Jonny Gomes snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter with his third career pinch hit home run in the seventh inning yesterday.

Seth Smith is batting .448 (13 for 29) with four doubles, three home runs and nine RBI over his last nine games...is batting .340 (33 for 97) with all seven of his home runs in 32 games in the outfield compared to .178 (13 for 73) in 23 games at designated hitter.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1967 the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in 1988 Stan Javier's RBI single in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the this three game series with the Rangers...in 1996 Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high five-game winning streak...the longest winning streak last year was six games from June 15 to 21...have won the first two games of this series after sweeping a three-game series at Colorado...have won back-to-back series for the second time this year (April 30-May 6 at Boston and Tampa bay)...with a win today, would sweep back-to-back series for the first time since September 14-20, 2009 (at Texas, vs. Cleveland)...prior to this winning streak, the A's had lost 14 of the previous 18 games...are now 12-18 since May 15 after going 19-17 over the first 36 games...the mark since May 15 is tied for third worst in the majors...are 31-35 for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in third place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and are eight games behind Texas...have spent one day tied for first this year, 30 days in second, eight days tied for second, 16 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth...the sweep of Colorado earlier this week was the A's first series sweep since September 2-4 of last year against Seattle...it was their first sweep on the road since sweeping a four-game set at Seattle in the final series of 2010 (September 30-October 3).

RECENT OFFENSE: The A's are batting .307 (54 for 176) with 42 runs, 12 doubles, one triple and 12 home runs (.591 slugging percentage) over the last five games...have scored at least six runs in each game, the first time the A's have scored six or more runs in five consecutive games since June 13-18, 2007 when they did it in six straight contests...are now batting .291 (143 for 491) over the last 14 games, including .343 (47 for 137) with runners in scoring position...hit .181 with a .179 average with RISP over the previous 18 contests...have 89 runs over the last 14 games (6.4 per game) after tallying 38 over the previous 18 (2.1 per game)...have 58 extra base hits in the last 14 games (33 doubles, six triples, 19 home runs) after collecting 31 over the previous 18 (17 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-5 in interleague play (1-2 at San Francisco, 0-3 at Arizona, 3-0 at Colorado, 2-0 vs. San Diego)...have scored 68 runs, which is the most in the majors and 18 more than the A's scored all last year in interleague play (50)...have 15 home runs after combining for 16 over the previous two seasons...are tied for the interleague lead in extra base hits (43), rank second in slugging percentage (.477), tied for third in doubles (25) and fourth in batting (.280)...however, have a 5.23 ERA (55 er in 94.2 ip), which is fifth highest...are 27-38 (.415) over the last four years (since 2009), which is tied for the seventh worst mark in the majors...however, are 150-127 (.542) all-time, which is tied for sixth best...following this three-game series, the A's conclude interleague play with Los Angeles and San Francisco...went 8-10 in interleague play last year, their third consecutive season with a losing record against the NL...it was just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing interleague record.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 12 home runs in the last five games and now have 61 for the season...last year the A's hit just 50 home runs before the All-Star Break...31 of the A's 61 home runs have come with two outs, which is tied for second most in the American League...hit four home runs on Tuesday at Colorado, the A's first four-homer game since June 3, 2010 at Boston...it snapped a 330-game streak with three home runs or fewer, which was second longest in Oakland history (440, Aug. 10, 1976-June 18, 1979).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 42 runs over the last eight games (41 er in 69.2 ip, 5.30 ERA) after allowing just 15 runs over the previous seven contests (2.21 ERA)...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (6) and tied for third in fewest home runs (58)...have the second fewest strikeouts (414) and the fourth most walks (221)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in each of the last three games (4 er in 19.0 ip, 1.89 ERA) after tossing five innings or fewer in each of the previous five contests (26 er in 23.2 ip, 9.89 ERA)

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the majors in batting (.227) and have the third lowest slugging percentage (.366) and on-base percentage (.302)...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (253) and the fourth lowest average with runners in scoring position (.247)...have been shutout a Major League leading 11 times...were shut out 15 times last year and those were the most times the A's were shutout in a season since 1979 (17)...lead the AL lead in stolen bases (53) and have the second fewest grounded into double plays (41)...have six double steals, which is second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (had 11 in 2010)...lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (3.98)...A's designated hitters rank last in the AL with a .196 (40 for 204) batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this nine-game homestand against San Diego (2-0), Los Angeles (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season to a 10-game stand from July 30-August 8...it follows a stretch from May 28 to June 14 where the A's played 12 of their 16 games on the road...went 7-9 over that span, including 3-3 on the last road trip to Arizona (0-3) and Colorado (3-0)...are 15-16 at home and 16-19 on the road...the A's pitching staff has a 3.08 ERA (99 er in 289.2 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (145 er in 301.2 ip) on the road.

