 BB & 14 SO.

TEAM BATTING: Were shut out for first time in '12 last night...2 HR last 7 G, fewest in a 7-G span since mid-June 2011...Tues. was just 3rd homerless win in 2012...Rangers are batting .266 (204-766) last 22 G to drop from .296 to **.285, still best in majors...**have hit 3+ HR in ML-best 10 times in 2012 (tied w/ TOR)...scored 10+ runs ML-best 10 times...10+ hits A.L.-best 26 times (STL-27)...has 6 innings of 6+ runs, including 3 times in 1st inn...A.L.-best 47 runs in 1st inning, just one last 7 G...**lead majors in avg. (.285), runs (309), SLG (.465), OBP (.344), hits (575), and total bases (939)**...rank among A.L. leaders in XBH (2nd, 198), doubles (3rd, 110), HR (T3rd, 78), and stolen bases (4th, 42)...22-for-last-26 (84.6%) in steal attempts beg. May 12...have gone deep in 23 of last 29, 44 of 57 G overall in 2012 (30-14 record w/ HR)...Rangers lead the majors in road average (.286) and on-base percentage (.346), ranking among ML leaders in slugging (2nd, .447), hits (2nd, 321), runs (2nd, 165) and HR (T5th, 36)...just 3 HR last 8 road games.
