# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brandon Moss has six home runs in nine games with the A's, which matches Jack Cust (2007) for the most home runs in franchise history over a player's first nine games with the club...has homered in four straight games (five home runs total), the 20<sup>th</sup> time in Oakland history a player has homered in at least four straight games.

Seth Smith is 16 for 35 (.457) with five doubles, one triple, two home runs and nine RBI and five multiple hit games over his last 10 games.

# THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1934 Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a doubleheader against Chicago...in 1938 Jimmie Foxx sets an American League record by walking six times in a nine-inning game against Boston...in 1971 Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a major league record for consecutive home runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire drives in the 790th run of his career, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland record OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-35) VS. # ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won each of their last four games, which is the longest winning streak of the season...had lost 14 of the previous 18 games prior to that...are now 11-18 since May 15 after going 19-17 over the first 36 games...the mark since May 15 is tied with San Diego and Seattle for second worst in the majors to the Cubs (7-22)...are 30-35 for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in third place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and are eight games behind Texas...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...swept a three-game series at Colorado to start the week, their first series sweep since September 2-4 of last year against Seattle...it was their first sweep on the road since sweeping a four-game set at Seattle in the final series of 2010 (September 30-October 3)...the series win over Colorado was just the A's second over the last 12 series (six losses and four splits).

**RECENT OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .317 (46 for 145) with 36 runs, 10 doubles, one triple and 10 home runs (.607 slugging percentage) over the last four games...have scored at least eight runs in each game, the first time the A's have scored eight or more runs in four consecutive games since June 6-9, 2004...are now batting .293 (135 for 460) over the last 13 games, including .341 (44 for 129) with runners in scoring position...hit .181 with a .179 average with RISP over the previous 18 contests...have 83 runs over the last 13 games (6.4 per game) after tallying 38 over the previous 18 (2.1 per game)...have 54 extra base hits in the last 13 games (31 doubles, six triples, 17 home runs) after collecting 31 over the previous 18 (17 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 5-5 in interleague play (1-2 at San Francisco, 0-3 at Arizona, 3-0 at Colorado, 1-0 vs. San Diego)...rank second in runs (62), tied for second in extra base hits (39), third in slugging (.473), tied for third in doubles (23) and triples (3) and fourth in batting (.282)...however, have a 5.36 ERA (51 er in 85.2 ip), which is fourth highest...are 26-38 (.406) over the last four years (since 2009), which is tied for the fifth worst mark in the majors...however, are 149-127 (.540) all-time, which is tied for sixth best...following this three-game series, the A's conclude interleague play with Los Angeles and San Francisco...went 8-10 in interleague play last year, their third consecutive season with a losing record against the NL...it was just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing interleague record.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 10 home runs in the last four games and now have 59 for the season...last year the A's hit just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break...30 of the A's 59 home runs have come with two outs, which is tied for third most in the American League...hit four home runs on Tuesday at Colorado, the A's first four-homer game since June 3, 2010 at Boston...it snapped a 330-game streak with three home runs or fewer, which was second longest in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 38 runs over the last seven games (37 er in 60.2 ip, 5.49 ERA) after allowing just 15 runs over the previous seven contests (2.21 ERA)...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (6), have the third fewest home runs (57) and rank fourth in ERA (3.71)...have the second fewest strikeouts (404) and fourth most walks (215).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Jarrod Parker tossed 7.0 innings Thursday, snapping a streak of five consecutive games where the A's starter pitched five innings or fewer...A's starters are now 3-2 with a 6.87 ERA (28 er in 36.2 ip) over the last seven games after allowing two runs or fewer in nine of the previous 11 games (2.43 ERA).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have the second lowest batting average in the majors (.226) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.364) and on-base percentage (.302)...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (247) and the third lowest average with runners in scoring position (.245)...have been shutout a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...lead the AL lead in stolen bases (51) and are tied for the second fewest grounded into double plays (41)...have six double steals, which is second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (had 11 in 2010)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this nine-game homestand against San Diego (1-0), Los Angeles (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season to a 10-game stand from July 30-August 8...it follows a stretch from May 28 to June 14 where the A's played 12 of their 16 games on the road...went 7-9 over that span, including 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 14-16 at home and 16-19 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 3.05 ERA (95 er in 280.2 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (145 er in 301.2 ip) on the road.

**COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's overcame a four-run deficit to win Wednesday night for the second consecutive game and third time this year...that marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's have overcome a deficit of four or more runs to win in back-to-back games...the other two times are September 7-8, 1996 (Kansas City) and April 26-27, 1998 (Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...are 8-7 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-6 in the last at bat...have lost each of their last four one-run games and are 6-6 in one-run games for the season...the 12 one-run decisions are tied with Cleveland for the fewest in the majors...are 14-14 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 16-21 in all other games...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the American League in extra inning wins and tied for second in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's have used 39 players, which is third most in the American League (Boston and Detroit, 40)...14 of the 39 are rookies, which is the most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...currently have eight rookies on the roster (Céspedes, Cook, Cowgill, Donaldson, Doolittle, Miller, Milone, Parker).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Norberto, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 10<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 3-6 (.333) in his starting assignments this year and 7-10 (.412) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in four of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today for his second stint with the A's... was the A's final cut of the spring as he was optioned to Sacramento April 4...was one of the three inactive players in

Japan...went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17, the first day the A's needed a fifth starter...went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31...went 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA in two starts with the River Cats following his option and is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA in four Triple-A starts overall.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Has tossed 47.0 innings...based on a minimum of 40 innings pitched, his .342 opponents batting average is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Marquis, MIN-SD .353)...his 6.51 ERA is second highest in the AL (Blackburn, MIN 7.68).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 1-3 with a 3.86 ERA (10 er in 23.1 ip) and .259 (22 for 85) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 9.13 ERA (24 er in 23.2 ip) and .407 (44 for 108) opponents average in five starts at night...his career splits are 3-5 with a 3.44 ERA (21 er in 55.0 ip) in 15 day games compared to 3-8 with a 6.42 ERA (48 er in 67.1 ip) in 29 games at night.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Has made one interleague appearances this year, a start and loss on May 14 at San Francisco (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in five career interleague appearances, including one start.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .342 opponents batting average, breaks down to .258 (25 for 97) against right-handed hitters and .427 (41 for 96) against lefties...the mark against lefties is the highest in the majors (Carpenter, HOU .395)...has a .288 (21 for 73) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .351 (26 for 74) the second time and .413 (19 for 46) the third time.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on six days rest today...is 2-3 with a 3.06 ERA (12 er in 35.1 ip) in six starts when pitching on four days rest and 0-3 with a 16.97 ERA (22 er in 11.2 ip) in three starts on five days rest.

**IN MAY:** Went 1-5 with a 6.53 ERA in six starts in May...led the American League and tied for the Major League lead in losses in the month...his ERA was fourth highest in the AL.

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed three home runs May 25 against New York, the only time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in an outing...has surrendered six home runs for the season...five have come with runners on base.