COMEBACKS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's overcame a four-run deficit to win Wednesday night for the second consecutive game and third time this year...that marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's have overcome a deficit of four or more runs to win in back-to-back games...the other two times are September 7-8, 1996 (Kansas City) and April 26-27, 1998 (Baltimore and Tampa Bay)...are 9-7 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-6 in the last at bat...have lost each of their last four one-run games and are 6-6 in one-run games for the season...the 12 one-run decisions are tied with Cleveland for the fewest in the majors...are 15-14 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 16-21 in all other games...are 4-2 in extra inning games...rank second in the American League in extra inning wins and tied for third in games...have three "walk-off" wins, matching their season total from last year...all three of those wins came after the visiting team scored at least one run in the top of the final inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times and currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Carignan, Devine, Norberto, Sizemore)...Devine ("Tommy John" surgery) and Sizemore (torn ACL) will miss the entire season...the A's used the DL 15 times last year, which was the fewest since 2006 when they also used it 15 times...used the DL a total of 87 times from 2007-10.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season...the A's are 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 204-161 (.559) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in seven of his 14 starts and allowed two runs or fewer eight times.

LAST EIGHT, FIRST SIX: Is 3-4 with a 5.80 ERA (29 er in 45.0 ip) and .347 (66 for 190) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 3-2 with a 2.53 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the majors in most hits allowed (100)...is tied for second in the American League in

starts (14)...is averaging 14.4 pitches per inning, which is the lowest mark in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts and has issued just 16 free passes for the season...is averaging 1.64 walks per nine innings, which is second lowest in the American League (Lewis, TEX 1.11)...intentionally walked Nieves in his last start, his first walk against a right-handed hitter since September 27, 2011 against Tampa Bay (Longoria)...has issued 15 of his 16 walks to left-handed hitters...is tied for ninth the AL in strikeout to walk ratio (3.31).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in eight of his 14 starts and his season run support average of 3.70 (36 rs in 87.2 ip) is sixth lowest in the American League...has received two runs of support or fewer in all six of his losses and has five runs of support total in those games (5 rs in 33.1 ip, 1.35 RSA)...is 5-0 in six starts with three runs of support or more...the A's have been shutout in three of his starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 5.80 ERA (23 er in 35.2 ip) in six starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 3.12 ERA (18 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...his home ERA is fifth highest in the American League and his road ERA is eighth lowest...over the last two years, he is 6-9 with a 5.05 ERA (61 er in 108.2 ip) in 19 games in his home ballparks compared to 8-7 with a 3.33 ERA (53 er in 143.1 ip) in 24 games on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 2-0 with despite a 6.30 ERA (10.0 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 11 so) in two interleague starts this year...is now 18-12 with a 4.04 ERA (109 er in 243.0 ip) in 38 career interleague appearances, all starts.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 12 home runs...however, all of his home runs have been solo shots as have 39 of his 46 over his last three seasons...10 have been hit by left-handed hitters as have 35 of his 46 over his last three years...eight have been hit by a batter leading off a inning.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .263 (31 for 118) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .345 (40 for 116) the second time and .252 (29 for 115) after that...has allowed a .328 (19 for 58) average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .475 (19 for 40) batting average to the opponents number three hitter, which is the highest mark in the American League.

IN MAY: Went 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of May...tied for the American League lead in hits allowed in May (44), tied for fourth in home runs (7) and tied for seventh in runs (23)...based on a minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest singlemonth mark of his career and the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks sixth among active pitchers in complete games (32), eighth in wins (167), tied for eighth in shutouts (9) and 10th in strikeouts (1795).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 167 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (365), innings pitched (2328.2) and strikeouts (1795).

39 YEARS OLD: Celebrated his 39th birthday on May 24...is just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to start a game at age 39 or older...the other four are Tommy John (42 in 1985), Tom Candiotti (41 in 1999), Don Sutton (40 in 1985) and Jim Perry (39 in 1975).

