### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's swept a three-game series at Colorado for their first series sweep since September 2-4 of last year against Seattle...it was their first sweep on the road since sweeping a four-game set at Seattle in the final series of 2010 (September 30-October 3)...have a season-high tying three-game winning streak (fourth time, last: May 5-8)...the series win over Colorado was just the A's second over the last 12 series (six losses and four splits)...are now 10-18 since May 15 after going 19-17 over the first 36 games...the mark since May 15 is second worst in the majors to the Cubs (6-22)...are 29-35 for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in third place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and are eight games behind Texas...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 14 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

**AT COLORADO:** The A's hit .313 (35 for 112) with 26 runs, nine doubles and nine home runs (.634 slugging percentage) in the three-game series at Colorado...the nine home runs were their most in a three-game series since April 26-28, 2002 against Chicago (also nine)...scored at least eight runs in each of the three games, just the second time over the last seven years the A's scored at least eight runs in three straight games (September 22-24, 2009)...collected at least 10 hits in all three games, the first time the A's have tallied 10 hits in three straight games this year.

**LAST 12, PREVIOUS 18:** The A's are batting .290 (124 for 427) over the last 12 games, including .325 (38 for 117) with runners in scoring position...hit .181 with a .179 average with RISP over the previous 18 contests...have 73 runs over the last 12 games (6.1 per game) after tallying 38 over the previous 18 (2.1 per game)...have 51 extra base hits in the last 12 games (30 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs) after collecting 31 over the previous 18 (17 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have three straight multi-home run games for the first time this year (nine home runs total)...now have 58 home runs for the season...last year, hit just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break...30 of the A's 57 home runs have come with two outs, which is tied for second most in the American League...hit four home runs on Tuesday at Colorado, the A's first four-homer game since June 3, 2010 at Boston...it snapped a 330-game streak with three home runs or fewer, which was second longest in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 4-5 in interleague play (1-2 at San Francisco, 0-3 at Arizona, 3-0 at Colorado)...rank third in runs (52) and extra base hits (36) and fourth in doubles (22) but have a 5.75 ERA (49 er in 76.2 ip), which is third highest...are 25-38 (.397) over the last four years (since 2009), which is tied for the fourth worst mark in the majors...however, are 148-127 (.538) all-time, which is seventh best...conclude interleague play with this nine-game homestand against San Diego, Los Angeles and San Francisco...went 8-10 in interleague play last year, their third consecutive season with a losing record against the NL...it was just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing interleague record.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 36 runs over the last six games (35 er in 51.2 ip, 6.10 ERA) after allowing just 15 runs over the previous seven contests (2.21 ERA)...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (6), have the third fewest strikeouts (398), are tied for the fewest third home runs (57) and rank fourth in ERA (3.74).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Jarrod Parker tossed 7.0 innings yesterday, snapping a streak of five consecutive games where the A's starter pitched five innings or fewer...A's starters are now 2-2 with a 7.63 ERA (26 er in 30.2 ip) over the last six games after allowing two runs or fewer in nine of the previous 11 games (2.43 ERA).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.224) and have the third lowest slugging percentage (.362) and on-base percentage (.300)...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (237) and the third lowest average with runners in scoring position (.238)...have been shutout a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...are tied for the AL lead in stolen bases (49) and fewest grounded into double plays (40)...have six double steals, which is second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (had 11 in 2010)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a nine-game homestand tonight against San Diego (three games), Los Angeles (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's second longest of the season to a 10-game stand from July 30-August 8...it follows a stretch from May 28 to June 14 where the A's played 12 of their 16 games on the road...went 7-9 over that span, including 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 13-16 at home and 16-19 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 3.08 ERA (93 er in 271.2 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (145 er in 301.2 ip) on the road.

**COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's overcame a four-run deficit to win Wednesday night for the second consecutive game and third time this year...that marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's have overcome a deficit of four or more runs to win in back-to-back games...the other two times are September 7-8, 1996 (Kansas City) and April 26-27, 1998 (Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...are 8-7 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-6 in the last at bat...have lost each of their last four one-run games and are 6-6 in one-run games for the season...the 12 one-run decisions are tied with Cleveland for the fewest in the majors...are 14-14 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 15-21 in all other games...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the American League in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year.

