LONG ROAD HOME: The Padres continue a 10-day, nine-game road trip today with the first of three in Oakland...following the three-game set, the Friars will return to San Diego to host the Texas Rangers (6/18-20) and Seattle Mariners (6/22-24) for an Interleague homestand...the club is in the middle of a 45-day stretch during which the team embarks on three 10-day road trips...over that 45-day period, the Padres are playing 29 of 41 games away from home.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: For this year's Interleague schedule, the Padres will play 15 games against the American League West...the Padres are 108-137 in 15-seasons of Interleague Play, including an 8-14 mark against the A's...the club is 5-1 against the American League this year and has won 11 of the last 14 Interleague games and four of the last five Interleague series dating back to last year...if the Padres can win three of their remaining nine games against the American League, they will clinch their third ever winning season of Interleague play...the only other times the Padres finished with a record above .500 against the AL were 1999 (11-4) and 2010 (9-6).

SERIES BUSINESS: A win yesterday gave the Padres their first sweep of the season, also extending their winning streak to a season-high three games.

WAKING THE BATS: Over the last 15 games, the Padres offense has picked up to the tune of a .264 batting average (136-for-516) with 30 doubles, 10 triples and 17 home runs...the Friars are averaging 4.4 runs per game and 1.1 home runs per game over that stretch, with a team OPS of .792.

TEXAS LEAGUE ALL-STARS: Three member of the San Antonio Missions have been named to the Texas League All-Star team, including infielder Nate Frieman, infielder/outfielder Dean Anna and catcher Ali Solis.

SNAPPED: Chase Headley had his 10-game hitting streak snapped last night...the streak tied Yonder Alonso and Orlando Hudson for the longest by a Padre this season...over the 10-game stretch, he went 15-for-41 (.366) with four doubles and is posting a .435 on-base percentage.

OUT OF THE GATE: Will Venable connected for his seventh career leadoff home run on Sunday vs. the Brewers...it was the second of the year for Venable and the seventh of his career...he is now tied with Quilvio Veras for first on the Padres all-time list...prior to his two leadoff homers this year, each of his previous five came during the 2011 season.

BACK FOR THE FIRST TIME: The Padres activated outfielder Carlos Quentin from the disabled list after he missed 49 games to start the season...he has gone 17-for-42 with nine extra-base hits (four doubles, five homers) since joining the Friars, including three three-hit games...in 53 plate appearances since being activated, he has reached base 28 times (.528 OBP), including at least once in each game he has played.

CABBY: After going hitless in his first five games of the season, Everth Cabrera has hit .329 (23-for-70) with eight doubles, one triple, two home runs, eight RBI and nine runs scored in his last 20 games dating back to 5/23...over that stretch, he is posting a .405 on-base percentage along with a .557 slugging percentage...he has also stolen nine bases in nine attempts, making him a perfect 24-for-24 between Triple-A Tucson (15-for-15) and the Padres this year.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Yonder Alonso has hit a career-high tying two doubles six times this season, tying Tony Gwynn (1993) and Adrian Gonzalez (2007) for the most multi-double games in a season by a Padre...with his 16 doubles on the season, Alonso leads the club and all Major League rookies.

STARTING PITCHER

RHP - Anthony Bass #45 (2-6, 4.38)

FOR STARTERS: The 24-year-old is set to make his 13th start of the season in his 15th outing tonight against the A's at the Coliseum...will be his first career start against the A's...will be his 16th career start in his 42nd Big League outing.

- Has allowed 19 runs in his last four starts (21.0 IP, 8.14 ERA) after posting a 2.94 ERA (16 ER/49.0 IP) over his first eight this year.
- Made two relief appearances in the Padres opening series vs. LAD, with 2.0 innings on 4/5 vs. LAD and another 2.0 on 4/7 vs. LAD, before making his first start of the year on 4/12 vs. ARI.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster this season.

