ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four from Texas to win their first series since May 4-6 at Tampa Bay...lost each of the previous five series and split each of the four series prior to that...the streak of nine consecutive series without winning a series was second longest by an A's team since 1995...went 12 consecutive series without a win from July 11-August 24, 2008...have now won four of the last six games after a season-high nine-game losing streak...the losing streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history and was the longest since a 10-game losing streak last year from May 30 to June 9...are 7-15 since May 15 after going 19-17 over the first 36 games...are 26-32 for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in third place in the AL West and trail Texas by seven games...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 11 days in third, eight days tied for third and seven days in fourth...have not been all alone in fourth since April 16.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's lost two of three in San Francisco in May to begin interleague play...face Arizona and Colorado on this six-game road trip and then return home to host San Diego, Los Angeles and San Francisco...went 8-10 in interleague play last year, their third consecutive season with a losing record against the NL...it was just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing interleague record...are 22-35 (.386) over the last four years (since 2009), which is tied for the third worst mark in the majors, but are 145-124 (.539) all-time, which is the seventh best record.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0 for 5 with three strikeouts this year are now 0 for their last 26 dating back to a Ben Sheets single June 19, 2010 at St. Louis...have a .085 (23 for 272) average with four doubles, seven RBI, eight walks and 120 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an AL team over that span (Toronto, .093)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

PITCHING: The A's allowed one run or fewer in three of the four games against Texas and surrendered just eight runs total in the four game series while holding the Rangers to a .189 (23 for 122) batting average...now have a 2.21 ERA (15 er in 61.0 ip) over the last seven games and a 3.50 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...have allowed just two home runs over the last seven games and 47 for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in nine of the last 11 games and have a 2.43 ERA (19 er in 70.1 ip) over that span...now have a 3.92 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

SHUTOUT: The A's pitching staff tossed its sixth shutout of the season Wednesday night, which is tied for second most in the American League...however, the offense has been blanked a Major League leading 11 times...including eight times in the last 22 games...the A's pitching staff has allowed four runs or fewer in nine of the 11 games in which the A's have been shutout and have a 3.77 ERA (38 er in 90.2 ip) when the A's are held to no runs...the A's were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...were shut out five times in the month of May, the A's most in one month since September, 1991 when they were also blanked five times.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 33 runs in the last six games after tallying 32 runs over the previous 16 contests...have 197 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...it is also the fewest by an A's team over the first 58 games since the 1979 club had 190...have hit two home runs in three of the last four games and now have 48 for the season...last year, the A's hit just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break...stole three bases yesterday after swiping just four bags over the previous 14 games...that included the A's sixth double steal of the season, which is second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (had 11 in 2010)...rank second in the AL with 47 stolen bases for the season...are hitting .266 (54 for 203) over the last six games after batting .186 over the previous 19 games...rank last in the majors in batting (.214) and slugging (.342) and second to last in on-base percentage (.292)...are second to last in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.220)...have grounded into 35 double plays, which is the fewest in the AL...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.99).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 38 players, which is tied with Detroit for second most in the American League (Boston, 39)...Evan Scribner, who was called up Wednesday, would become the 39th...13 of the 38 players have been rookies (Scribner would be number 14), which is the most in the majors...used a total of 14 rookies all last year...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Doolittle, Miller, Milone, Parker, Scribner).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Arizona (three games) and Colorado (three games) tonight...this trip concludes a stretch from May 28 to June 14 where the A's will play 12 of their 16 games on the road...went 3-1 on the last homestand against Texas after going 1-5 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Kansas City (1-2)...are 13-16 at home and 13-16 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 3.08 ERA (93 er in 271.2 ip) at home compared to 3.96 (110 er in 250.0 ip) on the road.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 12 assists, which is tied with Arizona, Philadelphia and Kansas City for the most in the majors...last year, A's outfielders had 21 assists for the entire season...the A's have turned 65 double plays, which is tied for second most in the American League.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-4 in one-run games and the 10 one-run decisions are the fewest in the majors...are 13-12 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 13-20 in all other games...are 7-6 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 6-5 in the last at bat...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Norberto, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

A's vs. DIAMONDBACKS

The A's won the season series last year, taking two of three in Oakland...this is ninth time the A's and Diamondbacks have met...the A's have won five of the series and Arizona has won three...all time, the A's are 13-11 against Arizona...that includes 7-8 in Oakland and 6-3 in Arizona...last played in Phoenix in 2008 and lost two of three...