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's have used 39 players, which is third most in the American League (Boston and Detroit, 40)...14 of the 39 are rookies, which is the most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...currently have nine rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Doolittle, Miller, Milone, Parker, Scribner).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Norberto, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10.

### A's vs. PADRES

The A's and Padres meet for the first time since 2009 when the A's won two of three at San Diego, June 19-21...have not met in Oakland since June 5-7, 2000 when the A's swept a three-game series...the A's are 14-8 all-time against the Padres...that includes 6-2 in Oakland and 8-6 at San Diego...have a four-game winning streak in the Coliseum.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Brandon Moss** homered in all three games at Colorado and his four home runs were the most by an Athletic in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa did it against Minnesota, August 12-14, 1996...has five home runs in eight games with the A's, which is second most in Oakland history by a player in his first eight games with the club (Jack Cust, 6 in 2007).

**Seth Smith** is 16 for 31 (.516) with five doubles, one triple, two home runs and nine RBI and five multiple hit games over his last nine games...has hit safely in all nine interleague games (13 for 29, .448).

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win is a Major League record...in **1983** Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in **2002** the A's go errorless for the 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his seventh appearance and fourth start since he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco May 15...it is his 11<sup>th</sup> appearance overall this year...the A's are 0-3 in his three starting assignments and his teams are 3-8 (.273) in his career...has tossed 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his three starts, allowed one run or fewer one and walked two batters or fewer twice.

**BRIEFLY:** Began the season at Triple-A Fresno and was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, before he was selected by San Francisco May 1...posted a 9.00 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four relief appearances with San Francisco before he was designated for assignment May 13...was claimed off waivers by the A's May 15 and did not allow an earned run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip) before making his first start May 28...is 0-2 with a 3.98 ERA (9 er in 20.1 ip) in six games with the A's.

**ONLY MAJOR LEAGUE WIN:** Started and won his Major League debut for Seattle on July 1, 2004 against Texas, an 8-4 decision (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...is 0-5 with a 7.62 ERA (46 er in 54.1 ip) in 17 games, 10 starts, since then...should he win today, he will have gone 7 years and 350 days between victories...that would be the most time between Major League wins since Vicente Romo went 8 years and 3 days between victories from July 16, 1974 to July 19, 1982.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 0-2 with a 5.65 ERA (9 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts this year and 0-0 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) in seven relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 for 6 with a sacrifice hit in his relief appearances and he allowed 1 of 2 inherited runners to score...had eight career appearances entering this season and all were starts...is 1-5 with a 8.27 ERA (45 er in 49.0 ip) in 11 career starts...made six starts with Seattle in 2004 and two with San Francisco in 2007.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 4 for 23 (.174) with two walks when leading off an inning...has issued all eight of his walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed a .333 (9 for 27) average with runners in scoring position.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in three career interleague appearances, including one start...all have been this year.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota May 28...blanked the Twins on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Plouffe in the fifth inning...the A's scored a run in the sixth to increase the lead to 3-1 but Norberto allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was his first Major League start since September 29, 2007.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven hits and but also matched his career best with five strikeouts...retired the first six batters before the Rangers scored three times in the third inning on a two-run double by Kinsler and a RBI double by Hamilton...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Torrealba in the fourth and a RBI triple to Young in the fifth.

**LAST START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona last Sunday...allowed three runs, two earned, in the first inning on a fielders choice and a two-run single by Hill...the A's scored twice in the fourth to make the score 3-2 but he allowed a RBI single to Kubel in the fifth.

**BLACKLEY vs. SAN DIEGO:** Has never faced the Padres in his career.

**WITH FRESNO:** Was 3-0 with a save and a 0.39 ERA in four games, three starts, with Triple-A Fresno in the San Francisco organization...walked just three batters in 23.1 innings (1.16 per nine innings) and allowed one home run...allowed a .163 opponents batting average, including .153 (9 for 59) against right-handed hitters and .190 (4 for 21) against left-handed hitters...opponents were 1 for 27 (.037) with runners on base, including 0 for 11 with runners in scoring position...tossed at least 4.0 innings in each of his four outings...did not allow a run over his final two starts and finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign with a 15.1-inning scoreless streak.

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** Pitched for the KIA Tigers of the Korean Baseball Organization...appeared in 25 games, including 22 starts, and posted a 7-5 record with a 3.48 ERA...struck out 115 and walked 62 in 126.2 innings.