2012 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Los Angeles April 17...left after six innings trailing 2-1 but the A's scored four times in the eighth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 victory over Cleveland **April 22** in Oakland...the victory came on his 25<sup>th</sup> birthday and he became the first Oakland pitcher to start and win on his birthday since Todd Stottlemyre in 1995 (May 20 vs. Kansas City)...issued a career-high five walks in 6.2 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Baltimore **April 28**...allowed a career-high nine runs on 11 hits in 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the fifth inning on a Davis RBI single, a Paulino two-run single, an Andino RBI single and a Hardy sacrifice fly...also allowed a Betemit RBI double in the third and was charged with three runs in the fifth...surrendered a Jones RBI single and was relieved by Blevins with runners on first and second...Blevins allowed a two-run single to Davis...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Tampa Bay May 4...allowed seven runs on nine hits in 3.1 innings after yielding nine runs on 11 hits in 4.0 innings in his previous start...the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed three runs in the third on a RBI double by Upton and a two-run single by Scott...then allowed four runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Molina, a RBI double by Upton and a RBI single by Joyce...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-2 loss to Toronto May 9 in Oakland...allowed a hit and walked three over the first three innings but did not allow a run until Lind hit a two-run home run in the fourth inning...also allowed a RBI single to Rasmus in the sixth inning...combined with Balfour, Norberto and Cook on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles May 14...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed five of the hits...stranded runners in scoring position in three of the six innings and retired the side in order just twice...was charged with his fourth loss of the season in the A's 4-0 loss at San Francisco **May 19**...tossed a career-high 108 pitches in 6.0 innings...blanked the Giants on six hits and four walks over the first six innings...then allowed a single to Burris and hit Vogelsong to start the seventh inning and was relieved by Balfour...he allowed both inherited runners to score plus two of his own...Vogelsong, Lopez and Hensley combined to shutout the A's on one hit...wwas the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to New York **May 25** in Oakland...allowed a career-high 12 hits and yielded a career-high three home runs...allowed three runs in the third inning on a RBI double by Cano and a Teixeira added a two-run homer...allowed three more runs in the fifth inning on a solo home run by Cano and a two-run home run by Swisher.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Minnesota May 30...allowed two runs in the first inning on a pair of RBI singles by Willingham and Dozier...also allowed a two-run home run to Willingham in the fifth...Liriano, Burnett and Gray combined to shutout the A's on three hits.

ROSS vs. SAN DIEGO: Has never faced the Padres in his career.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA in four starts with Sacramento...allowed a .253 opponents batting average, including .188 (9 for 48) against right-handed hitters and .343 (12 for 35) against left-handers...opponents were 1 for 19 (.053) with three walks when leading off an inning...yielded a .170 (9 for

**RHP Bartolo Colón (6-6, 4.21 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 15<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 3-4 with a 5.80 ERA and .347 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 3-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his first six starts...is 2-4 with a 5.80 ERA in six starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 3.12 ERA in eight starts on the road ...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-5 A's win at Colorado last Tuesday (5.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 1.13 ERA in two career appearances, both starts, against San Diego...last faced the Padres on June 18, 2006 and was the losing pitcher in a 7-3 Angels loss at Los Angeles (7.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 2-0 despite a 6.30 ERA in two interleague starts this year...is now 18-12 with a 4.04 ERA in 38 career interleague appearances, all starts.

- Is tied for second in the American League in games pitched (32) and ranks sixth among AL relievers in innings pitched (32.2).

Save/Opportunities: 7-9

- First batters faced are 9 for 27 (.333) with five walks for a .438 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is fifth highest in the AL and the batting average is tied for sixth highest.
- Has a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) in 15 appearances at home compared to a 4.76 ERA (9 er in 17.0 ip) in 17 outings on the road.
- Has a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in five interleague appearances this year and has logged a 1.23 ERA (6 er in 44.0 ip) in 37 career appearances. Has not faced San Diego in his career.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Colorado last Tuesday...allowed four runs in the first inning on a lead-off home run by Colvin and RBI singles by Cuddyer, Nelson and Nieves...the A's then scored six times in the third inning and he allowed just one run over his final four innings, a home run by Helton in the fifth.

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 13 as he continues his recovery from July 14, 2011 "Tommy John" surgery.

# DARIC BARTON

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento June 2.

# JERRY BLEVINS

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

# DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

# ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.

# YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field... doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career... the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).

- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.

# BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.

# RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous high was 21.0 innings by Ale Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.

# COLLIN COWGILL

• Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419)

# COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

# FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

# JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

# JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the hits, doubles and RBI were all career highs.

# SEAN DOOLITTLE

• Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

# PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.

# **BRIAN FUENTES**

• Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

# **GRAHAM GODFREY**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

# JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.

# LUKE HUGHES

• Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

# **BRANDON INGE**

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his two-game rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

# KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6.

# BRANDON MCCARTHY

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blaton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

# JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 afte posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.

# TOMMY MILONE

 Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

# BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.

# JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on thw 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder.

# CLIFF PENNINGTON

Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).

# ANTHONY RECKER

• Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

# JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).

# ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17.

# **TYSON ROSS**

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.

# EVAN SCRIBNER

 Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.

# SCOTT SIZEMORE

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

# SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

# **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21.

# KURT SUZUKI

- Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.
- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