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has six hits in his last six plate appearances...the Oakland record for consecutive plate appearances with a hit is seven.

Coco Crisp has been successful in each of his last 31 stolen bases attempts, which is longest such streak in Athletics history.

Brandon Inge has 22 RBI in 20 games with the A's, which are second most in Oakland history by a player in his first 20 games with the A's (Kingman, 26 in 1984).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1933 Jimmie Foxx homers in his first three at bats in the A's 14-10 win over New York...he had homered in his last at bat the day before to give him four consecutive home runs...in 1965 Rick Monday is chosen by the Kansas City A's as the first player ever taken in baseball's free agent draft...in 1975 Ken Holtzman one-hits the Detroit Tigers in the A's 4-0 win...Claudell Washington homers twice and drives in all four Oakland runs...in 2008 Mark Ellis hits the fifth walk-off grand slam in Oakland history to lift the A's to a 7-3 win over Los Angeles in 12 innings.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments and his teams are 11-5 (.688) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

LOSING STREAK: Has lost each of his last two starts, the first losing streak of his career...has a 2.63 ERA (4 er in 13.2 ip) in those two starts and the A's have been shutout in each start...the A's have been blanked in three of his 11 starts this year.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in wins (6) and innings pitched (71.1), tied for second in starts (11) and tied for fifth in strikeouts (41)...is the first rookie pitcher in Oakland history to have six wins before the end of May...his 11 starts are the most among Major League pitchers without a no decision.

FIRST FOUR, LAST SEVEN: Went 3-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .185 opponents batting average over his first four starts and yielded just one home run in 27.0 innings...is 3-4 with a 4.47 ERA (22 er in 44.1 ip) and .273 (48 for 176) opponents average over his last seven starts and has allowed seven home runs in 44.1 innings.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is making his first career interleague appearance.

WITH THE BAT: Went 1 for 6 (.167) with a home run, three RBI, one run scored and one strikeout in his five starts with Washington last year... hit a three-run home run off Dillon Gee on the first pitch of his first big league at bat in the second inning September 3, 2011 against New York (NL)...hit .273 with a double and four RBI in his minor league career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 6.23 ERA (24 er in 34.2 ip) and .295 (41 for 139) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 4-1 with a 0.98 ERA (4 er in 36.2 ip) and .186 (24 for 129) opponents average in five starts at home...has allowed seven of his eight home runs on the road...has the seventh highest road ERA in the American League and the third lowest home ERA...won each of his first four career starts at the Coliseum before taking the loss in his last start...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum...the previous best was three by Tim Hudson in 1999.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-2 with a 2.70 ERA (12 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest and 2-3 with a 4.60 ERA (16 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Six of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has issued eight walks in 56 plate appearances against left-handed hitters compared to nine walks in 232 plate appearances against right-handers...has limited the opponents clean-up hitter to a .138 (4 for 29) batting average, which is seventh lowest in the American League...has allowed a .313 (21 for 67) batting average to hitters leading off an inning.