LAST TIME OUT: Tagged with his sixth loss of the year on 6/10 at MIL after working 5.2 innings and allowing four runs on five hits, one home run, and three walks while striking out six...held the Brewers scoreless over his first 5.0 innings of work, with the Padres taking a 2-0 lead into the bottom of the sixth inning before allowing four runs in the frame...Padres rallied with three runs in the ninth but fell short, losing 6-5 at MIL.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Making his third career appearance and second start in interleague play tonight.

- Made a start against the Angels this season on 5/20 at Petco Park, working 6.0 innings and allowing two runs on five hits and three walks in the club's 3-2 victory in 13 innings.
- Only other interleague outing came last season on 7/1/11 against the Mariners at Safeco Field...worked 2.1 innings and allowed one run on two hits and two walks in the relief outing.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Making his seventh road start tonight, his first ever at the Coliseum.

- Padres have won just one of his six starts on the road this season, on 5/15 at WSH (8.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 7 SO, 1 HR).
- Has allowed 15 runs in his last three road starts after allowing just six over his first three (6 ER/21.0 IP, 2.57 ERA).

AS A STARTER: Is 4-5 with a 3.92 ERA (37 ER/85.0 IP), a .247 (79-for-320) opponents batting average and 71 strikeouts against 36 walks over his 15 career starts.

- In 12 starts so far this season, has gone 2-5 with a 4.50 ERA (35 ER/70.0 IP), a .252 (67-for-266) opponents batting average and 67 strikeouts against 29 walks (three intentional), with seven home runs allowed.

PLEAD THE FIFTH: Over his 12 starts this season, has allowed 19 runs (18 earned) between innings 1-4 combined for a 3.38 ERA (18 ER/48.0 IP) early in the game...in the fifth and sixth innings of his starts, has allowed 17 runs (15 earned) for a 7.11 ERA (15 ER/19.0 IP) in innings 5-6 combined.

SWEET RELIEF: Over 26 career relief outings, has gone 0-1 with a 1.93 ERA (8 ER/37.1 IP), a .233 (31-for-133) opponents batting average and 20 strikeouts against 14 walks.

- Last season, after making his Major League debut on 6/13/11 at COL, made 24-straight relief appearances from 7/1-9/16/11, posting a 1.89 ERA (7 ER/33.1 IP) and a .242 (29-for-120) opponents average over that stretch.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

RHP - Ross Ohlendorf #59 (1-0, 3.38)

FOR STARTERS: The 29-year-old is set to make his first start of the season and first as a Padre in his third outing of the year tomorrow at OAK.

- Was signed by the Padres to a Major League contract on 6/4.
- In 10 starts for Triple-A Pawtucket (BOS) this season, went 4-3 with a 4.61 ERA (27 ER/52.2 IP) and 37 strikeouts against 15 walks.
- Tomorrow will be the 98th outing and 65th start of his Big League career.
- Making his 14th career interleague appearance and eighth start tomorrow.
- With his start tomorrow, will be the 12th different pitcher to start a game for the Padres in 2012, the most starting pitchers used in a season for the Padres since the 2009 club had a franchise-record tying 15 different pitchers start a game (2x, also, 2002)...11 different pitchers to start a game currently the most for any Major League club this season.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win on 6/9 at MIL after working 4.1 innings and allowing just one run on five hits and two walks while striking out four...threw 67 pitches in the effort, 43 for strikes...came in relief of Andrew Cashner who made his first start as a Padre in that game and worked 2.1 innings...Padres scored four runs between the fifth and seventh inning to win by a score of 5-2.

VS. THE ATHLETICS: Making his third career appearance and second start against the A's tomorrow.

- Last faced the A's during interleague play in 2010 for PIT in a game started on 6/27/10 at the Coliseum...worked 6.0 innings and allowed two unearned runs on two hits and four walks while striking out three...Pirates fell by a score of 3-2 to the A's.
- Only other appearance against the A's also came at the Coliseum in 2008 while with the New York Yankees...worked 1.1 innings in relief on 6/11/08 for NYY, allowing one run on two hits and three walks.