2012 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss to Seattle *April* 7 in Oakland...yielded seven earned runs, which were his most since July 6, 2007 at New York (AL)...combined with Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Seattle *April* 13...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three hits while walking one...combined with De Los Santos on a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles *April* 18...tossed eight innings and allowed all four of the hits...threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point, the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss to Chicago *April* 23 in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 18.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Baltimore *April* 29...left with a 2-0 lead and one out in the ninth inning with runners on first and second but Balfour blew the save and took the loss...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles *May* 15...Santana, Downs and Frieri combined to shutout the A's on five hits and three walks...combined with Brian Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas *June* 6 in Oakland

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Colorado last Tuesday...allowed four runs in the first inning on a lead-off home run by Colvin and RBI singles by Cuddyer, Nelson and Nieves...the A's then scored six times in the third inning and he allowed just one run over his final four innings, a home run by Helton in the fifth.

COLÓN vs. SAN DIEGO: Is 1-1 with a 1.13 ERA (16.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances, both starts...last faced the Padres on June 18, 2006 and was the losing pitcher in a 7-3 Angels loss at Los Angeles...allowed a solo home run to Cameron in the first but the Angels scored twice in the bottom of the first...then allowed three runs, one earned, in the fourth inning on a solo home run by Gonzalez and RBI singles by Castilla and Barfield...his other start was on August 19, 2002 when he tossed a two-hit shutout at Montreal in a 4-0 win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (5-3, 2.79 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...is 5-0 with a 2.31 ERA and .228 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-3 with a 3.38 ERA and .308 opponents average over his first five starts...the five-game winning streak is the longest of his career and tied for second longest in the American League this year...ranks fifth in the AL in ERA (2.79) and seventh in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.63)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-1 A's win over Texas June 7 in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...has never faced the Dodgers in his career...is 2-1 with a 1.41 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in nine career interleague appearances, including four starts.

The A's bullpen is 2-0 with four saves, one blown save and a 1.77 ERA (4 er in 20.1 ip) over the last six games after going 0-3 with one save, four blown saves and a 5.40 ERA (17 er in 28.1 ip) over the previous 12 contests...has a 2.80 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has the lowest opponents batting average (.209) and slugging percentage (.328) and has allowed the third fewest home runs (15)...has allowed the third most walks (91)...has 51 strikeouts in 46.0 innings over the last 17 games (10.0 per nine innings) after fanning 117 in 153.1 innings over the first 49 contests (6.9 per nine innings).

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento
 June 2.

JERRY BLEVINS

 Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.

DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he

 the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched
 the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).

- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest
 a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian
 Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout a April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.

Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419)

COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.

FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
 optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).

JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.

BRIAN FUENTES

 Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).

GRAHAM GODFREY

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits
 for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home
 runs.

LUKE HUGHES

 Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

BRANDON INGE

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports
 Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over
 a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more
 RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16
 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was
 his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one
 sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas,
 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history
 to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24,
 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player
 in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust
 (2007).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI
 in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his twogame rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.

KILA KA'AIHUE

• Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).

BRANDON MOSS

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).

- Was placed on thw 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder.

CLIFF PENNINGTON

Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).

ANTHONY RECKER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he
was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).

ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
 optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- Returned to Oakland May 17.

TYSON ROSS

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.

EVAN SCRIBNER

 Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left
knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports

- Was the A's eight different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 21.

KURT SUZUKI

 Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at catcher...the five starts are second most by a catcher in Oakland history...only Terry Steinbach, with nine, has more.

- Made his 598th career appearance at catcher April 7 against Seattle, which moves him past Ossee Schreckengost for fifth most in Athletics history.
- Had five assists April 25 against Chicago, the third time in Oakland history a catcher had five or more assists in a game (6, Jim Essian vs. Texas on Sept. 19, 1979; 5, Jeff Newman vs. Toronto on Aug. 13, 1979).

- Was claimed off waivers from the Los Angeles Angels April 20 and appeared in one game for the A's before he was designated for assignment April 25...faced Chicago on April 23 (0.2 ip, 1 h).
- Cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento April 27.

NEIL WAGNER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 17 but did not appear in a game before he was optioned back to Sacramento April 20.