2012 START-BY-START: He combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City **April 9** in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle **April 14**...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first five innings but that was a solo home run by Montero in the second inning...then allowed three runs in the sixth...Noesi and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win at Los Angeles **April 19**...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first three innings before allowing his only two runs in the fourth...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago **April 24** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-6 loss at Boston **April 30**...allowed a career-high eight runs on eight hits, including a career-high three home runs...allowed four runs in the second inning, including a lead-off home run to Ortiz and RBI singles by Byrd and Aviles...McDonald hit a two-run home run in the third and Ortiz added a solo shot in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win at Tampa Bay **May 6**...allowed five runs in five innings and walked a career-high four batters...allowed four runs in the first inning...walked the first three batters he faced...Keppinger followed with a sacrifice fly and after hitting Scott to reload the bases, he allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez and a two-run single to Joyce...the A's then scored five times in the third and three more times in the fifth to take an 8-4 lead...also allowed an Upton solo home run in the fifth...won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-4 win over Detroit **May 11** in Oakland...struck out a career-high six batters in 7.0 innings...allowed a run to score in the first inning when Jackson led off with a double and later scored on a double play...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the inning before he allowed an unearned run in the third on a Cabrera RBI double...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Texas **May 16**...allowed four runs in 7.0 innings pitched and all four runs came in the fourth inning...allowed a two-run home run to Beltre, a RBI single to Gentry and a RBI single to Andrus...surrendered a career-high nine hits...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles **May 21** in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first four innings before allowing his only run on a Trout RBI double in the fifth inning...retired each of the final six batters that he faced...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to New York **May 27** in Oakland...allowed just one run over the first six innings, a lead off home run by Jones in the second inning...also allowed a RBI double to Teixeira in the seventh...Kuroda and Soriano combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 2-0 loss at Kansas City last Sunday...matched his career-high with six strikeouts...allowed a leadoff home run to Hosmer in the second inning and a RBI single to Giavotella in the fifth...Mazzaro, Herrera, Holland and Broxton combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (2-2, 2.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, the 10th of his career...has not allowed a run in either of his last two starts and no has a career-high 18.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 23...that is the longest active scoreless streak in the American League...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight starts and two runs or fewer in all but one...has a 2.40 ERA, which is the lowest among Major League rookies with at least 40 innings pitched...also has the lowest opponents batting average (.205)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 12-1 win over Texas last Monday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 6 so)...made his first career interleague start May 18 at San Francisco and allowed six runs in 2.0 innings (27.00 ERA) for the loss...is 2-1 with a 1.35 ERA in seven starts against American League teams...struck out in his only at bat this year May 18 at San Francisco and is now 1 for 3 (.333) in his career.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-5, 2.66 ERA (172.1 ip, 124 h, 57 r, 51 er, 79 bb, 137 so, 13 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 13/19 (68.4%)

The A's bullpen has a 1.65 ERA (3 er in 16.1 ip) over the last eight games and has converted its only save opportunity after going 0-3 with three blown saves and a 5.03 ERA over the previous six contests...has a 2.66 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Baltimore, 2.49)...has the lowest opponents batting average (.204) and slugging percentage (.325), is tied for the second fewest home runs (13) and ranks third in opponents grounded into double plays (18)...however, has issued the second most walks (79) and recorded the second fewest strikeouts (137).

- Has not allowed a run in 11 of his past 13 games for a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip)...had a 14.54 ERA (7 er in 4.1 ip), two saves and two blown saves over his previous six contests.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (29) and tied for seventh in blown saves (2).
- First batters faced are 8 for 24 (.333) with five walks for a .448 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is fourth highest in the AL.
- Has a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) and .154 (8 for 52) opponents batting average in 15 appearances at home compared to a 6.39 ERA (9 er in 12.2 ip) and .271 (13 for 48) opponents average in 14 outings on the road.
- Has a 10.80 ERA (2 er in 1.2 ip) in two interleague appearances this year but has logged a 1.36 ERA (6 er in 39.2 ip) in 34 career appearances.

- Was used mostly as a setup man with Oakland last year, posting a 5-2 record with two saves, a 2.47 ERA and .199 opponents average in 62 appearances...tied for eighth among AL relievers in grounded into double plays (8) and ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.266).

- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Leshner, who did it in 14 games in 1996.

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.

PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.

BRIAN FUENTES

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righthetti, Lyle).

GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

LUKE HUGHES

- Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off" plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin...it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his two-game rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.

TOMMY MILONE

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

ANTHONY RECKER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he was optioned to Sacramento May 28..

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17.

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery in Phoenix.

tive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21.

KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

RICH THOMPSON

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

JEMILE WEEKS

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span...since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