**MINOR LEAGUE CAREER:** Was originally signed by Seattle as a non-drafted free agent on October 29, 2000 and is 69-57 with a 3.91 ERA (476 er in 1094.2 ip) in 227 career appearances, including 176 starts, over 10 minor league seasons...traded to San Francisco April 1, 2007...was a Rule 5 draft selection by Philadelphia prior to the 2008 season, was signed by Arizona as a free agent for 2009 and inked a minor league deal with the New York Mets for 2010...was released by the Mets May 1, 2010 and signed a minor league contract with the A's May 14...posted a 2-1 record and a 2.43 ERA in 17 games, six starts, with Single-A Stockton and Double-A Sacramento...was released December 20 to play in Korea...returned to the United States after signing a minor league contract with San Francisco February 19, 2012.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Tyson Ross (2-6, 6.51 ERA):** Is scheduled to be recalled tomorrow to make his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and made two starts before he was recalled April 17, the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31...went 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA in two starts with the River Cats following his option and is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA in four Triple-A starts overall...has tossed 47.0 innings...based on a minimum of 40 innings pitched, his .342 opponents batting average is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Marquis, MIN-SD .353)...his 6.51 ERA is second highest in the AL (Blackburn, MIN 7.68)...is tied for ninth in the AL with six losses...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start, a 4-0 A's loss at Minnesota May 30 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Padres in his career...is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA in five career interleague appearances, including one start.

**7-6, 2.79 ERA (193.1 ip, 144 h, 66 r, 60 er, 88 bb, 161 so, 15 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 15/22 (68.2%)**

The A's bullpen is 1-0 with two saves, no blown saves and a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) over the last four games after going 0-3 with one save, four blown saves and a 5.40 ERA (17 er in 28.1 ip) over the previous 12 contests...has a 2.79 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has the lowest opponents batting average (.210) and slugging percentage (.330) and has allowed the third fewest home runs (15)...is tied for the second most walks allowed (88)...has 44 strikeouts in 40.0 innings over the last 15 games (9.9 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

- Has not allowed a run in 14 of his past 16 games for a 1.56 ERA (3 er in 17.1 ip)...had a 14.54 ERA (7 er in 4.1 ip), two saves and two blown saves over his previous six contests.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (32) and ranks fifth among AL relievers in innings pitched (32.2).
- First batters faced are 9 for 27 (.333) with five walks for a .438 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is fifth highest in the AL and the batting average is tied for sixth highest.
- Has a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) in 15 appearances at home compared to a 4.76 ERA (9 er in 17.0 ip) in 17 outings on the road.

## BRANDON ALLEN

- Was the A's Opening Day starter at first base March 28 but went for 7 with five strikeouts in three games before he was designated for assignment April 9...was claimed off waivers by the Tampa Bay Rays April 19.

## BRETT ANDERSON

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

## DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento June 2.

## JERRY BLEVINS

- Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

## DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

## ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.

## YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field...doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career...the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).

- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Leshar, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.

### **BARTOLO COLÓN**

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

### **RYAN COOK**

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.

### **COLLIN COWGILL**

- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419)

### **COCO CRISP**

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

### **FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

### **JOEY DEVINE**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

### **JOSH DONALDSON**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.

### SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

### PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.

### BRIAN FUENTES

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

### GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

### JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

### LUKE HUGHES

- Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

### BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his two-game rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

#### KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6.

#### BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

#### JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.

#### TOMMY MILONE

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

#### BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a career-high 49-game homerless streak.

#### JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder.

#### CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).



### **ANTHONY RECKER**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

### **JOSH REDDICK**

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).

### **ADAM ROSALES**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17.

### **TYSON ROSS**

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.

### **EVAN SCRIBNER**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.

### **SCOTT SIZEMORE**

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

### **SETH SMITH**

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21.

### **KURT SUZUKI**

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

### **RICH THOMPSON**

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

### **NEIL WAGNER**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
- Was claimed off waivers by San Diego May 28.

### **JEMILE WEEKS**

- Played in the 100th game of his career April 6 against Seattle and collected 126 hits over that span... since 1918, the only player in Athletics history with more hits over the first 100 games of his career is Wally Moses, who had 134 hits in his first 100 games with the Philadelphia A's in 1935-36...the previous Oakland record was 122 by Ben Grieve.
- Had two RBI June 4 against Texas, snapping a career-high 25-game streak without an RBI
