LONG ROAD HOME: The Padres conclude a 10-day, nine-game road trip today with the last of three in Oakland...following the three-game set, the Friars will return to San Diego to host the Texas Rangers (6/18-20) and Seattle Mariners (6/22-24) for an Interleague homestand...the club is in the middle of a 45-day stretch during which the team embarks on three 10-day road trips...over that 45-day period, the Padres are playing 29 of 41 games away from home.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: For this year's Interleague schedule, the Padres will play 15 games against the American League West...the Padres are 108-139 in 15-seasons of Interleague Play, including an 8-16 mark against the A's...the club is 5-3 against the American League this year and has won 11 of the last 16 Interleague games and four of the last six Interleague series dating back to last year....if the Padres can win three of their remaining seven games against the American League, they will clinch their third-ever winning season of Interleague play...the only other times the Padres finished with a record above .500 against the AL were 1999 (11-4) and 2010 (9-6).

FINISH STRONG: With a win today, the Padres would finish the nine-game road trip with a 5-4 record, their first winning road trip of the season.

ON THE HILL: Clayton Richard is making his 14th start of the season, looking for his second consecutive win...today's start will be his second Interleague start of 2012 and the 13th of his career... in those games, he has gone 5-3 with a 3.48 ERA (26 ER/67.1 IP)...today's game will be Richard's third career appearance against the A's, having made one start and one relief outing prior to this afternoon...

FAMILIAR FACE: Mark Kotsay, who played for the A's from 2004-07, is a career .367 hitter (18-for-49) in 16 games against OAK...he has hit safely in 14 of the 15 games against the A's in which he has had at least one at-bat, including each of the last 13.

WAKING THE BATS: Over the last 17 games, the Padres offense has picked up to the tune of a .252 batting average (145-for-576) with 33 doubles, 11 triples and 18 home runs...the Friars are averaging 4.2 runs per game and 1.1 home runs per game over that stretch, with a team OPS of .768.

OUT OF THE GATE: Will Venable connected for his seventh career leadoff home run last Sunday vs. the Brewers...it was the second of the year for Venable and the seventh of his career...he is now tied with Quilvio Veras for first on the Padres all-time list...prior to his two leadoff homers this year, each of his previous five came during the 2011 season.

BACK FOR THE FIRST TIME: The Padres activated outfielder Carlos Quentin from the disabled list after he missed 49 games to start the season...he has gone 20-for-48 with 11 extra-base hits (five doubles, six homers) since joining the Friars, including three three-hit games...in 61 plate appearances since being activated, he has reached base 33 times (.541 OBP), including at least once in each game he has played.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Yonder Alonso has hit a career-high tying two doubles six times this season, tying Tony Gwynn (1993) and Adrian Gonzalez (2007) for the most multi-double games in a season by a Padre...with his 16 doubles on the season, Alonso leads the club and all Major League rookies.
